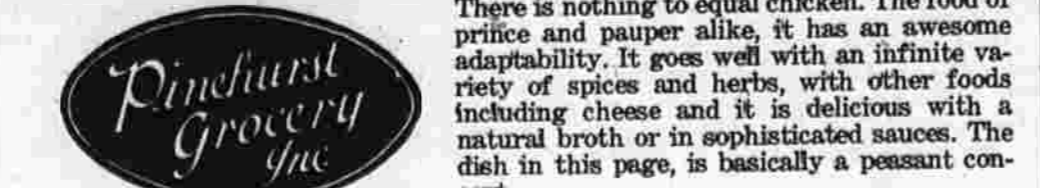

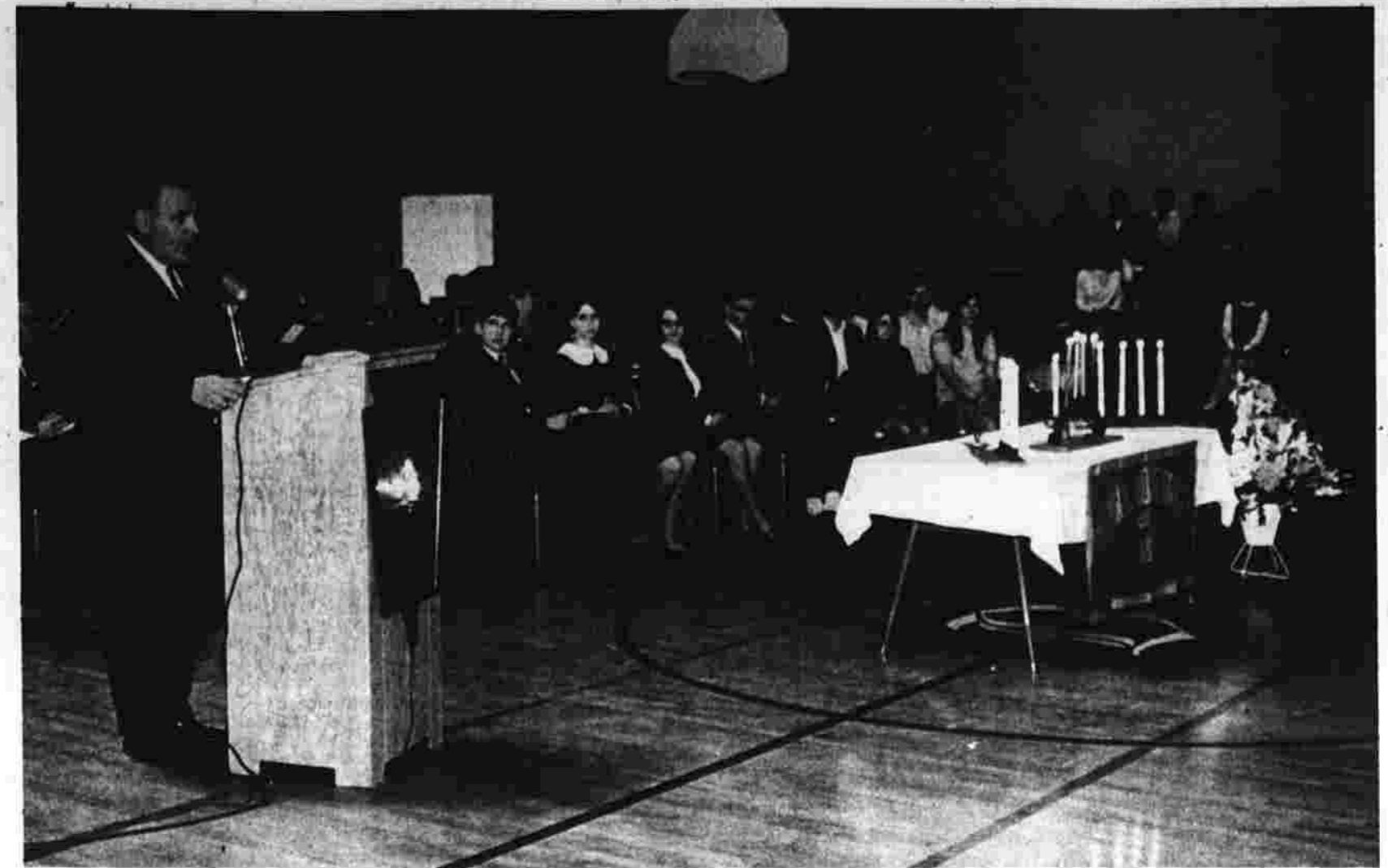

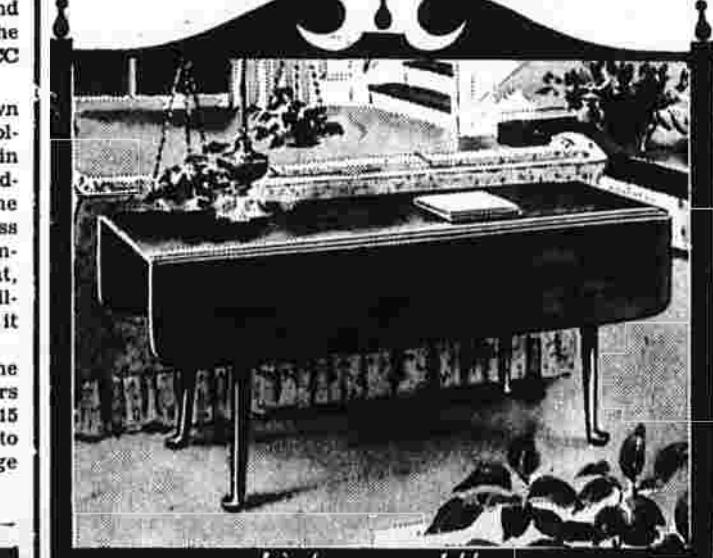

### Dramatic Air Rescue Frees Captive GI

**CAN THO, Vietnam (AP)**—In a free fire zone, an area in which all traffic is forbidden. An American infantryman captured by the Viet Cong was dramatically rescued in the Mer-ter gunnery that attacked the guerrillas, a U.S. officer said.

The soldier had been taken by the Viet Cong earlier this month. He was held in a cave for his return home at the end of his tour in South Vietnam.

Supported by a nurse, Blaiberg walked slowly down the stairs of the room while his wife and 20-year-old daughter watched through a glass partition.

Mrs. Blaiberg and their daughter, Jill, today visited Dorothy Haupt, widow of the man whose heart was grafted into Blaiberg on Jan. 2.
