Like Thoreau They Take to the Woods to Learn

"I went to the woods," Thoreau said, "because I wished to live deliberately, to front only the essential facts of life, and see if I could not learn what it had to teach, and not, when I came to die, discover that I had not lived."

Last week the Walden experiment of more than a century ago becomes contemporary for the first of 2,500 elementary school pupils in Manchester and nine other area towns. "Project Outdoors" became a reality after three years of planning and setbacks.

On Thursday the 69-acre tract of the Natural Science Center on Oak Grove St. was converted into a classroom for the first of 80 pilot classes.

This is a breakdown of the classes from participating towns: Manchester public, 2; Manchester parochial, 4; Coventry 1; Glastonbury 13; Hebron 3; Marlborough 2; South Windsor 14; Vernon public 17; and Vernon parochial, 1.

What is "Project Outdoors"? Its goals are twofold:

1. To educate teachers in the various ways the out-of-doors can be used in teaching natural science concepts.
2. To emphasize the importance of including outdoor learning in the school science curriculum.

Yes, it is all this — and more. Today when air and water pollution are more than topics of conversation, when man has destroyed the passenger pigeon and Carolina parakeet, and other forms of life teeter on the brink of annihilation, when Malinaus' law is rapidly becoming a reality, it is an attempt to reveal to children an irreplaceable age the interrelationship and in-

