Bolton Dr. Sheridan Town Head Of Girl Scout Campaign

Dr. Bernard J. Sheridan has been appointed Bolton chairman of the Connecticut Valley Girl Scout Council's annual campaign for the Connecticut Valley.

Hausman Questions Leroy Jones Control

HARTFORD (AP) — Republican State Chairman Howard Hausman called on Gov. John Dempsey today to explain why he had appointed Leroy Jones as director of the Department of Community Affairs.

Hausman said he was "seriously questioning the propriety" of the appointment.

He said the appointment was "engaging in secret consultation with the Democratic caucus of the Hartford City Council."

The Republican Mayor Ann Uccello took steps toward a federal investigation into the role of City Council Democrats in the selection of Jones as director of the Hartford City Council program.

Hanoi May Release Three U.S. Pilots

TOKYO (AP)—North Vietnamese officials today had decided to free three American pilots captured in the North and held at a police station in Saigon since this welcome news.

"We haven't been able to confirm the broadcast yet," the spokesman said, commenting on a dispatch from Tokyo, "but if it is true, we would certainly welcome it."

Hanoi's official Vietnam News Agency (VNA), monitored in Tokyo, said the pilots "had shown a repentant attitude during the period of detention" and were being set free in connection with the Tet lunar new year.

The agency did not identify the pilots or say how they would be released.

No captured pilots have ever before been turned free. One pilot, Navy Lt. Dieter Dengler, escaped from a Communist prison camp in Laos in the summer of 1968 and was picked up by an allied aircraft.

More than 100 U.S. airmen are known to have been captured after the nearly three-year air campaign over North Vietnam. Another 400 are listed as missing and a number of these are presumed captured.

The text of the brief VNA announcement:

"On the occasion of the Vietnamese lunar new year festival (1968), proceeding from the humanitarian and lenient policy of the government of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, the political department of the Vietnam People's Army has decided to set free three American pilots captured in North Vietnam."

"These pilots had shown a repentant attitude during the period of detention," the spokesman said.

South Vietnam's President Nguyen Van Thieu announced that he would release the prisoners—many of them held since the start of the war—shortly, to commemorate the new year.

The South Vietnamese government is also trying to release 40 North Vietnamese army invalid prisoners, a government spokesman reported. But Thieu added, so far North Vietnam has not indicated it would release any of them.

A message was conveyed to Hanoi "more than a month ago" through the International Red Cross, he said.

Ally Vessel Fired at in Viet Rescue

SAIGON (AP)—The U.S. Navy reported today the Australian guided missile destroyer Perth came under fire from enemy shore batteries Thursday while aiding a downed American pilot.

The Perth saw a U.S. F-4 Phantom II fighter jet shot down and fired protective barrages while a helicopter picked up the pilot, who was not identified.

The Navy said it was the second time in recent months that the Perth had aided in the rescue of downed fliers.

Recognizing Thursday's incidents, the Navy announced that the Perth, along with the U.S. destroyer Hornet, was carrying out a gunfire mission on North Vietnamese supply routes seven miles east of Vinh when enemy shore batteries opened fire. The first rounds landed between the two ships.

The Perth's rapid firing five-inch guns returned the enemy fire, and in response to her

FBI Confiscates Weapons, Explosives Seven Seized in 4-Bank Plot

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP)—The FBI has arrested seven men and accused them of plotting to blow up a police station and power plant and then rob four banks while the police were diverted.

The FBI said the seven planned to rob three banks in Redmond, a suburb of Seattle, and east of Lake City and Bellevue, and another in Des Moines, just south of Seattle, after blowing up the police station in the Redmond City Hall and a power plant in Redmond.

Federal agents said the men were led by Duane Ivan Carlson, 37, of Bothell, a church sexton and part-time maintenance man; Kelly E. Henderson, 34, 37, of Bothell, a civilian driver at St. Lewis, near Tacoma; Milton James Dix, 34, of Seattle, a longshoreman; and Jerome Edward Diemert, 43, of Arlington, an unemployed ship's officer.

De Pugh said Carlson probably was a Minuteman at one time "although I do not have any records before me. I believe he was dropped about a year ago for nonpayment of dues.
