LAGOS, Nigeria (AP) — Two columns of Nigerian commandos were reported pushing north today toward Aba, a highland stronghold of Aba in what would be the start of an all-out offensive to crush the Biafran secession of eastern Nigeria's Biafran provinces.

Big Arms Cache Found By Allies Near Saigon

SAIGON (AP) — American and South Vietnamese forces reported finding large new enemy caches Wednesday in a tunnel complex beneath the area of a village 25 miles north of Saigon.

The allied sweep began Tuesday and has uncovered 300 rounds of rockets and rocketless rifle ammunition and 75,000 rounds of automatic weapons. The search operation is designed to wipe out any enemy plans for a new attack on Saigon.

Ten Viet Cong who attempted to flee were killed in a 15-minute clash Tuesday and 10 others were captured. One captured Viet Cong was a "tunnel rat" captured another 10 prisoners in the underground labyrinth around Cu Dai, officials said.

Military officials believe 250 civilians living in the area are sympathetic to the Viet Cong. It is on a prime infiltration route and less than 10 miles north of a big U.S. Army helicopter base and the headquarters of the Fourth Vietnamese Air Infantry Division.

The Fourth Party Threat

Before the national political convention began meeting, it seemed to us that each of them was facing the danger of making those choices and decisions which might encourage—or even dictate—the entrance of a fourth party into the field this presidential year.

At first, the Republicans seemed safe by itself that danger. Their convention itself mirrored little visible revolt. It adopted a platform pleasing to everybody on everything. There are, after the Nixon victory, the standard compliances with good local eligibles on the part of Governor Reagan, Romney and Rockefeller. Mayor Lindsay, perhaps the party's brightest future ambition, chose to become a party regular.

In all this, it seemed that any possibility of any revolt which would be able to carry any of the participants in this convention into any open movement against the success of this convention's candidates had been removed.

Subsequently, however, the first hints of possible fissures began to appear. Details of the disappointment of various party figures in the choice of Governor Agnew as Vice President began to circulate. Governor Rockefeller's secret displeasures began to be reported. Senator James began mourning in public. Jackie Robinson resigned from his position as Governor Rockefeller in order to blast the Nixon-Agnew ticket and proclaim his intention of supporting the Democrats.

The Kind of Trains People Want

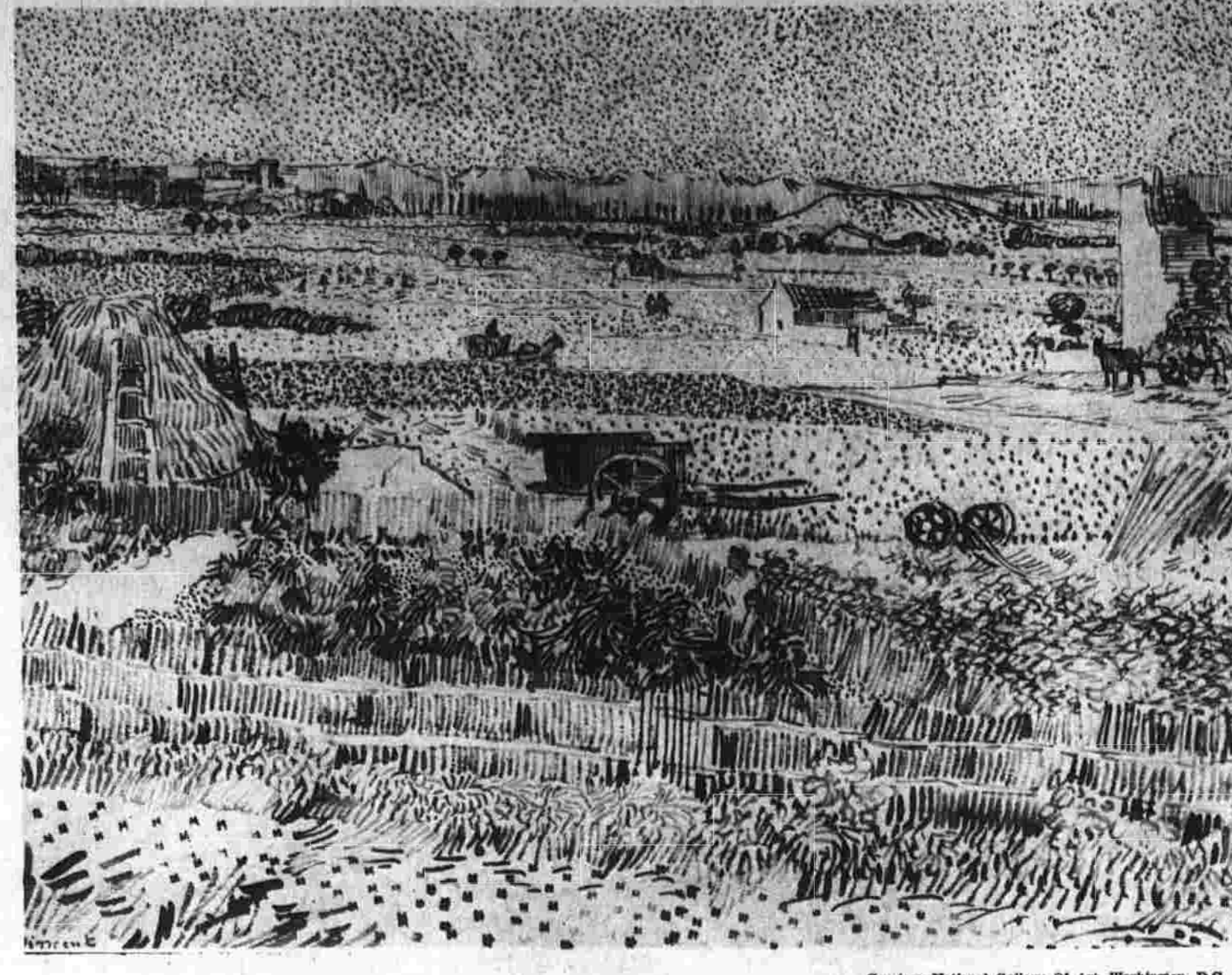
It develops that the one worry which probably concerned everybody least at the outset of the planning for new high speed trains on the Washington, New York and Boston runs has proved the most important.

