### After Four-month Search Divers Locate Remains Of Spanish Armada Ship

DUBLIN (AP) — The remains of the Santa Maria de la Rosa, a ship of the Spanish Armada sunk in 1588, have been found, but hopes of recovering her reputed treasure must wait until next summer.

The exact location was a mystery until last July. The wreck lies in the form of a long heap of ballast stones pointing approximately northwest. Cannon shot of three sizes and terra cotta pottery have been blasted to the surface.

The divers are staid about any discovery of treasure. Documents in London dated 1586 say the galleon carried 50,000 gold doubloons and 100,000 silver pieces. Today that would be worth around \$2 million.

John P. King, Dublin lawyer who acts for the diving team, says: "We have been granted a license by the Spanish government to explore the wreck. We deposited a bond of \$50,000 in return for which we may retain all objects of historical interest and 50 per cent of all other objects of historical interest."

But dreams of treasure are not shared by everybody. Tom P. Killethead, author of the book "Spanish Graveyard" says: "They are venturing their lives for the sake of a few pieces of metal."

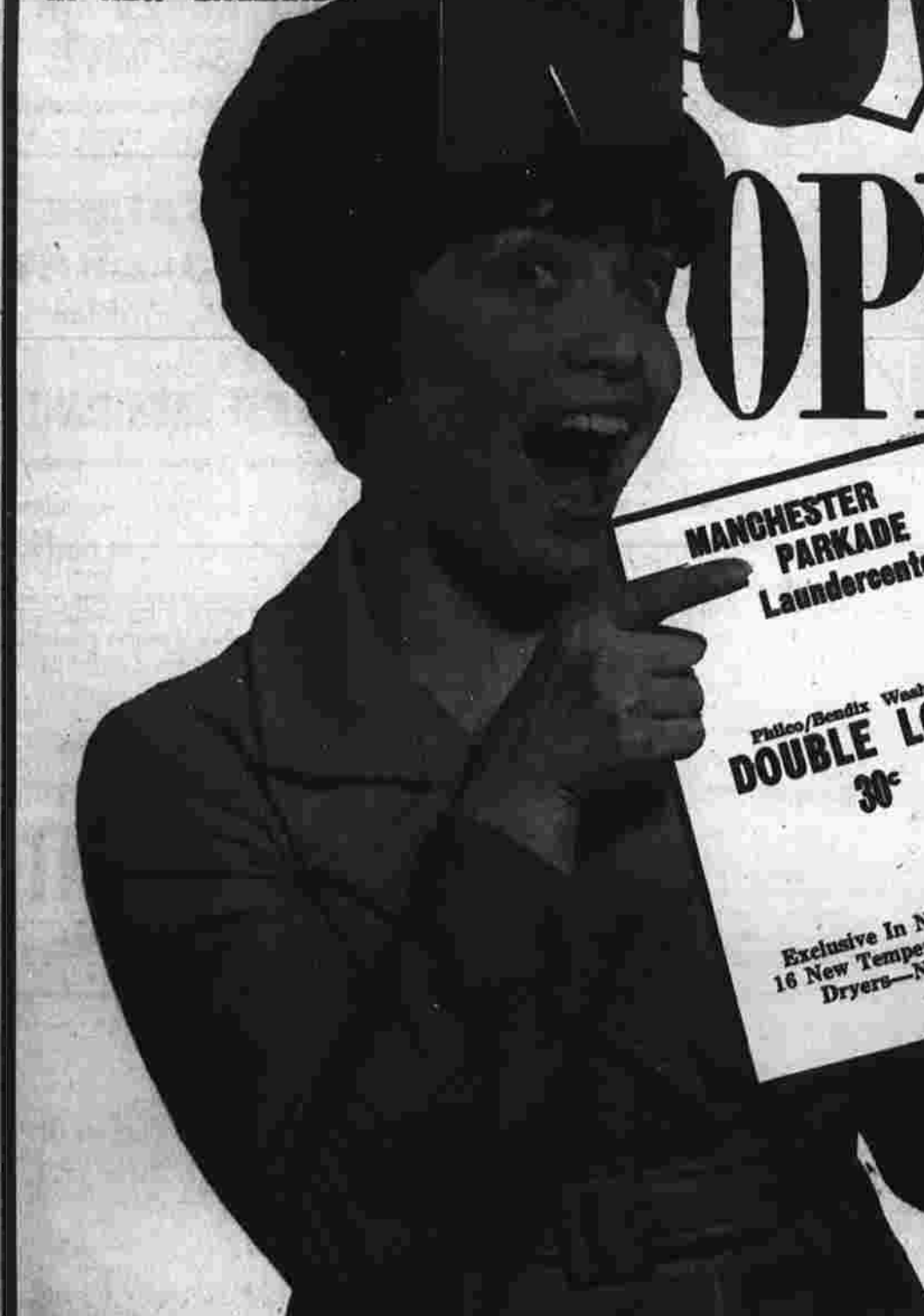
