There is a Better Way

NATHAN AGOSTINELLI
GOP Candidate For State Senator

Why I have chosen to run for State Senator. I believe that there is a better way to solve the problems which have caused a rapid deterioration in our State's security and economy.

I believe that community rights are vital and that regional cooperation is preferable to state controls.

I believe that the State must legislate laws that will provide educators and law enforcement agencies with the power to punish rowdies and hoodlums.

I believe that the Senate has failed to work for all people, especially the elderly.

I believe that my experience at the State level while representing the people of Manchester has helped me to understand the better way to work for the people and help solve the issues.

I believe that this shall be a campaign of issues, not of party affiliation or personalities, because these issues affect our homes and families and future. The issues are, in my opinion:

- WASTE.** Our state, one of the richest in the nation, is over \$100,000,000 in debt, thus far this year and still growing. This huge debt could drag down our State's economy. Although most of the State spending is done for city people, the debt must be paid by towns as well. The welfare chiselers must be weeded out and sent to work, so that the true needy will have enough.
- STATE CONTROLS OVER TOWNS.** "Let the chips fall where they may." This was the rude statement of a member of a State Committee who advocates a State takeover of town school systems. (Conn. Life, June/1968, page 3). I believe that a takeover of local school systems by a centralized State agency is a radical step backward with unknown consequences. Force is not the answer. Force has never solved anything. Regional cooperation is the better way to approach problems. Regional cooperation and State controls are very different. In another article (Time, 6/7/68, page 89) there was a plan discussed that the long held right of towns to zone property should be taken away. I would resist such a move with all of my energy, for once again the results could be quite radical and upsetting. The towns must be better represented at the State level. A portion of the gasoline tax which is collected from the towns by the State, could be left with the respective towns for needed road repairs. Another area to be studied is a State subsidy for water and sewer construction. State income tax can achieve much, it only depends on how the money is spent and who receives it.
- VIOLENCE AND CRIME.** The Senate must enact legislation which will severely punish those who commit assaults against other people or property. A negro teacher told me that he places the blame for the soaring crime rate on the State Legislature and the Judiciary. The former must pass legislation which will provide teachers and policemen with legal backing when an offender is caught. The state must also have faith in teachers and police if discipline is to be maintained. Teachers have told me they have little authority. This can be remedied. This teacher also felt that judges should be more stringent in sentencing convicted criminals. For the last few years many convicted criminals returned to their neighborhoods as heroes instead of as repentant members of society. This sets a poor example for other youths. These lawbreakers constitute only a small minority, yet they harm the other city people as much as the innocent person who is attacked. Yet, our State Senate has done nothing, and the crime rate continues to grow.
- LEGISLATIVE FAILURE TO REPRESENT THE PEOPLE.** With all of the record-breaking tax receipts of the past few years, our Legislature has done virtually nothing for the elderly. The elderly person or couple that owns their own home is in a financial squeeze. They are entitled to their fair share of the State's prosperity. A State subsidy for retired home owners would aid these elder citizens. Connecticut is so progressive in its welfare program, it could also be progressive in its elderly program. For the elderly who do not own homes, the State could do more in the construction of low rental housing units. Another area where the Legislature has failed to act only reacts—is the sale of guns to questionable purchasers. In the city of Hartford, in the past three years, over 43,000 pistol permits have been issued. And yet, no action will be taken by the Legislature until 1969, with hearings scheduled for next month. Why this long time gap? (Herald, 6/10/68, page 1).

Our task is a hard one. We cannot allow our security and economy to become endangered by the above issues. The results could be that the homeowner and executive will have a clouded future. The present government has been in power for two years. The problems have only increased. A modern government must be elected that will lead, not force; act, not react; represent people and towns, not just certain groups and cities; speak out honestly. The city negro and town executive must meet and work together because they want to make a better society, not because the state forces them to meet. Such an atmosphere breeds resentment.

With guidance and opportunities provided by the government, with faith in the people and towns to solve their problems by co-operation, the American people will solve their problems. Our nation will once again take its place as a world leader, our state can once again take its place as a secure state with economic opportunities. Based on my experience on local - state levels, I believe there is a better way.

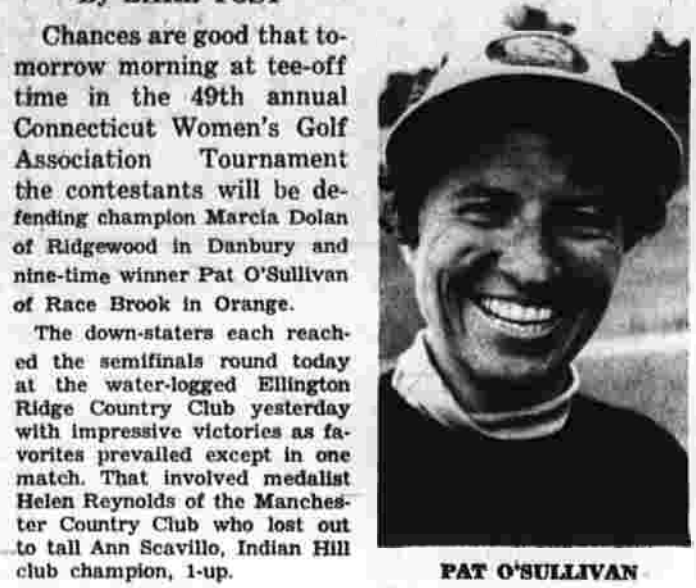

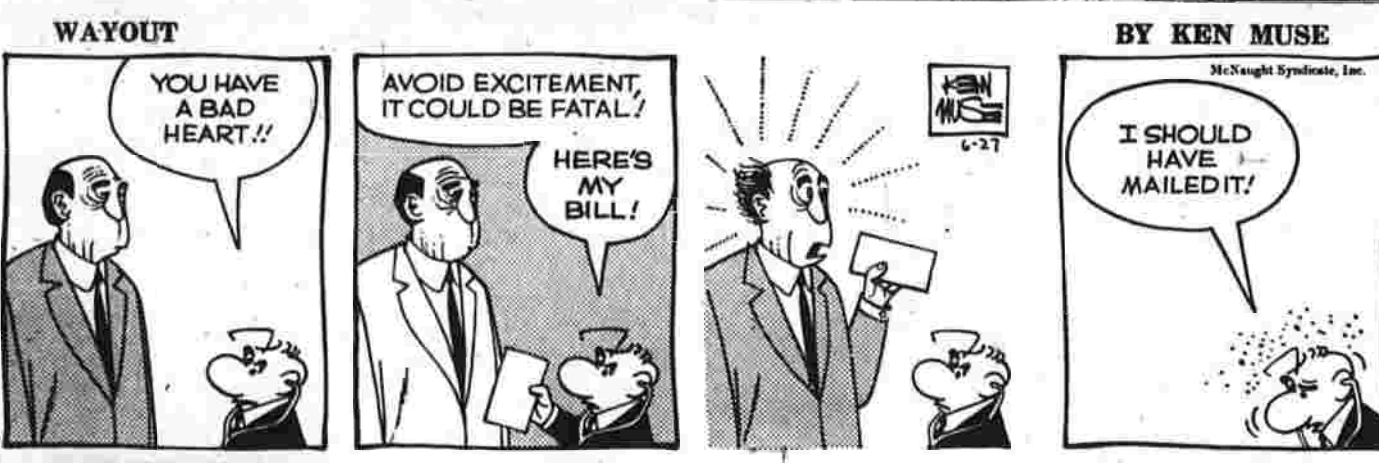
