#### The Christmas And The War

The religious holiday season is not going to cause the routines of war quite so much dislocation, or to raise quite so many human qualma, this year. The actual interruption of the fighting

itself is apparently going to be minimal. Although the enemy has proposed a three day cease fire for Christmas and a three day cease fire for New Year's, and finally a seven-day truce for Tet, the Vietnamese New Year late in January, the maximum truce being agreed to by South Vietnam and the United States is much more economical.

We are willing to stop fighting one day for the anniversary of the birth of Christ, another single day for the birth of our own New Year, and a generous total of two whole days for the birth of the Vietnamese New Year. Conceivably, if the Vietcong and the

North Vietnamese should insist on not fighting two additional days at Christmas and New Year's and on not fight-- ing five additional days at Tet, our side might find itself temporarily forced to let down on direct contact belligerence.

All this is good news to our own professional military leaders, whose argument has been that the enemy uses such religious holiday truces merely in order to move supplies and men into the future battle against us. But the real reason our military leadership dislikes the seasonal truce is that, from a professional point of view, it has to dread the possibility of let-up or softness in our resolution to keep on with the war.

Once the military have a job to do, they think the most efficient thing, even the most merciful thing, is to keep on with it until it is finished. And periods of truce are inevitably periods when danger of diplomatic softness develop. There may have been something of a narrow escape from peace during the pause for Tet last year, when, if President Johnson hadn't ordered the resumption of bombing before Hanoi had a chance to reply to his so-called peace letter of that time, the truce might have been prolonged for days and weeks, with no advance guarantee whether the result would be some real negotiating toward peace, or a resumption of the war which would then seem doubly

Perhaps the most significant thing about all this is that there is no great demand anywhere for more extended truce. Even the most avid lovers of peace seem to have grown out of the naive hope that some compassionate religious miracle might descend on the brutality of the battlefield, the resolution of governments. There are those who believe in the permanent cessation of all combing of North Vietnam, but who are not agitating for merely an inconsequential day or two more in honor of a eligious holiday.

And that same Pope Paul who once journeyed over to the United Nations to utter his passionate and anguished cry of "war, never again war" has now dropped his immediate demand down to an appeal to have one "Day of Peace" on New Year's Day on which mankind could address its prayers and its hopes to the realization, at some future time, after the present war has been perhaps fought and settled, of the ideal of "war, never again."

And this year, along with his appeal for peace, Pope Paul has opened division and schism in the ranks of those who believe themselves to be for peace, by words in which he describes the motivation of some pacifists as "the cowardice of those who fear it may be their duty to give their life for the service of heir country and of their own broth-

Other men of the cloth, in various denominations, are preaching pacifism these days, not as cowardice, but as the lighest brand of courage, which is indeed what it sometimes does require. But the summation is that there is less seasonal opposition to the idea of the war this Christmas than there was last year, and the year before. Humanity is resigned to its tragedy, and less eful of any easy, miraculous escape om it. Perhaps this is somehow for the etter. Perhaps it is even a step beyond one earlier and seemingly more ferat Christmases, with what now seems hypocrisy of innocence.

#### Guaranteed Nothingness?

An authority on LSD announced, at a recent conference at Saratoga the other day, that he intends to conduct an experiment at a certain institution with which he is connected, the purpose of the experiment being to determine whether this hallucinogen will lessen the dread and pain which normally accompany the experience of death.

This seems to mean that one branch of the same expertise which blames our sense of alienation and non-involvement for our addiction to hallucinogens is now proposing to use the drug to create the last possible, and perhaps the most despairing, alienation of all.

This good doctor plans to divide some of his experimental dying patients into three groups, one of which will receive LSD, another an LSD-like drug, and one merely a placebo, and he will then ob serve them to determine whether they have an improved attitude toward death, less need of pain-killers and bet ter relations with their families and hospital staff.

Such intended observations notwith standing, we doubt, first, that any authentic report on the experiment can be made short of the other side of the jour We doubt, second, that this is, even i

is could be certified successful, something that we human beings really want. We believe there is diagnostical truth in those psychological studies which say it is our sense of alienation estrangement, non-involvement and lack of real friends and real foes which drive us to drown our nothingness in one kind

But our acceptance of the validity of this analysis is also precisely why we wonder if we really want to divest ourselves of our last real enemy, our one possibly real friend, the one hitherto inescapable involvement, the one experience that still can sting us. That might be real nothingness, which could be something worse than mere

As the year 1967 draws to an end, none of these conditions seemed likely to be met. Military victory for the Americans still looked distant, if possi ble at all. Nor does it appear likely that Washington will abandon the war, as Hanoi hopes. As for the oversimplified position adopted by so much of the rest of the world, there is no indication it is being or would be considered by

Yet the necessity for finding some acceptable means of bringing this long and terrible conflict to an end grows more imperative with every passing month. The loss of life, the social dis ruption, the widespread destruction goes on. The diplomatic consequences of the war grow more ominous. The danger of a broader conflict remains.

So much is clear. What is not clear is what steps the world can take to put an end to a struggle which today has gone far beyond what any of the participants ever expected. It is our conviction that the most

fruitful first step would be to involve the United Nations, as a recent Senate resolution recommended. Yes, we are aware of the obstacles. Hanot and Peking have stated that it is none of the United Nations' business. Washing ton has been singularly unresponsive t the numerous tentative efforts by the United Nations Secretary-General U Thant. Many members of the world body doubt whether United Nations intervention would be successful and fear lest such a failure weaken that organi

All of these objections have some

validity. But we believe that they are outweighed by the dire need to find some outside force, some outside wedge with which to pry open the hardened positions of the combatants and introluce a new peace-seeking element. The great advantage of the United Nations is—or should be—that no nation, no side need feel betrayed or lessened if the world body decides against it. As nearly as one can find it, the United Nations is the collective conscience of the world. It is honorable and constructive to submit to such a force We therefore hope that this represents tion of the world's highest international aspirations will make strong and persistent efforts to find a solution to the Vietnamese dilemma. And we plead with Washington for full cooperation.-
