Project: Add large living-recreational room to existing house. Problem: Tree where addition is to be built which owners do not wish to remove. Solution: Build addition around tree.

And the result is just that. The Gordon MacDonalds of School Street, Andover, built their heart's desire around the tree of which they were so fond. The photo on this page might deceive one to believe that the top of the tree grows through the roof. Actually, the top of the enclosed tree was cut off and the stubs of the uplifting branches are concealed in an attic.

Originally, this home was a conventional cape cod in design and still appears so from the front with an addition to the side. But it is from the rear that one sees the dramatic change in the size of the home.

Inside and to the left of the front entrance is a storage closet which is referred to as "the chapel" because the ceiling shows exposed beams, light is admitted through a stained glass window over a small church pew and a collection of silver and pewter chalices is displayed on a beam shelf.

On the right is a small bathroom with cranberry red covered walls above a paneling of polished chestnut boards from an old barn. Bronze birds have been adapted to use as faucet handles on an old marble lavatory and, of all things, the towel bar was once an iron foot-cast in a horse-buggy.

The unusual thing in the kitchen is the piano. The front panel, by means of hinges and supporting chains, can be lowered to serve as a snack bar. When anyone feels inclined to tickle the ivories, the panel is replaced and the keyboard cover is raised.

Hung on the walls of the dining room and children's study-room are oil paintings by Mr. MacDonald. He decorated a white wall in one of their children's bedrooms with a bear

Mounted in old picture frames are varieties of winged beetles and insects, most-millars and locusts. On the stately wall hang several primitive farm implements.

Mr. MacDonald's studio is upstairs and overlooks Andover Lake. One of the most interesting features of the studio is a small table which is a slab from a felled elm tree. It has no legs, but is supported from the ceiling by four wires. Another slab from the same tree is used as a kind of dart board.

This would avoid the need for booster rockets needed to power spacecraft beyond earth's gravity.

These announcements did not indicate whether Bergegov's mission would involve experiments completed with the platform.

An official biography released later said Bergegov is 47 years old, a veteran of World War II and the father of two children.

Bergegov was born in a Ukrainian village, worked in a metallurgical plant but took an early interest in aviation and in 1938 joined the air force, where he has served since.

Bergegov became a test pilot after the war, and was assigned to the elite group of cosmonauts in 1964.

In the midst of this conflicting speculation, Prime Minister Keith Holyoake of New Zealand arrived in South Vietnam today for an official inspection tour.

In remarks aimed at Hanoi, he said the Saigon government would never accept anything less than "an honorable peace, freely negotiated."

"The Communist aggressors must soon acknowledge this," he said.

Holyoake was welcomed by South Vietnamese Premier Tran Van Huong, who said Hanoi "sooner or later will have to return to reason and agree to talk peace more seriously."

"In light of this, may I say there are good prospects for peace," he added.

GI's did not consider today's fighting an end to the month-long hill in the ground war. He said he didn't think the enemy attack was premeditated.

"I think this is a traditional Viet Cong infiltration route," he said. "The 1st Division troops probably just got into the area. Any time we get into an area where they don't want us, they'll fight."

Today's battle raged to 518 the number of enemy troops killed since 1963. Military spokesmen said 983 enemy have been killed in the past five days across South Vietnam.

Striking from land, sea and air, allied forces killed 498 enemy Friday in two battles along a 200-mile stretch of coast from the demilitarized zone to Nha Trang.

Troops of the U.S. 9th Mechanized Infantry Division, supported by jet fighter-bombers, helicopter gunships, artillery and offshore bombardments from the battleship New Jersey, decimated more than half of an estimated 400-strong North Vietnamese force.

The American infantrymen counted 392 enemy bodies after a seven-hour battle near the outpost of Con Thien in the southern part of the DMZ. U.S. losses were six killed and 29 wounded.

Military spokesmen credited the infantrymen with about half of the enemy dead, while the rest of the North Vietnamese bodies were found in trenches devastated by the Jersey's huge 16-inch guns.

In the second fight, 280 miles south of the DMZ near Nha Trang, South Korean infantrymen from the White Horse Division cordoned off a mountainous area honeycombed with natural caves. Backed up by U.S. air strikes and artillery they killed

Lassie Still Coming Home

WASHINGTON — Performing in the "Lassie" (CBS) series must shatter the well-kept ego of human actors. The series is now in its 15th season and no matter what two-legged actors are assigned to the show its popularity never wanes.

"Lassie" arrived on television in September, 1954. The boy in the show was Tommy Rettig, the mother was played by Jan Clayton and George Cleveland was Gramps.

When Rettig outgrew the role, blond little Jon Provost came to live on the farm. Miss Clayton eventually departed and for one season, the mother on the show was Cloris Leachman.

Another family arrived at the farm when June Lockhart became the mother, John Sheppard the father and George Chandler became the elderly uncle.

Three years ago, Lassie went to live with forest ranger Corey Stuart.

Over the 15 years of the series only two things remained

constant: The dog and the sponsoring Campbell Soup Co. (Campbell now shares sponsorship with several "participating" sponsors.)

Actually, several dogs have appeared in the series, but all have been males and all have been called "Lassie." Trainer Rudd Wetherwax has especially trained dogs to do various tricks. One is a good jumper, another cries on cue and one is especially good at the patient waiting so necessary in any film series.

The original Lassie has to rank as one of the great bargains in entertainment history. It was a collie puppy that was brought to Weatherwax for training. He was supposed to cure it of barking at passing automobiles.

