The Greek word translated "self-control" or "temperance" is a compound term. One part comes from a term meaning might, power, strength. The prefix is the first person singular Greek pronoun, "ego," I. Self-control means not only the elimination of excess, but also deficiencies. Maturity is marked by self-control. No wonder it is among the fruits of the Spirit. Gal. 5:22-23 and the Christian graces, 2 Pet. 1:5-7.

Self-control is needed desperately in the area of human pride. "God resisted the proud, but gives grace to the humble." Jas. 4:6. Pride or vainglory is one of three basic categories of sin, 1 John 2:16. Excessive pride is evidenced by man's seeking independence from God. This is caused by material affluence. 1 Tim. 6:17; by human learning, 1 Cor. 1:18ff.; by worldly power, influence, Acts 12:20-23. Pride also is seen in status-seeking, Matt. 23:1-12. And pride is reflected in self-commendation accompanying material gifts, as though the recipient had obtained them, 1 Cor. 4:7.

Pride precedes destruction, Prov. 16:18. Avoid its excess, yet do not deprive yourself of all sense of worth and human dignity as being in God's image.

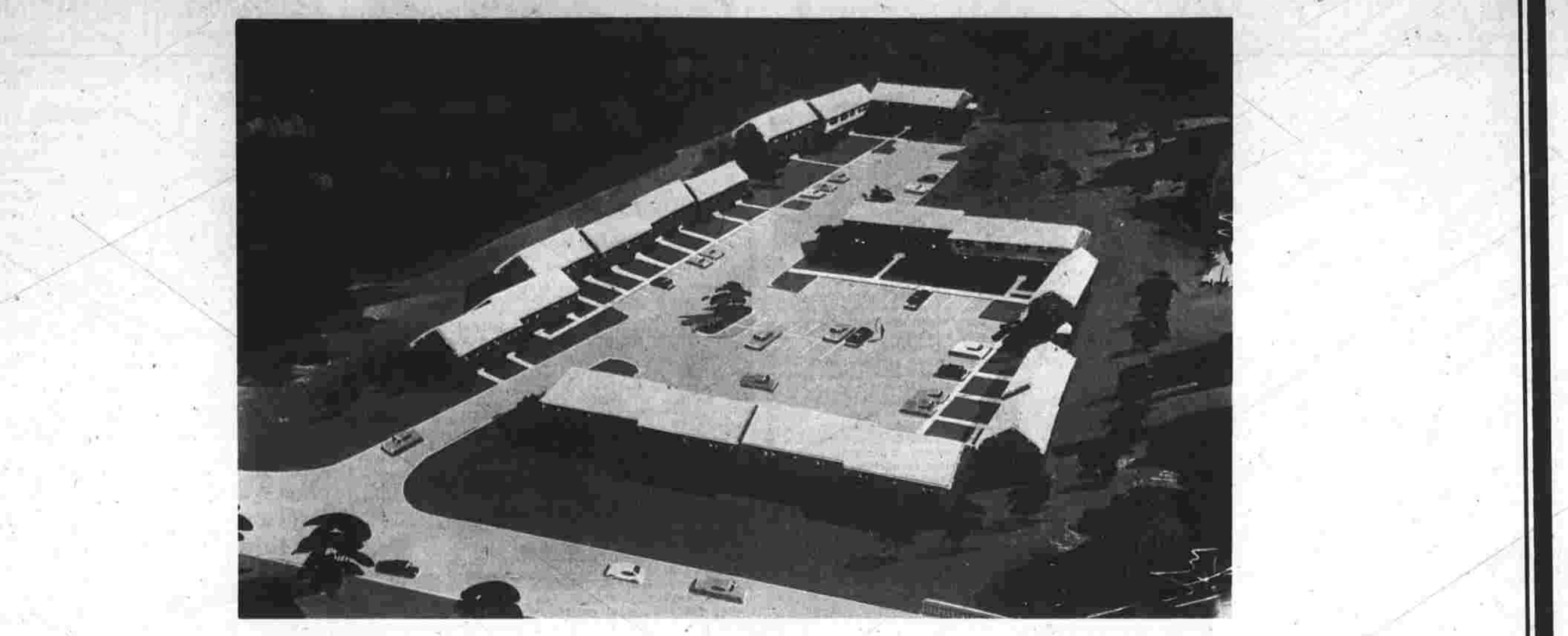

# The Name Of Game Is Money

By DICK KLEINER

HOLLYWOOD — (NEA) — The future of television may be arriving on Friday nights over NBC.

The entire television industry will be watching the network's new series, "The Name of the Game," with more than the usual interest. This project is a new concept and, if it works, it could mark the beginning of a new era.

The Name of the Game is a 90-minute dramatic series. That, in itself, isn't new — "The Virginian" has been going along for years. But this one is really a series of almost-movies, tied together by only the faintest of threads.

There are three stars on "The Name of the Game"—Gene Barry, Tony Franciosa and Robert Stack. They will alternate from week to week. The unifying theme is that they all work for a large magazine publisher. Barry is the owner-publisher, Franciosa a roving correspondent and Stack the editor of a crime magazine.

Barry will probably make a brief appearance in the segments starring Franciosa and Stack. With that exception, and the usage of Susan Saint James in a continuing role, each episode will be entirely self-sufficient.

Universal, which is making the series, obviously hopes to recoup some of the cost by selling many — six or eight out of the original 24 — as feature films in Europe. Insiders believe that the network sale alone will not be enough to defray the cost, which is estimated at between \$400,000 and \$500,000 each.

