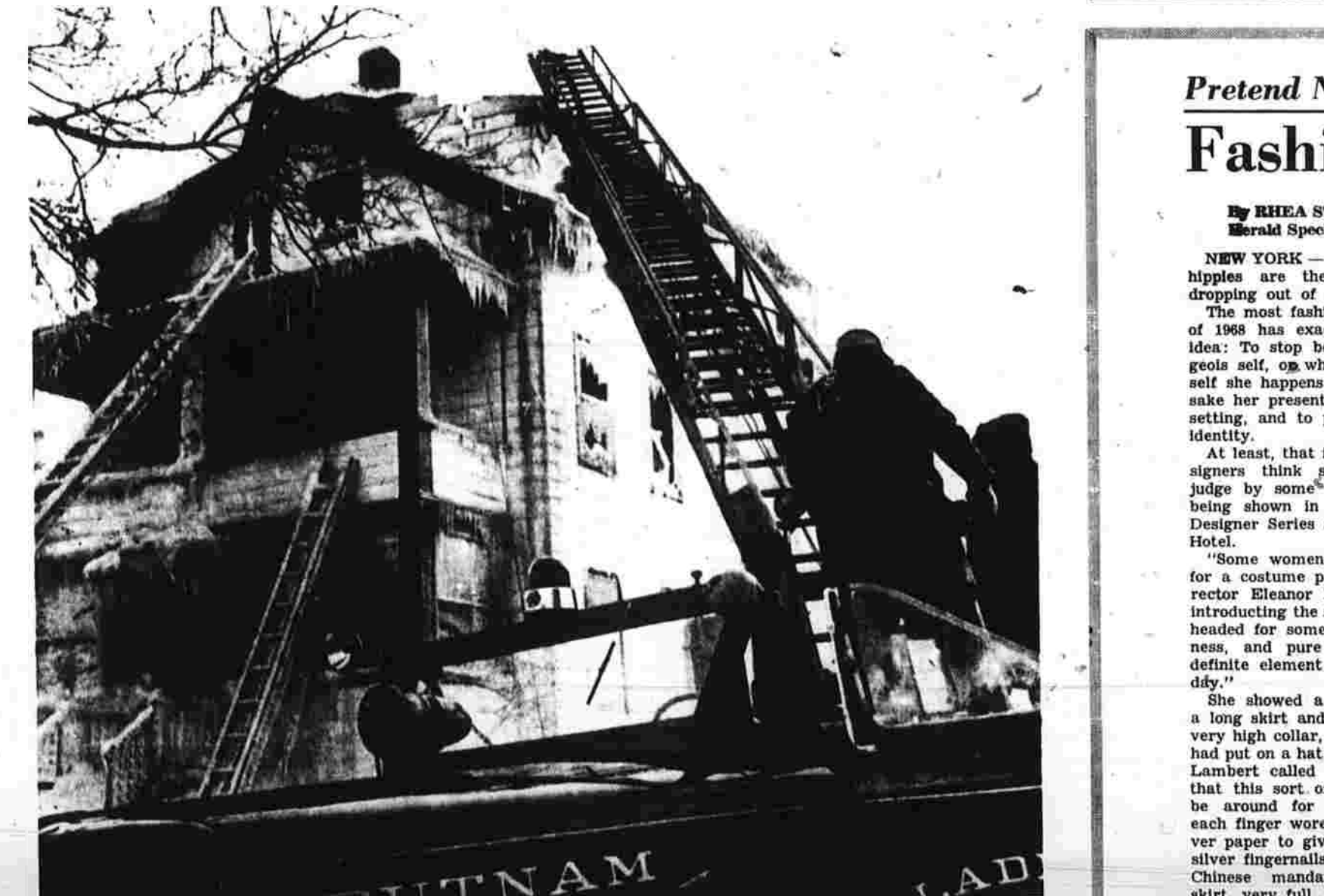

Disabled Support Broadened

WASHINGTON (NEA)—
When you put aside the matter of newly enacted higher Social Security cash benefits, it is in the disability field that the program has shown its most pronounced expansionist tendencies.

