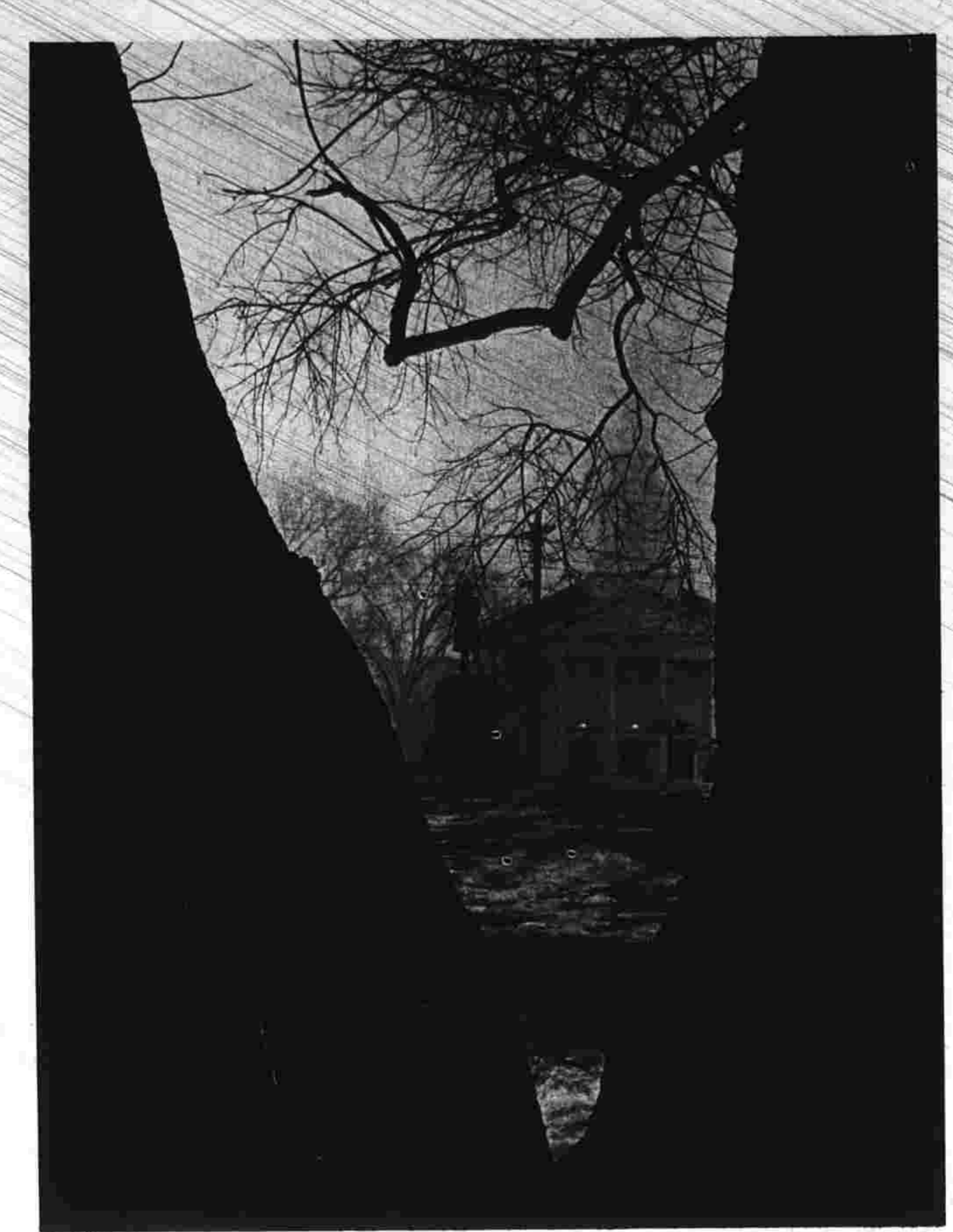

School Board Hears Outline Of Contract for Project ASK

If the Vernon Board of Education enters into a contract with Project ASK, it will be part of a joint effort of 22 towns and Windham County to improve the quality of education in the area.

The main components of the proposed contract which would allow the towns to share special services of the Ancillary Services Center were explained to the Board of Education last night by Wilson Tilley, director of the project.

