**Directors Act Today On Charter Proposals**

The Board of Directors, in a special meeting tonight, will take action on a host of recommended charter changes, as required by the state's Home Rule Law. The meeting is in the Municipal Building Hearing Room.

Today is the deadline for board action on accepting or rejecting all or part of the proposals made by the Charter Revision Commission (CRC). If no action were taken by tonight, all of the CRC's recommendations would stand.

One is a proposal for the election, every two years, of the entire nine-member Board of Education, and to non-staggered terms.

The proposal is opposed by post and present school board members, by the Democratic minority of the CRC, and by the three minority Democrats on the Board of Directors.

The other controversial proposal is for a mandatory, not-for-profit, one-time mill tax for Capital Improvements. This proposal is also being opposed by the CRC's minority Democrats.

In the only other item on tonight's agenda, the board will consider approval of a \$29,400 appropriation. It would finance the cost of preparing plans and specifications for a proposed new Lincoln School in Center Springs Park. The school question, too, will be up for a referendum vote in the spring.

**Train Crash Injures 200**

**JERSEY CITY, N.J. (AP)** — A New York-bound rapid transit commuter train crashed into the rear of another at the height of the evening rush hour Thursday night, injuring some 200 people. Eighteen required hospitalization.

There were no fatalities. The injured began jamming the Jersey City Medical Center shortly after the 8:18 p.m. collision, which occurred just west of the Fort Authority Transit Hub (PATH) tube station at Journal Square here.

Twenty-eight doctors were called in to reinforce the two normally assigned to emergency duty. Dr. Clifford Bland, director of emergency facilities, said more than 200 victims were brought in. Most were treated and released.

"I heard a big sound and then everything went black," said Robert Rodriguez, 44, of the Bronx, N.Y., a passenger in one of the trains. Rodriguez said he was in a train which he believed a second of the subway was waiting to enter the Journal Square station.

A third train collided with the rear of one was on, Rodriguez said. He added the impact knocked him unconscious and he was pinned to the people were on the floor, all yelling.

He was taken to the hospital with back and neck injuries.

Jersey City Police Director George Whelan declared a state of emergency and police, Red Cross, fire and civil defense units swarmed into the area to evacuate injured.

Rescue operations were hampered because of the near-zero weather, and the location of the train in an open gully, or cut, just west of the station. Firemen used ladders to climb down the steep, ice-covered walls of the gully.

Many of the injured were helped from the gully to a department store built on concrete pillars over the subway. The employees comforted them until (See Page Eight)



**Large Bed Sales Spring Up Americans Are Snoozing Big**

**NEW YORK (AP)**—Queen-size, king-size and king extra long beds are crowding regular-size beds out of the bedroom. That's the word from the National Association of Bedding Manufacturers which reports that 40 times as many big beds were sold last year as were sold 10 years ago.

The big beds accounted for 20 percent of sales last year against less than one half of one percent in 1957.

Extra-size beds aren't new but the demand for them is.

"Young couples aren't thinking of anything other than kings or queens," says Elaine Borchert, president of Hale's Bedding Stores, Inc. in New York City. "They're people are bigger, they want to be more comfortable and the bigger bed is becoming a prestige item, according to the manufacturers."

Twenty per cent of American men are 6 feet tall or taller against only 4 per cent in 1960. Since 1960 the average man has become seven pounds heavier and the average woman 11 pounds heavier. The standard double bed has been 54 by 75 inches. The queen is 60 by 80, the king 74 by 80 and the king extra long 78 by 84.

Manufacturers expect the interest in bigger beds to push sales this year over the \$1 billion mark for the first time. Last year's sales were estimated at \$950 million.

And there's another, though smaller, trend in the bedding: odd-shaped beds. Among these are round beds and beds made in the shape of a heart, a piano and, for one Long Island couple that shipped it, Hale's, a teardrop.

**U.S. Gives Cambodia Pledge on Hostility Romney Asks N.H. Debate With Nixon**

**BANGKOK, Thailand (AP)** — Viet Cong and North Vietnamese troops using Cambodia as a sanctuary.

**Marines Go North To Counter Threat**

**SIGON (AP)** — The U.S. Marine force in South Vietnam can cover a wide area and two northern provinces increased to 28,000 men today as one regiment was moved north to meet the threat of Communist divisions generally.

