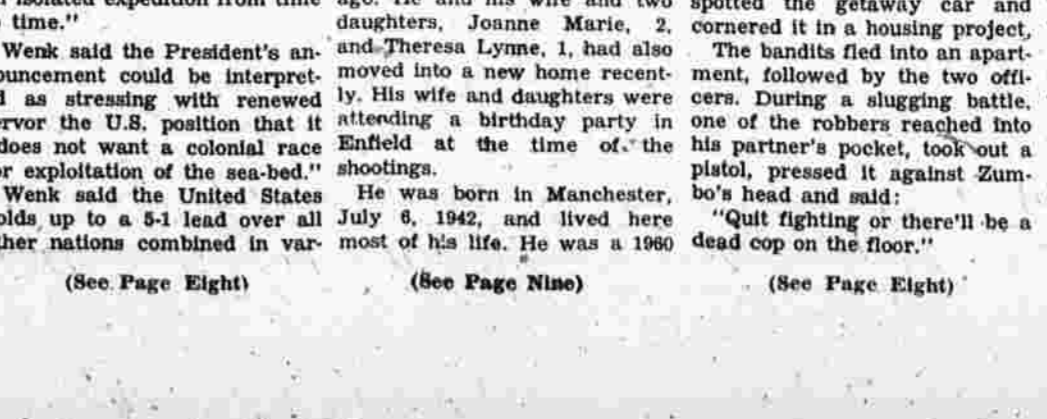
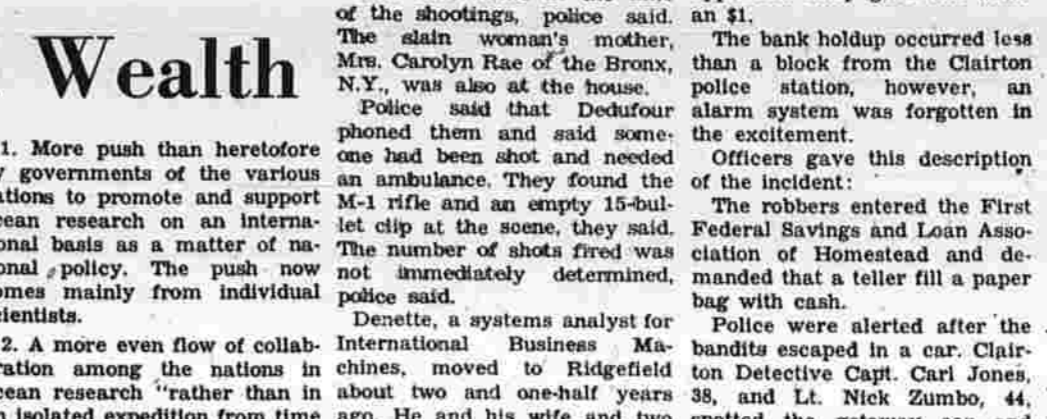
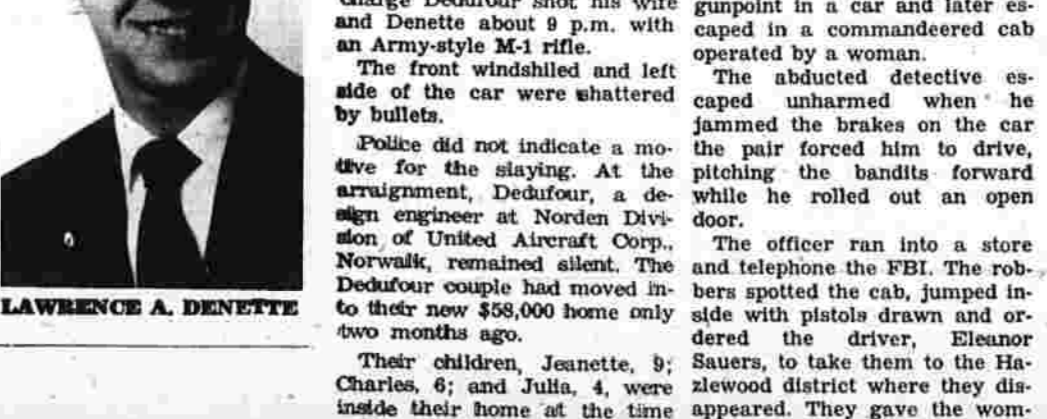

A Monumental Irrelevance

When the President came out against crime, a little more than half way through his State of the Union Message the other night, Congress broke into the only sustained applause it had for any of the Presidential remarks of the entire evening.