The contract was drawn up by Atty. John Kottner of Manchester. The center, Tilley explained, would otherwise normally be beyond the capability of an individual community.

Signing a contract would not require any expenditures by the individual Boards of Education until July of 1970, Tilley explained.

Albert Kerkin, a teacher at the middle school, who is in charge of the project locally, told the board that the biggest problem is the testing to determine which schools need the services of the center.

The contract would allow local autonomy for Boards of Education in the performance of their statutory duties and at the same time provide boards with the means to furnish extra services.

It would also provide for the planning and implementation of future programs which may be supported by funds of federal, state and local governments.

Representatives on Panel In order to give each member board a voice in the policy of the service center, the proposed contract provides for representation by each member board on the Supervisory Committee, whose policy would be implemented through an executive committee which it would elect.

In agreeing to contract with the Special Services Center, the Board of Education would be creating a way to get programs supported by federal and state funds which would not be possible for sponsorship by an individual school board.

The contract provides for the election of a supervisory committee which would act as the agent for the member boards and in this capacity would supervise all of the programs agreed upon.

This committee would be composed of the superintendent of schools of the member boards and one member from each member board. The boards would elect a member by ballot.

In turn, the supervisory committee would elect an executive committee to implement policy of the supervisory group. Each town's share of the total budget would depend on total enrollment.

Any member board may withdraw from the contract agreement if it gives written notice of its intent to do so to each member board a year prior to the date of the proposed withdrawal.

Even if a board withdraws, however, it must be responsible for its share of the current operating budget.

Nader Hits Mine Health

WASHINGTON (AP) — Safety critic Ralph Nader charged the U.S. Bureau of Mines is not pressing high health and safety standards because "it is the captive of the coal mine operators."

Nader also accused United Mine Workers leadership of siding with coal mine operators against better preventive safety measures.

The Washington attorney, noted for his auto safety and meat inspection campaigns, made the charge Monday in a letter to the U.S. Secretary of Interior Stewart L. Udall.

He urged a congressional inquiry into miner lung disease from coal dust and said the bureau has not urged coal dust control standards even though an estimated 10,000 miners suffer from the disease.

Nader charged the bureau meets regularly with coal mine operators and union officials before drafting recommendations to Congress.

The bureau denied the charges and the union issued a statement saying it has "led the fight for coal mine health and safety in spite of strong opposition at times from the coal industry and federal state governments."

New Surgical Technique

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two South Carolina surgeons have reported a novel new technique for controlling weakened sections of a major abdominal blood vessel which can balloon and burst.

Increasing the aneurysms on the abdominal aorta in healthily "exceptional" children is emotionally disturbed, socially maladjusted, perceptually handicapped in 21 of 27 patients.

The rupture of a large aneurysm on the main arterial blood in a pipeline from the heart can be fatal.

Doctors J. Manly Stallworth and Antonio Ramirez, of the Medical College of South Carolina, said Monday the knitted cloth reinforcement can be used when surgical repair of the artery is too dangerous to the patient.