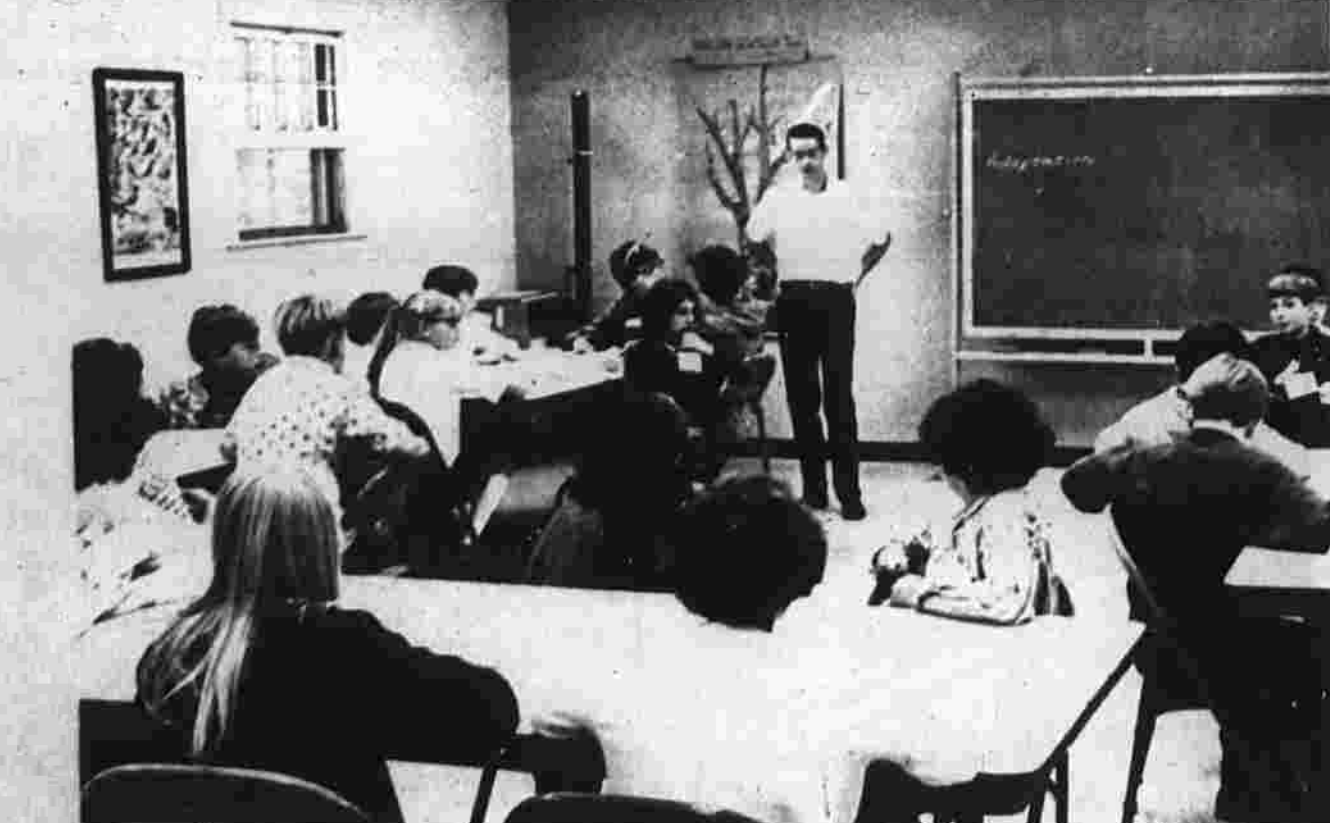

spring session. In addition, each class will be visited once by a project instructor to coordinate field exploration with the classroom.

Three classes are conducted each day by the staff: 9-10:30, 10:30-12 and 12:30-2. In that hour and a half the pencil is exchanged for the scalpel, a straight leaf or blossom is studied over instead of the all too familiar textbook page, and the NCS fields, hills, and ponds become a vast audiovisual aid.

Before the opening class, Mrs. Norman Newton, project coordinator, and instructors Jean Michael and Fred Fredette conducted a three-day in-service orientation program for 90 teachers. These workshops will be repeated when the fields of study change in the winter and spring.

For 20 other teachers who were not in the in-service program there will be nine after-school workshops — three each in the fall, winter, and spring. These sessions will last for 7½ hours on Mondays or Tuesdays. The project program is a trimester one. In the fall the emphasis is on seasonal adaptation of plants and animals, plant and animal communities in a field, and seed production and dispersal.

In the winter the field of study will include soil and water conservation, the forest community, and environmental adaptations of plants and animals during this season.

The ecology of the fresh water pond, plant succession in field and forest, and the plant world will be stressed in the spring.

The curriculum is geared to the curricula of the area schools. In Manchester grades 3 and 4 are involved. In other towns the grades may vary. The schedule of classes is staggered—Manchester, Coventry, Glastonbury on a typical day, for example—to avoid the drain on the teaching personnel of a school on any one day.

Nixon Wealth Said \$500,000

MANEAPOLIS, Minn. (AP) — An aide to Richard M. Nixon said Tuesday that the GOP presidential hopeful has personal wealth of just over a half million dollars.

The information had been requested by the Chicago Tribune and was supplied by Ron Ziegler, a Nixon press aide, during a campaign appearance here.

Assets of the former vice president were listed at \$525,000, according to Nixon's business manager, and liabilities were given as \$42,000.

The bulk of Nixon's wealth is in undeveloped land in Florida. This accounts for \$401,320 of the candidate's \$515,500 total net worth.

Other assets include the family home in Whittier, Calif., at \$100,000 market value and a New York City cooperative apartment worth \$166,400.

Most of Nixon's liabilities are in bank loans and mortgages secured by real estate.

Ziegler said Nixon has bank accounts totaling \$39,385—across the country to business manager Vincent Andrews—and life insurance policies with a cash value of \$16,007. His civil service retirement benefits for service in the House of Representatives and Senate are worth \$120.

In addition, Nixon's interest in his New York law practice is valued at \$46,000. Personal preservation Commission. Objectives, rules, and regulations set at \$60,000.

