HHH Lead 'Uneasy' On Convention Eve

CHICAGO (AP) — Hubert H. Humphrey held a heavy but highly uneasy lead for the presidential nomination today as a deeply divided Democratic party headed into its 1968 convention.

The Vice President had in his hip pocket two-thirds of the first-ballot votes needed for the top prize, but most of the talk and much of the enthusiasm were for two non-candidates who were miles from this fortified city: Lyndon B. Johnson and Edward M. Kennedy.

The President, home on the ranch near Johnson City, Tex., was giving no hint on whether he'd even show up in Chicago—though his 60th birthday anniversary tomorrow offers a dramatic opportunity to put real steam behind a budding "Draft Johnson" movement.

Sen. Kennedy, like Johnson an avowed non-candidate, was relaxing at Cape Cod, Mass., but a movement more insistent "draft" movement appeared to be surfacing here.

Forces in the Texas delegation are ready to put Johnson's name in nomination, 2nd former Gov. Michael DeSalle of Ohio is ready with Kennedy's—and this morning in a powerful new strength turned the senator's way.

Longshot presidential hopeful George S. McGovern said if Kennedy "called me and talked to me directly and said that he wanted the nomination I would probably throw my support to him."

Signs Point to Floor Fight Over Democrats' War Plank

CHICAGO (AP) — Indications continued today to point toward a floor fight over the Democrats' position on the Vietnam war, although both supporters and critics of President Johnson's war policy said they are seeking compromise.

Weary members of the Democratic National Convention's Platform Committee struggled into the early hours without apparent success in setting the potentially divisive issue.

Platform writers favoring what they term a strong peace plank claim more than enough votes to bring a dissenting report to the convention floor.

And Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey once again said Americans have the right to expect "some little sign" from North Vietnam that it would enter into meaningful discussions if bombing was stopped. There is no such sign, he stated.

Unconditional cessation of the bombing of North Vietnam is one of the points most hotly debated.

Even apart from the prospect of a Vietnam floor fight, preparation of the platform ran into delay after delay.

The scheduled Sunday night meeting of the full committee to consider a platform draft ended without completing its task and the drafting subcommittee could only hope to have a paper ready for a general session sometime later today.

A long review by the full committee could scramble convention deadlines.

Under normal procedure, the platform should be approved in committee in time to be printed and distributed to delegates and the news media before its formal presentation to the convention scheduled Tuesday evening.

Some of the compromise straws were tossed by key supporters of Humphrey and Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy.

Sen. Edmund Muskie of Maine, who supports Humphrey, said he thinks the views of his side and those of McCarthy's spokesmen "are close enough together on fundamentals that a compromise here ought to be possible."

Governor Harold Hughes of Iowa, who favors McCarthy, said he is "truly hopeful we can work these differences out and not have to go to the floor."

He said the aim should be a

Protestors Snarl Chicago's Streets

CHICAGO (AP) — Nearly 1,000 Yippies, hippies and assorted purveyors of protest played traffic-stalling street tag with police over a four-mile section of Chicago's most famous streets Sunday night, climaxing a day of varied protest demonstrations.

Despite a short barrage of rocks aimed at police in Lincoln Park after midnight, there were very few arrests—at least eight—for the number of people involved—at one point about 2,000.

Activity began on a serious note in the early afternoon when several youth and antiwar groups peacefully picketed the major hotels of Democratic National Convention delegates.

They were protesting U.S. fighting in Vietnam, Soviet troops in Czechoslovakia, federal troops on the alert in Chicago, and Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey in the lead for the Democratic presidential nomination.

But toward midnight a sudden, unplanned romp developed that gaily zig-zagged through several sections of Near-North Chicago.

Problems first began when the more than 1,000 demonstrators set up picket lines at the Conrad Hilton and the Palmer

Crisis Talks Continue Amid Signs of Accord



Over 1,000 Enemy Killed by Allies

SAIGON (AP) — Smashing Communist thrusts across South Vietnam, allied forces killed more than 1,000 of the enemy today and Sunday and raised their toll to more than 6,000 Viet Cong and North Vietnamese dead in the past eight days, military spokesmen reported today.

The intensified fighting went into its ninth day today with one battle still under way below the demilitarized zone. Near Con Thien, U.S. Marines cordoned off more than 500 North Vietnamese troops and were trying to tighten the noose around them. Fifty-two of the enemy were reported killed.

The U.S. Command said that more than 5,000 enemy troops were reported killed last week.

Such signs have appeared on almost every road leading to the east. To make sure that the Soviet occupiers understand them, the Czechs and Slovaks have written them in the Cyrillic alphabet used in Russia.

On the route through southern Bohemia from West Germany to Prague, other signs read "Ivan go home," in Russian, Czechoslovak and English.