One has to suspect that there was something about the occasion which had turned a whole organized body of human beings, the membership of Congress, into a sudden sophisticated, and that the applause contained at least a heavy quotient of irony. It had become apparent, by that time in the message, that what the Congress and the country were to get from it was the greatest collection of uniform and irrelevant platitudes in the history of Presidential message-making.

This was intended to be an uneventful, soothing message, full of promising platitudes, and platitudinous promises. This is the political strategy of the President and his political advisers have determined upon. And the President, in his formal text, offered the Congress itself the title which would have been best with his idea of how to play upon the country's supposed instincts and desires in this election year of 1968.

He invited this to be the "Consumer Consensus" Congress and he went down the list of actions that measures that could be devoted to the cause of cooling Americans more comfortable and contented with their lives.

We think it so happened that all this paternalistic solicitude for us all which greeted us all as if we were a nation of children, that the President was not only richly and laudably in its approach to the American people, but one of the greatest pieces of irrelevance in history.

There are Americans who believe that first things should come first, and who think that the greatest perils the American consumer of today needs to be protected against are the perils of fire and violence abroad and at home, of the blindly fixed course in Vietnam, of the endemic and often wildly irrational racial struggle at home. Unless we can somehow emerge surviving from both these predicaments, there are more pipes burnt than tempers.

Don't Erase Postmarks
We sympathize with the General Accounting Office in its attempt to set free of all radiation hazards. The high priest of defoliation in Vietnam is not going to be a very successful crusader to save the redwoods of California.

In 1962, when the Conservatives came to power again, they instituted a charge of 28 cents on each prescription, but the responsibility was not entirely that of the Conservatives. The Labor Government had also been moving toward the imposition of the fee, prior to its defeat.

The 28 cent fee for a prescription continued until 1964, when Prime Minister Wilson brought the Labor Party back to power, and immediately proceeded to celebrate by brightening up Labor's favorite program by removing the prescription charge.

Now this same Prime Minister has found himself presiding over the reimposition of a charge for prescriptions, this time a 30 cent charge.

Of all the stringencies the Wilson government has found it necessary to order, this has probably been the most painful.

But it might also have been an agonizing wrench for it to have to postpone its planned improvements and educational opportunities for British youth. And it is difficult to imagine the self-torture with which any liberal government anywhere would find itself announcing the end of the free milk program for children, even if only those in the secondary schools are being eliminated.

All of the bitter lessons being exemplified by such bitter remedies, being administered by the very party which lived and fought so long for such welfare state measures, add up to the one single unpleasant lesson—that even for a socialist heaven on earth, somebody must pay.

There is, after all, nothing that is "free." These never has been. There never will be.

What there can be, what there should be, in any civilized society, are better and more equitable systems for distributing the material necessities of decent living, and better and more equitable systems of sharing the cost so distributing these essential necessities.

"Free" is an impossibility, even for the most advanced socialism. "Fair" represents a goal that can be approached under more than one political ideology.

The Helpless And The Harassed

In this winter of tortured relationships between the helpless householder and the harassed plumber, who can venture to interpret to both sides?

Who can explain to the good housewife who has water bursting from her pipes, her husband sick in bed, her children cold, and her furnace about to stop running because of shortage of water that her plumber had just promised, that he needs another \$1.1 billion from Congress for welfare spending.

Or who can explain to the plumber, with his own great sense of professional capabilities, just how helpless and desperate some great big blubber of a man can feel when, in his position as captain of an immense ship, he feels everyting sinking hopelessly beneath him?

If the householder, overpowered with his own emergency, is a bit hysterical, that is almost the inevitable pattern for human behavior in such a situation.

And if the plumber, suspecting that some of his customers are magnifying their own particular troubles in the effort to get his best, sometimes turns just a shade businesslike and curt, that doesn't make him a hard-hearted character, but merely that he has to balance with respect to how much he can take.