Everybody worried about how a high speed train could ever run on such roadbeds as existed between the points in question, or about how safe the operation of trains at such high speeds could be made.

Yet it is in that field—in the development of one "big" after another in the development and transmission of power enough to produce the high speeds being sought—that the most serious difficulties delaying the probable date for inauguration of any of the new high speed services have been encountered.

What people really want from trains—what would really reestablish the Boston-New York-Washington run—is not speed so much as it is dependability, cleanliness, and an atmosphere of civilized comfort.

Yet we think it could be pointed out that, so far as the public's interest in the new trains is concerned, the public has never placed quite as much priority on speed as the designers, manufacturers, and potential operators of the trains. Few people have been actually dying to travel 150 miles an hour on rails, or even 120. And railroad passenger service, with its more careful pickup and discharge terminals, doesn't need very much speed or time to offer sensible competition to the air buses on such Eastern seaboard runs.

Tollard Finance Board Backs Want for Road Post

Democratic minority select a town meeting last April, with man Eugene Want last night received the backing of the Board of Finance for the post office in the town of Tollard.

Want, high school teacher in the state administered last year, faces the decision of whether to continue as selectman or to post office in the town of Tollard.

The hiring a superintendent of highways has a strong effect on the traditional role of the Board of Selectmen, turning the office of first selectman into an administrative one.

The first selectman has traditionally served as "town foreman" for the town. The new post however, has been formed under state statutes, thereby placing new duties and responsibilities on the position.

King's interpretation of the statutes precludes the holder of the post from holding other public office in the town.

The position was approved at a town meeting.

Gold Pan Champ Is Woman from Greeley, Colo.

Greeley, Colo. (AP) — The may be little in lore or legend about female prospectors in the Old West. But that doesn't mean a thing to an attractive brunette Greeley housewife.

She happens to be the world champion gold panner.

Not only did Barbara Chesmore win the championship in the annual contest in California last March—she beat her husband, Robert, who was the defending champion, and she set a record for the event of 33 ounces.

The 35-year-old Mrs. Chesmore, who wears her glossy dark hair shoulder length, is the mother of two daughters and a 10-year-old son.

She heads a Girl Scout troop that includes daughters Laura, 12, and Nancy, 11, director of a junior day summer camp for Girl Scouts, is president of the Parent-Teachers Congress at the girls' school, is active in the League of Women Voters; loves to hunt, fish and go camping, and has learned to ski.

Ironically, she got her first lesson in the art of manipulating a gold pan from her husband, Chesmore, an official of an insurance firm, won the gold panning title four years in a row until Barbara dethroned him this year. She had entered for the first time in 1967, won the women's division, then finished second in the open competition. Last March she topped both divisions.

The contest is held each March at the Trouted Gold Mine near Rosamond, where gold was discovered in Southern California.