Passing through the small villages of Bohemia, one sees walls and shopwindows covered with anti-Soviet signs, many of them in Russian.

"We don't want your help," said one. "This is our country," said another. There were endless variations on the main theme "Moscow is that way, please get going."

New signs also warn travelers of Soviet checkpoints or roadblocks.

Entering Prague on one road, travelers encountered such signs as, "Soviet roadblock, 1500 meters ahead" and "Watch out for Ivan, 500 meters from here."

Another phase of the sign campaign aims at confusing the occupiers and hindering their activities.

MOSCOW (AP) — Czechoslovakia and Soviet talks went into an afternoon session today on the fourth day of negotiations amid reports they had reached preliminary agreement to end the crisis. But some Czechoslovak sources expressed doubt that anything had been agreed upon.

The party leaders of Poland, East Germany, Hungary and Bulgaria, who joined in the occupation of Czechoslovakia, in an attempt to head off Prague's liberalization, have not yet joined in the discussions, Czechoslovak sources said.

Authoritative party sources in Prague said there was hope of reaching an agreement that would include Soviet recognition of the liberal party leaders in exchange for acceptance of a temporary Soviet occupation.

A Czechoslovak Embassy spokesman said President Ludvig Svoboda and other liberal leaders would return to Prague no matter what the results of the negotiations. Another Czech source put it this way: "The negotiations may end late this afternoon and the Czechoslovak delegation would fly home immediately without meeting with the East Germans, Poles, Hungarians and Bulgarians."

One Czechoslovak Embassy source said the negotiations were continuing, but that preliminary agreement on a compromise already had been reached on a pullout of Soviet and East bloc troops within the next two months.

In return for this, the source added, the Czechoslovak press would be prohibited from publishing anti-Soviet statements.

The source added that all Czechoslovak officials would remain in their posts.

The press secretary of the Czechoslovak Embassy, asked about the report, replied: "I don't know anything about it."

There have been conflicting reports in recent days from several embassy sources and it was impossible to obtain confirmation of any reported agreement.

One Czechoslovak source said Svoboda is anxious to reach agreement and return home.

The Czechoslovak Embassy spokesman said three more officials arrived from Prague to join the talks on the fourth day. They were Josef Spacek and Bohušíl Simón, liberal followers of Alexander Dubcek, the party

Red Soldiers Ordered from U.S. Embassy

PRAGUE (AP) — Three armed Soviet soldiers entered the U.S. Embassy grounds today but reluctantly obeyed Ambassador Jacob Beam's order to leave.

Beam ordered the American flag hoisted after the Russians were spotted picking apples in the embassy garden and then climbing to a lookout tower on top of a summer house in the garden. The ambassador instructed embassy officer Mark Garrison to direct the Russians to leave.

Two Marines, M. Sgt. Robert Gattis of Los Angeles and Cpl. James McMore of Savannah, Ga., both in civilian dress, climbed to the top of the tower to hoist the flag.

A few minutes later Garrison climbed up and found the Soviet soldiers eating apples.

"You are eating American apples," he told them through the interpreter. "put them back."

He then explained: "This is U.S. property, the American ambassador would like you to leave."

"We have our orders," said one of the soldiers.

"I don't care about that," said Garrison. "The ambassador wants you to leave."

They put down the apples and left.

About 20 minutes later two Soviet troop carriers and two armored cars drove up to the embassy main entrance. In them were six officers, a civilian in a dark suit and about 40 Soviet soldiers.

They stayed for a few minutes and then drove away.

Sunday night an apartment rented by one of the embassy officers was forcibly entered. The

WASHINGTON (AP) — Army doctors reported today that former President Dwight D. Eisenhower has shown "further increase" in heart irritability since Sunday and remains in critical condition.

Doctors of the Walter Reed Army Hospital said that extra heart beats have been occurring with "increasing frequency" since Sunday.

But they added that there had been no further episodes of "rapid heart action," which constitute the more serious symptom of his condition.

The hospital issued this morning bulletin:

"Gen. Eisenhower has shown further increase in heart irritability since yesterday. Extra beats have been occurring with increasing frequency. However, there have been no further episodes of rapid heart action.

"The general's condition remains critical.

"He enjoyed a light breakfast this morning and continues to rest comfortably."

Gov. Dempsey Sets Caucus State Delegation Unchanged

Connecticut's 44-member delegation to the Democratic National Convention appears to be unchanged from its line-up at the time of the June state convention—still 35 for Vice President Hubert Humphrey and nine for Sen. Eugene McCarthy.

A caucus called for today by Gov. John Dempsey is expected to reveal that the Connecticut Humphrey backers will be among the 1465 delegates estimated to be in the Vice President's pocket. A count of 1312 is needed for nomination.

