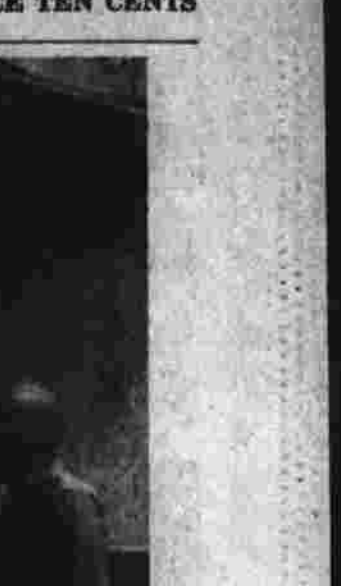

**Sheinwold on Bridge**

ONLY CAREFUL EXPERT CAN MAKE SLAM TODAY

By ALFRED SHEINWOLD

You cannot win a tournament by being dealt cards like those in the South hand today. The 5,000 experts who will start play today in the national bridge tournament in Minneapolis know that counts is not what counts you get but what you do with them.

Opening lead - queen of diamonds.

Since the same hands are played at many different tables in a tournament, you would expect dozens of tournament players to bid six spades with the North-South cards. Most of them would go down - even experts.

One way way to go down is to draw trumps at once. Then you lose a heart and a club without any struggle. Some players would draw only two rounds of trumps and then take the queen, king and ace of hearts and bid eventually get club trick. Better, but not good enough.

It is correct for South to draw only two rounds of trumps, but then he must cash the ace of hearts and lead a heart to dummy's queen. This puts him in position to lead the third heart from dummy. If East is out of hearts and has the last trump, South discards one of dummy's clubs on the fourth heart. West wins the heart trick, but South can take the top club and ruff his last club in dummy. South wins the rest with high trumps, making the slam.

Daily Question Partner opens with two diamonds, bidding to game, and the next player passes. You hold: Spades, 8; Hearts, 2-9-10; Diamonds, Q-K-10-9-8; Clubs, J-8.

What do you say? Answer: Bid two notrump. Show your weakness first. There will be time enough to show the excellent diamond support.

**Stop, Frisk Law Backed by May**

The first order of business of the 1969 General Assembly should be the enactment of a stop and frisk law, according to the one in New York State, declared Edwin H. May Jr. of Westfield today.

May, the GOP candidate for U.S. senator, spoke at a luncheon meeting at the Elderside Restaurant in Danbury.

Pointing out that the U.S. Supreme Court recently upheld the constitutionality of the New York law, May said, "The enactment of a similar law in Connecticut would give a police officer the right to stop a person acting suspiciously and to search him for dangerous weapons."

Emphasizing that the law would have to contain the limits spelled out in the Supreme Court decision, May said, "The officer should require the police officer to identify himself and to make reasonable inquiries before proceeding with the search. And, the search should be limited to outer garments only."

May said that, like most ordinary citizens, he always had assumed that a policeman had the right to stop a person acting suspiciously and to search him for dangerous weapons.

"It seems to me," he concluded, "that any meaningful action to make our streets safer should include a Stop and Frisk law. Armed with such a law, and with lighter restrictions on hand guns, the cop on the beat would be much more effective."

### Contract Talks Reach Impasse At Electric Boat

GRINGTON (AP)—The status of contract negotiations between the Metal Trades Council of New London County and the General Dynamics Electric Boat Division is uncertain today after negotiators reached an impasse Thursday.

Thursday's talks, in which state and federal mediators were participants, were marked by a statement from EB that a contract proposal from the MTC was "totally unacceptable."

The disagreement reportedly centered on eight major issues: occupational titles, overtime equal distribution, strike and lockout clauses, shift premiums, automatic progression, vacation pay, specialists and working leaders, and travel policies.

A strike by about 7,000 workers at the plant who were members of the MTC started July 23. The Electric Boat plant is the nation's largest manufacturer of nuclear submarines.

The MTC also proposed Thursday a three-year pact calling for wage increases of 41 cents for the first year and 23 cents each of the following two years.

Electric Boat said the proposal would cost an increase of \$72 million during the next three years over the recently expired contract.

Negotiations for a new labor contract started last April, and were broken off when a wildcat strike started June 17 and lasted about two weeks.

### UConn Expert Calls for Hikes In Price of Milk

NEW YORK (AP)—A University of Connecticut agricultural economist has testified that increases in minimum prices dealers pay for fluid milk are "imperative for price alignment and orderly marketing" in several regions including Connecticut.

Dr. Howard Johnson, testifying on behalf of 18 dairy cooperatives that are members of the New York-New England Dairy Cooperatives Coordinating Committee, made the statement Thursday at a hearing in the office of the New York-New Jersey Milk Market Administration.

The committee is seeking an increase of 20 cents per hundredweight, slightly more than 1/2 cent per quart, in the price of Class 1 fluid milk.

The increase would apply to six milk-marketing regions: New York-New Jersey, Massachusetts-Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Washington, D.C., the Delaware Valley, Connecticut, and the upper Chesapeake Bay.

The minimum farm milk price is established by the federal government under federal marketing orders.

The historical price relationship between midwestern and eastern federal orders has been disrupted by increases in July 1 to the Chicago milking region and 14 other regions in or near the Midwest, Johnson said.

"Ordinary blend prices move up from the Midwest to the East," Johnson said. "But the situation is now reversed and New York blend prices are lower than those in Ohio and Michigan."

