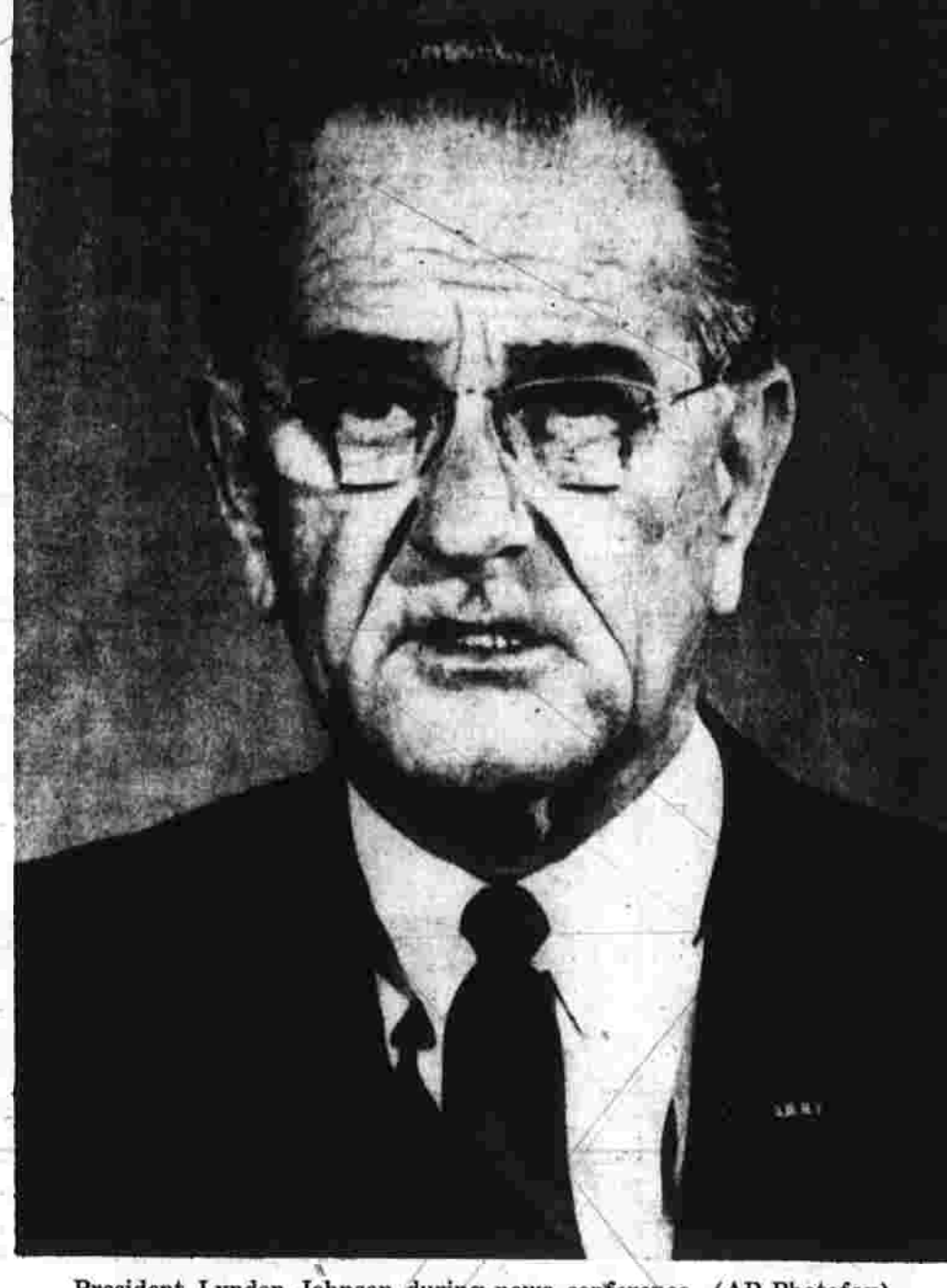

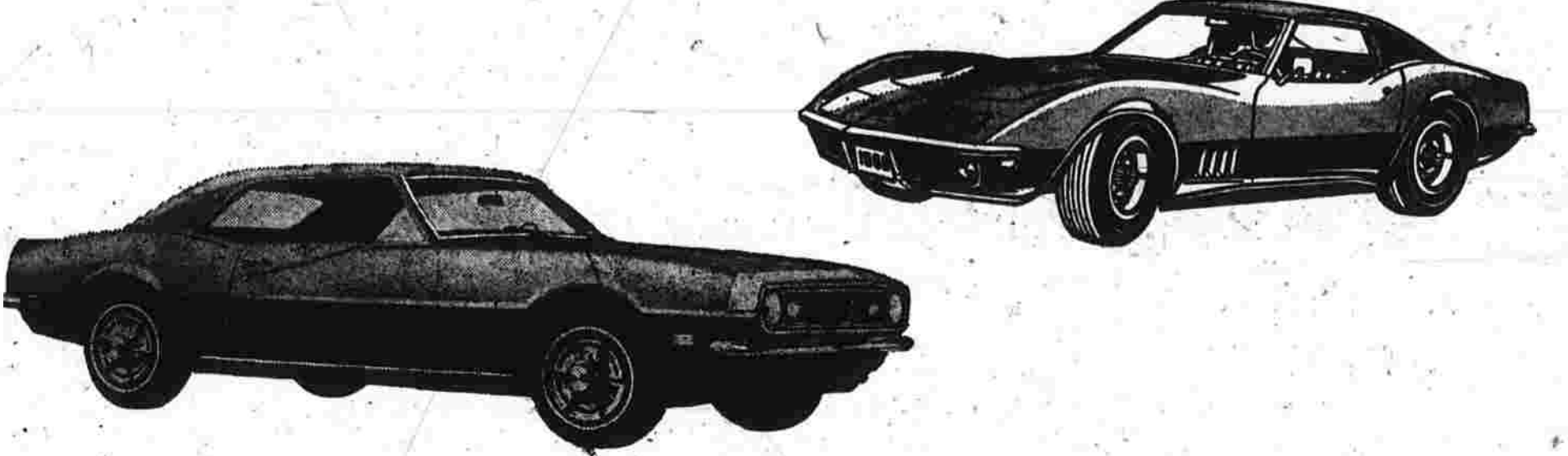

About 600 goldfish travel together to stores in specially-painted, 