21 Miners Trapped After Fire

CALIMET, La. (AP) — Twenty-one miners were trapped deep in the eerie caverns of a salt mine early today after fire broke out in a shaft and severed an elevator hoist. The last word heard from the men, about 100 feet down, was: "Pull up the cage!" After that, communications cables were burned and set afire. Those on the surface swore off their fate.

Emergency units swarmed into the remote marshy area bordering the Gulf of Mexico, where salt mining is a multi-million dollar industry in large domes that reach like smokestacks into the earth. State Police Sgt. Thomas Burbank said troopers at the scene reported workers were trying to build another shaft in an attempt to reach the isolated men.

"We believe that the fire is still hot," a spokesman for the Salt Mines said at mid-morning. "We did have a fire which damaged a hoist cable that's why we can't get the men out." At his headquarters in Minneapolis, Minn., a Cargill spokesman said his safety director, Roy Greizer, reported that emergency oxygen equipment, masks and lighting was situated in the mining area where the men were located.

Greizer said the Federal Bureau of Mines, whose nearest location is Dallas, had been informed and that an emergency crew from the bureau was preparing to go to the scene. The Cargill spokesman said the night crew superintendent had called from the mining level about 11:30 p.m. Tuesday and reported a fire in the shaft, presumably near the cage lift. It was at this point, the superintendent said: "Pull up the cage!"

Rescue units expected it would take several hours to reestablish communications, since it was not known exactly where the men were stranded. Shafts reach to different depth levels and the miners could be as deep as 1,200 feet. "A new elevator, or 'man cage' as it is called, was built at the plant during the morning and fitted into the shaft. Rescue teams were told to lower the lift 'as far and as progressively as conditions would permit.'"

At New Orleans, the Coast Guard said it had dispatched an 82-foot patrol boat from Morgan City to assist in rescue operations. It also had received a request from the Cargill company for a crane, but reported none available.

Families of the miners were kept advised of progress being made in rescue operations, but were warned not to go to the mine area. They live in the area.

All 63 Passengers Killed In Guadeloupe Plane Crash

POINTE-A-PITRE, Guadeloupe (AP) — Rescue crews reached the wreckage of an Air France 707 Boeing jet today and reported that all 63 persons on board, including a woman identified as the wife of real estate Pointe-a-Pitre's Rabel Airport, had perished. The plane ploughed into it as it headed for a landing at Pointe-a-Pitre's Rabel Airport, about 30 miles away. Witnesses said the jet burst into flames and exploded. A resident of the nearby village of Matouba Mountain said the crash was coming in at an extremely low altitude. I heard it land French West Indies territory explode like a bomb.

Czech General Defects

WASHINGTON (AP) — Maj. Gen. Jan Sejna, until recently a top political officer of the Czech army, has been admitted to the United States as a refugee, officials said today.

Sejna, a former official in the defense ministry and a member of parliament, fled Czechoslovakia last week with his 18-year-old son and a 22-year-old girl. Authorities here said they understood the general is his son's fiancée.

Sejna and the two young people were reported to have traveled through Hungary, Yugoslavia and Italy en route to the United States. The general fled while Czech courts were taking away his immunity as a member of parliament. Press dispatches from Prague reported he was accused of misappropriating state funds.

Washington authorities said they believed he had wound up on the "wrong side" of a political controversy which has unsettled top Communist officials in Czechoslovakia.

On Friday, Czechoslovakia's chief military prosecutor Jan Simek, said Sejna had crossed the Czechoslovak-Hungarian border by car on Feb. 25. "The search for him has so far remained without results," Simek added then.

Sejna would be the highest ranking official to defect to Warsaw. Fact power to have defected and would have much knowledge of interest to Western intelligence.

U.S. Told to Halt Saigon Corruption

WASHINGTON (AP) — A top U.S. civilian adviser says the United States must boldly take the initiative to root out corruption in South Vietnam's government because, he insists, there aren't honest Viet namese officials to do the job.

"Corruption is permeating all echelons of government and society, corroding the vitality of this nation, eroding the frame work of government and unnecessarily prolonging the war," the adviser said in private reports from Vietnam.

The reports were made available to The Associated Press on Monday. The condition that the adviser, chief of a 23-man team in Vietnam, not be identified.

Saying the United States "must take the initiative in this (remedial) action" and, once having started, must continue until the adviser declared: "Vietnamese officials are so involved in the game that they can't even see the need to reform themselves. If we are divided, we may lose forever the opportunity to meet the challenges of this generation."

The 1964 presidential candidate had said 24 hours earlier that "conservatives want no part of Rockefeller" — and the remark prompted pleas from around the country for Republicans to unify and beat the Democrats.
