AEC Reveals Advances In ICBM Construction

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Atomic Energy Commission disclosed today the United States may be close to significant breakthrough in enhancing the powers of American missile-tipped intercontinental missiles to penetrate an enemy's antimissile defenses.

It did so in a report saying that:

1. America already leads the world in the "nuclear defense" field;
2. Improved nuclear weapons of various types including "decoy" missiles, such as atomic land mines were added last year to the missile; and
3. The nation's nuclear weapons are even now working toward developing even more advanced types.

The AEC's annual report to Congress did not specifically describe the letter.

But apparently they entail still further progress toward ensuring that American missiles are launched after an attack on the United States — would at least partially be able to foil, decoy or penetrate enemy defenses — including their own missiles, and ground-based electronic detection devices.

The AEC put it this way: "A major weapons development objective has been the improvement of the penetration ability of strategic missile nuclear devices elsewhere in the area.

Referring to "underground" weapons, the report said that the AEC said the past year had marked a continuation of "an aggressive" program of that nature undertaken when the limited test ban treaty — outlawing all but underground tests — went into effect in 1963.

The report also said that as a result of the development of "more sophisticated test devices," it had been able to carry on, beneath the ground, weapons tests which previously had been thought possible only in the atmosphere.

The report also said that late this year the United States would launch two additional satellites — "with further improvements and suggested capabilities" — in the program designed to detect any sneak attacks of explosion tests conducted in space. This would bring to eight the number of satellites engaged in the mission, all of them in "hardened" pairs.

The AEC also reported that the nation has further improved its "readiness capability to respond to nuclear test in the event of a nuclear test ban treaty by another nation and a subsequent decision by the United States to resume testing in the atmosphere."

CHARLESTON, W. Va. (AP)—Another Rockefeller has entered politics — but in West Virginia of all places, and as a Democrat.

He is John D. (Jay) Rockefeller IV, great grandson of the empire builder and member of one of the nation's best-known Republican families. Jay, whose Uncle Nelson is Republican governor of New York and whose Uncle Whitcomb is a GOP gubernatorial candidate in Arkansas, filed Monday for a seat in the West Virginia House of Delegates.

NEW YORK (AP)—"Life is a kind of shaggy dog joke without a punchline," said the man with the brown beard.

But although life may be inconclusive it is far from unwarding to the man with the brown beard—British author John Fowles. At 50, Fowles, former teacher at a girls' school in London, has turned the corner of literary success.

His first, published novel, "The Collector," the creepy story of a young man who captures a girl as if she were a butterfly and keeps her prisoner until she dies, was made into a successful film.

His latest novel, which has an even eraser treatment of the man playing God theme, is the January selection of the Literary Guild. Fowles also has sold the paperback rights for \$125,000 and is doing a movie script.

"But there are some bad things about having money," he said. "It gives you too much freedom to buy. When you can buy anything within reason you aren't a conventional middle-class type who looks down on working people.

GI's Personal Messages Brought Home by Singer

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—"Hollywood, you know how I miss you, especially at this time of year. Keep your fingers crossed; it's just eight more months. By the end of August I'll be home."

This message, in the words of an American soldier in Viet Nam, will be heard by his wife this week, thanks to singer Jack Jones. Last week Jones finished processing several dozen taped messages he recorded with GIs on his recent trip to the battle zones with the Bob Hope troupe.

"I felt inadequate as a male entertainer going over there with five beauties," said Jones, who accompanied Carroll Baker, Joey Heatherton, Anita Bryant, Kay Stevens and Miss U.S.A. "I tried to think of some extra contribution I could make. After every show, I went among the soldiers and asked them to put on tape the name and address of the folks back home, and that's a message for them."

"The boys responded wonderfully. Some of them closed their eyes and said, 'I love you, sweetheart,' just as if they were talking to their wives."

Back here, Jones put the messages on three-inch reels and mailed them to the next of kin. He is recommending the device to other entertainers going to Viet Nam.

Jones is anxious to go back. Even a month afterward, his voice rises with emotion as he talks about the next of kin.

"You can't realize what it's like until you're over there facing 20,000 guys who are far from home," said he.

UN Units Keep Quiet Peace Along Once Hot Gaza Strip

GAZA (AP) — Stretched border in something like a thin line of desert from the Gaza Strip to the Egyptian Sinai Peninsula, UN units keep the peace in an almost unbroken line of UN units.

