The creation of the largest privately owned railroad system in the world probably would never have been permitted by this nation's public authorities, regulatory and judicial, if they had been able to figure out some other way of taking care of another problem they

had in hand. The New York Central and the Pennsylvania Railroads have, in other words, received permission to merge only after they have promised to take care of the New Haven Railroad.

That promise is, of course, Connecticut's chief interest in the merger. The continued operation of the New Haven is now assured, by pledge of the merging giants. That continued operation has always been assured, in reality, in our opinion, even if it were going to take outright governmental takeover o the New Haven to do it. But what we have now is the easiest possible way to solve the problem of the New Haven. detail as is possible. 

We happen to believe that, if the new management does care to do that it can make even more money for itself, even on the New Haven, whose misfortunes have been more the product of mismanagement than of any trend of the times. There is a good way to run a railroad, and the new merger is going to be blessed with the money with which to try it. Both for its own good, and for its obligation to the public permission it has received, it should start aiming at providing, on all three lines, something that could be called the best railroad service in all the world.

Russia Has Intellectuals, Too

Over in Soviet Russia the news is not that four young people have been put on trial for some kind of intellectual heresy to the standards of the Communist party or the Communist state, and railroaded through to prison sentences, but that two other young Russians sympathetic to the accused have issued, over their own names, a formal statement attacking the conduct of the trial, and are apparently still alive and

at large. This piling of dissent on dissent is something new in the history of Communist Russia, and one more proof of the theory that a little freedom, a little knowledge, a little privilege are a dangerous thing for any authoritarian regime ever to permit its subjects. Once they are permitted, there are always those who will dure to stretch and expand them. "This trial," the document said, "is a stain on the honor of our state and on the conscience of everyone of us." All this sounds remarkably like some of the defiances currently being hurled at the policies and conduct of the American government by some of the young intellectuals on our own national

#### Why Not "111" Or "011"?

For 20 years, Britain has had a nationwide emergency telephone system-in which dialing "999" took the caller to a central clearing operator for police, fire, and other emergency services.

Such a number has frequently been recommended for this country, and now A. T. & T. has announced that we're going to have it. The announcement says that our number is going to be "911." Anybody can dial this number anywhere in the country, when the preparation is complete, and get immediate connection to report fire, burglar, ill-

ness or accident. The first thing to say about this is that it is, obviously, a magnificent idea. Now and then the planners of our modern civilization and its facilities and its gadgets use their heads with special brilliance and some attention to the

truly human needs of our time. The second thing to say about this proposal is that, while it is a disappointment that it is going to take years to get everything set sq the new system can operate nation-wide, this necessary delay at least gives us time to make doubly sure we do it, when we do it, with as much foresight and attention to

Have any of these planners, for instance, thought of what would be the supreme test for the usefulness of such standard trouble number?

It would be, we think the ability of the person needing help to dial the trouble number in the dark. Accident or fire in the home might involve loss of power for lighting, or inability to reach the glasses with which one car see. If the emergency involved the presence of a burglar in the house, the use of a light might seem injudicious. The ideal trouble number, then, would be the number which could be most

The next easiest number to use would be "0" because that is the number at the very end of the dial circle and also, therefore, a number that can be found easily using only one's sense of touch. The number "9" is, however, not an easy number to use in the dark. It can be located only by going to the last number, which is "0" and then moving back one slot to "9." This would not be impossible. But it would be much more difficult than the process should be, for a nation-wide number with such a pur-

said, and found that it totaled near a vacant house in Preston and used much of the remaind er to pay debts.

GIRLS TALK MORE NEW YORK (AP) - Scientific tests with a specially designed meter that measures how much time a person talks per day indicate that teen-age girls talk more than anybody else. Bulova researchers repor They add, however, that so far no professional politicians have been tested.

The timing meter, nicknamed "The Chatterbox," is technical ly described as a voice-actuated elapsed-time clock. Its time standard is a self-powered accutron electronic timepiece simi lar to those used on the instrument panels of manned Gemini

"The meter is worn by the person being tested," says Egpert Van Haaften, director o the company's Timer Laboratory. "The sound of the human voice actuates an acoustic trigger and an elapsed-time record-

ing begins.

#### Suspension Of Teacher Is Upheld

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) - The school board has voted 6-1 to uphold the suspension of teacher Ronald Kunkle, whose controversial views and unorthodox teaching methods were objected to by parents of his pupils. He had been suspended on charges of inefficiency and insubordina-

"The whole thing puzzles me. But I think the school board has to be commended for this. They gave me a hearing after all," he Kunkle had been criticized for the way he handled his class.

He participated in a peace march in San Francisco and then told his pupils why he went. He encouraged the youngsters in his class to carry signs in protest against the school's playground safety police. He reused to have his class salute the flag every morning, saying, "It's right up there. You can salute it any time you want." board transferred Kunkle to another school. Kunkle refused to go. The superintendent suspended him. Finally, the school board fired him in December. Kunkle, 34, said the transfer was the result of pressure from

angry parents. His supporters asked the school board to hold a hearing on why he was fired. For two days parents, teachers and lawyers testified before the board-both pro and con-in a trial-like hearing that was

closed to the public, but open to After three hours of secret deliberation Tuesday night the board announced its decision. Technically the vote was to uphold the superintendent's action in suspending Kunkle, but what it really means is that Kunkle can never teach in the Eugene school system again. He has been teaching part time at a local community col-

tege since he lost his grade school job. Richard Miller, a Eugene lawyer, was the only school board member who voted for Kunkle. He said that "considering the community climate ... the action was too drastic."

