Gypsy Moth Tree Pests

Spread joy, not gypsy moths, is the U.S. Department of Agriculture's annual Christmas message to residents of the northeastern United States.

Christmas follows soon after the hatching season for the gypsy moth — one of the world's worst pests of forest, shade, and fruit trees. Female moths attach their fuzzy, tan-colored egg clusters to Christmas trees and greenery, logs, rocks, etc. Each egg mass contains from 100 to 1,000 potential pests.

The area infested by this pest includes the entire states of Connecticut, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, most of New Hampshire and Vermont, and parts of Maine, New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania.

Cummings Critical of Board For Delaying Lincoln Funds

The Board of Directors' recent action tabling an appropriation for the preparation of plans for the proposed new Lincoln School in Center Springs Park has come under fire from Democratic Town Committee Chairman Ted Cummings.

The directors, following a Dec. 13 public hearing, tabled action on a \$20,000 appropriation. They had previously allocated to that amount a school board request of \$77,500 for preliminary plans.

Monday night, the school board resided in a meeting to discuss the budget deficit because it learned it had been claiming too much summer school state aid for the past three years.

Cummings as Democratic spokesman said, "There is no question between the request for funds to finance preliminary plans and the request by the school board for funds to finance an all-out effort."

Shift Seen In Greek Crisis

ATHENS (AP) — Greece's political crisis appeared today to be reaching a turning point after King Constantine said he would return if the junta is restored to power.

The 77-year-old monarch's condition appeared easy for the ruling junta to accept. He called for an "acceptable date" for the publication of a new constitution, an early date for a national referendum on it.

The junta, which wants Constantine back to help it hold recognition as the legitimate government, long has pressed a return to parliamentary rule. A draft constitution is to be presented to it Saturday.

The three ruling colonels who came to power in a coup last April 21 resigned Wednesday from the army, clearing the way for them to run as civilians in the elections they have promised.

In Praise Of The Shortest Days

It is not just that, by compressing us all inward, behind doors, between walls, and into that closer swirl of contact...

As one begins to analyze their pleasures and virtues it begins to seem strange indeed that we should spend half our year pretending to dread their arrival...

But this much is certain: either this stand is something of a sensational new turn for the President's policy, or it was terribly misleading as it was presented the other night.

Perhaps, for the moment, no one can be really sure what the case is.

It has to be pointed out, however, that whatever the President was doing, he intended good.

Now for the five points. The President said, first, that violation of the demilitarization zone set up by the 1954 Geneva Agreement must be halted.

He said, second, that the infiltration of Laos must stop.

He said, third, that the one man one vote principle of democracy must be accepted in South Vietnam, even by that section of the population now under Vietcong control.

The President said, fourth, that "the unity of Vietnam as a whole must be a matter for peaceful adjustments and negotiations."

The President said, fifth, that it would be useful for the government of South Vietnam to undertake informal discussions with the Vietcong, or the National Liberation Front, because, he said, such discussions might bring "good results."

In setting forth these conditions, the President several times referred to the fact that the points are set out in points which had once been agreed upon by the other side, at the Geneva Conference in 1954.

He did not discuss the fact that one of the most important points agreed to at Geneva was that one-man-one-vote elections would be scheduled within a year to decide the question of the unification of the two Vietnams, and that South Vietnam, on the advice of the United States, reneged on that point because it seemed obvious that any one-man, one-vote election would be won by the Communists and their sympathizers.

But, although he did not discuss that particular breach of the Geneva Agreement, President Johnson seemed to be offering to include something like that in the reconstruction of the Geneva conditions he was demanding as the main requisite for peace.

All this adds up, then, to something almost unbelievable, because, on paper, taken at its surface value, it seems to represent a right angle turn in American policy in Vietnam.

The preponderant probability is that our policy is not where our Christmas season tongue is, but where our action is. And our action, as in the bombing news from North Vietnam, as in the continued flow of new troops to the scene, as in the latest removal of restrictions on the approaches by our pilots to the population centers of North Vietnam and on the border of Communist China, is all predominantly the action of an escalation which is asserting a determination, not to seek easy negotiation, which the President's five points could produce in a few days, as he himself says, but to try to achieve a smashing military victory. If such attention to what we are actually doing, in place of what we seem to be saying, shows the Christmas look at Vietnam grim again, that grimness is compounded by mounting evidence that, despite our escalation, we do not seem to be drawing nearer even to a military victory.

