London's Catholic Enquiry After Ones with No Religion

LONDON (AP) — London's Roman Catholic Enquiry Center, after 14 years of angling for Protestants, has changed its tactics to aim for the millions in swinging Britain who profess no religion at all.

Catholic Enquiry Center advertisements, shining amidst sex and violence from pages in the popular newspapers, used to show a priest holding aloft a chalice. Readers were asked if they knew what happened at a Catholic Mass.

Now instead the advertisement is topped with a single word in heavy type. The word is "Live."

"The story of Christ is a love story," the hippies and flower children are told. "And Christianity is the religion of love. We all want to love and to be loved. We have had the leaflets made more scriptural and emotional. In fact we are in a state of continual experimentation."

The real problem, said Father O'Brien, was to make Catholicism intelligible to people who had little or no acquaintance with the Christian faith at all. The message invites those who want to bring happiness and purpose into their lives to write for booklets which tell clearly and frankly about the Catholic faith.

As in the old advertisements, discretion is assumed. The free booklets will be sent at regular intervals "in a plain sealed cover" and "no one will call on you."

Another of the new advertisements takes this form: "Born in poverty. Lived only 33 years. Spent most of his life in obscurity. Never wrote a book. Never had any position in public life. Was crucified with two thieves, and yet 2,000 years later, more than 800 million people follow Him."

The Catholic Enquiry Center has been operating from an anonymous-looking building in the fashionable suburb of Hampstead since 1954. It sends out its plain-wrapped booklets to about 25,000 people each year about 1,000 of whom later write to say they have been received into the Church.

A sample survey has shown that 46 per cent of those answering the center's advertisements are between the ages of 18 and 25. This was a major factor in causing the center to update its approach.

The original set of 21 booklets, one sent by mail each week, was revised and condensed to 11.

"There seems to be a suspicion of all organized religion among the young," said the Rev. James O'Brien, the young priest who took over direction of the center in November. "These

Pastor Got Threat Note Before Fire

TERRYVILLE (AP) — A fire official says the fire which destroyed Terryville's historic Congregational Church came soon after the church pastor received a printed, unsigned threat.

A source reported the letter threatened the "judgment of God" on the church if the pastor, the Rev. Loring Roberts, did not leave the church.

The fire which destroyed the 18-year-old church Thursday was the second at the church in seven days. A fire last Friday caused an estimated \$50,000-\$100,000 worth of damage to the church.

While authorities called the first fire "mysterious," Terryville fire marshal John Gibb called the second "definitely a case of arson."

Gibb said he and other investigators were checking a printed letter received a day before the fire by the Rev. Mr. Gibb said the letter contained a threat but he would not elaborate.

The second fire reportedly began less than two hours after investigators checked the first fire had left.

The Rev. Mr. Roberts is chairman of the Department of Justice and of the United Church of Christ.

Sheinwold on Bridge

One way to protect yourself against a bad trump break is to avoid ruffing the side suits. This lets you preserve your trump length. Another way is to ruff as often as possible.

Opening lead — four of spades. Declarer won the top spades, took the ace of hearts and ruffed a heart. He ruffed a spade with dummy's ten of clubs and returned another low heart from dummy.

East could afford to discard a diamond, and South ruffed for the second time. South led a trump to dummy's king and led still another low heart from dummy.

At this stage South still had A-Q-T of trumps. If he ruffed with the seven he could cash the top trumps and his ace of diamonds to take the first 11 tricks.

South could have lost his contract by overruffing, but he was above this kind of foolishness. He had already discarded one diamond on the ace of hearts.

East returned a diamond to the ace, and South cleared trumps with the ace and queen. The opponents got one diamond at the end, but the contract was safe. South had assured his contract by discarding a loser instead of overruffing.

Daily Question
Partner opens with one heart, and the next player passes. You hold: Spades, Q-10-6-4-3; Hearts, Q-9-5-4-3; Diamonds, K-7; Clubs, 5.

What do you say?
Answer: Bid four hearts, showing strong trump support, not more than 8 points in high cards, and a singleton or void in a side suit. It is more informative to describe the hand in this way than to show the spades.

Perfect Timing

NEW YORK (AP)—Exactly 200 years to the hour after Dr. Samuel Clossy delivered a lecture which opened Columbia University's medical school, the original manuscript of his discourse on anatomy was presented to the school as a gift.