"Incidents have been few," comments Lt. Col. Gregory Bernhoff, commander of the joint Danish-Norwegian battalion. "There have been some attempts by both sides to cross the border from time to time but no serious clashes have taken place. Farmers have been able to cultivate their lands and to take care of their livestock within a few meters of the demarcation line and people on both sides go about their business without interference from each other."

Bats' Sonar May Help in Insect Control

WASHINGTON (AP) — Bat sonar — the means by which bats use sound to find their way around — may provide a key to new and safe methods of insect control, two government researchers reported today.

The idea stems from the fact that bats emit high-pitched chirps and use the echoes not only to navigate but also to locate and track insects for food.

It has been found by other scientists, the researchers said, that moths get panicky and fly away from a given area when they hear a bat's ultrasonic chirping — or artificially produced sounds imitating it.

As a result, they told a national symposium on pest control sponsored by the National Academy of Sciences, field studies were not made for the control of insects in the United States and Canada to evaluate the method for use in protecting crops from certain insects.

The account was given by Prof. Stuart O. Nelson, a U.S. Department of Agriculture researcher stationed at the University of Alabama, and Dr. John S. East of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Laurel, Md.

It was one of the highlights of a report in which they said that various forms of electromagnetic energy such as radio waves — as well as sonic and ultrasonic energy may offer new methods for control of insect pests.

"Such possibilities have received more attention in the last few years because of increased concern about effects of pesticides on human and animal health," they said.

They added that experiments in Ontario, Canada, already have shown that "broadcasts of bat-like ultrasound over a plot of corn control red-winged blackbirds by the European corn borer by greater than 10 per cent."

HARTFORD (AP) — James G. Harris Jr. is leaving his post in the War on Poverty to become a special assistant to Gov. John Dempsey.

Harris, 35, has been state coordinator for the Office of Economic Opportunity since last March.

Dempsey, who announced the appointment Tuesday, effective immediately, said Harris' background in welfare, civil rights and anti-poverty work "will be a great asset to this office."

Mining Area Berlin Turnpike Merchants Seek Planning Firm's Aid Quiet Today

BRUSSELS, Belgium (AP) — The coal mining area of northern Belgium was reported quiet today after police and riotously injured a woman in a recently injured.

Police said a bullet struck the woman in the back Tuesday night while miners fought police at the Winterslag coal mine.

Army paratroopers moved into the area Tuesday after miners striking against the closing of a mine rioted. Two miners were killed Monday.

Some 4,000 miners went on strike last week to protest a government decision to withdraw subsidies from the privately owned Zwartberg mine, which have been pending since 1958.

Violence broke out Monday, when the strikers were joined by Flemish nationalists, who want Belgium divided into a two-state federation.

The coalition Cabinet of Social Christian Premier Pieter de Maeter met until 3 a.m. today. Ministers said the government would decide Friday on a procedure for closing the Zwartberg mine. One proposal was to make sure miners have other jobs before they are dismissed.

The Catholic-Socialist government was reported heavily split over a threatened nationwide doctors' strike set for Sunday.

The doctors want a 6-per-cent increase in their fees under the national health insurance plan and an end to free treatment of patients in Socialist health insurance clinics, which the doctors claim is unfair competition.

35 Arrested After Sitting On Icy Street

NEW YORK (AP) — A group of anti-Viet Nam demonstrators broke away from a protest march in Times Square Tuesday night and sat on the icy streets and blocked traffic.

Thirty-five were arrested.

An estimated 100 persons marched from the United Nations headquarters to protest the bombing of North Viet Nam by the United States.

At the U.N. they had staged a 24-hour silent vigil.

The demonstration was orderly until the group darted from the police barricades into the streets. The sitdown by the young men and women halted traffic at the intersection of Seventh Avenue and 42nd Street.

Some sat in the snow-covered streets and some crouched on their heels. One demonstrator carefully unfolded a newspaper and sat on it.

Police asked the demonstrators three times to move, then carried them to the police vans. About 10 women were in the group and they walked to the vans, escorted by two policemen each.

A second sitdown demonstration was staged at Seventh Avenue and 42nd Street.

Police charged the demonstrators with disorderly conduct.

