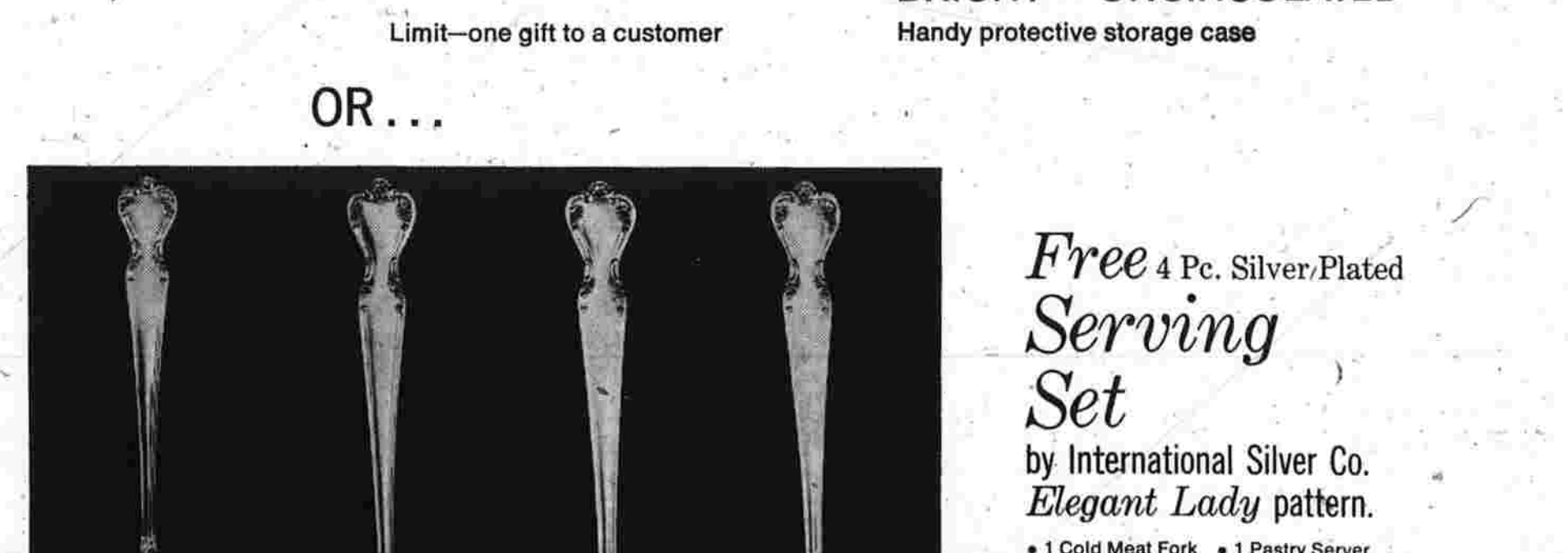

Can Two Words Make Peace? Two words—one noticeable for its absence—the other drawing attention to it by its presence—constitute the key to renewed interest in Washington and elsewhere, in the possibility that Hanoi is once again moving its position with regard to negotiations over the war in Vietnam.

Our own statement, "once again moving" is predicated on the supposition that, a year ago, Hanoi also was moving toward negotiation, in the sequence of events which ended in President Johnson's sudden resumption of bombing of North Vietnam while Hanoi was still presumably in process of replying to a letter it had just received from him.

It is conceded that heat works too, and that, for most people, the application of heat is going to feel better, for the moment, than the application of ice.

The ice treatment has been given a new name, Cryokinetics, which combines the Greek words for cold and for movement.

Later in the same statement, the North Vietnamese foreign minister changed a word. Usually, Hanoi has said that after the United States has stopped "permanently and unconditionally all bombing of North Vietnam" negotiations "could" result.

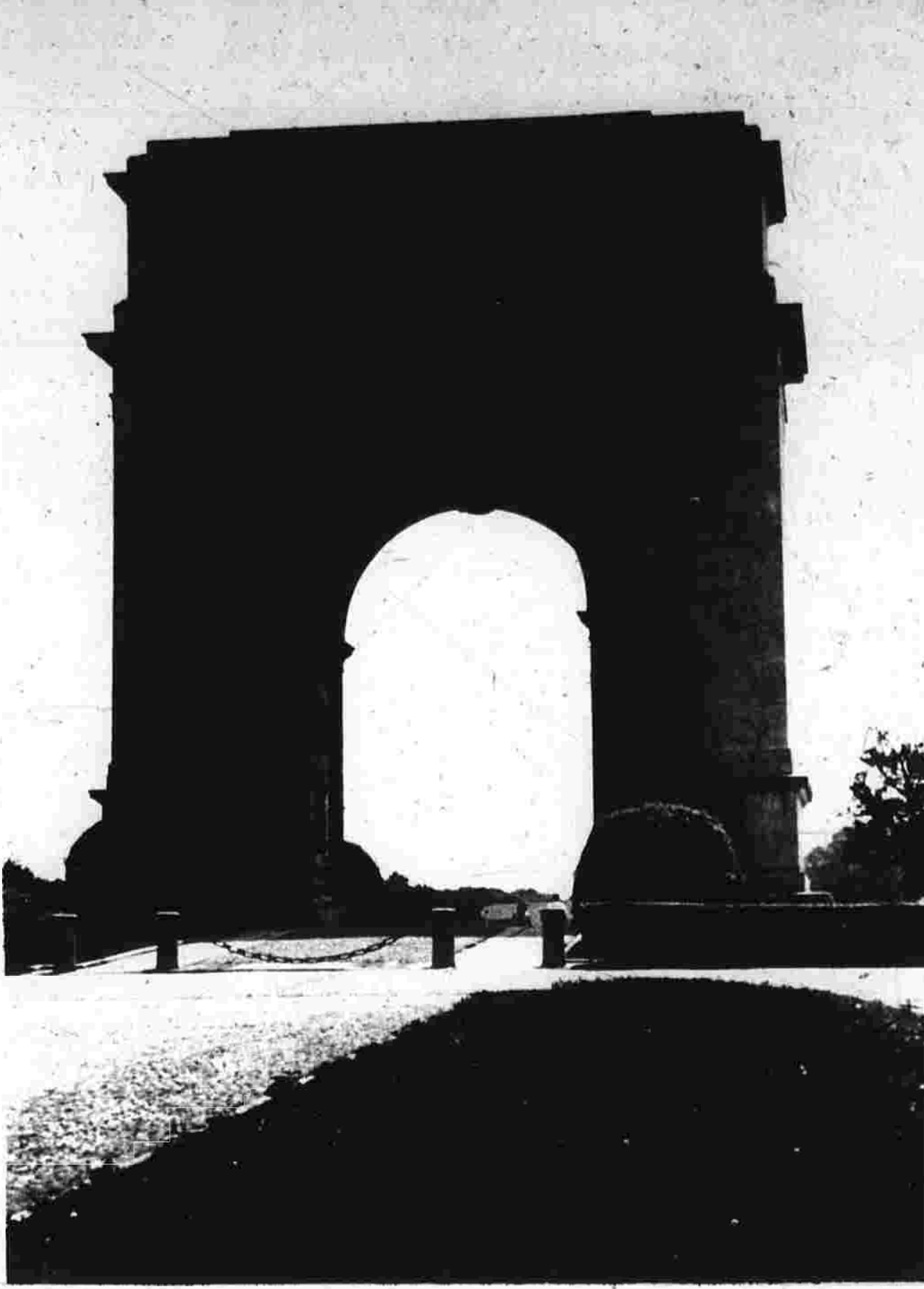
