Tolland Law Banning Rotating Signs Is Appealed to Zone Board

Owners of a rotating sign, turkey, gravy, mashed potatoes, which is presently required to remain in a stationary position, have appealed to the Zone Board of Appeals for a public hearing. It will be held April 22 at 8 p.m. in the town hall.

The exception is being sought by Mercury Oil Company, which to convert an existing outdoor pole sign from a fixed position to a rotating sign.

The subject of rotating and oscillating signs has been a bone of contention between the Planning and Zoning Commission and the ZBA. The PZC specifically states that no sign will be permitted which moves in any direction.

Despite this regulation, rotating signs have been installed at all the newly constructed gasoline stations along Merrow Rd.

Edridge Yost, owner of the Shell Station on Merrow Rd. and Rhodes Rd., obtained a Zoning Board of Appeals, which was granted because the sign "rotated" and oscillated.

The sign on the American station owned by Mercury Oil rotated until about a month ago when PZC Chairman Walter Beaton notified the building inspector the sign was in violation of town zoning regulations.

The appeals decision will likely have an effect on the type of signs that will be permitted at gas stations to be constructed on the corner of Merrow Rd. and Goose Lane.

John H. Noyes of Manchester will seek a variance of rear and side yards to permit the proposed addition to an existing building for storage on the westerly side of Rt. 30, 1400 feet from the intersection of Kingsbury Ave. and Rt. 30.

Sheinwold on Bridge

Since our subject this week in the fitness perhaps we should try to say just what we're talking about: A fitness is an attempt to win a trick with a card that is not the highest unplayed card of its suit. South missed this simple point in today's hand.

Partner opens with two spades, forcing to game, and the next player passes. You hold: Spades, 9-8-4; Hearts, 10-8-7-6-5; Diamonds, 10-8-7-6-5; Clubs, K-10-9-8-7.

Answer: Bid 2NT, the negative response. Your hand is not quite strong enough for a positive response.

Misses Chance Either South didn't realize that he had a chance to make the winning play in diamonds, or, more likely, he thought that West had the ace. At any rate, he played another trump from dummy. When South led a third diamond, West won and got out safely with the king. South eventually had to give up the setting trick to the king of diamonds.

South should draw only two rounds of trumps before tackling the diamonds. Then if he misplays the diamonds, he still has a chance. When South leads the king of diamonds, West must win and return a heart or a spade. Either return would give South his contract so long as South has the ace of hearts.

Alabama license 1-8969, Birmingham police said this tag had been issued to Eric S. Galt, 2608 Highland Ave., Birmingham.

In Atlanta, the residents who first told police about the abandoned white Mustang said the car bore the same Alabama license as the white Mustang. It was a 1967 Buick Wildcat.

The FBI was all over the place before the car was impounded, an Atlanta witness said. He said the vehicle was towed away between 8:15 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. Thursday—about the time the Florida teletype message was sent.

Witnesses in Memphis who reported seeing a white Mustang pull away from the rooming house said the car had a red and white license plate. Alabama tags are red and white.

The Birmingham address given on the tag is a large white two-story house in what once was an elite residential area. A red neon sign flashes the word "rooms," but a knock on the door was unanswered.

A Birmingham newspaper, the Post-Herald, said residents of the rooming house confirmed they had been questioned by the FBI. It also reported they had not seen Galt for about three months and could not recall what type car he owned.

King was killed as he stood outside his motel room about 200 feet from the bathroom window in the rooming house. Witnesses said they saw King being taken to the rooming house, dropped a bungee cord including a .206 rifle in the rooming house.

King had come to Memphis to attend the city's 1,000 striking garbage collectors, 98 per cent of whom are Negroes.

Vernon Police Union Denies Reports Of 100% Pay Hike Requests

Sgt. Clarence Neff, president of the local police union, today denied a report that salary requests are 100 per cent of what they were last year.

The union said the actual increase being asked will represent a high of 12 per cent to a low of 7.5 per cent. It is noted that the highest per cent represents the increase for starting patrolmen.

The union also denied that the union came in initially with one request and then upped it considerably during the negotiations. The source of the report was learned by Neff as "completely irresponsible."

Neff said the original proposal presented to the town shortly after the beginning of the year and has not been increased. He further points out that the police department has only received one raise since consolidation was instituted three years ago and that the 7.5 to 12 per cent increase being asked is not unreasonable.

No Raise Last Year

Neff added that town employees below the union did not receive a raise last year when the non-union employees did receive an eight per cent increase. He said at that time it was anticipated that the proposal was for a five per cent increase and this was considered not sufficient.

Neff further notes the police union does not know of any condition that has made the cost of living go down since last year. He continued, "But still we are not asking for a 100 per cent increase as the considerable increase as the contract which we proposed certain items (such as vacation, holidays and sick time).

Driver Gets Jail Term in Boy's Death

BRIDGEPORT (AP) — A 19-year-old whose car fatally injured a child while the youth was being chased by Norfolk police has been sentenced to one year in the Fairfield State Jail.

Superior Court Judge Samuel H. Tedesco pronounced sentence Thursday in the case of Othello Hayward of South Norwalk, who was charged with the manslaughter of a 12-year-old boy.

The judge gave the youth credit for five months and 11 days served at the police cruiser later.

Police said these charges resulted from an incident in which the youth was chased by Norfolk police for payment of damages to a car, striking a pole and injuring himself and a companion.