The slender, fragile manuscript, enclosed in a blue presentation case, was given to Columbia by Dr. Morris Safir, a New York dermatologist, medical historian and authority on the life of Clossy, one of six physicians who composed the school's first medical faculty.

The presentation ceremony was part of Columbia's year-long celebration of the bicentennial of King's College Medical School, now known as the Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. The Clossy manuscript had been in Dr. Safir's possession since 1955, when he purchased it at a book auction.

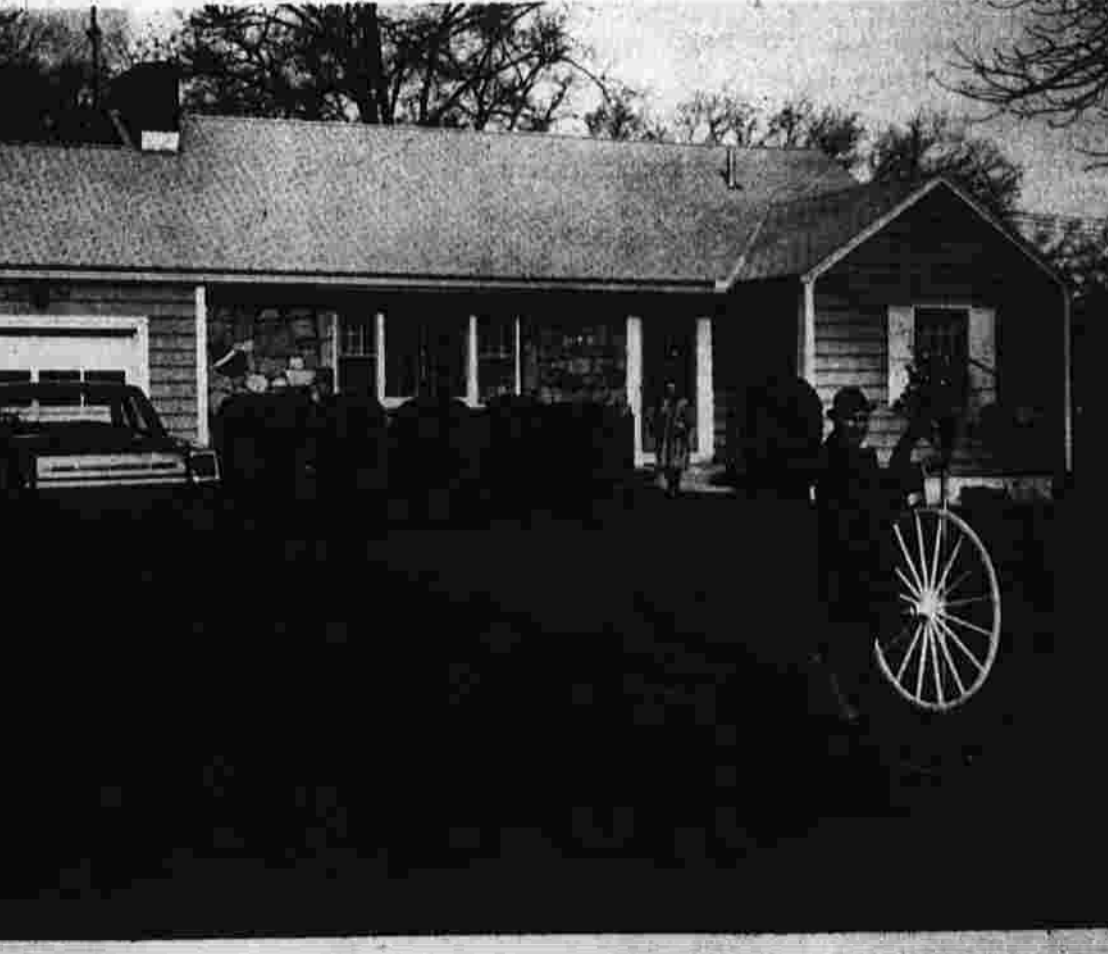

High School Senior, 16 Wins Prizes in Medicine

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. (AP) — As a senior at Parker High School, 16-year-old Eric Watson isn't saying what research he's doing now.