Perhaps one can suggest a common thought to both sides. All this will pass, and there will come, sometime in July, August or two warm, benevolent days when no one will have to worry about frozen pipes. Then this present nightmare for both sides — of nerves and customer waiting to be helped, of competent professional unable to help every body at once — will begin to seem a far-off winter's tale, which couldn't have been quite as bad as it seemed at the time.

All in all, however, such a cold winter, like almost any emergency directed at the human being, does not always produce negative results. On the average, there are more pipes burnt than tempers.

We sympathize with the General Accounting Office in its attempt to set free of all radiation hazards. The high priest of defoliation in Vietnam is not going to be a very successful crusader to save the redwoods of California.

There is more unity than the President may wish in the State of the Union message. Put all his "can and will" incantations end to end and it can be found that they cover and embrace about lately everything but one thing. By the spirit and text of this State of the Union Message we can not and we will not face the necessities and openly our truly vital priorities.

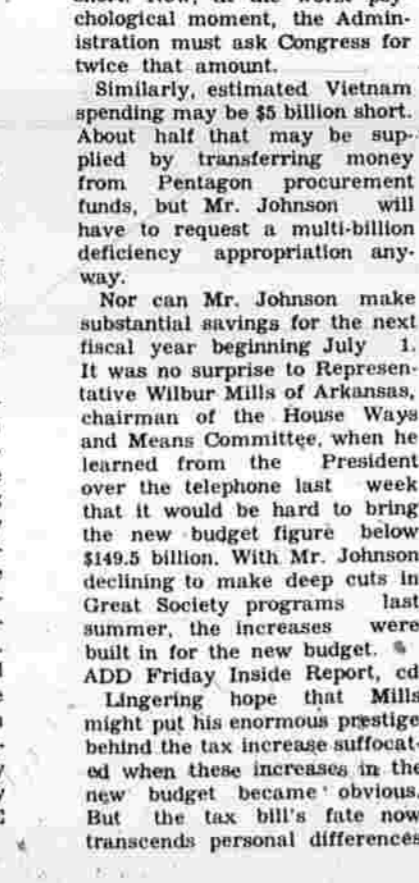

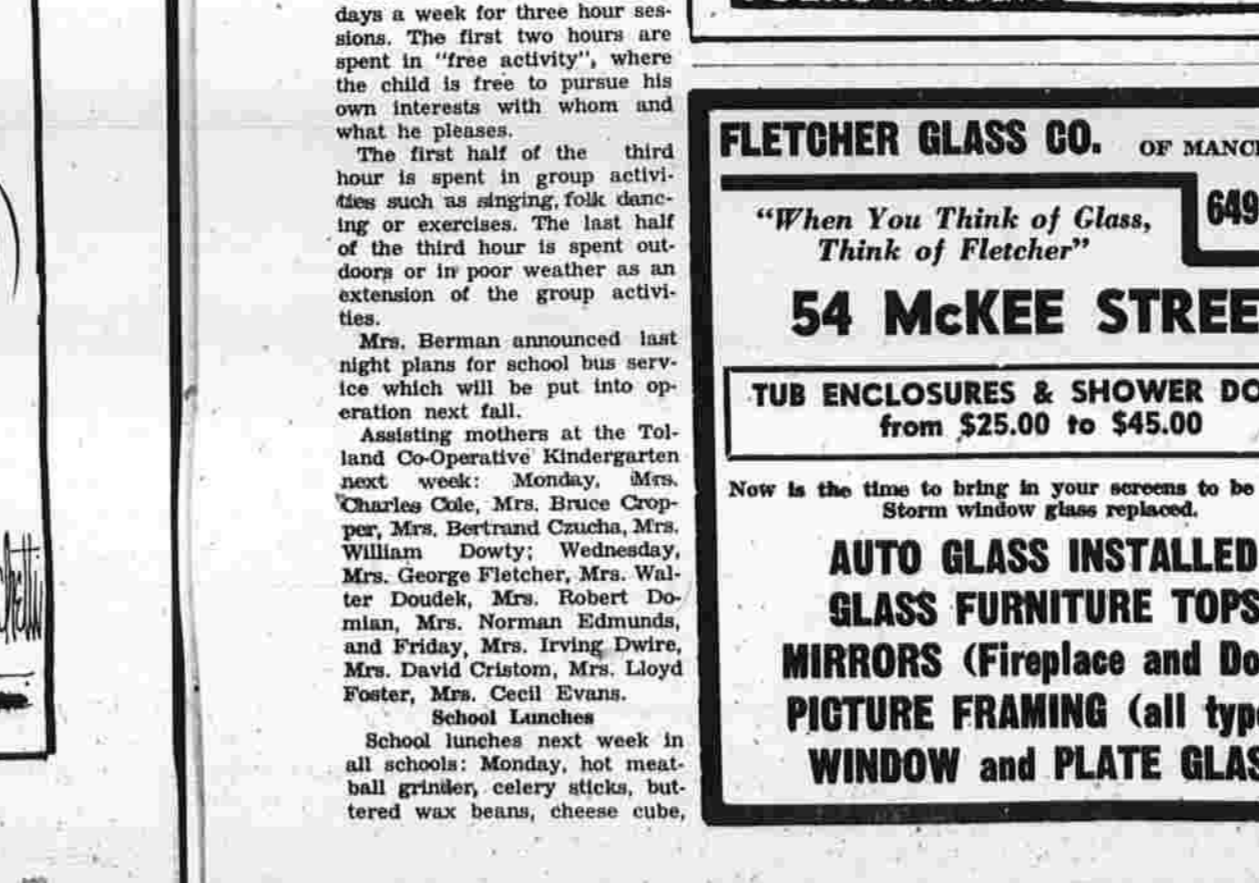

"Seminar Autoculture," a teaching method developed by a Tolland educator, will be used this summer on an experimental basis at Harvard University.