Those who claim to know predict that Humphrey will reach the magic figure when Tennessee is called.

The sidewalk on Michigan Ave. opposite the Hilton Hotel convention headquarters was the scene yesterday afternoon

of a one-hour, peaceful and uneventful picket by a few hundred demonstrators for an end to the Vietnam war.

Meanwhile, about four miles north in Lincoln Park, throngs of youths, some of them hippies, many of them "Yippies" (Youth International Party), mobilized for demonstrations today through Thursday. They were counted at from 2,500 to 25,000, depending on whose estimate one took.

Michigan Ave. yesterday was quiet, when one compares it to predictions of an armed camp. Some protesters have nicknamed the city "Fort Chicago."

Helmeted police were on every corner in the morning and afternoon, but there were no incidents, before, during and after the one-hour picket. No National Guard troops were seen, although they are known to be on call.

A helicopter dived overhead, directing police to posts

where crowds had congregated.

Those crowds consisted mostly of delegates, alternates, newsmen, and just plain curiosity seekers—the latter Chicagoans, out as if for a Sunday outing.

The crowds dispersed quietly when the picket ended, and the delegates, alternates, newsmen, and the just plain curiosity seekers went about business as usual.

Chicago, except for the hippies and Yippies in Lincoln Park, rallying to ridicule the convention and to embarrass the authorities, was a convention city without incident last night.

Delegates and alternates roamed Michigan Ave. and The Loop, ate, went to movies, to cocktail parties, and to planned entertainments. Many congregated in the hotel lobbies and just gossiped. Spirits were high

Varieties of Intervention

The reaction of a good many Americans, including a couple of Presidential hopefuls, to the Soviet invasion of Czechoslovakia seems to be: It's terrible out there, look what we are doing in Vietnam. The sentiment is understandable, but the analogy is, to say the least, imperfect. The U.S. and Soviet purposes are exactly the opposite.

America's Vietnam policy is justly criticized on a number of points. It is apparent that the Kennedy and Johnson Administrations blundered into a constantly expanding war, without any clear idea of what they were doing or how they were going to get out of it.

Perhaps Senator Edward Kennedy expressed the heart of the matter as well as any politician could. It has existed since the American people have been unwilling to meet the needs of its own people, a government that has demanded ever more money, more American lives to be poured into the swamp of their failure. 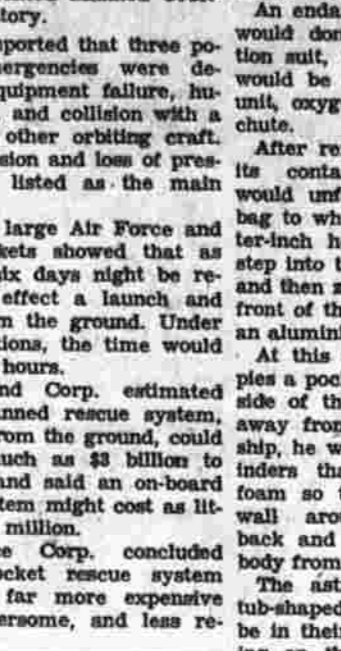

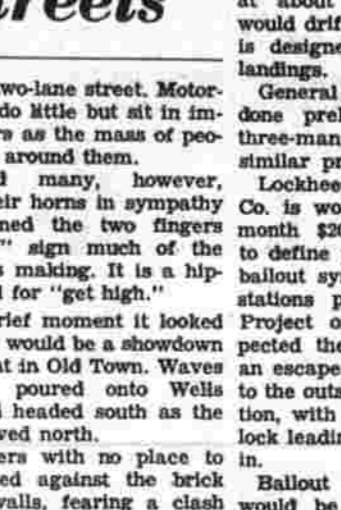

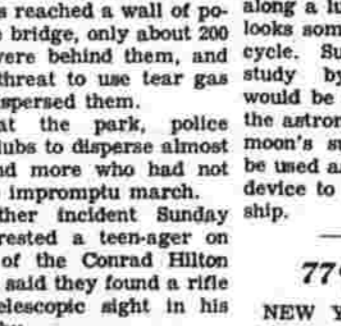

Transit Workers Strike, Increase Chicago Tieup

CHICAGO (AP) — Public transportation for the Democratic National Convention was severely hampered today by strikes of transit workers and taxicab drivers. A group of predominantly Negro bus drivers employed by the Chicago Transit Authority, who called themselves the Concerned Transit Workers, began a strike against their union at 12:50 a.m. Sunday.

The walkout came late Sunday morning as the city's major cab companies, which have kept 80 per cent of the city's 4,500 taxis off the streets.

