HELP BRIDGE PLAYERS BY PERFORMING QUEENS. By ALBERT SHEINWOLD. As an admirer of their product for many years I hereby offer, free of charge, an ingenious suggestion to the U. S. Playing Card Co. Put a different perfume on each of the queens in the pack, so that bridge players who have a keen nose can tell just where each queen has been dealt.

Opening lead - ten of diamonds. Unfortunately for South, nobody had thought of perfuming the queens when today's hand was dealt. Declarer won the first diamond in dummy, lost a finesse to the king of hearts, and won the next diamond in his own hand. He then drew trumps, wondering which black queen might be in favorable position for a finesse.

After rubbing his chin very slowly (which looks thoughtful), South led a club to dummy's ace and returned a club to try a finesse with the jack. This lost to the queen, and South was down one.

"Who had the queen of spades?" South asked as he claimed the rest of the trick. East showed his queen, and South sighed with relief. "Both she and I were wrong," he announced. "I couldn't have guessed."

North agreed. "That's true," North agreed. "You couldn't have made it. I'm almost exactly 25 years ago I met a man in North Africa who also wouldn't have made it. Fancy meeting two of them in one lifetime!"

North had a poor sense of smell, so perfume might not have helped him, but he had a different way to make the slam without a finesse. If the queen of spades failed to drop, South could then try the club finesse; but it could cost him nothing to try the spade ruff first.

Partner opens with one spade, and the next player passes. You hold: Spades, 9-8-8-4; Hearts, K-4; Diamonds, 10-9-8-7; Clubs, Q-10-4. The figure was 24,200 for the corresponding week last year.

Town Is Rid Of Arsenic in Water Supply

ALLENWORTH, Calif. - The men of this tiny all-Negro town Tuesday began installing the community's first arsenic-free water system.

"It is a job," exclaimed Mr. Clark, 67, as he helped place a lightweight section of 4-inch polyvinyl chloride pipe into a ditch.

The people of Allenworth, a poor community 300 farms and their families 40 miles northwest of Bakerfield, have been drinking arsenic-poisoned water since the town was established 80 years ago.

Now they are finally starting to lay five miles of pipe leading from the new 1,800-foot deep town well to Allenworth's ramshackle homes.

"Every male over 16 is to work on the project," explained Jefferson Piero, 50, who grazes cattle on his 60 acres.

"The men in each family are to work a total of 160 hours putting in the water system."

In this manner the edge-of-county residents will save 15,000 dollars in labor costs.

"We expect to get all the pipe laid, purifiers, tanks and faucets installed in the 34 occupied homes in town within 60 to 90 days," Piero continued.

"Then we're going to turn on all faucets the same day and have a big barbecue and picnic."

Only six families have had running water in their homes until now - and that tap water, like the water drawn for years from irrigation spouts by the rest of the people in town has been loaded with arsenic.

Child Guidance Clinic Gains Accreditation

The Community Child Guidance Clinic of Manchester has received national accreditation and been admitted to membership in the American Association of Psychiatric Clinics for Children (AAPCC).

The accreditation is significant, because it means the clinic is considered by AAPCC to be meeting national standards for operational procedure and for the staff's training, experience and ability to work together as a smoothly functioning unit.

The clinic at 317 N. Main St., which serves emotionally disturbed and troubled children and adolescents from Manchester, Rockville-Vernon and several smaller area towns east of the river, will, as a member of AAPCC, be eligible to train students of social work and psychology.

After a year's successful probationary, or associate membership, it can qualify for full membership in the organization and be eligible to give residency training for child psychiatrists. The Manchester clinic is one of "only a handful in Connecticut towns this size" which have become accredited by AAPCC, Dr. Atoyman said.

Application for the accreditation was made late in 1966 by Dr. Atoyman, Dr. Norman Kugelmass, chief psychologist, and Leonard Yarensky, administrative head of the clinic and chief social worker.

The accreditation was carried on over a period of several months by AAPCC "visitors" from child guidance clinics at Worcester, Mass., and Buffalo, N. Y., who studied the local clinic's records and organization and the staff's philosophy and methods of handling a variety of cases then in progress.

Weaknesses in organization and operational procedures were also discussed and recommendations made for improvement, with the net result being a recommendation for the clinic's admittance to membership. Yarensky said there are yet no concrete plans for accepting social work trainees, but that he will "explore the possibility" with schools of social work.

The clinic, which recently completed its sixth year of operation, has come a long way from its messenger beginnings in January 1959 when it opened in temporary second-floor quarters on Hayes St., proximate to Manchester Memorial Hospital. Established through efforts of interested citizens and the Chester Mental Health Society, the clinic was an outgrowth of society and PTA studies showing

A reporter, after noting down the item, would speak to police officials to get details for a news story.

Levister expressed annoyance with recent detailed reports in newspapers concerning two men being bound over to Superior Court on statutory rape charges, and two others bound over for indecent assault on a female minor.

The judge said both stories contained details that prejudiced the defendants' rights.

A reporter for the Stamford Advocate told Levister today that the stories were fed to the news desks by arresting police. The judge said such details in a court story, especially prior to the trial, violated a man's constitutional rights.

Asked why he imposed the clampdown, Levister said he felt "this is my obligation to protect the rights of the accused in Circuit Court. A judge has the right to direct that before trial, information can't be leaked out to newspapers."

The judge, asked whether he had the support of any other Circuit Court judges, replied: "I know that other judges agree with me. No others have taken such action as far as I know."

He advised reporters that "you can report verbatim anything during the course of a trial, but before the trial such reporting violates a man's constitutional rights."

He said he had not discussed the matter with Chief Circuit Court Judge John J. Daly.

Levister has been sitting in Stamford for the past week during the vacation of presiding Judge George DiOzono, who is expected to return May 1.

Asked whether his directive would be continued upon DiOzono's return, Levister said he believed so but was uncertain.

Reporters from the Stamford Advocate and radio station WTRC were startled when informed today that they could have no information other than what appeared on the police blotter.

It May Have Saved Both... There was, in the last round of big city riots, a new control technique on display which some people are beginning to attack as really a lack of control techniques.

Putting it bluntly the new policy is as it was displayed on television from Washington. It is a policy of being willing to sacrifice some property in the effort to avoid the taking of human lives.

The outraged cry raised against this kind of tactic on the part of the authorities is that it condones violation of the law. There is no good answer to that charge, not as a matter of principle.

In the pragmatic measure, however, it seems to us there is much to be said for the new technique, and not merely from the point of view of saving lives.

Second, it seems to us quite conceivable that the new policy not only saved lives, which seems beyond question, but that it also actually reduced the amount of looting and burning about which it seemed so pervasive, and reduced it far below the levels of damage it might have attained had it been tried.

What we suggest, as a sort of summary theorem, is this: That when the potential force of the riots was met, this time, by a resistance which was quick, more adequate in numbers, but more passive in its own conduct, the resultant damage which developed in the clash between the rioters and the authorities was considerably less than it would have been, both property-wise and life-wise.

Now some of their admirers are calling upon the government to drop its case against them. One of the defendants, William Sloane Coffin Jr., said

the time of the law violation, that federal officials would be "derelict in duty" if they did not prosecute. The government would be equally derelict to abandon the case now.