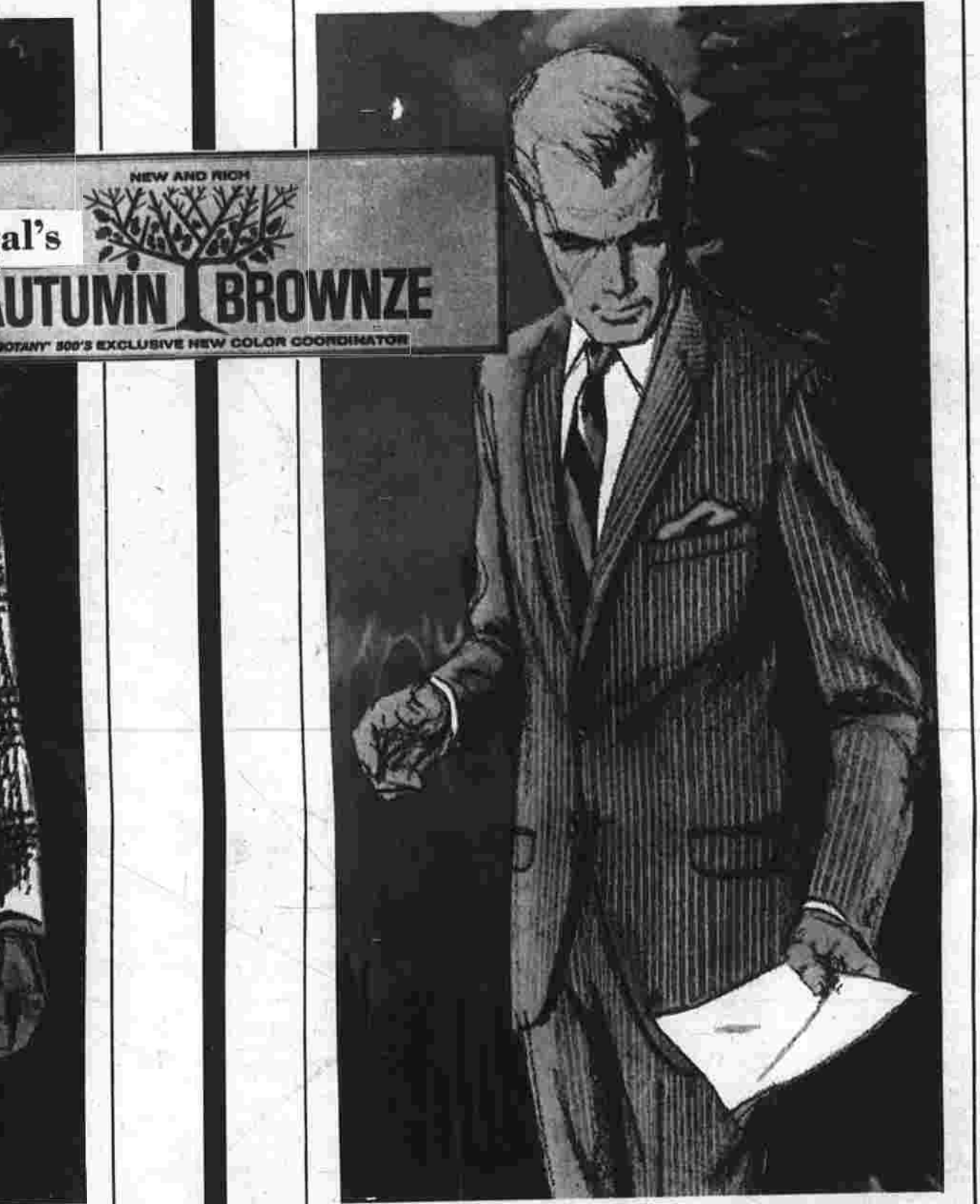

Mrs. Doris Boyle Stresses Need for Welfare Director

A report presented Monday night by Mrs. Doris Boyle, who just resigned as the town's welfare director, pointed up the need for a full-time director for Vermont.

The presentation was made to the Board of Representatives on request of the Board. Members declined to know exactly what the job involved and what the qualifications required.

Mrs. Boyle pointed out that the job does not involve just giving a voucher for a week's supply of food to a family who meets the requirements.