But his teachers won't be surprised, whatever it is.

As a ninth grader, he grafted skin of an hour-old chick to another. The chick with the new skin lived to be frying fish.

As a 10th grader, he took the kidney of one dog and transplanted it into another. The dog suffered no ill effects—and even bore a litter of eight puppies a few months later.

As an 11th grader, Watson took several embryo rats from the bodies of their mothers and kept them alive for hours in a mechanical womb which he designed and built.

He says his interest in such things began when he joined a science club his first year at Parker.

His skin graft project took first prize in a local science fair. The fair was for Negroes only, and winners could not enter regional contests.

This discouraged Watson, but one of the judges was a professor at the University of Alabama Medical Center. He invited the student to use his lab at the center and Watson jumped the chance.

In his first kidney transplant, the dog died. Then came the successful experiment.

In May, 1966, Watson read about the problems of unborn babies whose parents had different RH factors. He began specu-

First Lady WASHINGTON (AP) — The nation's First Lady celebrated her 80th birthday Friday at the White House staff members. Her husband, President Johnson, was absent.

The President had flown to Australia for memorial services for Prime Minister Harold E. Holt, and then traveled on to Thailand and Vietnam to visit U.S. troops.

Mrs. Johnson attended memorial services for Holt in Washington Cathedral Friday morning, before her birthday party began in the holiday-decorated East Room of the White House. Professional entertainment was provided, and Mrs. Johnson also led her guests in singing Christmas carols.

After the party, she spent the evening with her family—daughters Lynda and Lucy, grandsons Lynn and sons-in-law Charles Robb and Patrick Nugent.

Dick Gregory COMEDY — Comedian Dick Gregory, who says he's now 49 pounds lighter than when he began his Vietnam war protest by fasting since Thanksgiving Day, hopes to continue going without food until Jan. 1.

Gregory said Friday he had managed to extend the fast "in response to demands that our nations I have received from all over the world."

Drinking nothing but distilled water since Thanksgiving when he weighed in at 185 pounds, he's now down to 109, Gregory said.

Gregory, a Negro, added "I will not eat a bite of food, I will wear conventional clothes until the war in Vietnam is over."

He's appearing at a Greenwich Village nightclub, heavily bearded and shaggy-haired.

Revived Soldier COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Jacky Bayne, the young soldier pronounced dead in Vietnam but revived by an embalmer, hopes to spend Christmas day with his parents away from Columbia's Veterans Hospital.

His doctors will permit the one-day leave "if his slight temperature comes down." Bayne has an infection and mild case of the flu.

Last July 16, the 22-year-old soldier from Fort Mill, N.C., was pronounced dead on a Vietnam battlefield. His pulse was noticed sometime later—how much later has not been determined.

Hospital officials say Bayne is making steady progress, talks well for short periods but still has not been told everything about that July day. Bayne also hasn't yet been formally awarded a Bronze Star for earned for "meritorious service" in Vietnam.

Vernon Grant Gets Authority To Buy Land

Major John Grant has been given the authority to purchase industrial land for the town for \$175,000 and to hold \$14,000 of this in escrow.

The action will be permitted according to a resolution passed at a special meeting of the Board of Representatives last night.

A referendum last month approved the appropriation of \$175,000 for the purchase of the land for an industrial park. The site is located off the Water Cross Highway on Bolton Rd. and consists of about 47 acres.

In making the title search of the land town council Abbott Schiavello uncovered a technical defect involving about four acres in the tract. The land is owned by Werner Kunzli Sr. and Bruno Friman.

The owners have agreed to clear the defect and pay all of the costs related to this action. They have also agreed to allow the town to hold in escrow the \$14,000 from the purchase price until the title is cleared.

The bond for deed for the land requires that the deal be closed by the end of the year. Robert Deming, town treasurer, said it takes a couple of days to go through the routine of getting the money. He will give the bank permission Tuesday to go ahead and get the notes ready and the matter should be completed by Friday.

Mayor Grant said he has a "hot" prospect for about six acres of the land and he is anxious to have the matter cleared up.

Storm Assures Town Of White Christmas

Manchester residents woke up this morning to the sight of a guaranteed white Christmas, thanks to an unpredicted and unpredictable storm which dumped 4 to 5 inches of snow on the town. The storm tapered off at 8 a.m. and after a few flurries, ended before 9.