Weatherwax's bill for the training was 10 dollars, but the owner decided to give the dog to Weatherwax in place of the fee. That 10 dollar puppy became the star of a 1943 movie called "Lassie Come Home." (The present Lassie is a great grandson of the original.)

For seven years, Lassie was a big star, earning 204,000 dollars.

And that wasn't Weatherwax's last bargain.

The bosses at Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer in 1952 were being pinched by the new, temporary, fad called television and had turned to production of lavish musicals. Lassie was a has-been. MGM agreed to give all rights to the Lassie material for about 40,000 dollars that the studio still owed Weatherwax.

Two years later, Weatherwax got together with writer-producer Robert Maxwell and made a TV pilot episode. It was immediately sold to the Campbell Soup sponsor.

In 1956, the Wrather Corp. purchased the "Lassie" program and affiliated enterprises. The price was several millions of dollars.

"Pretty good," Weatherwax mused, "for a dog that wasn't wanted."

Good for the dog, but still rough on the egos of the human beings who are hired for "Lassie."

New Hand at Shiloh Ranch

HOLLYWOOD—The revolving door at the Shiloh Ranch — which has seen the entrances and exits on "The Virginian" of Lee J. Cobb, Charles Bickford, Robert Shore, Gary Clarke and Randy Boone among others—has spun around again.

Entering now as a new semi-regular character this season is David Hartman. He is cast in the role of David Sutton, a young Welshman who has dropped out of medical school and is wandering through the West is signed on as a greenhorn at Shiloh Ranch.

Though Hartman has had some television and motion picture exposure of late, his principal experience has been as a singer and actor in the theater, both on the road and on Broad-

way. He had a role in the original cast of "Hello, Dolly!" and after 800 performances in that musical, he went into the original cast of "The Yearling."

Why did he give up the bright lights of Broadway to rope calves and ride horseback on a television series? He explained it this way: "I was up to the first feature level and doing rather well in the theater. I was also doing loads and loads of commercials."

"But I knew the time would come that if I wanted to shoot for the whole major image I'd have to come out here and do film. It's deadly, though, for an actor to come to California and have to scratch for parts."

So Hartman wisely waited until the "right way"—The promise of work—came about for him to make the move, and it paid off. "The first 10 months I was here I was shooting solid," he reported. On his schedule were "I Love a Mystery," a World Premiere movie for Universal and NBC; a co-starring role with Doris Day in "Ballad of Josie," "Nobody's Perfect" with Nancy Kwan, James Whitmore and Doug McClure . . . and a guest shot in one episode of "The Virginian."

The response by viewers to that "Virginian" appearance last season was so favorable that he's back to stay this year. Hartman likes the fact that he won't be in every episode. Among other things, it provides him with free time to keep attuned to the world of music, which he loves. One of his favorite pastimes is attending scoring sessions for motion pictures at Universal Studios (where "The Virginian" is filmed).

While he has been involved in music most of his life ("I started taking violin lessons when I was 6, later switched to wind

instruments and started singing at the end of high school"), his original plans didn't call for a musical or acting career.

He was a top athlete in school (won seven letters) and could have gone into professional baseball. But he forsook the baseball offers to attend Duke University, where he earned his degree in economics.

Upon his graduation, he had 32 firm offers from top companies to enter the business world. However, he tried to picture himself riding the commuter train and carrying a briefcase and he couldn't see going that route for the rest of his life.

So he hid himself off to the American Academy of Dramatic Arts in New York to prepare for an acting career . . . then came the Broadway roles and now television.

More Cars For Milner

HOLLYWOOD (AP)—Automobile play an important part in the television career of Detroit-born Martin Milner. There were four years, starting in 1960, of "Route 66," an action series notable for the fact that although Milner and co-star George Maharis played a pair of penniless wanderers, they always were driving the latest model of their automobile sponsor's sports car. Now there is "Adam 12," a new NBC series in which producer Jack Webb will explore the work day of police men of the Los Angeles Police Department in somewhat the same realistic understated way he has handled his "Dragnet." Milner is teamed this time with Kent McCord. They play a pair of cops patrolling their beat in a squad car. After accepting the part of senior officer Fats Haller, a year ago, Milner logged 200 or more hours in the field, tagging along with real policemen in cruiser cars. Dressed in civilian clothes and mildly disguised behind a pair of heavy horn-rimmed glasses Milner watched and made notes as the men handled situations that ranged from murder to accidents. His first encounter was with a violent psychopath threatening to kill his wife and mother-in-law. Just as "Dragnet" over the years has been a void of violence as "The Donna Reed Show" in spite of its subject matter, so too will be "Adam 12." "We've got six shows in the can now," said Milner, "and although there have been some shots fired, no one has been hit. I haven't fired a gun and no one has used fists." The series, again like "Dragnet," has the blessing of the local police force, and its stories will be based on real Los Angeles cases. In many cases policemen involved in a case adapted to television will serve as consultants in their off-duty time. "I have a definite preference between the two men," Milner said, "and I certainly feel that actors like other people have a right to make their political choices known. But I'm going to stay quiet about this one, because by November a lot of people are going to think about me as a Los Angeles policeman."

SAIGON (AP) - North Vietnamese troops spearheaded the attack on Saigon this morning, military officials announced today.

A government spokesman said 32 soldiers were killed and 13 heavy fighting tanks were destroyed north of Saigon. The list of military casualties included a commander, a lieutenant and a sergeant.

The South Vietnamese also seized a large area of battle and took control of the area. The area was heavily shelled by North Vietnamese tanks and artillery.

Six South Vietnamese soldiers were reported killed in the fighting. It was the first time since the force of the attack had been repulsed on May 5, when the North Vietnamese badly mauled the South Vietnamese.