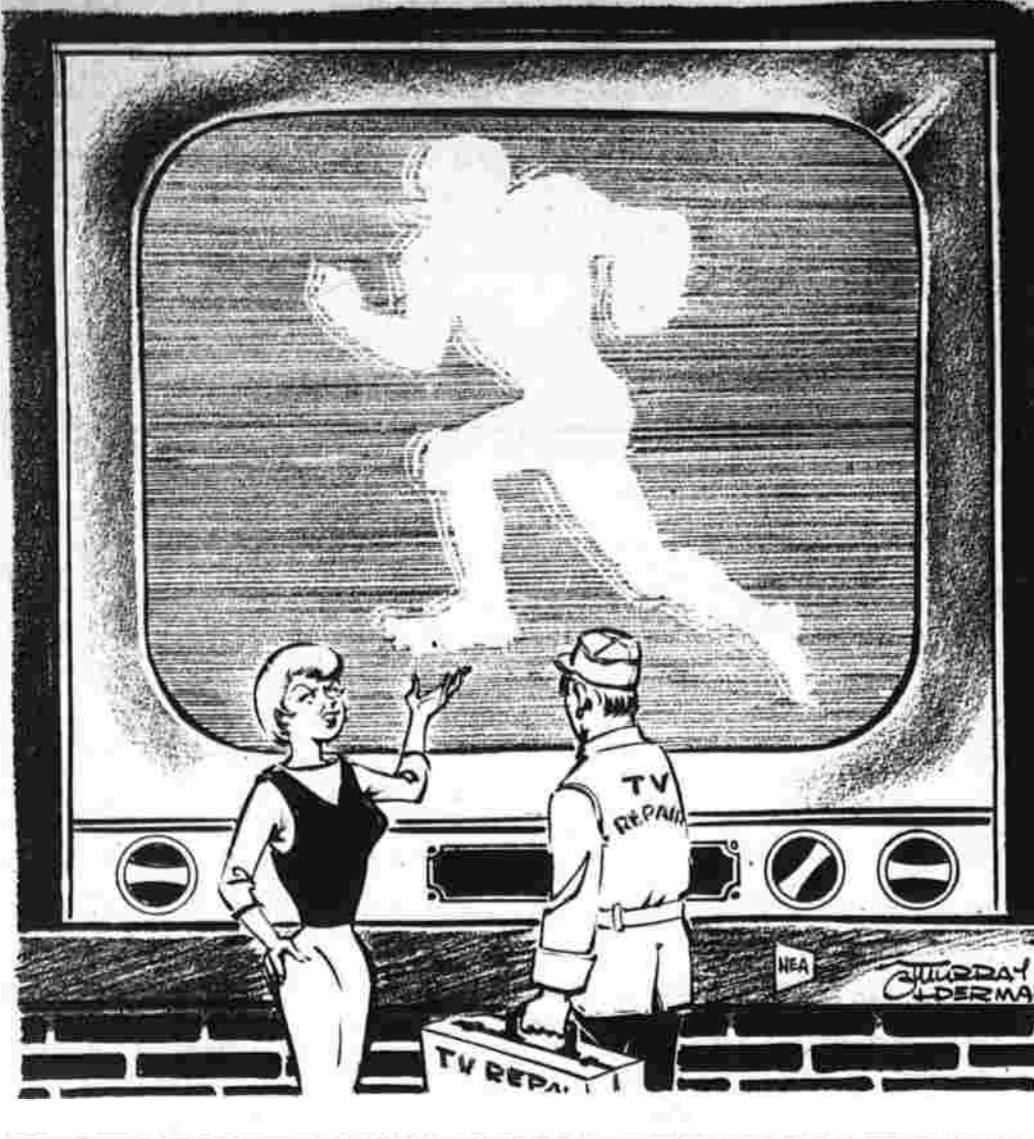