The forecast was for no more snow after this morning and at least through tomorrow, with temperatures in the 30's and a sunny sky permitted for this afternoon and for tomorrow.

The snow started in Manchester at 2:15 this morning, after a day of rain yesterday.

The Town Highway Department was alerted at 2:30 and at 3:30, crews went out on six chemical routes.

At 4:30, all contracted equipment and men were called in and plowing operations started on 26 townwide routes.

Herman Passerelli, the department's work coordinator, in charge of operations, said, "We will stay with it until the whole town is plowed."

The greatest difficulty for his crews, he said, is plowing the business streets, crowded because of last minute Christmas shopping.

Police Chief James Reardon has alerted homeowners to the provisions of Manchester's snow and ice removal ordinance.

Snow must be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours of the end of the storm. Ice must be removed from sidewalks, or covered with sand or some other suitable substance, within 24 hours of the formation of the condition.

Violators are subject to a fine of \$2 for each offense, plus \$2 for each hour of refusal or neglect to comply with an order.

The penalty may not exceed \$20 for each period of neglect.

Chief Reardon asked motorists to exercise extra caution in driving today, because of hazardous and slippery conditions, and not to drive unless necessary.

Danish Cult Awaiting Atomic End to Earth

COPENHAGEN (AP) — Hundreds of Danes who are members of a cult led by a 46-year-old cab driver believe that an atomic war will kill two-thirds of the earth's population by midnight Sunday.

Earth won't be destroyed but millions of dying sufferers will be left to suffer through the land and transport the earthlings who are left to suffer space where their spiritual level will be raised, they believe.

The cab driver predicting all this is Knud Welting, pronounced Veling. He says his information comes from Orthon, who he describes as leader of the galaxy that contains earth.

Welting tells this story of his "vision." Orthon came to him last March. At first the cab driver only heard his voice but later he showed up in person. He has long hair and dreamy eyes. When he talks through Welting, he uses phrases from the Bible and lectures on cosmic laws.

"Many people think this message is fatal, but it is really a message of joy. One third of the population on Earth will be rescued from the atomic war," says Welting.

Welting says he is not the first to see and talk to Orthon. A British real estate agent from Blackpool saw him for the first time in 1961 and was told the same things, he says.

"An Italian customs officer from Catania, had had an experience similar to mine, and from all over the world I hear of people who have met Orthon," Welting says.

"Many of the followers of the 'space-god' have given up their jobs and left their families to be ready to leave for another planet when the time comes," he says.

Welting has a center in Borup, a small Danish village and from there he leads a Scandinavian project under the international Orthon organization, called Universal Link. Several hundred Danes have subscribed to this project, Welting says.

Entering Mutual Funds Life Insurance Seen Undergoing Inflation

By JOHN CUNNEIFF, AP Business Analyst NEW YORK (AP) — The entrance of insurance companies into the mutual fund sales industry is partial admission that one of the keystone of life insurance—a guaranteed, fixed return—may be surrendering to inflation. The decisions by which John Hancock and New England Mutual have moved into mutual funds were really made by their customers, potential and actual. The companies have had to accept the dictate of the buyer. In the past two decades Americans have shown a growing interest in equity investments, in shares of stock that grow or shrink rather than remain fixed in the manner of life insurance payouts.

These people have been liberally rewarded for stock prices have doubled on average in the past 10 years of economic expansion and millions of people have made their fortunes, large and small. The word has spread. Since 1952 the shareowner population of America has grown from about 6.5 million to 23 million, expanding at the rate of nine per cent a year or nine times the gain in adult population during that time. In the same period the insurance companies have seen their relative share of the dollar decline steadily, although the industry has continued to grow and remain profitable. It simply hasn't grown as fast as the fund industry.

Mutual funds, which invest in scores of stocks for their customers, have come out of nowhere, possessing in 1945 assets of less than \$500 million but swelling close to \$40 billion in securities 22 years later.

As the insurance companies explain their moves, they are hardly abandoning the concept of a guaranteed return, as from a life insurance policy. Neither are they totally embracing the equity concept. Instead, they are recognizing that mutual funds in various combinations with life insurance may be more suited to a buyer's needs and aspirations than a fixed return. This, of course, is especially true during inflation, which some analysts fear may be with us for many years. If this turns out to be true, the fixed return would really be a shrinking return.