A Transit Authority spokesman said Sunday that city police had cut services in half on the city's South Side and by 25 per cent on the North Side.

George L. Dement, authority chairman, said elevated and subway trains ran on schedule. Only 30 per cent of the usual transit service operated on Sunday, however, and the full effect of the strike was not felt until today.

Dement said 18 arrests were made in connection with assaults on bus drivers and damage to buses and railway tracks. He said "Any CTA employee arrested in connection with any of these acts will be severely disciplined."

The "incidents" strike could snarl normal weekday traffic and cause a snag in services for delegates and visitors. But chartered buses and an auto pool were set up to transport most persons authorized to attend the convention.

Many negotiations to end the strike by drivers against the Yellow and Checker Cab companies were planned for today.

The walkout affects 5,400 drivers and 600 mechanics of Local 77, Democratic Union Organizing Committee of the Beaters International Union.

The union is demanding an increase in drivers' compensation by 50 per cent of base rate, plus more fringe benefits including safety glass partition between driver and passenger compartments, a safeguard against holdups.

Organizations under the old contract ranged from 45½ per cent for new drivers to 47½ per cent after 13 years experience. The companies offered a new scale with a 48 per cent top after 20 years experience.

The resident bus drivers walked out Sunday for a second time after their leader rejected union officers given to seven

Coast-Fire Line Calm

Troopiers to Red Party
HONG KONG (AP) — Seven of the 10 vice ministers of foreign trade in Communist China have been purged and branded traitors to the Communist Party, a purported Red Cross pamphlet says today, according to a newspaper.

The undated copy of the Chilly Chuan-shih (Special Research) said the purged vice ministers included Lei Jen-min, Chang Ming, Li Cheng, Lu Chang and Pan Heng-chang.

The pamphlet said the Ministry of Foreign Trade had only a skeleton staff left. This, according to the pamphlet, could hamper the forthcoming Canton Biennial trade fair scheduled to open in October.

McGovern, a South Dakota senator, said, however, "I don't expect that to happen. I don't know about any Kennedy movement."

A second liberal senator from the Midwest, Philip Hart of Michigan, endorsed Kennedy for the nomination and said he would back Kennedy if he became a candidate.

Like McGovern, both Hart and Levin spoke cautiously, saying they were not urging anything but the Kennedy brothers to get into the race.

But a boom, or at least a boomlet, has been launched. Attention was centered particularly on the vote-heavy Illinois delegation where, at the direction of Mayor Richard J. Daley, a presidential preference vote was put off until Wednesday—obviously to see if either Johnson or Kennedy drives a coalition.

Bill Clark, campaign manager for Sen. Eugene J. McCarthy, contended at a news conference in mid-morning "It is quite clear that Humphrey is not going to win on the first ballot."

Clark cited particularly the postponement by the vice delegation "this convention is not going to proceed hastily to the business of nominating a president," Clark said.

On paper, at least, the strength of the declared candidates remained constant. The Associated Press, basing its count on primary results and pledges, checks with delegates and caucus, gave this standing in mid-morning:

McGovern 37½;
Favorable sons 19½;

On another front, meanwhile, Gov. Lester Maddox of Georgia resigned as a delegate to the convention—though he remains a candidate for the party's nomination.

California Assembly Speaker Jesse M. Unruh, heading the 170-vote delegation won by the late Robert F. Kennedy, said it would be difficult for him to support Humphrey, but said he would be impossible for the group to band unanimously to find any one candidate.

Humphrey's supporters seemed to make up some of this contested ground with the vote cast by Frank P. O'Connor, head of the New York City Council, that the vice president will get about 100 of his state's 190 votes on the first ballot.

An Associated Press poll of 478, and McGovern 38½ to ward the minimum of 1,212 needed for the nomination. Another 78½ were uncommitted, with favorable sons and scattered other candidates holding 42½.

The convention began clearing away the preliminaries to fight in an atmosphere of maximum security blockade at the Stockyards International Amphitheatre.

Delegates and alternates were outnumbered by troops 4-1. Six thousand federal troops had been alerted into Chicago to back up 18,000 Illinois National Guardsmen and 6,000 men from any racial flareup or antiwar violence.

Police officers have sealed off the convention area. Small crowds of anti-war demonstrators rallied Sunday in downtown lakefront park areas and marched on one hotel, but there were only a few arrests and no major disturbances.

President Johnson, who declared in March he would not accept his party's nomination for another term, remained at his Texas ranch with no announced plans to attend the convention.

Johnson will be 60 Tuesday, but in contrast to the elaborate birthday party staged by the convention that nominated him four years ago, the Democratic party's program for that day omits any mention of the President.

Johnson's Vietnam policies appear headed for a floor fight Tuesday night, despite efforts to reach an off-stage compromise.