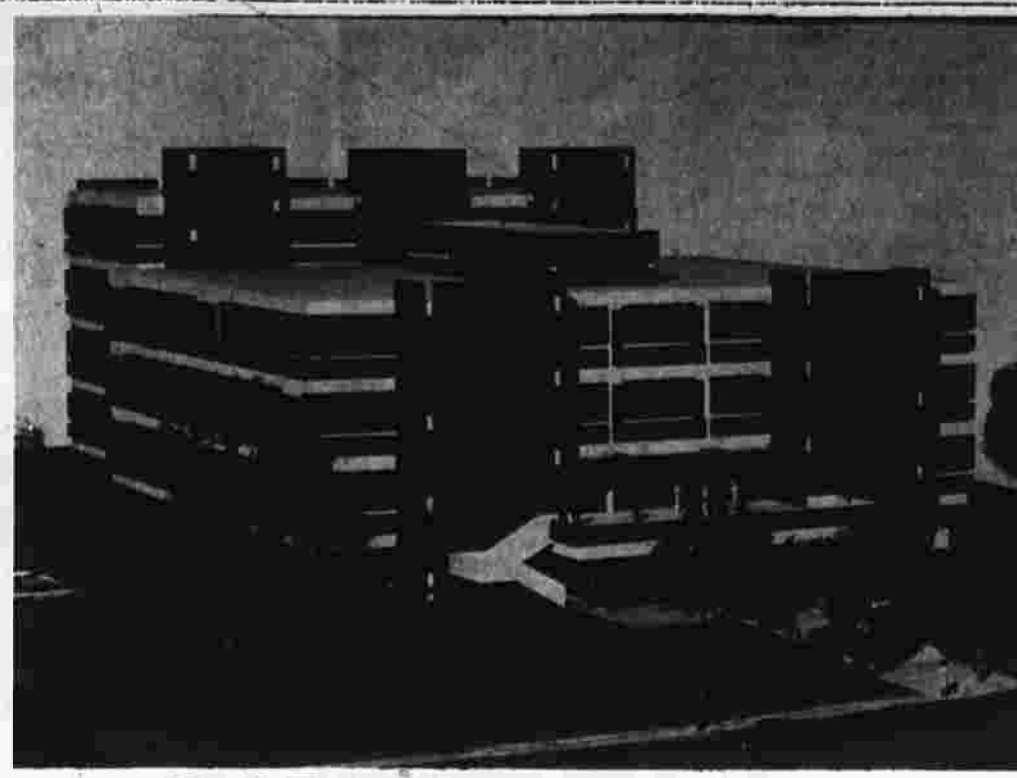