This makes it far and away the most expensive television series ever made. The actors are in awe of the way money is being spent — each episode

has four or five high-priced guest stars, the sets are as good as most movies, the scripts are being written by experienced and costly movie writers.

"We had two scripts, which weren't quite right," Bob Stack says. "So we postponed them. When I was doing The Untouchables, they would have gone ahead and tried to make the script work."

"We had a set that the producer didn't like. He ordered it rebuilt."

"Are these movies? It's a matter of semantics—I'd say it's about half again as good as an ordinary TV show. We shoot 12 days on each. I have a week off between them."

On the sound stages of Universal, often the three companies are shooting simultaneously. When I visited the sets, the Franciosa company wasn't working; they had wrapped up at 2 a.m. the night before.

But, on one stage, Stack was in a jail cell, interviewing Jessica Walter, as an accused murderess.

On another, Gene Barry

was in a Berlin night club, drinking beer with Anne Francis while on a raised circular platform behind the bar, two girl wrestlers were knocking each other around.

In both cases, the sets were the same as you'd see on any movie sound stage. In fact, the Berlin night club set was more lavish than most, crowded with extras and what they call "atmosphere."

Nobody is sure how the thing will work. The public will be the deciding factor.

"The name of the game is rating points," says David Victor, producing the Stack shows. But everyone is watching with great interest, because there are some intriguing questions left to be answered.

The stars are happiest of all, and most hopeful. For them, this is a chance to do a series—with all its attendant financial benefits—and yet lead a more-or-less normal life.

"It gives me a chance to do a series and live a little," Barry says. "Only eight a year—and a week off between them. I hope it goes."

## How to Tell Television Plots

NEW YORK (AP) — Television viewers with sharp eyes for details can sometimes foretell the twists of plots from the way the series, sets—even the players—are dressed.

If, for instance, one sees a plane in flight, or when the hero is shown boarding or leaving a commercial flight, it is likely that somewhere in the background will be the name or insignia of an airline.

Thus, if there is visible on the screen some real carrier's identification, it is practically certain that the plane will be involved in no mishaps—not even encounter mild air turbulence. Or that there will be any active skulduggery aboard, like madmen holding the passengers in terror or stealing secret papers from trussed up couriers.

Airlines are sensitive about such things, feeling that they already have enough problems with passengers who fly with clenched fists.

So when the viewer sees a fictitious name on the side of a plane, there is a good chance some exciting action will take place in transit.

One action series has a hero who almost weekly takes a plane for some place or another to save the good side. A permanent set in the series, a Hollywood studio, consists of a complete reproduction of a passenger section of a plane, with one side cut away so the cameras may shoot the interior. The initials of a widely advertised international carrier are all over the place—on the back of every seat, on the overhead racks, on the sides of the plane.

All, however, are easily removed—just in case something nasty is going to happen aloft.

Auto manufacturers are sensitive, too. Heavy advertisers in television, they dislike programs using auto accidents in plots. Agents of "The FBI" always tool around in the latest models of their automobile sponsor's product. And while it is an action-loaded series, there are a minimum of stories in which that speeding car caroms off a mountain road or smashes into a tree.

The automobile sponsor of "Bonanza" eliminated this type of problem by investing in a series that is set in a period before the mechanical horse was invented.

When Lucille Ball turns up on your screen wearing slacks, it is certain that within seconds she is going to be involved in some bizarre unladylike situation—like getting stuck in a chimney or tangled in a ladder—where pants are mandatory.

Many stars of police and private eye series have one or two specially constructed break-away suits—garments built to tear easily—for wear when fight scenes are coming up. If you can spot the suit—Robert Vaughn used to do all his U.N.C.L.E. fighting in a gray, single button suit—it is easy to predict when fists will fly.

# 'It Takes a Thief' Has Carefree Crowd

HOLLYWOOD (AP) —This is the time of the year when working is a way of life for the inhabitants of televisionland.

If you are connected with an established show that has gone merrily along for two years or 10, you worry about the competition and whether the viewers will love you in October as they seemed to last March.

If you are involved in a new series, you worry about everything—the competition, particularly if part of it consists of feature movie reruns; the time period; the scripts; the format and—mostly—the reaction of the fickle, inscrutable public.

The only relatively carefree crowd is found working in a series that was tossed into a mid-season vacancy in a network schedule and, somehow, caught on.

One of these last season was ABC's "It Takes a Thief," which not only proved a popular winner, but attracted an audience that saved the show that followed it, "N.Y.P.D.," which had been slated for extinction.

"I was pretty unhappy when ABC gave us that midseason spot," said Robert Wagner, the star of "It Takes a Thief." "I liked the show and I liked my character but I figured it was all down the drain."

The public liked the character, too. Wagner plays a jaunty, debonair thief using his skills as a superagent. What makes it all sort of a mystery, however, is that at the time the show made its debut, jaunty, debonair superagents had become a drug on the market—"Laugh-in," in fact, had replaced the jauntiest, most debonair of them all, "The Man From U.N.C.L.E."

"Ours just took off," said Wagner. "When we started production all we had was one script. We worked 17 hours without a break and I think now the terrible pressure of deadlines kept us on our toes and added something."

Now, established as a hit, the emergency is over, the production plan is made—and with success has come an extra dimension.

"Writers now are interested in doing scripts; actors and agents want to get involved with the show," Wagner said.

Wagner, who has been a successful film actor for more than 20 years, is committed to the
