In Spite Of The Bombing?

Defense Secretary Robert McNamara seems to be leaving office with at least a paper victory in one of his arguments.

The society which seems excellent in plumbing because plumbing is a humble activity, and tolerates abominations in philosophy.

And, in the past few days, the reports of our military establishment in South Vietnam have been sustaining McNamara's contention.

These reports all concerned what may be the greatest regular size battle of the whole war.

They began by crediting the enemy with moving a force of 10,000 men down into the Khe Sanh area in search of a major battle.

That force of 10,000 was augmented by daily reporting units, at one point, it had reached a 40,000 figure in the estimates of our own generals.

Not only was the enemy reported moving 40,000 men into one particular sector, there were also mentions of something never before reported in this war—the apparent movement of military armor, even including tanks, along the roads to the area.

The proportions of the enemy forces reported in this early paper reporting of the political battle may strike either on, and the battle itself may never take place.

Perhaps no one really knows which it may be—a lead from strength or a lead from desperation.

But there is one thing that does not reflect. It does not indicate that anything has interfered with the enemy's ability to move south into South Vietnam with as much force as he pleases.

This actual experience, this early demonstration of what Secretary McNamara claimed in his testimony before Congress, may prove the McNamara point, so far as the practical physical results of bombing are concerned.

Actually, however, neither the claims of our Air Force enthusiasts nor the downgraded evaluations of Secretary McNamara have discussed the real purpose of the bombing of North Vietnam.

That real purpose, in our opinion, was always intended to be mainly psychological. It was intended more to make the North Vietnamese afraid to keep on fighting in the South than it was to interfere with their actual physical movement South.

Our bombs were aimed more at their minds than at their noses. We know, or should have known from the Korean war—that it was impossible to halt their will, or our own military reports at the moment credit them with both the physical ability and the will to send their largest concentration of troops to the whole war into something close to a set battle with us.

WASHINGTON — At a moment when Communists are launching a new offensive in Vietnam and provoking a second-round crisis in Korea, President Johnson's new budget calls for a whopping 60 per cent increase in appropriations for the superpower transport (SST).

When Mr. Johnson's budget for the fiscal year is studied, the SST millions will quickly be hot out of Congressional limbo into a full-scale Congressional investigation.

If the outcome is in doubt, it is not because of the facts unvarnished so far, which clearly warrant investigation. But a move to evade a decision which is a business-as-usual budget.

Indeed, the President's unwillingness to put Washington on a wartime footing is hardly underlined by the background of the SST financing program.

A year ago, the President asked an appropriation of \$198 million for the SST, the 1,600-mile-per-hour fast word-in-transit travel whose development is being subsidized by Uncle Sam.

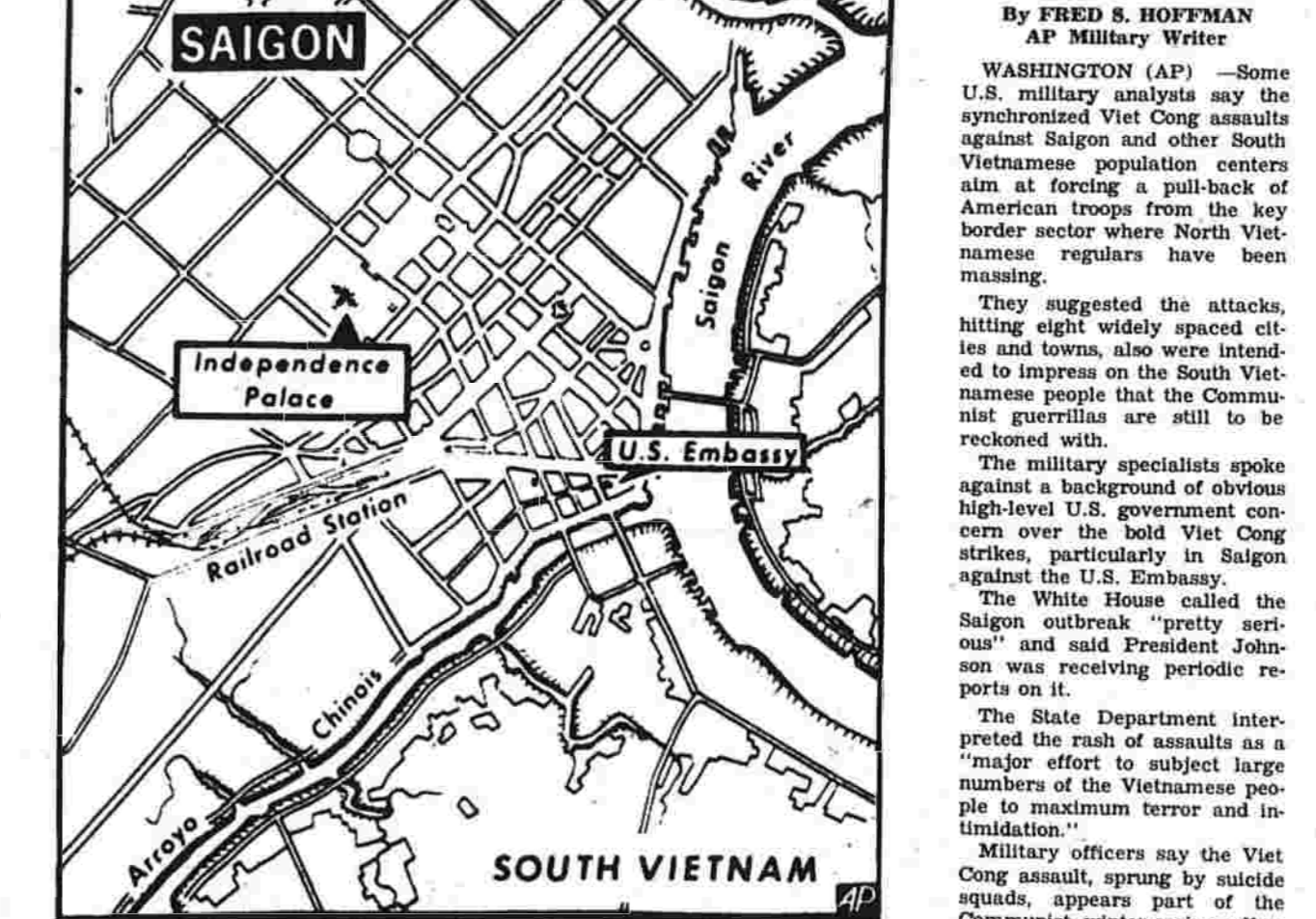
