#### The McNamara Departure

Namara, the industrial executive erving as Secretary of Defense, was onsidered something of a personal symbol of that menace Dwight Elsenhower spoke about in his celebrated valedictory as President.

"In the councils of government," said President Eisenhower, "we must guard against the acquisition of unwarranted influence, whether sought or unsought, by the military-industrial complex. The potential for the disastrous rise of misplaced power exists and will persist. We must never let the weight of this combination endanger our liberties or democratic processes. We should take nothing or granted. Only an alert and knowledgeable citizenry can compel the proper meshing of the huge industrial and military machinery of defense with our peaceful methods and goals, so that security and liberty may prosper to-

For a long time, there were those who saw Defense Secretary McNamara, with his computer-like mind and computerlike principles, as the menacing number one mogul of the "complex" Eisenwhich we were engaged in Vietnam was attacked as "McNamara's war." Mc-Namara himself was probably considered a bad, hawkish influence on President Johnson. He himself was some electronic automatom programmed not to feel, not to possess conscience, but merely to establish the mastery of that military-industrial complex more succonstully than any mere general ever could have done.

He seemed the perfect high priest for the combination of interests and forces Eisenhower had warned about.

A year and a half ago, however, the Secretary of Defense went up to a meeting of newspaper editors at Montreal and suddenly revealed a softer, human side. Subsequently, he made other oratorical efforts in which he seemed to be deliberately fighting off the image of

More recently, McNamara has shown signs of trying to advise and act counter to the automatic instincts of the military-industrial complex Eisenhower warned against. He persisted in producing findings which scaled down the value and effectiveness of our bombing of North Vietnam. He differed almost openly with his own generals over their manpower needs in Vietnam. He espoused the establishment of a "McNamara wall" across the northern boundary of South Vietnam, in an apparent approach toward the instinct of those doves who want the war conducted in such a manner as to avoid an infinity

As a result-perhaps with not much more accuracy of analysis and real justice to his real views than was involved in the original judgment in which they assessed him as the nation's leading hawk—the doves of the Vietnam debat had recently begun to regard Defense Secretary McNamara as an asset rather

This is what has been appearing on

the surface. The judgment will now have to be that there has been even more under the surface, in order to produce a situation in which McNamara would retire from the most meaningful engagement of his career and go to the elines with the World Bank. How much of the underground impetus oward this move has been caused by policy, how much by personality, or how much by the President's 1968 campaign plans, and how much of a difference it may herald in the speed with which we eliminating the limits we once placed on our strategy and goals in Vietnam-all this remains to be seen or guessed. But one thing that may be stated is this; the one visible trend at Washington during the past three years has been toward the disappearance of those who exhibited square edges which didn't fit into the smooth circle of the
