By another year, the Department has an idea it can merge the airmail and first class mails into a single class, carried at a single rate.

For only a cent more, they could have been telling their customers, "you're about to get air mail handling for all your letters." 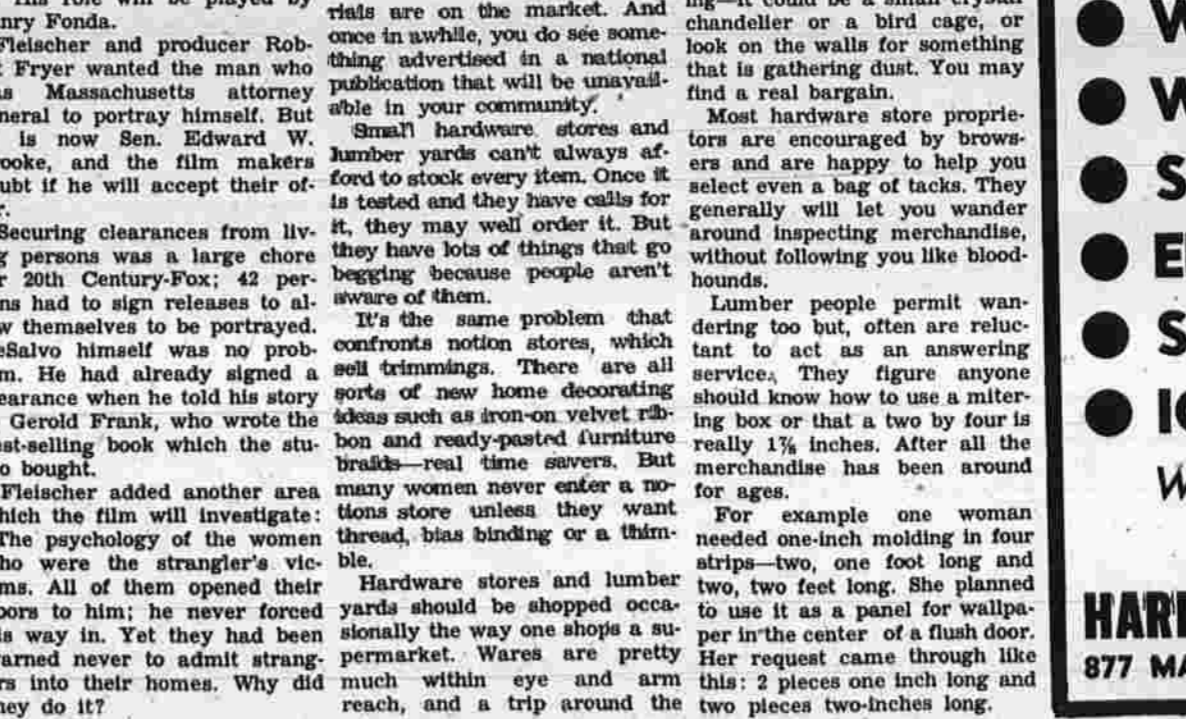

### Events in World

**Ship Visit Protested**  
 TOKYO (AP) — Police arrested 118 students, including 13 coeds, today after a shouting match erupted with authorities in a demonstration against the coming visit of the nuclear-powered U.S. aircraft carrier Enterprise.

The students shouted anti-American slogans and surged into downtown Tokyo after a campus demonstration. They charged a police cordon with sticks and rocks.

The group belonged to the radical wing of the Zengakuren organization. The Enterprise is expected in Osaka, in southwestern Japan, later this week and will be the first nuclear-powered surface warship to enter a Japanese port. Nuclear-powered U.S. submarines have been visiting Japan for several years.

**Worst Poll Turnout**  
 BANGKOK (AP) — Thai voters went to the polls Sunday for the second time in 10 years and according to reports from around the country it was the worst turnout in history.

The elections, the second in less than a month, chose 1,704 provincial councilors. The Bangkok Post reported that less than 20 per cent of the eligible voters bothered to appear at the polling booths.

The turnout in December for election of municipal councilors was nearly 90 per cent.

Political parties have been banned since the military coup in 1966, so the local elections were popularity contests. A new constitution passed its second reading in the government-appointed constituent assembly last week, and elections may be held by the end of the year for a parliament.

**Woman's Death Probed**  
 GUATEMALA (AP) — President Julio Cesar Mendez Montenegro has ordered special investigation into the slaying of a 26-year-old former beauty queen whose nude body was found four days ago.

Police reported finding the body of Rosalia Cruz Martinez, Miss Guatemala of 1960, under a hedge 50 miles from Guatemala City. They said she apparently had been thrown to sea.

The machine guns and rifles of seven farmers were found in the same area the following day.

Miss Cruz's family said she was taken away by four civilians Monday and they assumed they were secret police. The family were told later there was no warrant for her arrest.