Viet Issue Dominates NY Election

NEW YORK (AP) — Viet Nam is dominating the special election campaign for Mayor John V. Lindsay's old congressional seat, even though both principal candidates seem to advocate the same course: Peace with honor as soon as possible.

"You don't take a firm stand in quicksand," says the Republican candidate, Theodore R. Kuperman, 49. But he adds that the United States cannot withdraw until it insures Democratic government in Viet Nam.

"It is for every possible effort to bring about peace," says Democrat Orin Lehman, 46. But he adds that it must be "an honorable peace."

The third man in the race, Conservative Jeffrey St. John, 35, calls Kuperman and Lehman the "leftist peace-at-any-price team."

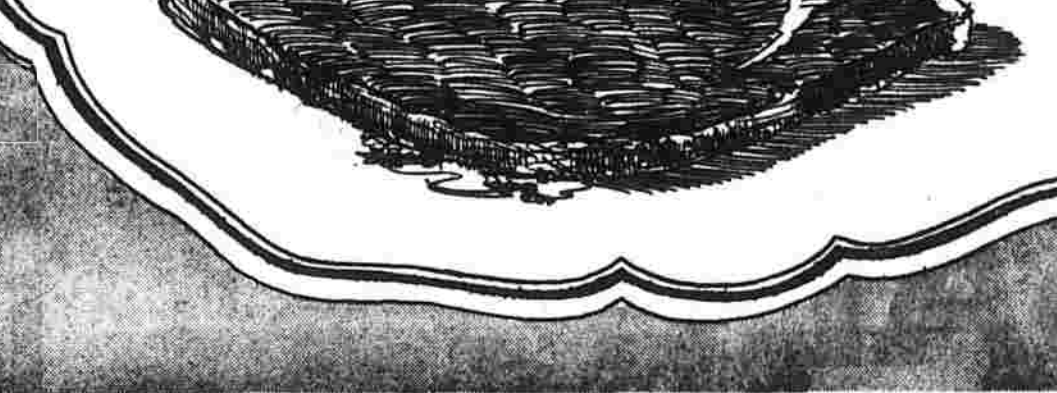

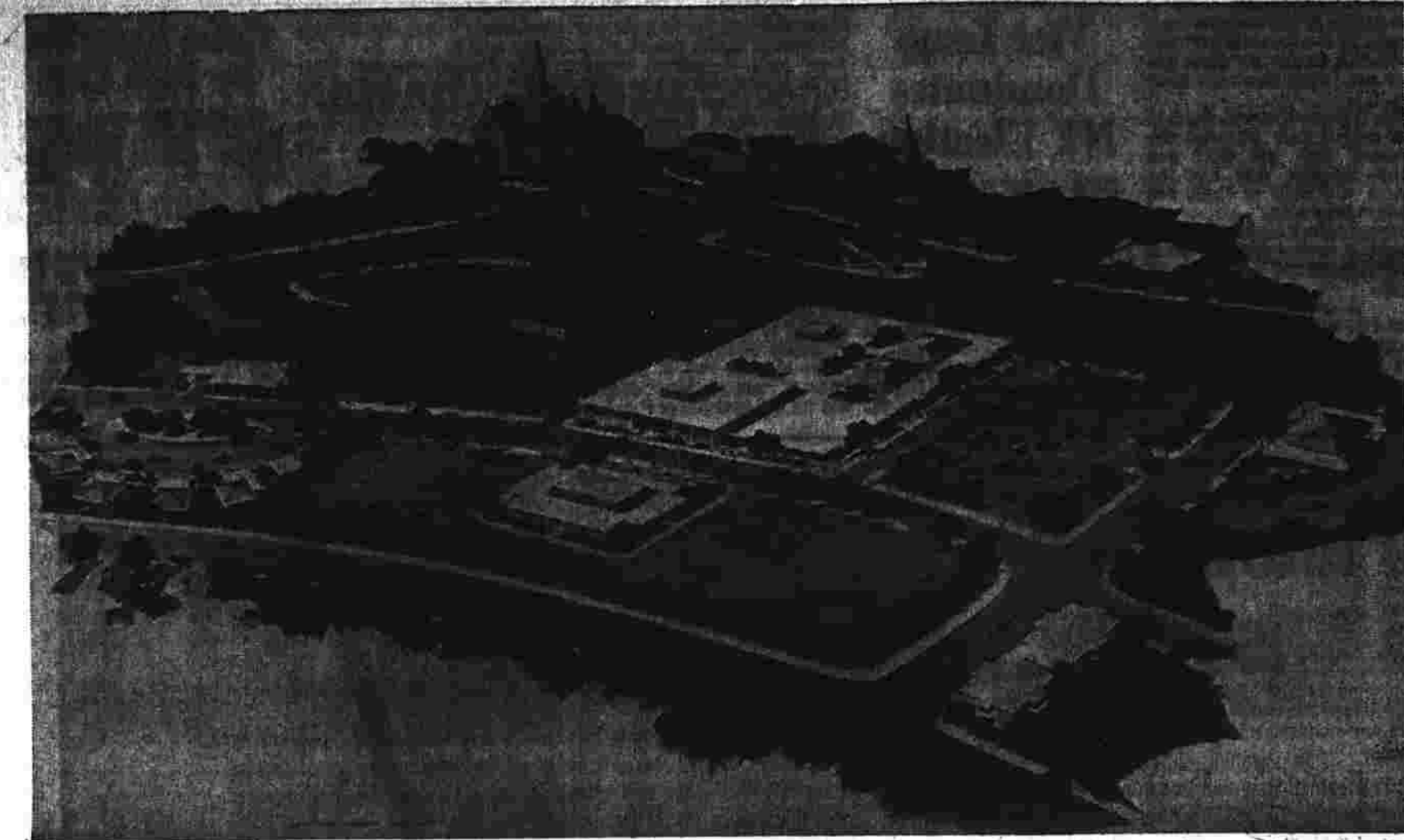

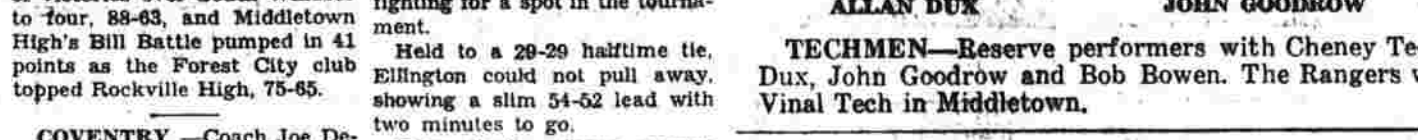
Winter Snow Cuts Sports Schedules

CHICAGO (AP) — Jesse Owens, the superb track star who ruffled Adolf Hitler by winning four gold medals in the 1936 Olympics, was fined \$3,000 Tuesday in an income tax case.

Owens had entered a plea of no contest to charges that he had failed to file income tax returns on \$25,135 for the years of 1959 through 1962.

Judge Joseph S. Perry said Owens "good influence on the community" and after 30 minutes of comment he imposed the fine of \$3,000 which is payable within six months.

The maximum penalty would have been four years in prison and a \$50,000 fine under the criminal charge placed by the government.

Owens, who has spent recent years working for the Illinois Youth Commission and coaching basketball, has had numerous appearances before youth groups in addition to a national television spot with Judge Perry's ruling.

"I certainly regret that I had to be brought before you," Owens told Judge Perry. "I want you to know this was not a willful violation. For many years I have tried to build a reputation in this country. All I ask is an opportunity to prove to my family and the community and my country."

Diabetes Prediction May Be Possible

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. Public Health Service scientists say the work of researchers in Dallas may pave the way to predicting diabetes.


Dr. Jesse Roth, UNPHS told newsmen Thursday Dr. M. D. Papanicolaou, director of the University of Texas Southwest Medical School and the Veterans Administration Hospital in Dallas had found abnormal thickening of capillary membranes in diabetics when they examined tissue samples with electron microscope.

While their technique would be too costly and difficult for large-scale use, it may be possible to develop a simpler test based on the discovery, Roth said.

Text For A Citation For Bolton?

The Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations is composed of members of Congress and others, and mayors. In its ninth annual report to Congress, the commission tried to shake the American people up a little by opening with the following language: "In 1967, the American political system—in its form, its structure, its processes, its values, its goals—has become so unrecognizable to the American people that it is almost unrecognizable to the American people."