15-pound bags containing some water, oxygen, cleaning chemicals and, in hot weather, ice cubes.

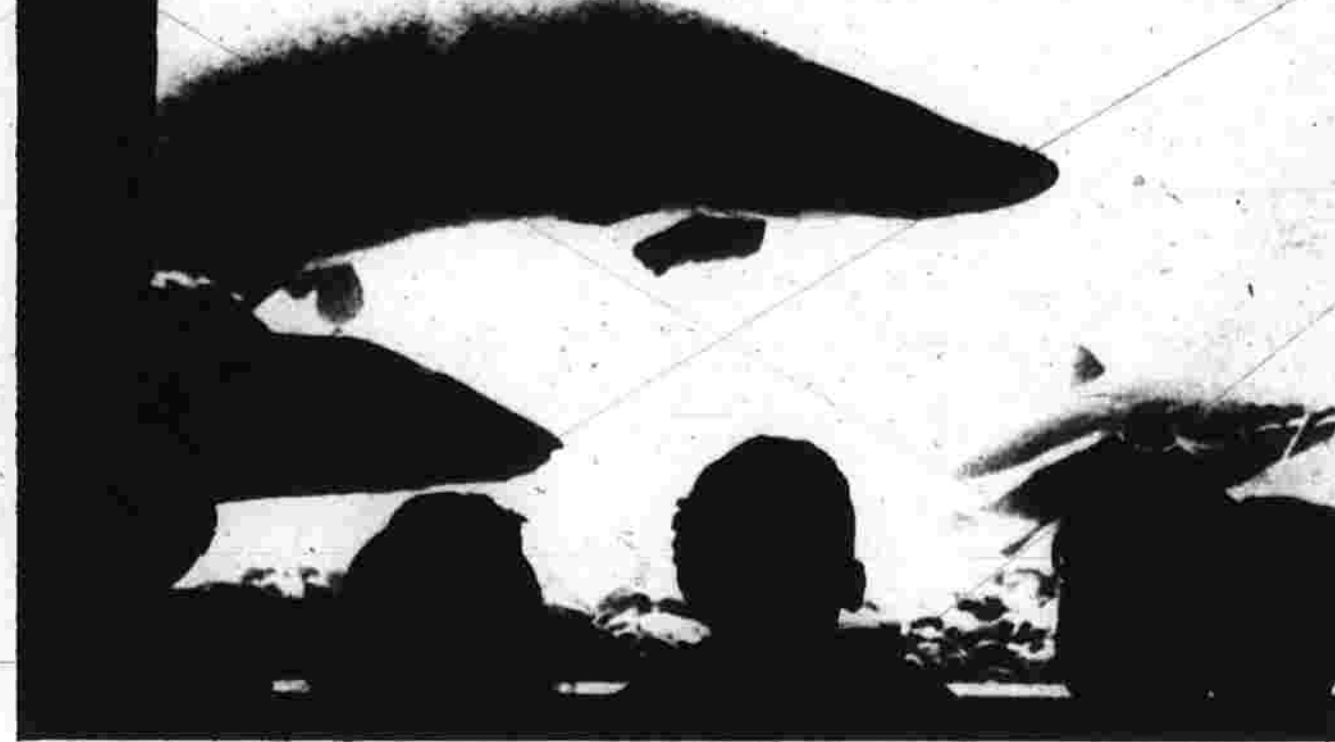