The blend price is the price which dairy farmers actually receive for all of the milk they sell under federal marketing orders.

For about 14 years, Johnson said, the New York-New Jersey Class 1 price has averaged \$1.49 above the Chicago price.

The number of dairy farmers in the six Northeastern regions have dropped from 22,461 in 1967 to 49,972 in 1968, Johnson told the group. The figure is a 6 per cent drop, he said.

In addition, he said, there has been a decline in the per capita milk production in the Northeast compared with the rest of the nation.

A second proposal presented at the hearing by the Eastern Milk Producers Cooperative Association Inc. suggested an eight per cent increase in Class 1 milk prices in the New York-New Jersey region, with a five per cent increase in Class 1 prices in the Delaware Valley, Connecticut and Massachusetts-Rhode Island-New Hampshire regions.

### Tolland Middle School Plans Approved

Plans for a 23-classroom middle school were approved by the Board of Education last night and will go to town meeting for approval on Aug. 26.

Richard Quinn of the architectural firm of Brunel, Gibson and Van Dolan of Hartford presented the plans to the committee. This is the first of a two-phase plan. A special town meeting last January approved an appropriation of \$60,000 to start preparation of these preliminary plans.

The school will be constructed on 67 acres of land in the center of town, located between the Thruway and Meadowbrook and there will be two movable partitions in each floor. Plans for the school were approved because of opposition by some townspersons. They petitioned to hold up construction until estimates were prepared to add on to the lower classes of two elementary schools and the high school.

In re-working the plans, Quinn explained the first floor core area was made more compact. This area will include office space, conference rooms, teachers' lounge, maintenance room and a library. The school will be serviced by an elevator. The classrooms will be grouped around this side of the building and there will be two movable partitions in each floor.

The problem of what to do with the cafeteria when it is being used for an auditorium was caused by the committee. The possibility of having tables which will fold into the wall is being considered.

An estimated cost of \$1.8 million was given for the first phase of the school last March. It is hoped by the re-working of the plans to bring this cost down.

A motion was made last night to ask the selection to call the special town meeting for Aug. 26. It was the feeling of the committee to call the meeting as soon as possible to have the plans out to bid by late May.

The meeting will be asked to consider and act on the preliminary plans and to give the committee authorization to proceed with the working drawings and put them out to bid.

The voters will also be asked to appropriate additional money to further cover preliminary costs and to authorize the selection to give the committee permission to proceed with the sale of bonds.

The preliminary plans will be presented to a special meeting of the Board of Education next Wednesday.

### Vernon Junk Car Graveyard Sold; Town Looks for New Spot

Town officials are now looking for another location to bury junk cars. The area which has been used for the past nine months has been sold and approved for apartment construction.

Last year George and Samuel Piant offered the use of land they owned off Rt. 317 for use as a burial ground for junk cars. Over the nine-month period some 100 cars have been piled up and according to Francis McNulty, building inspector, there remains some 200 more.

The land was leased to the town for a total fee of \$1 for a six-month period and was intended to expire on June 30. Cars are brought in, the gas tanks removed and then they are flattened by a large tractor and buried.

Another possibility being considered by the building inspector is a site on which the junk cars could be stored until a large number are gathered and the town could then call in equipment to crush them and have them hauled away.

The town would then only have to dispose of the wheels, engines, gasoline tanks and seats, McNulty pointed out.

Having the graveyard for the junk cars enabled the town to enforce an ordinance of long standing which prohibits the parking of unregistered cars on private property. Because there was no place to dispose of them it was impossible to enforce this ordinance.

After the Pearl property was obtained, the town notified car owners who were in violation of the ordinance and they had to have the junk cars towed to the lot at their own expense. If they did not, a fine was imposed.

### Columbia Cut in Service Starts Tomorrow At Post Office

Columbia, like all other towns, will have its postal service somewhat curtailed beginning tomorrow, according to postmaster Mrs. Ruth Senecal. Locally, service will not be cut back as much as it is in larger towns.

Mrs. Senecal said, "We have been advised by Postmaster General Walton to empty with the postal carriers by the federal postal budget cut, and will reduce the postal service by discontinuing the window service on Saturdays. Clerks will be on duty for distribution only and the dispatch of mail. However, the lobby will be open for box holders and the rural carriers will work as usual."

She added that many of the instructions regarding the cut-back do not apply to a small office like hers.

Mrs. Senecal also said it is impossible to cut back mail locally as there are some 25 to 50 families added to the service annually.

### MMH Plans Class In Resuscitation

A course in resuscitation, with stress on external cardiac massage and mouth-to-mouth respiration, will be offered to all personnel of Manchester Memorial Hospital Monday through Friday next week. This training is being offered as part of the In-Service Education Program for nurses conducted by Lois Stout, R.N. More than 200 hospital employees will take the course.

"Resuscitation," a life-like plastic model equipped with automatic guns and breathing apparatus, will be brought to the hospital for demonstrations and practice. Each student in the course will have a chance to practice cardiac massage mouth to mouth resuscitation on the dummy. Nurses from the hospital's special care rooms will demonstrate and supervise the techniques.

Quizzes attached to the plastic model indicate when the heart is being massaged effectively and when sufficient air is reaching the lungs. Simulated arteries will pulsate when circulation is restored.

A film entitled "External Cardiac Massage" will be shown at the first session.

Knowledge of resuscitation measures plus quick thinking can save the life of a person in an emergency. The course has been given before at the hospital, but repetition and practice are most important for such techniques.
