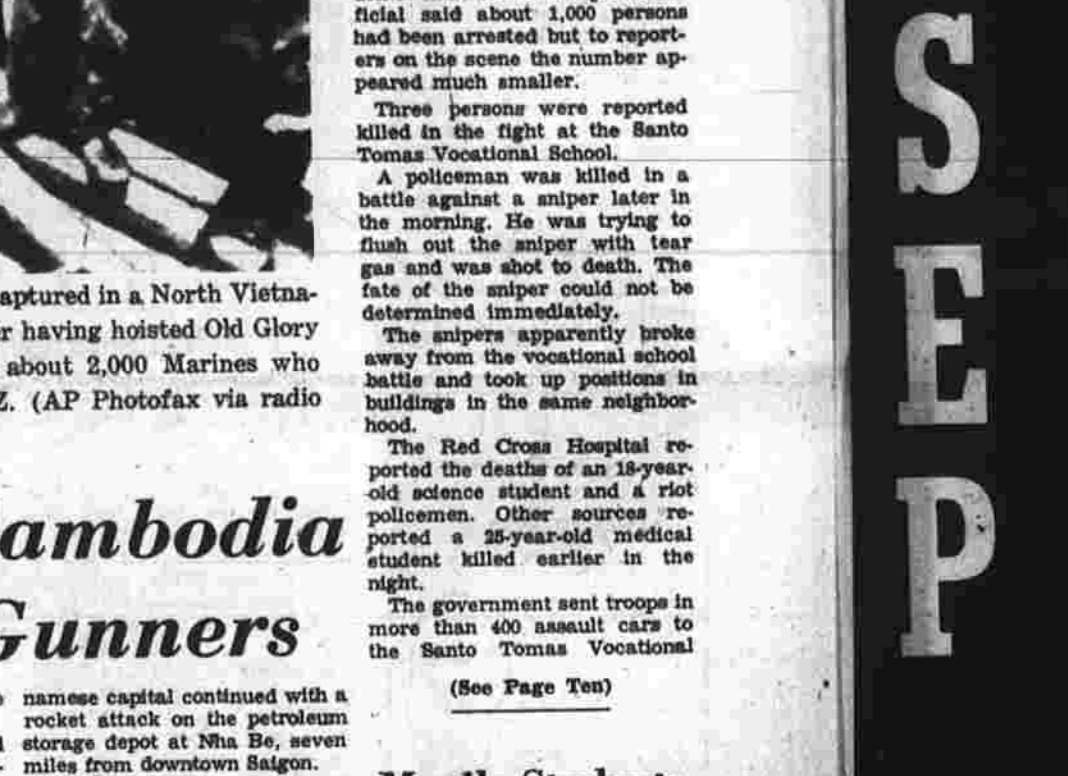
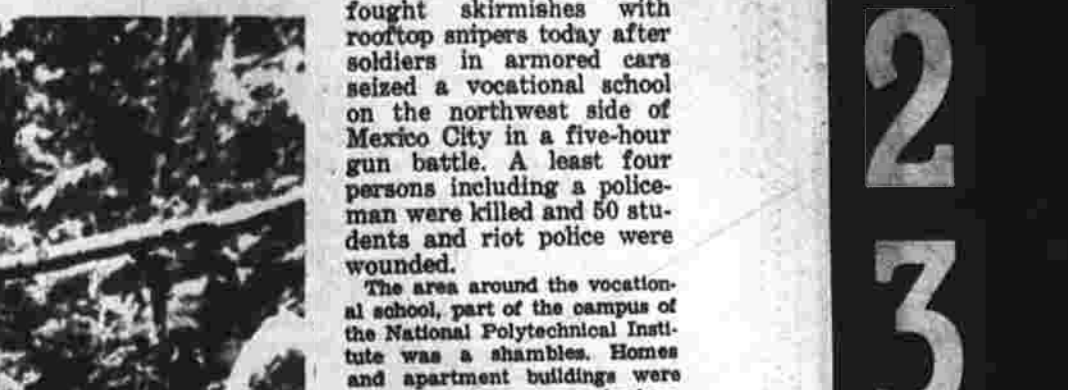

SAIGON (AP)—A crack enemy battalion of about 300 men armed with flame-throwers, rocket launchers and assault rifles was chopped in half early today trying to overrun a Special Forces camp close to the Cambodian border.

U.S. headquarter said 13 South Vietnamese were killed and 13 were wounded.

Under a furious barrage of 800 mortar and rocket rounds, the attackers rushed the barbed wire around the Katum camp a few hours before dawn.

Wave after Wave hurried at the camp before what was left of the battered battalion fled back in midmorning, some six hours after the first assault.

Normally the camp at Katum is the base for six companies of South Vietnamese irregulars. It was believed about 400 South Vietnamese plus 10 to 12 American Green Beret advisers were in the camp when the assault came.

U.S. headquarters said 13 South Vietnamese were killed and 13 were wounded. No American Special Forces advisers were hit during the battle.

Associated Press photographer Henri Huet reported from Katum that another 15 South Vietnamese troops and one Green Beret were wounded by helicopter-borne reinforcements after the main fighting died down.

The amount of weapons left on the field indicated the enemy battalion had almost totally lost its effectiveness. Normally the Viet Cong and North Vietnamese troops are equipped with 17 rocket grenade launchers, a command radio and a stock of mines in addition to the blocks of plastic and the rocket grenades.

Often hit, the camp at Katum is only three miles from Cambodia, and 70 miles northwest of Saigon. It guards a heavily jammed highway.