Mrs. Boyle noted that each case is different and the decisions to be made varied.

She cited cases where husband and father have left home, leaving wife and children with no money or even food.

She said the job involved not only counting but also looking for help and guidance. They all required different types of counseling. Mrs. Boyle pointed out that the qualifications required for the job were not only a high school graduate but also a social worker or a person with a similar background.

At the present time, she said, the town has a part-time director who handles the day-to-day work. She said that if a full-time director were hired, it would mean a significant increase in the town's budget.

national funds for this fiscal year," Mrs. Boyle questioned the Board. She said that the state pays 75 per cent more for the state than for the town welfare costs.

With the exception of the director serving before Mrs. Boyle, previous directors handled their own problems.

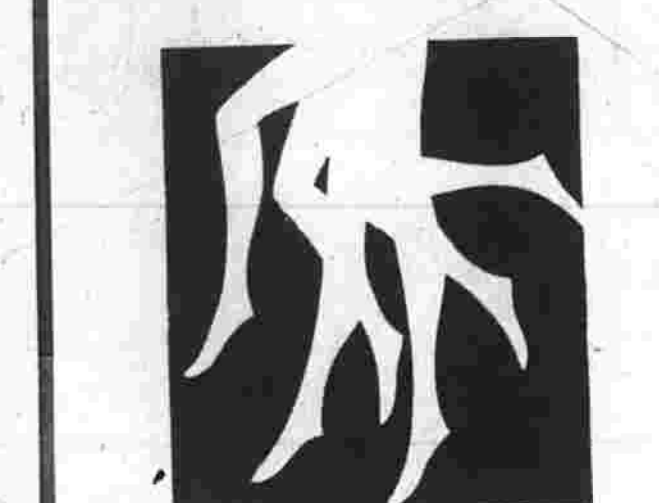

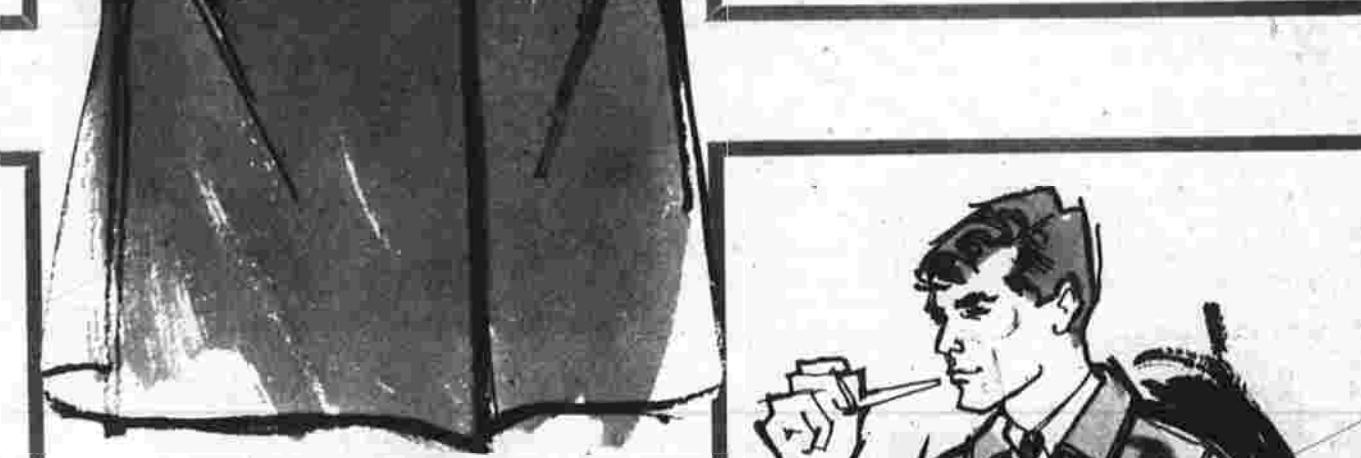

Red Chinese Elite Seen Wielding Immense Power

By WILLIAM L. BYRAN

A Peking Correspondent

Official Peking accounts of Red China's 19th anniversary celebration this month border on an impression that the military is wielding immense political power. The same accounts dance before Western eyes tantalizing clues to a variety of Chinese puzzles.

