WASHINGTON — The embarrassing and surprising result of the Saigon government's attempt to go to the negotiating table in Paris is in no small part the product of a security blackout that kept South Vietnamese authorities in the dark about preliminary arrangements for a bombing halt.

Indeed, behind studied confidence in the upper reaches of the Johnson administration, the threat that President Nguyen Van Thieu ultimately must send a message to Paris, there is a deep concern. This is coupled with a retrospective wish that the Saigon regime had been brought more frankly into the three weeks of negotiations preceding President Johnson's bombing halt announcement last Thursday night.

Only Thieu himself, Vice President Chu Ky, and perhaps one other top official were privy to the U.S. plan as it developed from Oct. 9 to 14 last Thursday. Ambassador Elliot A. Richardson, on orders from Washington, had to let his official family into the secret of the delicate negotiations going on in Paris.

What complicated this was that Thieu himself apparently did not realize the extent of opposition within his own government. Thieu, in fact, at least temporarily lost control over his own administration and was unable to deliver the support for the U.S. plan that Bunker expected.

According to well-placed authorities here, this inability of President Thieu to persuade his own government to support President Johnson was a total surprise to both Bunker and Washington. But there is reason to believe that Bunker was counting on a few more days for Thieu—and Bunker himself—to break the way to leading South Vietnamese politicians, including the Catholic leaders and rising wing politicians in the National Assembly, and win them over to the peace plan.

## Vernon Youth Rally Decides Life Doesn't Rot

Not according to 300 teenagers who attended the first interfaith youth rally held in this area over the weekend.

The boys and girls came from 11 Protestant and Catholic churches in Vernon, Ellington and Talcoctville and met at the Vernon Congregational Church. "Does Life Really Rot?" was the theme.

They saw and heard some evidence that life can be pretty tough for particular people. The girls news clippings were read to them in rapid succession and a movie explored the personal impact of sudden and complete blindness on a young man.

The youths then divided into discussion groups of from 12 to 20 persons to discuss the questions of whether or not it would be better if certain people were never born. These included the physically and mentally handicapped, those born into starvation and war and the permanently disabled.

Even in the short time allotted to these discussions a feeling was expressed that it would be better if every one's life has some purpose.

They were quick to point out the limitations of their own experiences. "Nothing around us is that lousy," someone said, but they couldn't think of anything worse than not living.

Even one admission that "Life is a big mess" was met with a moment of optimism. "Jobs do vivify" prevailed.

Folk singing with guitars set the mood for the worship service held in the church itself. Traditional prayer was translated sentence by sentence into modern teen jargon.

Donuts and cider and more excellent folk singing by Gordon McDonald closed the rally.

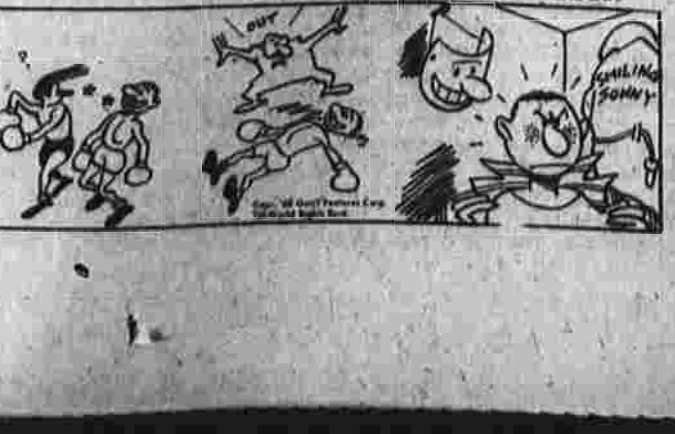