"Each contestant uses the same pan and the same light spoozy sumps of gold," Mrs. Chesmore said. "These are about the size of popcorn kernels."

The pan is filled with gravel, the suggests are placed just below the surface, then more gravel is sprinkled on. As soon as the contestant takes hold of the pan, the judges begin timing.

The trophy Mrs. Chesmore won for her championship stands close to three feet high and features the figure of a bearded prospector with a gold pan. The key suggests in the pan are real gold.

Big Maine Power Project Marked by Controversy

DICKNEY, Maine (AP) — If the late levels would make a mess of the situation, the controversy over a big Maine power project in New England is heating up.

The \$27 million plan to build two dams on the St. John River near the tiny hamlet of Dickney in northern Maine is a spin-off from the Passamaquoddy tidal dam of 20 years ago.

President Franklin D. Roosevelt sparred "Quoddy" as he looked across the surging tides of Fundy from his summer home at Campobello Island near Portland.

Quoddy produced millions of watts over three decades, but not one jot of electricity.

A plan to dam Rankin Rapids near here to supplement "Quoddy" during low tidal cycles was left high and dry.

Dickney-Lincoln is being talked to death too.

"Talk in on the side of the private utilities. The more talk the more delay, and the more delay the higher go the costs of a possible public project."

New England has the highest power rates in the nation and it is also the only region without large-scale public power projects.

Last month 17 of 25 New England congressmen voted against further planning funds for Dickney-Lincoln.

"Another victory for the greedy power lobby" say Dickney-Lincoln supporters. They say these same congressmen voted for public power project in the rest of the nation.

"Dickney-Lincoln does or does not make sense according to what yardstick you measure it with."

By one yardstick it would produce "peaking power" at a rate below any other built or planned power project in New England.

"Peaking Power" is the power needed during the late afternoon rush when Mrs. New England housewife turns on her electric stove to cook supper or draws hot water to bathe the children, and stores and offices turn on their lights.

Hydro-electric plants make good peaking power since they can be easily turned off and on for a few hours a day. Steam and nuclear power plants do not operate economically for short periods.

Private power defenders say nuclear plants now under way in New England in conjunction with "peaked storage" make Dickney-Lincoln obsolete.

Pumped storage is a system whereby electric power during slack hours of the day is used to pump water to a height where it is stored for use to turn turbines during the peak hours.

The Allagash forest is on the edge of the Dickney-Lincoln battlefield, but few of the protagonists have ever visited the area. It is New England's nearest approach to wilderness.

Lumberjacks of a century ago, sometimes dubbed "Barney Tigers," logged the Allagash of virgin pine, but it has been re-cut several times since of fast-growing spruce for pulpwood.

"Today's big paper companies are still trying to live down the 'robber baron' reputations of their cut-and-run predecessors. They now find themselves in the same canoe with conservationists, normally their normal enemies, on Dickney-Lincoln."

Northern Maine is famed for its wilderness canoe routes on the Allagash, St. John and St. Francis rivers as well as several dozen lake routes.

The Dickney dam would flood the St. John, and fluctuating

Rough Rider Finds Youth Gone Soft

LAS VEGAS, N.M. (AP) — Eighty-seven-year-old Jess D. Langdon, one of the last surviving members of Teddy Roosevelt's Rough Riders, hasn't much use for the younger generation.

"They're soft—haven't got any opinions worth anything," said the Spanish-American War veteran here for the Rough Riders' 40th annual reunion.

Teddy Roosevelt and more than 800 of his Rough Riders gathered in Las Vegas in 1926 for the group's first reunion. They voted to meet annually until the last man died.

"Can you ride a horse?" Langdon, who lives in Red Oak, N.Y., is one of three known survivors of the famous cavalry group that Roosevelt led up San Juan Hill.

Arthur L. Tuttle, 81, Salinas, Calif., and Frank C. Brito, 81, Las Cruces, N.M., now are too ill to attend the reunion.

Langdon said that Roosevelt asked him only one question. "Can you ride a horse?"

He said he was offered a commission as a lieutenant in the regular Army after his service as a Rough Rider.

"I turned it down," he said. "The Rough Riders were a good group and I got along, but my Daddy told me the first time I served an officer in the regular Army I'd be in Leavenworth and I would have, too. I'm that kind of guy."

UN Study Shows Possibility of N-Bases in Sea

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) — A U.N. study shows the possibility that the oceans are some day may hide nuclear waste bases on the bottom of the ocean unless something is done to stop them.