Among the puzzles: Is the "great proletarian cultural revolution" beginning to fade away after two violent years? Has a political bureau of the Central Committee, and making it clear that this body is separate from and greatly subordinate to the ruling elite, none of whose members are included in the Politburo was the all-powerful governing body of the Communist party and the nation.

At least six of the 10 listed as members of the Politburo had at one time or another been demoted by Red Guard militias as foes of Mao's thinking. Their appearance as Politburo members could point to a process of compromise in the upper levels which could permit Red China to stabilize herself after the vast disruption of the party and government bureaucracies wrought by the excesses of the cultural revolution.

Two military men in this Politburo listing are connected with the nuclear weapons program. One is Nieh Jung-chen, who has a marshal's rank before the abolition of all ranks in 1965, and Yeh Chien-ying, also a former marshal and vice chairman of the National Defense Council. The former has been in general charge of the nuclear weapons development program. The latter is president of the Military Science Academy.

Little can remain, however, of the party and government structure as it existed before 1966. Much of the bureaucracy in the generation, which fought for the Communist revolution, has been destroyed.

There seems to be a firm link between the restoration of order in Red China and the rising influence of the armed forces. This month, the army was singled out for extravagant praise as "the pillar of the dictatorship of the proletariat under the direct command of Vice Chairman Lin Biao... a great steel wall defending the country... and defending the great proletarian cultural revolution."

Whatever has taken place, has not lessened the hostility of the current Red Chinese regime to the Soviet leadership. The tone toward Moscow is as defiant and provocative as ever.

China's leaders have predicted that the cultural revolution would end by 1968. The time is close at hand.

Little can remain, however, of the party and government structure as it existed before 1966. Much of the bureaucracy in the generation, which fought for the Communist revolution, has been destroyed.

Clifford Sees Indications of Red Withdrawal

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of Defense Clark M. Clifford said today there have been "some indications recently" of the withdrawal of some Soviet Union troops from Czechoslovakia.

But Clifford said the U.S. government does not have details on the reported Soviet troop withdrawal or the number involved.

Clifford spoke with newsmen at nearby Andrews Air Force Base, Md., just before flying to West Germany for a two-day meeting of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization's nuclear planning group. He also will visit West Berlin briefly as well as meet with U.S. military commanders in West Germany.

The defense secretary made it clear, as previously indicated, that his side trip to Berlin is intended to underscore U.S. determination to stand fast behind Western rights in the Communist-encircled city.

He described the Berlin visit as "demonstrating the attitude of our country toward the freedom and viability of West Berlin."

Clifford makes his trip at a time when the United States is taking a tough stand toward the Soviet Union on a wide diplomatic front in the wake of the Soviet-led invasion of Czechoslovakia in August.

The Soviet Union and its Warsaw Pact allies are reported to have moved as many as 30 divisions into Czechoslovakia, where there were no Soviet armed forces before the invasion of Czechoslovakia.

The Russian troops would be to see their backs as they retreat over their own borders...

What Russia says it wants Russia has made it impossible for Russia to have.

It has been an idiotic exchange. And it is an idiotic world in which our great power seeking security sets so much against its own real interests.

Decline Of The Arts It's the fashion these days to write about the decline of just about every thing from public morality to the creative arts...

Much is being said, of course, about how this is a dirty campaign and how the political figures are saying nasty things about another.

Yet when these outraged out-criers cite these cases all they come up with are such things as Vice President Humphrey referring to Richard Nixon as a "Nuisance" or Governor Agnew decrying Vice President Humphrey as being "not on Communism".

And the way it appeared was in Mr. Nixon's suggestion that, given certain military conditions in Vietnam, he, as an incoming new and free President, might be able to agree to peace terms.

