### Sheinwold on Bridge

Since bidding is not an exact science you must expect to get to many unplayable contracts. Fortunately, you should make some of those unplayable contracts when the defense slips.

Opening lead queen of diamonds.

When today's hand was played in the recent national championship for the Harold S. Vanderbilt Cup, West opened the queen of diamonds against South's bid of four hearts.

Jordan, a member of the U.S. Olympic bridge team which won the national championship, won the first trick in dummy with the ace of diamonds and returned a club. East ducked and Jordan took the king of clubs and returned a low club to East's ace.

East now slipped, returning a diamond and West took the ace with his own ace and a trump. Jordan overruled with the king of hearts and returned a trump, two trumps too late.

Declarer was able to win with the queen of hearts and ruff another club with the dummy. East couldn't overrule, Jordan trumped, he could then cash his last club, securing the contract.

East should return a trump to gain the hearts later, since the ace of clubs, South wins a fit and the queen of hearts and ruffs a club in dummy. Jordan overruled with the king of hearts and leads another trump, removing the last trump from dummy. Now South is down since he must lose a second club trick.

Daily Questions  
Partner opens with one heart, and the next player passes. You hold: Spades, K-A-9-3-3; Hearts, 9-4; Diamonds, A-8-3; Clubs, 8-2.

What do you say?  
Answer: Bid two hearts. The hand is not quite strong enough to bid the spades first, since you raise the hearts later. Since you can afford only one response, prefer to raise partner's major suit. The trump support for hearts is below the normal standard, but most experts would still prefer this raise to a spade response.

## Town Gets Advice On Hiring Manager

Problems of transition to a "somewhere around \$10,000 a council-manager form of government." Asked to define the duties of the council and the manager, a group of experts gathered at a Young Republican meeting Tuesday night, with speaker Donald G. Peach, town manager in Glastonbury. Peach said that the council is the legislative body, and the manager is sort of an executive secretary, and does the "leg work" for the council. The council is particularly important since Coventry has switched to a council-manager city and alternates to the council, which then adopts a specific policy. The manager has little to say about the policy after it is adopted, but the council has to live with it. YGOP and guests, was in a question and answer format, keeping Peach busy answering many questions during the 1 1/2-hour meeting.

Peach said in response to a question, that he feels it is important for the town council to hire its manager. He said it is quite a complicated procedure, and the council members are the ones who will have to work with the manager.

There has been some local discussion since Peach's last October, of hiring the manager in advance of the election of the council. Peach said that administrative cost "often much assistance" to a town such as Coventry, but that the town could investigate other alternatives, such as having a consultant hire the actual manager. He pointed out, could include hiring an interne, or a retired manager.

Expected Problems

Interne, Peach said, are generally "mature people" and are usually hired at a salary of "about \$3,500" a year. Peach said that "present employees usually wonder if they will lose their jobs," though this seldom actually happens. "You get to know them," he said, and it takes a lot of time, but most are pretty competent."

He said a second problem is that both the council and manager "are new at it," and ground rules and methods of operation have to be set up, all of which also takes "a lot of time." Cooperation is important, Peach said, and much depends on the support of the community.

Peach also said that it usually takes a minimum of three months for the council to hire a manager, and then possibly an additional six months to get things running smoothly, "though during that period, things by no means come to a grinding halt."

Peach is Glastonbury's first town manager and has held the post since 1966, having come from Bloomfield where he was assistant town manager. Since he arrived in Glastonbury, the population has grown from just over 14,000 to about 20,000.

Salary at \$10,000

Peach said he thought Coventry would be looking for a manager who has served as an assistant in another, good-sized town, "so that he is familiar with various departments", or someone who has been manager in a rural, northern New England town. Salary he estimated

Dinosaur Site Urged as Landmark WASHINGTON (AP) — The Rocky Hill dinosaur track site near Hartford, Conn., has been recommended for inclusion in the National Registry of Natural Landmarks.

The U.S. Department of Interior approved the idea, Sen. Abraham A. Ribicoff, D-Conn., said Wednesday. The Soviet leadership has shown serious concern over the relaxation of controls in Prague this year. The Czech regime's new leader, Alexander Dubcek, was called to Moscow last weekend, and in an effort to counter Western speculation of trouble in the East European camp, the Soviet press has published a series of assurances from Czechoslovak party officials praising Soviet-Czech friendship and Communism.

There has been pressure on Dubcek and his liberal colleagues to call special party congress to elect about 50 conservatives from the 110-member party presidium. Conservative forces naturally oppose this, and Dubcek is appearing in Prague charging that the new leadership is steering the country away from communism.

The latest was a long article today in Pravda, the newspaper of the Soviet Communist party. President Ludvik Svoboda wrote that "sympathy for socialism (communism) has taken deep roots among the Czech people."

**Burials in Arlington Will Be Limited by 1985**  
WASHINGTON (AP) — Burial in Arlington National Cemetery will be limited to President, Medal of Honor winners and others marked for special honors by 1985.

Robert E. Bellar, project engineer for Arlington, said Wednesday the burial for national heroes will be in a special 15-acre tract—a Westmoreland Abbey type of thing—under a master plan for 1985.

Although there will be no room for burial of veterans and kin at Arlington by that time, Bellar said, marble vaults will be built to hold the ashes of nearly 400,000.

Bellar said there already are 145,000 graves in the cemetery's green hills across the Potomac River from Washington and only 6,000 burial sites remain.

The cemetery is being expanded by 162 acres for 60,000 new sites, he said, but they are expected to be taken by 1985.

**Brainwashing Charge On Smoking Denied**  
WASHINGTON (AP) — Missouri Rep. W. R. Hull Jr. has accused the U.S. Public Health Service of trying to brainwash the American public into giving up cigarettes.

Hull, D-Mo., accused the service of "seeking to make decisions on smoking for Americans rather than just informing them of alleged dangers and letting them make their own decisions."

But the U.S. Surgeon General, Dr. William H. Stewart, rejected the brainwashing charge. He insisted there is a hazard in cigarette smoking for Americans and people should be informed of it.

The exchange came during a closed House Appropriations subcommittee hearing last March. The testimony was made public Wednesday.

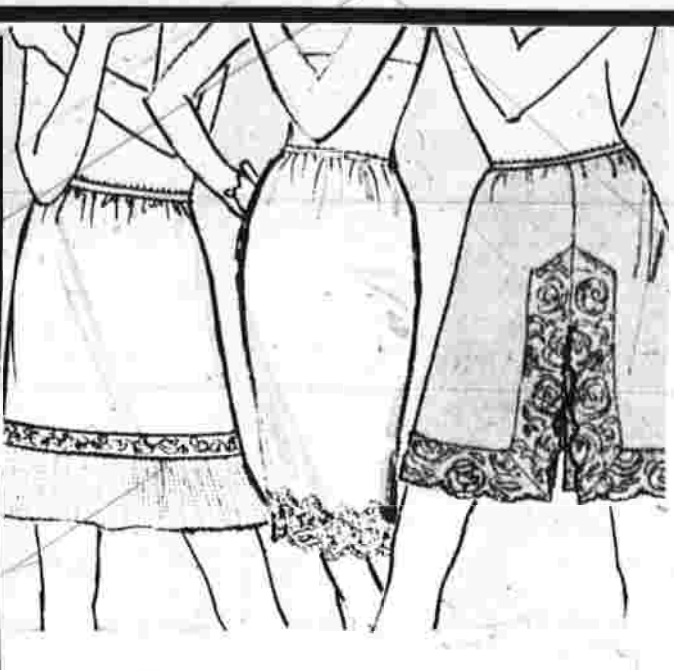