And the same phrase closed on a similar note of strident alarm. "The challenge of today," it said, "are cast in a setting of racial unrest and civil disorder, burgeoning crime and delinquency, alarming differences in individual opportunity for education, housing and employment. Historically, these constitute no more—albeit a highly dramatic—chapter in the American story than the struggle to fulfill the mighty promise of Jefferson's declaration within and through the balanced, constitutional system of our founders in the great charter of 1789."

The manner of meeting these challenges, the preface concluded, will largely determine the fate of the American political system; it will determine if we can maintain a form of government marked by participation and democratic competition among national, state and local levels, or if instead—in the face of threatened anarchy—we must sacrifice political democracy for the sake of the authoritarian action required for the nation's survival.

That is the sweeping generalization about the peril facing the American way of life today.

One of the phrases the Commission used in its diagnosis of America's ills: "The nation is in a state of almost universal decline." It said there is, unfortunately, a growing recognition that "somewhere the 'white noise' around the center of this nation would have to be cut."

The "white noise," it is, of course, the tendency of some suburbs to keep themselves safe from involvement with or invasion by dramatic, terrible problems inside the cities.

All this we have quoted, and we think, we converted into something of a formal citation of the Board of Education of the town of Bolton, for leading that suburban community voluntarily, of its own good instinct and resolve, into its effort to be host to a token number of Project Concern children.

Project Concern tries to do something about that "white noise."

It is of almost equal significance that it tells something important about, and does something important for, communities which consider it.

The answer, among Americans today, is not always as negative and hopeless as that big commission down in Washington seems to fear.

Worse Than The Pessimists Said

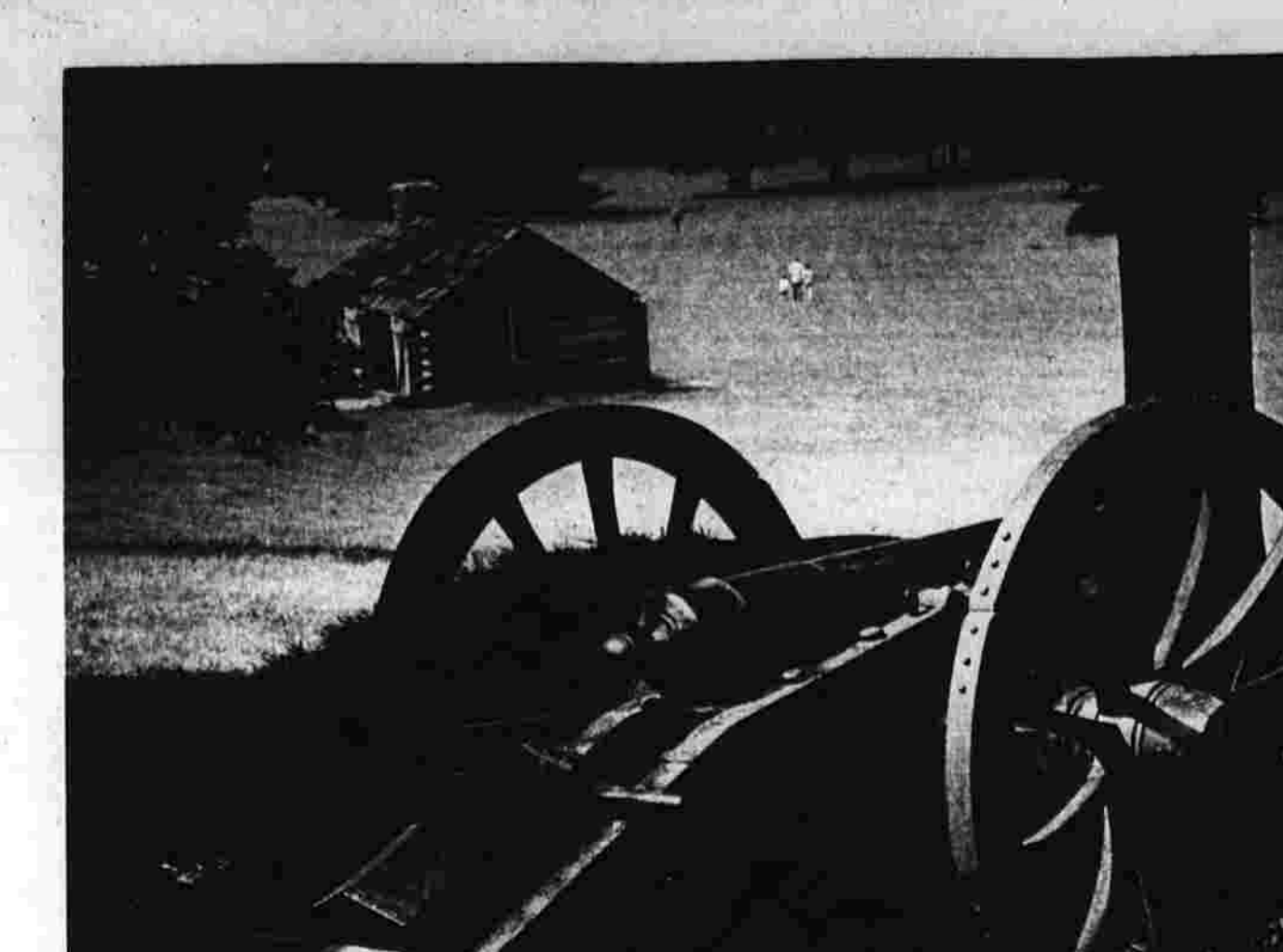
It will be some time before, even after the present country-wide guerrilla assaults have been quieted down, there is any full report of what actually went on, and how high the tide of guerrilla effort really reached into the big population centers of South Vietnam.