Since the ocean is opaque, it says, "the submarine ocean and the ocean floor offer one specific advantage in comparison with land-based installations — the satellite surveillance is less effective."

"Nuclear-weapon powers might, it is thought, find it desirable to replace land-based waste bases with sea-based ones."

Reasons making for better concealment, "such a shift might decrease the consequences of a nuclear accident, and the possibility of a nuclear strike against the missile force."

The study is titled "The Millitary Uses of the Sea Bed and the Ocean Floor." The U.N. secretariat prepared it on the basis of published material on the subject.

The U.N. Special Committee on the Peaceful Uses of the Sea Bed and the Ocean Floor is talking up the paper at an 11-day session in Rio de Janeiro.

The committee is concerned only with the bottom of the sea and oceans beyond the limits of national jurisdiction.

The secretariat study indicates that not even that deep-down area is likely to remain immune from the arms race unless international action is taken to make it so.

"The old idea of underwater cities is no longer considered as a possibility for its implementation."

"Although it is recognized that considerable development will be needed for its implementation."

"A logistic possibility... is that of sea-bed bases for nuclear submarines. Such bases could extend the time that a submarine may spend under water, and thus improve the possibilities of concealed operation."

Man Studies Nine Lions Of His Own

MIUWONGO, Kenya (AP) — The first thing George Adamson does each morning upon emerging from his split bamboo and thatched hut is to rescue a brace of frogs from an old hatbox which serves as a bird bath at his camp.

"Then, about sunrise, he begins another long day of listening to looking at and listing in the needs of his herd and his nine lions."

The troop, along with a multi-species herd of giraffes, has found refuge and food beneath the shade of a giant acacia tree under which Adamson set up his camp three years ago.

"Two of the lions, rescued from pending imprisonment in a zoo after fleeing the story of 'Elia,' came with Adamson to Miungo. A third later joined them after making an 11-hour trip from the Nairobi Game Park, orphanage with Adamson in his Land Rover."

Four cubs were later given him and bottle fed by Adamson before they learned how to kill game.

In keeping with his original goal of turning the pride back to nature, Adamson avoided giving much protection to the first cub born at Miungo. The first disappeared, perhaps into the stomach of a leopard, the second was killed by a lion from another pride.

"Two cubs born six months ago were never touched by Adamson. He didn't try to name them at all. Now you can come quite close but they won't allow themselves to be handled, which is of course what we wanted," Adamson said.

Before the year is out, as three young lionesses become of age, Adamson hopes to have more cubs added to the pride, and a chance to broaden his study of lion in the wilderness.

But Adamson, who gained fame in East Africa for his hunting expertise, and trail blazing in the unknown North-east Frontier District of the 1890s, wants some professional scientific help to catalog the life of his lions.

He feels the pride offers a unique opportunity for research into lion life.

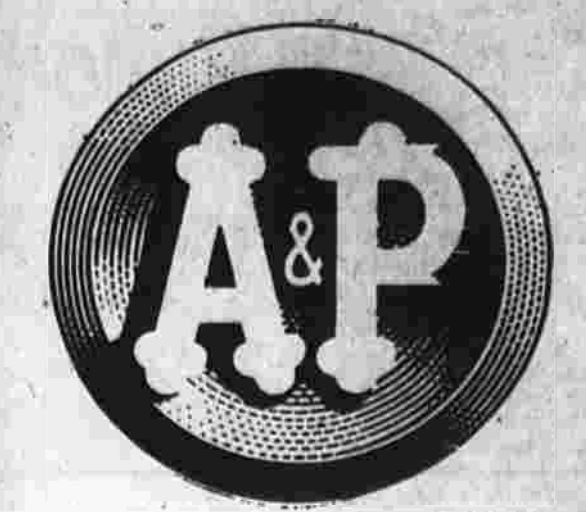

Cuban Trade Welcomed by U.S. Allies

HAVANA—Despite the U.S. economic blockade, Cuba can get almost everything it wants from the outside world—much of it from America's allies as long as it has the money to pay for it.

In 1967, Cuban trade with western countries amounted to \$50 million dollars, or about 25 per cent of its total foreign trade, much to the chagrin of the United States.

This year because of a bad sugar crop, caused by a severe drought, Fidel Castro's government has been short of hard currency. Trading with western nations especially has slowed down.

Consequently, Cuba today is going through a period of extreme austerity. Consumer goods, from food to Cuban clothing, are scarce because most are being exported to other nations in exchange for much-needed foreign exchange.