Vernon School Board Plans Review Of Study on Sex Education

Recommendations of the Health and Family Life Study Committee will be reviewed by the Board of Education at its curriculum meeting Monday at 7:30 at Sykes School, Mrs. Callahan said.

The committee has held several meetings to come up with a proposal for the board which will integrate into the education system the special course on health and family life. The course will include sex education.

The State Board of Education approved Wednesday an official policy statement on sex education and family life and urges public school systems throughout the state to teach the subject from kindergarten through high school.

The state board approved a statement submitted by a 10-member advisory committee headed by Dr. William Seltzer, a psychiatrist at the Institute of Living.

The statement emphasizes the importance of the schools setting as an agency within the community to help students learn how to make rational decisions that would benefit themselves and the groups with which they live.

Reaching what the local committee has already suggested, the state committee stated that in addition to providing sex and family life education for school children, public schools should also consider setting up courses for parents.

Six proposals made by Vernon has been studying the possibility of the special health and family life course for some three years. Interested parents are invited to attend Monday night's meeting to air their views on the subject.

The study committee will make six recommendations to the board for consideration. It is suggested that the program be studied in terms of a more effective part of the total health program in the schools.

A second recommendation is that health and family life education program be placed under the direction of a separate health department or coordinator to properly integrate the program.

Another recommendation to be made is that a committee of educators be appointed by the superintendent of schools to make a study of the present health and family life curriculum during the coming school year. They would then work out a new health curriculum and course syllabus during the summer of 1969.

The setting up of an advisory board of six or eight parents and professional people to aid the curriculum and syllabus committee is another recommendation to be considered.

The instituting of a course in health and family life education for adults and the relating of the study committee are two other recommendations to be made.

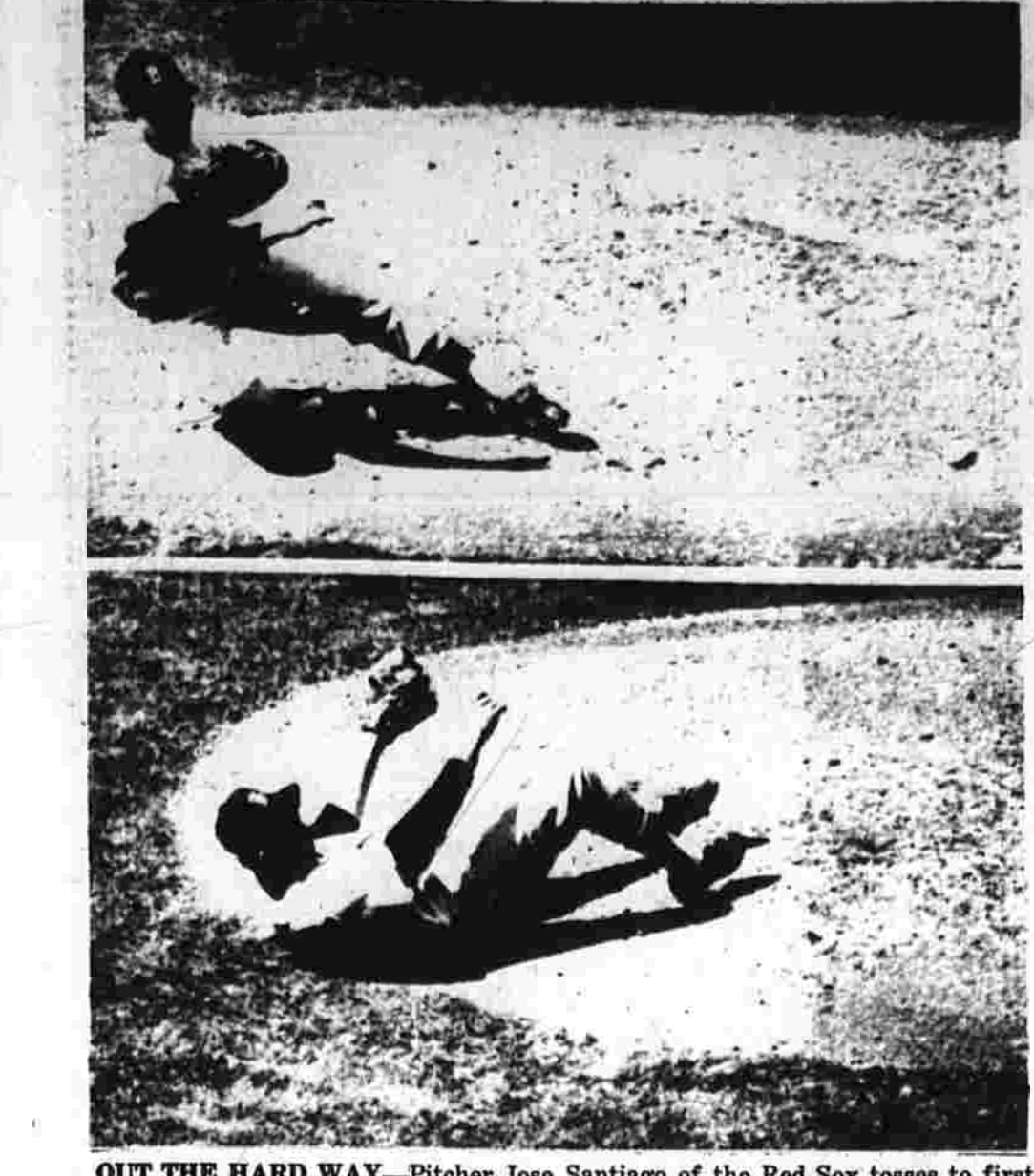