Along with this suggestion, Mr. Nixon pointedly recalled that General Dwight D. Eisenhower "did not indicate exactly in 1952 how he would end the war."

But how Eisenhower, as President, did end the war has become open history. He ended the war by being able to accept, because of his military reputation, peace terms in Korea.

Mr. Nixon, of course, would bring in to the Presidency the same particular asset — that no one, except the irrepressible John Birch, would be able to accuse him of having been an appeaser.

But since that score, a Nixon as President could, just as Eisenhower did in 1950, take a peace settlement in Vietnam that might be highly controversial if a Humphrey were trying to sell it to the nation.

This could obtain even if it were true, which the actual record does not happen to indicate, that Nixon has been more honest in Vietnam than has Humphrey as a supporter and defender of Lyndon Johnson's decisions there.

The only really basic difference in the 1952 and the 1968 situations may be the difference in the nature of the two wars itself — one a police action being waged largely with full moral justification under the flag and the law of the United Nations — the other a unilateral enterprise on the part of the United States being waged outside the United Nations sanction for purposes which are highly controversial in this country.

As for the parallel which does exist — in the potential importance of the election to peace-making — it is good news that it has found its place in the Nixon mind and awareness and potential policy.

Russia's Exchange, Friend For Foe The statement in Pravda that the people of Czechoslovakia will have to show friendship for the Russian troops before the Russian troops can ever be withdrawn is factually clear evidence of the dilemma upon which Russian power has now impaled itself.

Over a few years ago the quality of insult was much better. Winston Churchill was upholding the standard when he referred to Clement Attlee as a "sheep in wolf's clothing." So was Congressman Marwood when he described J. Edgar Hoover as "a Stork Club detective."

Moreover, Hubert Humphrey was more deft a few years back when he recognized "I always rather liked Barry Goldwater and his running mate, what's-his-name."

Now look what we are down to. Undergraduates wishing to insult their elders can only splutter about the rotten system, which even if it were true is neither original nor clever. And the best thing the Democratic candidate can come up with is a sort of little monkey joke about "What's an Agnew?"

It's enough to make you despair of our time. Paywright-like four-letter word uplifts the language of Shakespeare. Instead of Bernini columns up-ended corncobs pass for an architectural pride. To soothe the savage breast composers give us electronic buzzness. And to crown it all the art of incoherence has lost its sheen, bereft of all elegance, majesty or wit.

Colorado Offers New Category in Child Medicine

Colorado, Colo. (AP) — A new kind of medical practitioner will be trained at the University of Colorado Medical School in an attempt to meet an impending crisis in health care for children.

The work will have a range broader than a nurse's but narrower than a doctor's. The workers will meet the medical needs of children who don't require special attention or care for serious ailments.

This new category of medicine—it doesn't have a formal name yet—is the brainchild of Dr. Henry K. Silver of the medical school's department of pediatrics.

Silver said vast numbers of children already are "receiving grossly inadequate total health care." And, he said, "It's going to get much worse."

He said estimates place the child population of the UNITED STATES at 76 million by 1980. To provide adequate health care for these children an additional 100,000 pediatricians need to be trained by then, he said.

The quota cannot be met, even allowing for a drastic increase in the present rate of fewer than 1,000 pediatricians entering practice each year.

Silver's plan will begin to become a reality when the first group of trainees starts classes next summer.

With this specialized training, the new practitioners will be ready to see patients after five years of post-high school study, compared with 11 years to put a pediatrician into practice and into years for a general practitioner.

"This is not a substitute for a doctor, but entails more actual responsibility than a nurse or some form of medical technician," he explained.

The training period can be shorter, he said, because the course will be focused mainly on the needs of children. This abbreviated training should make the program attractive to those—such as women—who want a medical career along with marriage and family—who don't want to spend the time required to become a doctor, Silver said.

"This opens the health profession to people who might have had to select another area of study," Silver said. The pay, he said, is expected to start at \$10,000 to \$12,000, with increases up to \$15,000.