Sugar earns about 80 per cent of Cuba's foreign currency. Without a good sugar crop, Castro can hardly trade with the outside world. That is the reason the Cuban leader is determined to drive the Cuban people into producing a record 10 million tons of sugar in 1970.

If he's successful, or nearly successful, Cuba probably would come out of its present economic slump and be able to continue buying the U.S. economic blockade.

The blockade has hurt Castro's Cuba. On July 26, the 25th anniversary of the beginning of his revolutionary efforts, Castro complained about the "criminal blockade" and said it cost Cuba "millions of pesos" to buy goods from far-away markets.

Nevertheless, blockade or not, Havana's trade with Cuba in 1967 was 70 million dollars, the largest of any western country trading business with Castro. Second was anti-Communist Spain, 60.8 million dollars.

Other western countries which traded with Cuba in 1967, according to figures obtained from the U.S. State Department, were: Canada 48.8 million dollars, Britain 46.8 million dollars, Japan 25.2 million dollars, Italy 24.7 million dollars, Holland 15 million dollars, West Germany 9.2 million dollars, Sweden 8.2 million dollars, Switzerland 5.6 million dollars, Belgium 3.8 million dollars and Denmark one million dollars.

Through Castro complains about the "blockade," which means he can't buy relatively cheap goods from the United States and South America, it must be remembered that France has tripled its trade with Cuba since 1966. Furthermore, France is doing about nine times more business with Cuba than it did in the 10 years before Castro took over.

As for Spain, it recently has been doing more business with Cuba than such Communist nations as East Germany, Bulgaria, North Korea, Hungary, Poland, Romania, Yugoslavia and sometimes, Czechoslovakia.

According to figures available here from neutral sources, Spain at times has traded more with Cuba than has Red China, the island's second most important trader.

The Soviet Union, of course, continues to trade more with Cuba than any other country, 500 million dollars annually. It does so at a deficit and this is part of the reason why Russia must invest a reported one million dollars a day in nonmilitary aid to Cuba.

The remains, however, that Cuba can easily trade with nations other than Russia and China provided it can pay hard cash for the products. Not only that, Cuba's credit in the eyes of some western and eastern countries, is good.

For instance, Cuba has been given a five-year credit of 44 million dollars, backed by the British government, to build a fertilizer plant in the southern port of Cienfuegos. The work will be done by Simon Carves Ltd. of England.

Romania has given Cuba eight years to pay for 30 million dollars worth of oil drilling equipment, and East Germany has provided 25 million dollars worth of heavy construction and hydraulic equipment on credit.

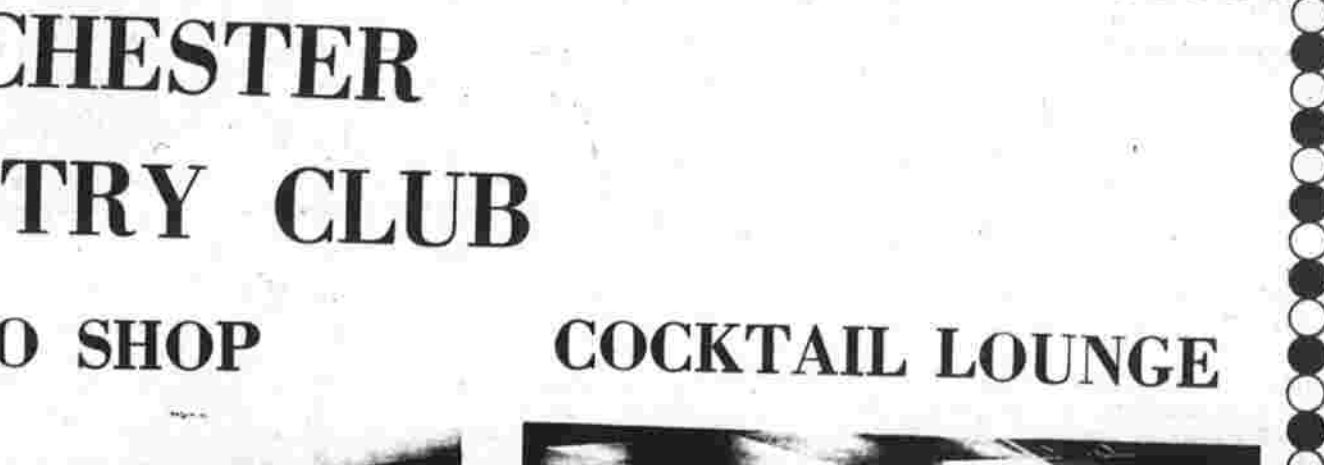