The insurance companies hope to offset this limitation both for themselves and their customers by establishing their own funds or by purchasing existing ones, and then offering shares for sale. John Hancock hopes to begin its own fund early next year. New England Mutual took the other route, purchasing a majority interest in the already successful fund management company of Loomis, Sayles & Co.

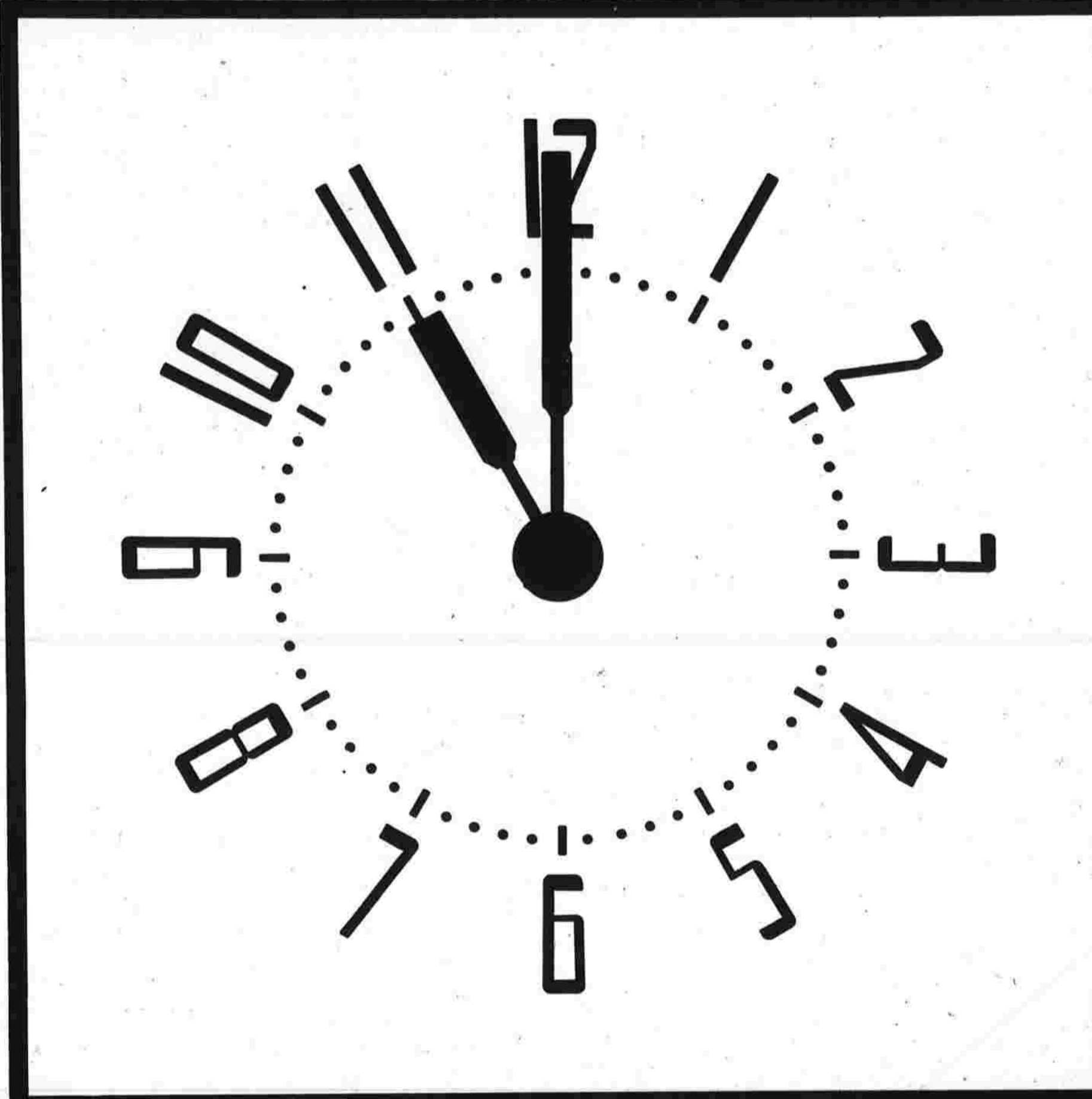

New Singapore Store Sells Red Bargains

By KELLY SMITH
 SINGAPORE (AP) — One of the more popular new stores in Singapore has customers with red eyes—most of them picking up bargain on the day. The store sells Red Chinese merchandise.