The training would include two years of undergraduate study, two years at the medical school in basic sciences and clinical experience, and a one-year internship. Those completing the course would be awarded bachelor's degrees.

These new workers—they may be called "child care associates" or some similar name—would undergo examinations and certification by the Colorado State Board of Medical Examiners before starting practice.

The association will work under supervision in offices of private physicians or public health departments. They will be able to handle about 80 per cent of the patient load seen by a pediatrician on a normal day.

The doctor would be freed for more seriously ailing patients, those with special problems, for research or for keeping himself up to date.

"Bob Gibson," he told me, "is one of baseball's all-time great pitchers. I'm no Johnny-come-lately saying that. For the past few years now and each year he gets better."

"I was managing a ball club and I had one big game, a game that I had to win. There's no question in my mind, he's the greatest pitcher in the world today."

"One thing about Gibson that impresses," Dean added, "is that he's challenged the strength of every batter he faces. He'll pitch to a batter's weakness and get him out. He doesn't go out there and pitch around at his so-called weakness."

"Gibson just stands there and challenges the batter. He's the best pitcher in baseball. He knows how to pitch and he has the talent to back it up. Dean said before taking himself to appear on a pre-game video show.

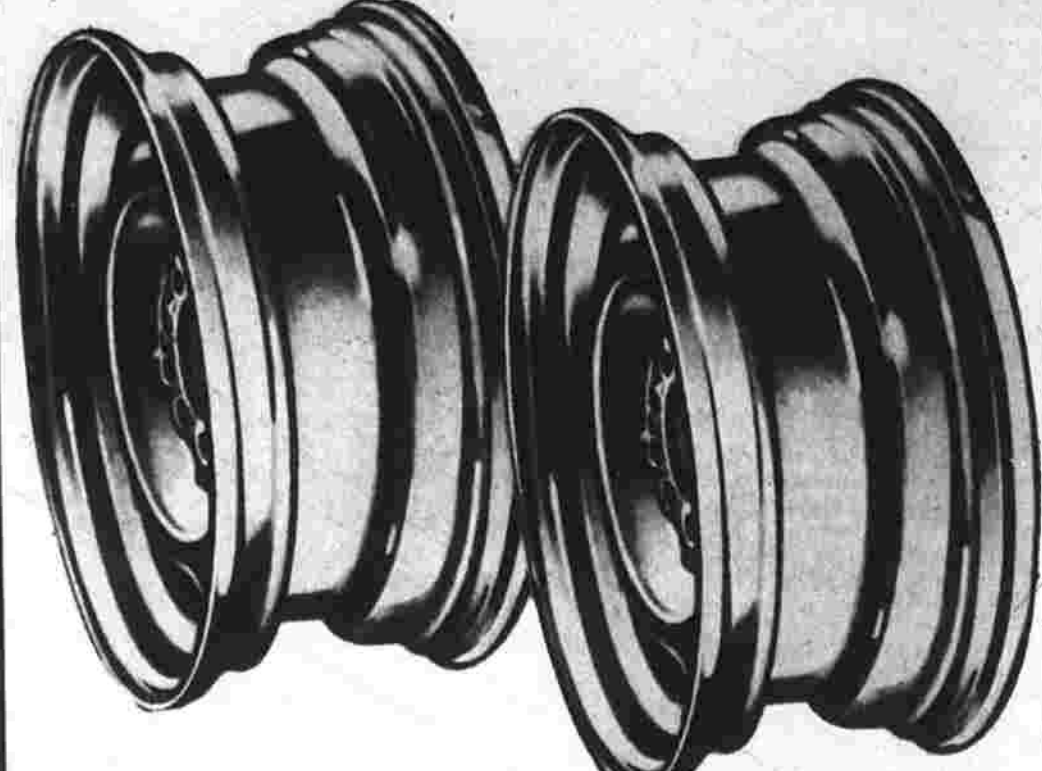