CHICAGO - More than a year after Martin Luther King's unglorious departure from Chicago, the civil rights movement here is prostrate and in danger of a take-over by violence-prone black nationalists.

That is why white liberals who know the Negro slums and the South and West Sides fear that bottled-up racial hate could explode into Negro violence by next summer or much sooner.

The absence of civil rights marches of the kind led by Dr. King in 1966, while reassuring to unempathetic whites, has left a vacuum. There is now no peaceful escape valve for slum tensions.

Thus, what Chicago faces in the winter of 1967-68 is no different from the prospect for other great cities. With the decline of the bi-racial civil rights movement, a racist black nationalism is climbing to the brink of power.

What makes Chicago different is that this is the only Northern city visited by Martin Luther King, symbol of bi-racial, non-violent civil rights techniques, for a prolonged campaign. His utter failure has not only encouraged Negroes, here and elsewhere, to look to the extremists for leadership but has demonstrated Chicago's responsible civil rights leaders, leaving them disorganized.

Even the altruistic designs of white liberals are backing. Some of their organizations set up to foster bi-racial harmony are turning into engines for racial warfare.

For instance, there are clear signs that the West Side Organized Union, set up by the interdenominational Chicago Missionary Society, is now dominated by violence-prone extremists. One South Side chapter of the bi-racial Independent Young Men's League (IYML) is about to disaffiliate to keep its racial integrity.

What kept this from boiling over last summer, and thus saved Chicago from the agony of other great cities, was essentially two factors. First, the local Negro leadership was so divided in the wake of King's departure that not even an extremist could really attract a following. Second, the magnificent work by Chicago's police force in cordoning off neighborhoods any time trouble threatened prevented incidents from mushrooming.

But neither of these factors may be controlling next year. There is dread of the emergence of demagogic leadership to exploit racial passions. Nor is there assurance that the police tactics of 1967 can work two years in a row.

Although he has come far toward understanding the Negro Revolution, Mayor Daley is no John V. Lindsay who could go into the slums to dicker with extremists. Nor is there any likelihood that King would come back here to the scene of his defeat to calm matters. If the convention city of the Democratic party is to avoid violence next summer, it will need some good old-fashioned luck.

State Firemen's Top Salary Up 15% in Past Two Years

HARTFORD (AP)—The median salary of full-time firemen in Connecticut went up from \$6,077 to \$7,020 in the past two years, an increase of over 15 per cent, the Connecticut Public Employees Council reported today.

The median starting salary in the town and cities with regular fire departments showed an increase from \$4,221 in July 1965 to \$5,700 in July 1967, the CPCEC said.

When the taxpayers' research group made its 1966 study of firemen's compensation, there were 44 departments with full-time firemen. This year there were 49.

As of July 1, New Haven had the highest starting salary, \$6,700, and Greenwich had the top minimum salary, \$4,800.

Of the five cities with populations over 100,000, New Haven was the only one which did not pay the same salaries to firemen and police patrolmen, according to the CPCEC report.

In New Haven, firemen's pay was higher than patrolmen's. More and more firemen are picketing don't do—but it is said to be much faster.

Sprengel, in Annual Report, Cites Town Growth for Year

Town Manager Terry V. Sprengel has submitted to the town council his sixth annual report covering the 1966-67 fiscal year. The report provides a summary of the operations of the various departments of the town and financial details of the municipal operations.

The town ended the 1966-67 year with a surplus of \$46,037.30 of which \$140,000 was used to defray the 1967-68 tax levy.

The fiscal year saw many major projects approved and construction under way. These include the Timothy Edwards Middle School, the sewer-system treatment plant, and the \$700,000 town hall project which has already had its ground-breaking.

One of the areas of future development has been in industrial development with the Parkade proposal, which has aroused national interest.

New legislation, according to Sprengel, as passed by the recent session of the General Assembly, will have a direct effect on South Windsor. The "Eminent Domain" bill, which changes the complexity and attitude of legislation and its enforcement on all local government units; the town manager has said.