"It is not supposed to be here," says the wife of a U.S. Embassy officer. "But these bargains can't resist!"

"I'd rather you not use my name," says another. "What if the customs people checked?"

"These two shoppers and 1,000 others a day drift through rows of handmade items, brightly colored children's toys, thick luxurious black silk, sewing machines, materials, shoes—15, 20, 30 items, all Communist-made, from \$2 up."

The store, which is called the Chinese Emporium, Strategic, is located near Singapore's embassy in the new International Building. It's been crowded since opening day.

Singapore is a free port, meaning it deals in goods from any country without the usual customs duties. But Americans are forbidden by law to bring Communist merchandise into the United States.

Prices at the Emporium are generally lower than in other city department stores. There are half a dozen other stores selling Communist goods in the area, but the Emporium is the largest and newest of its type.

The store's manager, a petite attractive young woman named Mini Ho Han Mei, says monthly sales go upwards of \$100,000.

"I buy things here myself," says Mini. "I think I know what women shoppers like, and women buy more than men."

Mini has instituted other lures designed to speed sales: she keeps the store open on Sundays—"we do a big business that day"—and closes on Friday. She has children's corners and games for small fry, and has trained her sales help to be fast and unusually knowledgeable in their particular merchandise.

The boy at the linen counter, for instance, can give a customer a rundown on exactly how various sheets, pillow cases, tablecloths and towels were stitched, and where.

Mini and her business associates claim no liaison with Communist China, politically. "Only in business," she says, "and we have no difficulty. We are merchants. They send us nice things, and we sell them."

Ease Restriction

WASHINGTON (AP) — The government says it will ease some of its tight restrictions on private access to secret nuclear information.

The Atomic Energy Commission said a proposed ban would have prevented private and corporate developers of nuclear technology from wrapping their information or from having access to one another's plants and equipment.

Other previously announced bans are still proposed for enforcement.

They would restrict government-developed secret data in the nonweapons field and similar data might have been developed by individuals or firms through an inspection of government information before the general ban was put into effect.

At the time it announced its proposed restrictions last May, the AEC said it was acting to stop any further international spread of nuclear weapons.

It said its easing of the regulation regarding privately developed data was the result of "confidence" from industries and universities.