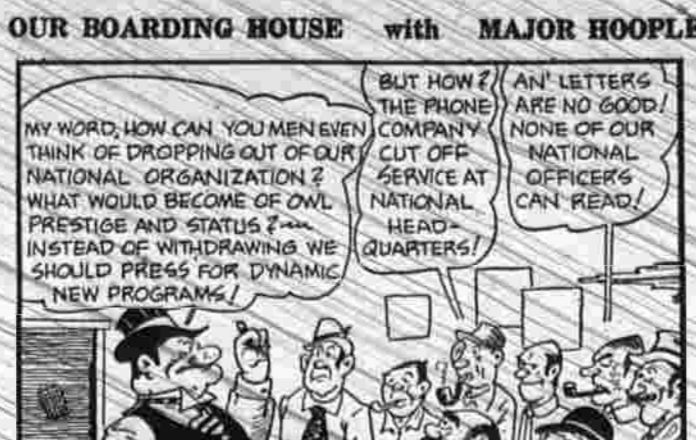

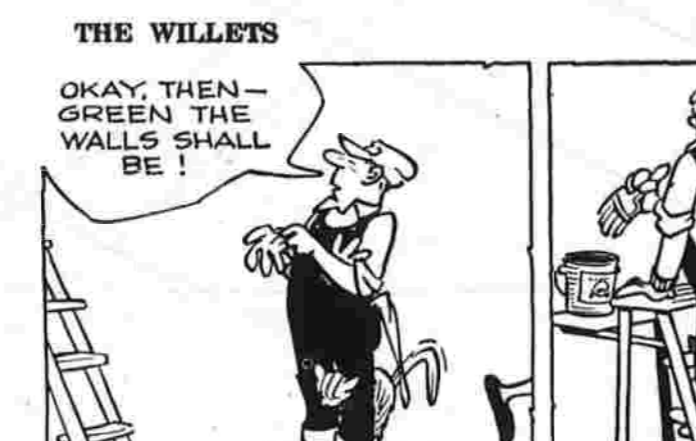

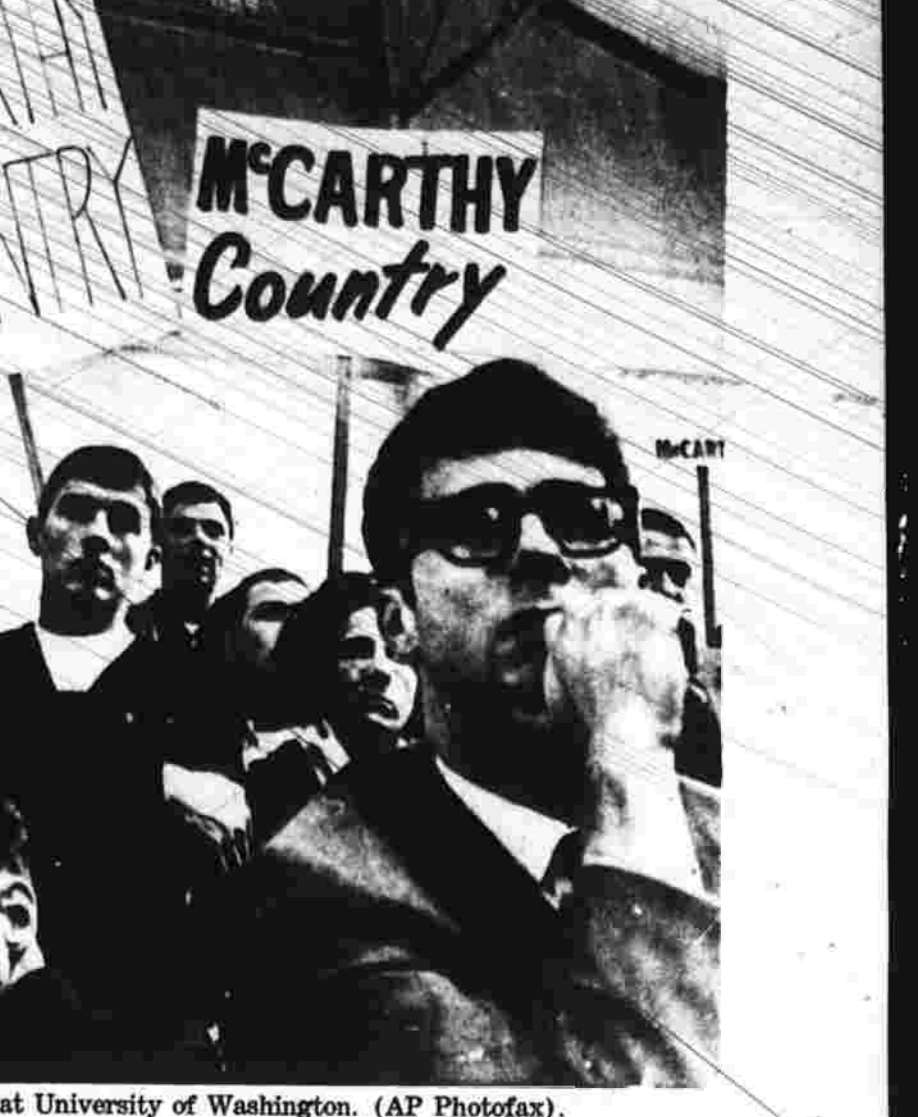