Two other board members said they believed the suspension "was justified because of the untenable climate existing in the community." Kunkle said he has no immediate plans and doesn't know if he will pursue his case in court. "I'm just going to rest," he said.

A CURE BAD AS A DISEASE LOS ANGELES (AP) -- A psychologist says he's getting mokers to stop by making them smoke more. Irwin Lublin of California State College at Los Angeles reports he got a woman who had smoked 40 cigarettes a day for 30 years to quit after two weeks f "aversive conditioning." The woman was among 50 volunteers who smoke more than a pack daily and under went two tests for Lublin: -Inhaling every six seconds on one cigarette and puffing without inhaling every three

seconds on a second one. -Smoking a cigarette while a machine puffs out stale warm cigarette smoke into the smoker's face.

The result was mild nausea, headaches and sore throats. "Almost everybody soon finds cigarettes intolerable," said Darid Schmahl, Lublin's assistant 'Hardly anybody finished whole one. Both methods proved very obnoxious." Of the 50 volunteers, Lublin said 14 dropped out quickly, 16 stopped smoking, 2 cut way down and 18 gave up on the proj-

An unusual design is featured on a new stamp by the Netherlands honoring the golden jubilee of that country's "Postal Cheque and Clearing Service' which has nearly 11/2 million par-

The design of automated ransactions depicts circles and rectangles of the kind seen nowadays on machine-sorted checks and money orders. In addition there are curved and circular lines similar to those that form the background on paper money. The dates 1918-1968 appear atop the adhesive. The colors are red, black and golden yellow. The Postal Cheque and Clearng Service was established by an act which became effective Jan. 16, 1918. At first, local post offices held the accounts, but n 1923 an administration was set up at The Hague. By 1965

American flags of the Revolutionary period varied in design, On Feb. 20, 1776 the Continental Congress issued an order permitting colonels of regiments to fly flags "such as they could procure and might deem proper." More than a year later, he Flag Resolution defined a "Flag" of seven red and six white stripes with 13 stars in a field of blue, but the arrangement of the stars and the proportional aspects of the flag were vague. of Bob Jones University at Greenville, died Tuesday morning after several years of declining health. The 84-year-old minister was one of the last "old-time" evangelists. Jones had been vocal in funiamental-vs.-liberal issues in the Christian ranks, and op posed what he considered con romise in present-day evangel sm in which evangelists work

under the sponsorship of liberal Born Oct. 30, 1883, in Dale County, Ala., Jones' home was a small farm at Brannon Stand near Dothan, Ala. The educator-evangelist preached for more than 70 years, having begun to hold re vival meetings at the age of 13.

He was formally licensed to preach in the Methodist Church before he was 15. He is survived by his wife Mary Gaston Stollenwerck Jones; his three grandchildren Dr. Bob Jones III, BJU vice president; Jon, captain in the U.S. Army stationed at Ft. Man's Collar Has History

By AP Newsfeatures NEW YORK (AP)-A man's collar has a history that extends back to the toga-clad Romans who often wore chin cloths to protect and warm their vocal cords—especially if they were accustomed to public speaking Egyptians and ancient East ern People wore ornamental neckbands of embroidered


Both men and women were collared during the early Eliza-bethan period. Unpretentious ruffles at the edge of a neckband grew into full-blown ruffs These elaborate ruffs, which eventually reached shoulder width, stimulated lace-making as one of the great industric arts of the 16th Century, Starch was invented along with several instruments to smooth, fold, Although they were originally designed to conceal the throat ruffs later opened away from the neck to reveal the throat. From these evolved the standing starched lace collars supported by wire frames which surround the neck and head. Then collars shrank to high trimmed neckbands. In England the style was known as "Piccadill", a diminutive collar with a succession of stiff lace points The name is said to be the ori gin of London's famous Piccadilly, the street and Circus. Gradually, collars fell, flat tened, and began to resemble modern ones until, with the ad-

vent of wigs, they all but vanished and the cravat was born As wigs were bobbed, handsome neckpieces again became popu-lar. These were elongated neckbands trimmed in lace, support ed by the swath of a cravat which often buried both mouth and the chin. For want of air, gentlemen adopted a shorter style. By the mid 1800s, the narrow, stiff standing collar held sway and a shirt with detachable collar and tie was considered "correct." The Victorian period witnessed variations of style, but the detachable white collar dominated. Up to this time, collars were made of fabric, usually cotton or some cotton derivative which required considerable care in washing, starching and pressing. Consequently, collars were reserved for those who could afford the personal services required for an elaborate

With the insurgence of new manufacturing techniques in the latter third of the 19th century, the working class was able to copy the styles thus far reserved for gentility. According to one source, "the rule of stare was tottering," and collars o linen-faced paper, washable rub-ber and celluloid were available The gentility reacted by de-manding fabric collars stitched to their shirts. The desires of

the gentility, however, had ceased to be the dominant persuasion in fashion. With improved production techniques, fashion could indulge in a fer whimsies. Stripes and colors became popular variations on the heretofore prevalent white, and a white detachable collar was standard accompaniment to a variety of shirt colors In 1929 one shop displayed 20 distinct and separate collar sty-