Budget High Point Former Mayor James Throve pointed out in his statement in the town report that the growth of the town is reflected in the budget, which reached a new high of \$7,888,000 over \$5,000,000 of which was for education.

Revenues and surplus appropriations reduced the total to be raised by taxes to about three-and-a-half million dollars which resulted in a 3.5 percent mill increase bringing the tax rate up to 46 mills.

During the past year the South Windsor police department has continued to augment their police services. For the second consecutive year there has been a decline in serious leading the list of violations are traffic offenses at 539 of which 221 were arrests and 318 warnings.

Under serious offenses, which include robbery, burglary, larceny, auto theft, rape, and aggravated assault, there were 126 arrests, of which 36 were cleared. The decline of two over the previous year.

There was more than a \$88,700 loss to buildings, an increase of 48 per cent over the previous fiscal year, and \$44,825 loss to contents, an 88 per cent increase.

Weather in The Nation

Autumn erupted into a violent finale across the midcontinent today, thrashing the Northern Plains with heavy snows and howling winds and pouncing the mid-Mississippi Valley with tornadoes and torrential rains.

San Francisco and the west coast were hit with a heavy snowfall, and heavy snow warnings were in effect for portions of North and South Dakota and Northern Nebraska while residents of Northern Minnesota were alerted for heavy snow.

A tornado churned out of the early morning darkness in Southern Missouri, striking the community of Potosi. Three persons were believed killed and several others were injured.

The Missouri Highway Patrol said the City Hall, a power and light plant, a shopping center and several homes were damaged or destroyed in the two 75 miles south-southwest of St. Louis.

A short time later a twister tore down 130 miles northeast of Potosi, at Jerseyville, Ill., inflicting an estimated \$100,000 damage in a farm area.

Severe thunderstorms rumbled throughout the night in Illinois and Indiana, dumping heavy rains on a wide area.

Flash-flood warnings were issued for portions of Central Illinois, and the downpours flooded numerous streets, viaduct underpasses in the Chicago area, where rainfall amounts ranged from 2 to 4 inches.

While storminess abated somewhat over snow-smothered sections of the Midwest, a cold front moved westward from the Gulf of Mexico, bringing a change in weather to the South.

Light rains, sleet and snow were reported in the South, with some areas receiving up to 10 inches of snow, and more was indicated through Friday.

Heavy driving warnings remained in effect for Utah, Wyoming and New Mexico, as well as Northern Minnesota at the opposite end of the massive storm system.

Flights, Ariz., hardest hit of the Southwest cities, measured 75 inches of snow, settled or melted by 5 inches from Wednesday's 8-inch depth. Monticello, in southeastern Utah, wallowing in 54 inches of snow, nearly half of it having fallen in 24 hours.

General midwest warning the Southeast reached northeast as far as Illinois and Missouri, with Chicago reading a record 61 degrees for the date before dawn and St. Louis reporting 67.

Coventry School Budget Work Starts; Bus Costs Go Up by \$30,000

Work has begun on the preparation of the 1968 Board of Education budget, with preliminary approval Tuesday night of \$177,000 for transportation.

Details of the 1968 school year represents an increase of nearly \$30,000 over the present budgeted amount of \$178,500.

Floyd Monroe, bus contractor for the Coventry schools, was present at the meeting to explain the estimated costs to the board.

Monroe explained that an additional \$11,500 will cover the cost of two more buses next year since the 12 buses now in operation "are just making it" in terms of capacity loads.

Another big cost next year will be buying of kindergarten students and extra trips required to bus students to the new middle school, scheduled to open next fall.

All these factors, plus normal growth of student enrollment, will increase the cost of busing students. Monroe's figures indicate a total transportation budget of \$112,191, but the board majority vote agreed to applications for just over \$8,000 to the \$107,000 figure.

The figures were made prominent when Richard Messier, superintendent, said that the board has not formally acted on either kindergarten or the scheduling of the middle school. Administration will then be free to work out transportation details of the 1968 school year.

Monroe said because of one central location, more trips will be needed, hence the increased cost. Students in Grades 4 and 5 will be bused to the new grammar schools will all be taken to the middle school next year.