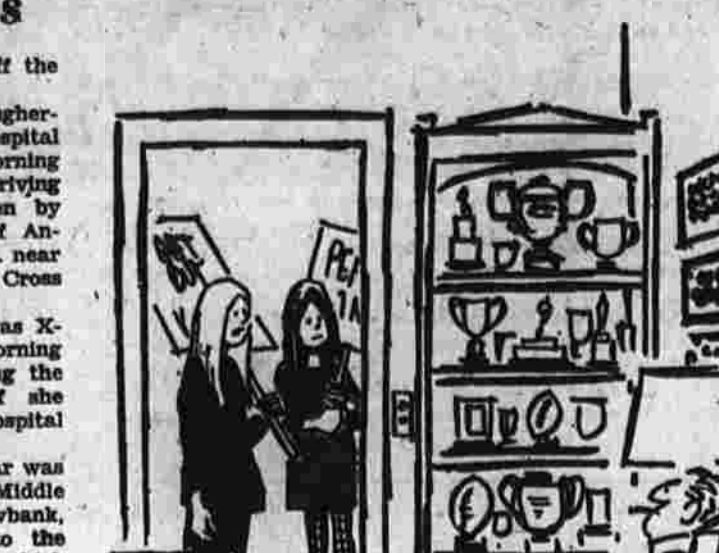

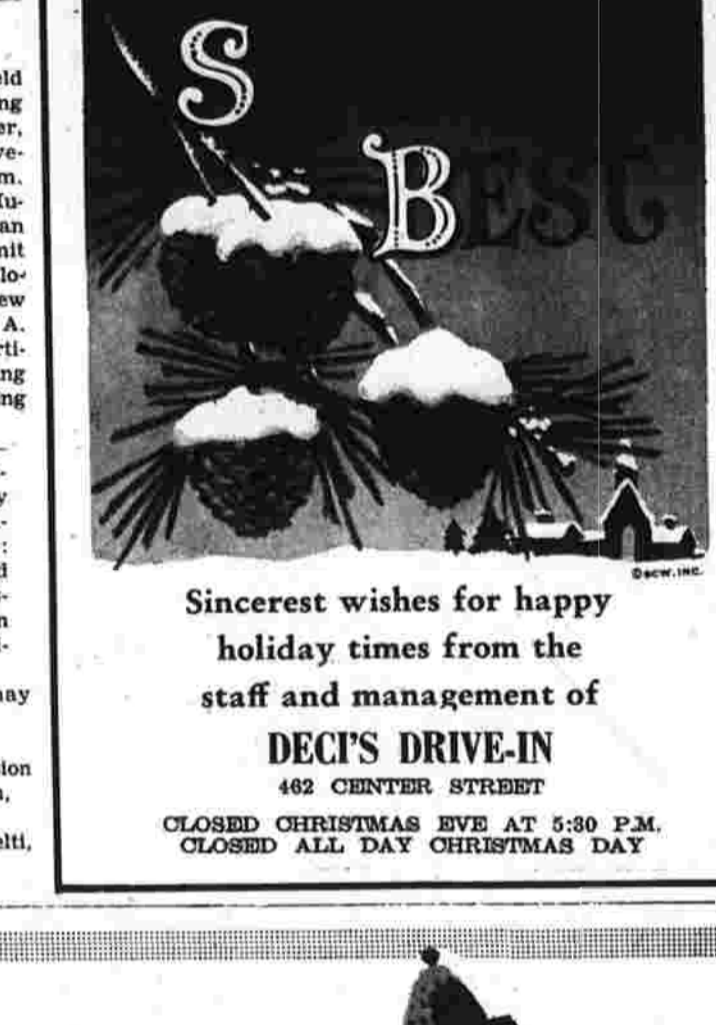

KKK Leader Auto Arrest Uncovers Submachine Gun

COLLINS, Miss. (AP)—Samuel H. Bowers Jr., one of seven men convicted of conspiracy in the 1964 slaying of three civil rights workers, was freed today after being charged with illegal possession of a submachine gun.

Bowers, 41, posted \$1,000 bond Friday. He and a companion were arrested Thursday night by Collins night marshal Buster Lott who stopped their auto for reckless driving.

Sheriff Billy Canfield said the loaded submachine gun, a World War II vintage 40-caliber weapon, was found on the seat of the car along with two automatic pistols. The gun was impounded by federal authorities.

The sheriff said the driver was Thomas Tarrant, 21, of Mobile, Ala. He was charged with possession of a concealed weapon. Authorities said Tarrant had reportedly lived in Laurel, Miss., and the two are to appear in Justice of the Peace court Thursday on the charges.

Bowers, 41, was convicted in U.S. district court Monday in the slaying of the three civil rights workers. He was charged with the slaying of James Rayburn, 24, and Andrew Goodman, 20, of New York, and James Chaney, 22-year-old African Negro.

The government claimed the militant White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan and marked Schwermur for execution and the other two civil rights workers were slain because they were with him on July 21, 1964. The FBI has identified Bowers as imperial wizard of the White Knights. He was freed on \$5,000 bond in the federal case.

Money Grows On Vines

NEW YORK (AP) —Sy Weintraub is a dapper fellow and long time producer who would never, under any circumstances, swing from a vine in a jungle or be caught in public wearing nothing but a loin cloth.

Yet the fortunes of "Tarzan" as a latter-day film hero and, more recently, a television star, are Weintraub's fortune. It is not a small fortune either, since the producer of NBC's Friday night jungle series acquired the film and television rights to Edgar Rice Burrough's brainchild nine years ago.

Since then he has knocked out seven "Tarzan" films with Jock Mahoney mouthing the ape cry, and his TV "Tarzan" with Ron Ely in the title role is now in its second season. Weintraub was in the east for conferences with the network about next season.

"We think—and NBC thinks—the series is good for 10 years," he said.