Disability under this law means you are unable to "engage in any substantial gainful activity."
As a year back, the requirement was loosened somewhat, so you could begin collecting disability benefits if you could demonstrate a disability which has lasted 12 months, is expected to last that long, or expected to result in death.

Under 1967 amendments to the law, a widow whose husband has worked long enough under Social Security to have qualified for retirement benefits can be eligible for monthly disability benefits if he is severely disabled.
To qualify, her disability must have started before or within seven years of her husband's death. Her payment ranges from 50 per cent to 82 and one-half per cent of her husband's primary retirement benefits...

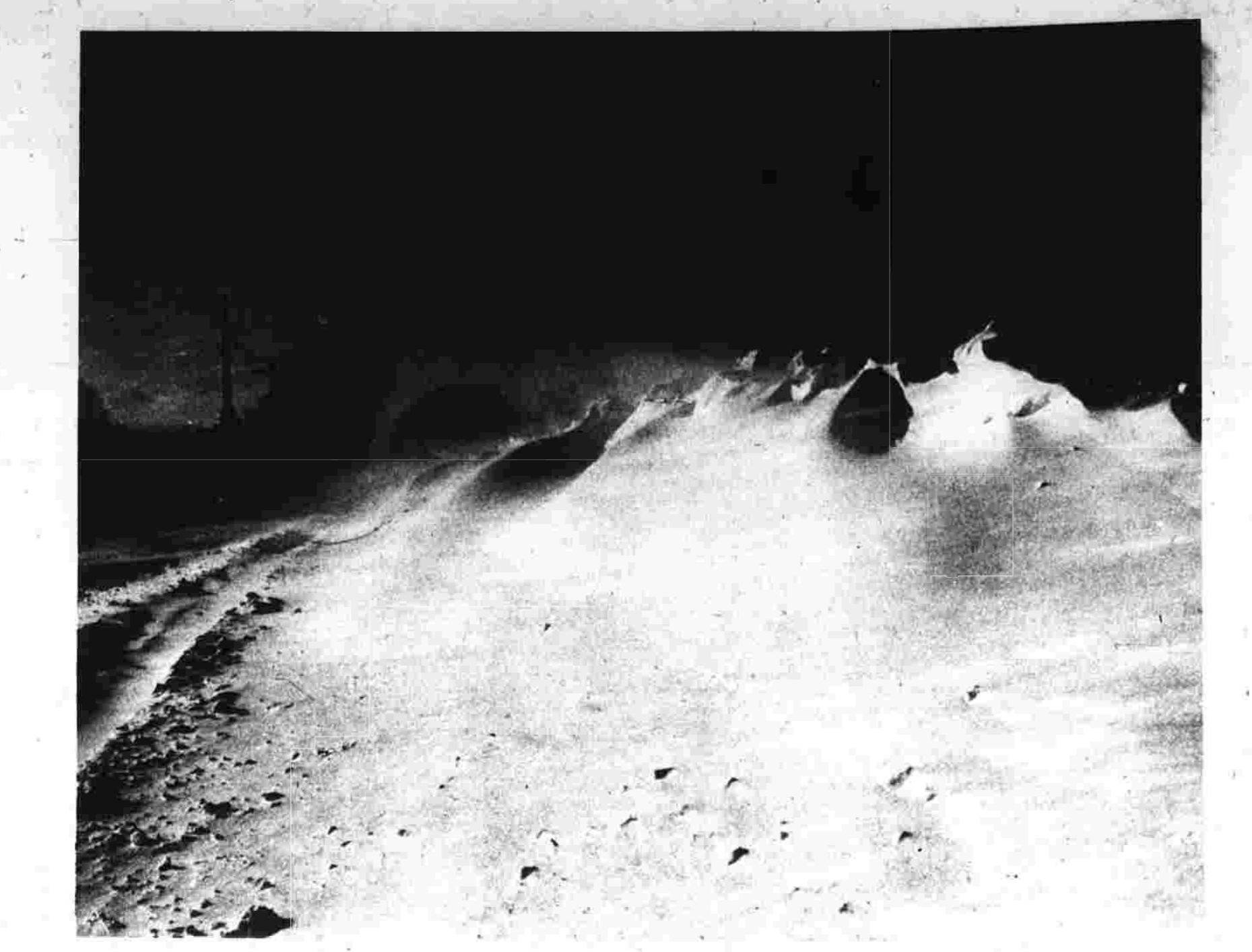

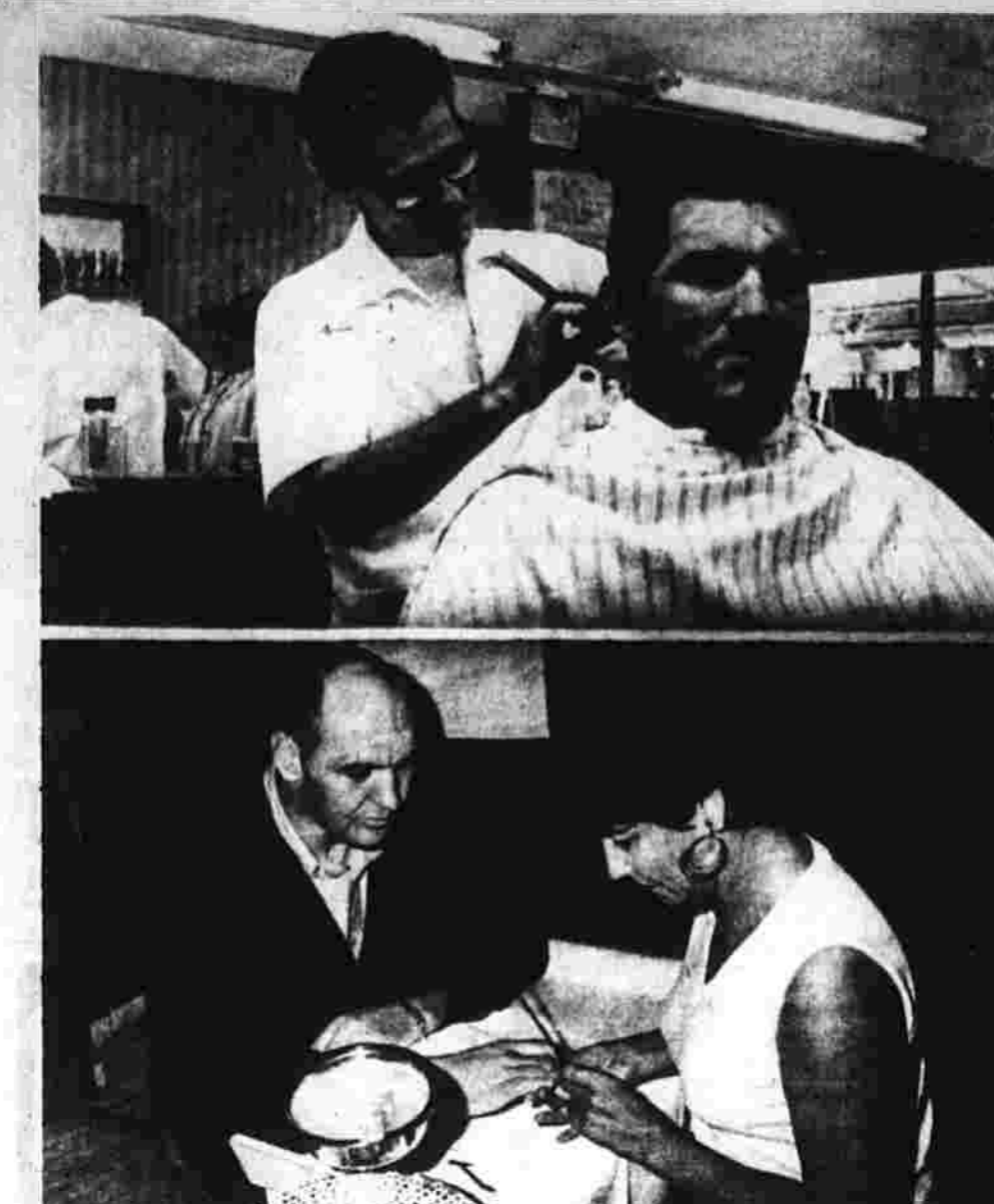