But it seems likely that some of the main objectives of the coordinated assaults have already been achieved. The American forces have been forced to fight with tanks for part of the city of Saigon itself. They have been forced to bomb their own air strips in order to clear the guerrillas off them. They have been forced to concede the ability of the enemy to penetrate temporarily, almost any square mile anywhere in the whole country. It has been demonstrated that the native population, and even in some instances, the native civil authorities, offered no opposition to the activities of the guerrillas, but did on occasion seem to welcome them. It has been driven home to us that the American effort in Vietnam, formidable and gigantic as it is, experienced though it had presumably become through three years of straddling, was not really geared to deal with the kind of war the enemy could throw at it.

The one generalization which rises out of all this is that these commentators and analysts, in both the political and news fields, who have been most pessimistic about real progress in Vietnam, all along, have been close to the truth.

No Washington optimist is going to be claiming, for at least a while now, that we are "winning" in Vietnam.

What will the Johnson Administration's instinctive reaction now be? On the one hand, of course, it would be to redouble the policies and escalations which have brought us to the present point. The guerrilla is deeper and more treacherous than we thought; do we therefore put more weight into it? We are already in much deeper than we expected to be, could we pull ourselves out now, even if we wanted to? If asking ourselves such questions strikes a note of helplessness, of insolvability, of "this is a job for the gods," the way it is. As has been the case for three years now, following our first plunge into the bombing of North Vietnam, only some thirty party card members, if we ever become willing to be rescued.

WASHINGTON—In confidential talks at the White House last week, the President's close advisers revealed that the White House is planning to take full charge of 1968 Presidential campaign planning. Typically, no campaign titles were offered or accepted, and O'Brien's status may not survive preliminary stages of the campaign. But for now he is de facto campaign manager. The fact that the President has gone beyond his innermost circle for professional campaign help not only reflects his realization that his campaign will not be the walk-through parade of 1964 but gives long-suffering state party leaders something to cheer about for a change.

They long ago abandoned all hope that the Democratic National Committee would be re-habilitated to run the campaign. The President obviously was not about to name O'Brien to replace John Bailey, now beginning his eighth year as head of National' Chairman, as generally desired in the party. John Orinwell, treasurer and operating head of the National Committee, has gained the respect of several state leaders but remains a vessel to Watson.

State Democratic politicians like Mr. Johnson himself are more than ready to accept the President's political advice, and the experience has been considerably less than satisfactory. A Texas conservative, Watson like Mr. Johnson himself is suspicious of Kennedy-oriented party leaders from industrial states and makes no effort to hide it. Thus, O'Brien will provide a bridge between Mr. Johnson and the heart of Democratic strength.

In addition, Mr. Johnson will continue to rely for advice on his longtime political kitchen cabinet: Rowe, Clark Clifford, and Arthur Krim of United Artists, the party's top national fund raiser.