Burrough's hero of more than 30 books was an English lord gone native in Africa. And there was a girl, Jane, in the middle of things.

"We play Tarzan as a legendary figure superimposed over reality," explained Weintraub. "We dropped the English lord business because of Ron Ely's American accent. And Jane was a problem for the writers, so we discarded her, too."

A number of adult viewers tend to regard "Tarzan" as a children's show, and sort of subtle camp. Weintraub has been making an enormous effort, largely through casting guest roles, to attract more mature audiences. Some very interesting talent, as a result, has been traveling to Acapulco, where the show is made, to work in the series.

Ethel Merman did a two-part episode. Julie Harris enjoyed the show so much last season, she will return this year. Helen

Hayes was a guest star, and in a recent episode, there were the Supremes, a popular singing group, appearing as nuns lost in the jungle.

"We never say where the jungle is located," Weintraub said. "Once, in an early show, the

word Africa slipped in by mistake. We skip the location deliberately so that we won't be limited in showing animals and even plants."

The series is shot on 22 acres of a reclaimed garbage dump near the Mexican resort town,

and it has become one of the community's biggest businesses. And one reason "Tarzan" avoided the word "Africa" is that it sometimes uses as many as 400 Mexicans as extras—and they would be hard to explain in an African jungle.

Fame Comes to Old Pointy-Ears

HOLLYWOOD — (NEA) — You never know about fame. Like the measles, it seems to strike unexpectedly, often in the strangest places. Currently, fame has come to Leonard Nimoy, old pointy-ears of "Star Trek."

Even Nimoy finds what's happened to him hard to believe, but isn't planning to send it back. He gets more fan mail than almost anybody else at NBC; he's the darling of the fan magazine set; he is constantly the target of adoring teen-boppers who write him, phone him, accost him.

It's hard to understand. He is handsome enough, in a sensitive way, but hardly the usual raw material of idolhood. Basically, he's an actor and a good one. He is a settled family man, some years removed from teen-agedness, and not the flashy, moistipped sort the young girls usually select.

It was only a few years ago that Nimoy, to make ends meet, was getting up at 3 a.m. to deliver newspapers. The \$100 a month he made supplemented the meager living he was eking out as an actor, and,

with a wife and two children to support, he needed it.

Those days are gone now, on the cheerful wings of his success as Mr. Spock, the coolly efficient first officer aboard the Enterprise, "Star Trek's interplanetary space ship. He is cashing in on that triumph—records, personal appearances—and the day after the series goes off, whenever that is, he will have his choice of movies or television series. As they say in the trade, he's hot.

He is adjusting to success with a minimum of traumas. The Nimoy's live in the same house they lived in before the lightning struck. The children go to the same schools. Leonard drives a used Buick to the studio. Sandy, his wife, buys more clothes than she did before, but that's about the extent of their frivolities.

The family likes boating. But they haven't gone out and bought a boat. As they did before, they go down to the ocean when the urge sweeps over them, and they rent a sailboat—\$6 for the afternoon.

"If I had the time now that I had then," Nimoy says, "maybe I'd buy a boat. But I

don't. In the old days, I had the time, but not the money."

The old days — three or four years ago — was when things were rough. It has been an uphill-all-the-way struggle for Nimoy.

He's from Boston. His father, a Russian immigrant, is still a barber in Boston. He is naturally proud of his son's success, but regrets that he can no longer cut Leonard's hair.

"My father is an old-fashioned barber," he says. "When he cuts your hair, you know you've had a haircut. When I go home on a visit now, with this haircut I've got for the show, I can't let him touch my hair. He's very disappointed."

Leonard cut out for Los Angeles at 19, determined to act. He studied, he worked, he managed to get a few parts. But it was slow, tediously slow. He did his two years in the Army. During that time he got married and Sandy and he had their first child.

After his discharge, it was back to the old treadmill. He might have made \$2,000 a year acting. Often he wanted to quit but Sandy talked him into sticking with it. He stuck. He worked at many jobs on the side,

to pay the rent and the grocery bills.

Gradually, things got better. By the time Star Trek came along, he was known as a competent character actor around town. At the time of the Star Trek offer, he also could have taken a running part on Peyton Place — the Steven Cord role which James Douglas plays.