**Royalist Aid Claimed**  
 BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Yemeni Republican government circulated documents and photographs it said were found on the body of a French paratrooper and claimed they proved European mercenaries are fighting on the royalist side in the civil war.

One photograph was of a certificate issued in 1967 by the paratrooper training school at Pua, France, to Jacques Benoit. The Republican Foreign Ministry said the certificate, plus six family snapshots, Paris business cards and notes of addresses in Paris, were found on the body of a mercenary after fighting recently near San'a, the Republican capital.

The note also included names of two hotels in Veddan, Saudi Arabia. The Republican regime has recruited by Saudi Arabia to fight with the Royalists. The Royalists have countered that they found papers of a Soviet pilot shot down while flying for the Republicans.

"If moderate Negroes can't families back to their African heritage and are proud of it," Rogers said.

Rogers said that the people of Bolton and Manchester are trying to help, then what about the rest of the country? He asked John Rogers over the weekend, speaking to the "club" of Bolton and Manchester. "They call us Uncle Toms and cast us on a heap," Rogers deplored the preaching of hate by the militant groups. The children are affected, he said, and will believe what they are told by these groups unless they can be shown otherwise.

"Intelligent middle class Americans have to lend their weight to the problem," Rogers said. It will not be solved by civil rights, by politicians or by the government, he said.

Rogers said that nine-tenths of the civil rights workers don't want things cleaned up because they won't have any work to do, that city politics in Hartford is corrupt and that government measures are too slow.

Rogers, a Manchester resident and long-time member of the Bolton church, began his talk on the problems of the Negro in the city with a brief history of the Negro.

**Augustine Was Black**  
 "Americans have been victimized by propaganda on the Negro," Augustine said. He listed some of the prominent black people in church history. Augustine was black, he said, and a black pope converted Constantine. He passed around a post card collected on his trip to Europe last summer showing a black man and a black child.

The Negro has been part of the country for a long time, he said, pointing out that there were Negroes in Jamestown a year before the Mayflower landed.

He spoke of Aaron White and others who fought in the American Revolution, and the Negroes who fought on the side of the Confederates in the Civil War.

He said that Negroes in the south had also owned slaves, and that white people had been brought to this country as indentured servants.

The breaking up of the family units among the Negroes brought as slaves to this country is "one of the most intelligent factors" the Negroes have been unable to overcome, he said. In other places, like Brazil, where the families were not broken up, the Negroes can trace their

**Aiken Claims Private Firms Monopolizing Atomic Power**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. George D. Aiken, R-Vt., accused private power companies today of trying to monopolize low-cost atomic power to the exclusion of public and co-operated electric systems.

"The goal is to monopolize the power," Aiken said. "No other interpretation can be put upon the present situation."

Utilities are virtually exempt from antitrust provisions in the Atomic Energy Act as the act has been administered by the Atomic Energy Commission, he charged.

"The private electric utility interests hope to establish monopolistic control over the electric power supply of the nation before the public becomes aware of what is going on," Aiken told the legislative conference of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association.

His comments were in a prepared speech.

"The Atomic Energy Commission appears far more concerned with improving the means for developing that power than it is with the distribution and use of such power once it is generated," he said.

"It may well be that having laid down the rules for control of radiation hazards, this agency should not be expected to act as fish and game warden, recreation director and enforcement officer for the antitrust laws as well."

He urged congressional action to clarify the regulations to clarify the regulations in connection with the antitrust laws.

"The law as it exists is highly satisfactory to the corporate utility interests, but is becoming more and more inadequate and unsatisfactory as a protector of the public domain and the democratic rights of the individual."

