LBJ Stops in Khorat During Mystery Trip

KHORAT, Thailand AP — The President meant by this, unannounced retelling stop President Johnson flew here as early Friday night on the latest leg of a continuing mystery trip.

Johnson flew to this American city on the same plane that air force base, which plays a role in the war ever Vietnam. The White House staff had sought to keep the trip here secret.

There was much speculation that he might visit Vietnam itself, although his staff refused to say where he would go next.

Johnson said each of his listeners "should know what he is talking about." He said "your cause is a just one."

Johnson flew to Khorat from Darwin on Australia's northern coast, where he had stopped for refueling after the flight from Melbourne where he had attended the Holt services.

The White House tried to keep the Darwin stop secret, too, but apparently the plane was not secret there. A small crowd gathered on hand and the makings of a motorcade were in place.

Mr. Holt, whose slogan was "He cuts the earth to suit your taste," since 1963 was the developer of many tracts in the Manchester area and some in Hartford and East Hartford. He has sold thousands of acres, built many homes, and has added several hundred acres to the city of Manchester.

Despite Missile Threat U.S. Bombers Return To Hit North Targets

SAIGON (AP) — U.S. B-52 bombers returned today to North Vietnamese targets in the demilitarized zone along the coast of Quang Tri Province.

The new Marine assault, also aimed at taking Communist pressure off the northern frontier area, was centered about five miles below the demilitarized zone along the coast of Quang Tri Province.

A battalion of Marines, about 1,000 men, landed Thursday morning from helicopters and from ships off the U.S. 7th Fleet.

U.S. headquarters said the only significant action so far occurred shortly before dark Thursday when one Marine company exchanged small arms and machinegun fire with an enemy force of unknown size entrenched in a complex of bunkers.

There was no report of any more B-52s returned Friday.

From Greece Publisher Says She Escaped

Chief Judge J. Edward Lumbard, sitting with Judges Henry F. Friendly and Wilfred F. Bell, asked Pollack if the \$1.7 million would be restored by a merged New York Central and Pennsylvania Railroad. "The New Haven is supposed to be absorbed in the merger," Pollack said.

17 Men Rescued in Cave-In

GORMAN, Calif. (AP) — Seventeen men, trapped for 16 hours behind a cave-in inside a snow-capped mountain, crawled through a narrow passageway to safety today.

Necessary qualifications for eligibility are: 1. 65 years of age or before Oct. 1, 1967, either husband or wife. 2. Own and reside in the property in Coventry and have owned and resided in property in the State of Connecticut for a total of five years preceding the application for said exemption. 3. If married, the total income of husband and wife from all sources can not exceed \$3,000; if single, income cannot exceed \$2,000.

"Many voices have requested us to exert one of the participants to suspend bombing," the Pope said.

"We have done it before and we do it again," he added.

The appeal was contained in a 28-page address delivered to the College of Cardinals. They had assembled at the Vatican to extend Christmas greetings to the Pope.

Continuing his reference to Vietnam, the Pope said:

"May violence cease in all its forms."

"We are certain that the final goal to pursue is not an oppressive victory, but security, peace and liberty for all."

"Frank and loyal negotiations are the only constructive road for the peace."

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Jimmie Rodgers says he remembers being "pulled off the road by an auto or something with very bright lights" just before he sustained a skull fracture Dec. 1 near a Los Angeles freeway.

Rodgers, 33, said Thursday that he does not remember, however, what happened after stopping his car and does not remember getting out of the car or talking with police.

The singer, round unobscured in his parked car near the freeway, was on the critical list for more than a week and underwent brain surgery twice.

Police, in an investigation, said that Rodgers had been stopped in his car by an off-duty policeman who was joined by two officers. Police said Rodgers apparently felt that other details were looking in the police explanation.

Rodgers told a small news conference in his hospital room, "I was in the car and I was hurt. I want to know why they let me there."

Rodgers was allowed to talk to police and the press for the first time since his injury.