The enlarged Marine force, together with about 12,000 South Vietnamese infantrymen, makes the allied and Communist forces in the DMZ theater of operations equal in infantry strength, which is expected spring offensive reports.

The allies began shifting troops last April to bolster the Marines under heavy ground probes, which the State Department said were designed to produce "clarification" of North Vietnam's intentions.

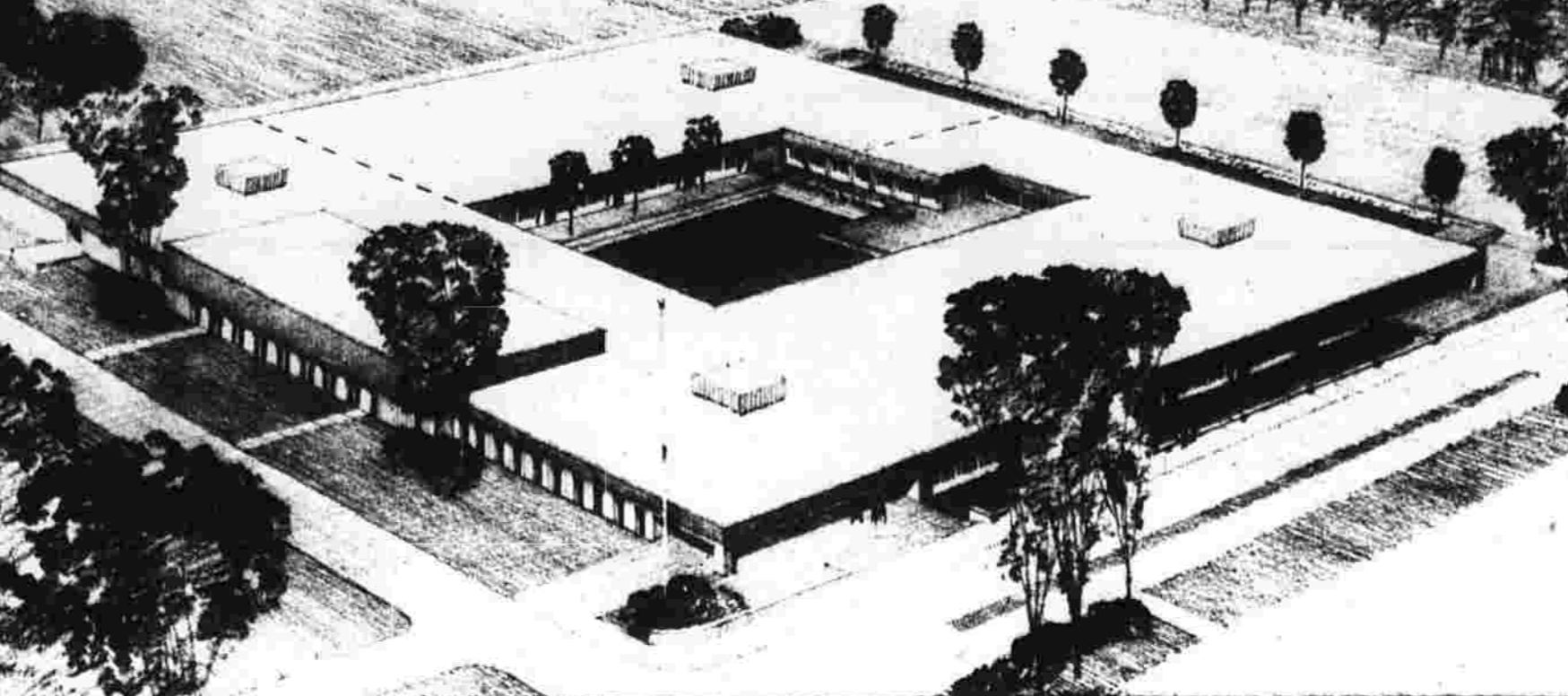