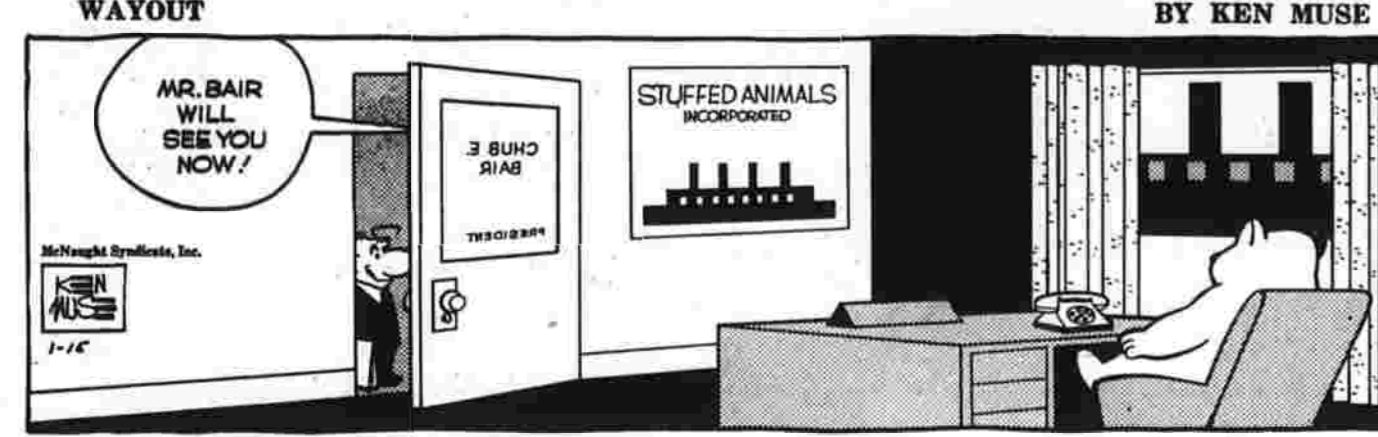

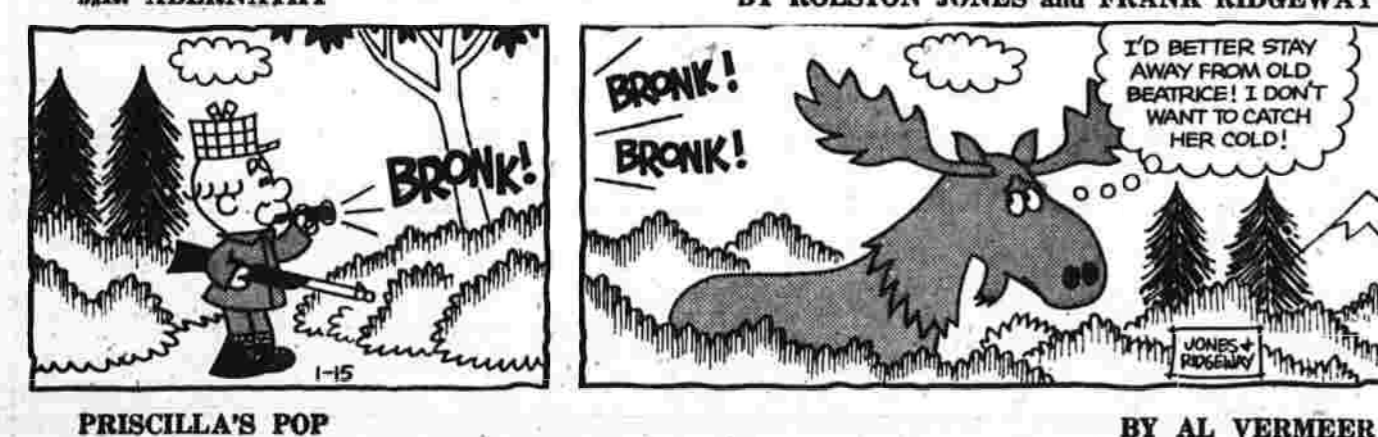

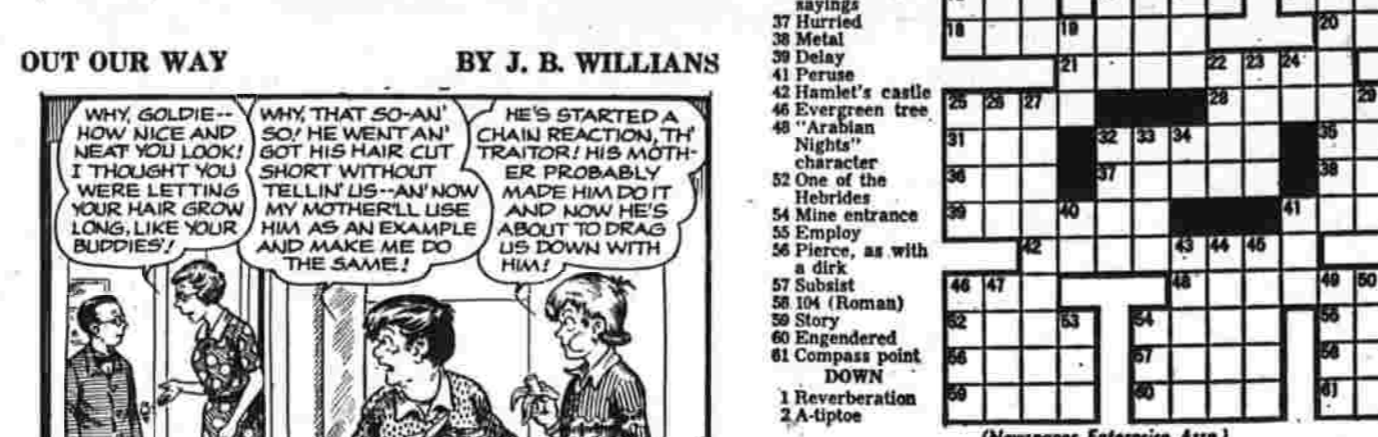
