With mobile type infantry operations and massive use of B2 bombers, in the wake of President Johnson's order halting bombing of North Vietnam.

His goal is to crush three elements of a fourth along a 100-mile stretch of the lower Cambodian border.

Latest U.S. intelligence reports indicate the enemy has 15,000 to 20,000 troops either inside Cambodia or inside South Vietnam in Tay Ninh, Binh and Phuoc Long provinces. Sources said Abrams wants to push them out, then smash the Viet Cong guerrilla forces.

South Vietnamese estimates of enemy troop strength along the border are three times as high as the American announcement. Lt. Gen. Do Cao Tri said 60,000 enemy troops are massed there for a new offensive.

The 1st Air Cavalry Division, led by Maj. Gen. George I. Forsythe, has 300 helicopters that can airlift troops and artillery pieces through the jungles and rubber plantations that dot the invasion routes northwest of Saigon.

Enemy base camps in the area have been pounded almost continuously for the past two days by U.S. B2 bombers. The eight-jet Stratofortresses dropped 750 tons of bombs along the border Friday night and today.

rising in the South, independent of North Vietnam.

He said he was insisting on a square table at the next conference to stress the physical separation of the delegations. He said a rectangular table, with the allies on one long side and the Communists on the other, was not acceptable.

U.S. officials in Paris remained silent on the matter.

He also was asked at the reception how Salgon's intranationalism in the face of U.S. pressure to end Thieu's boycott would be reconciled with Hanoi's charge that the Saigon government is a "puppet" of the U.S. government.

Dropping his customary smile, Thieu replied: "That is a biased question."

In Saigon, the government announced it was closing down one newspaper and suspending two more in its continuing crackdown on the press for printing material it considers harmful to the national interest.

The action brought to six the number of papers closed and four the number temporarily suspended in the past 15 days, a spokesman said.

He said the stiffened enforcement of government regulations on press freedom was aimed at newspapers that give publicity to Communists or publish material helpful to the Communists.

Salgon spoke on much the same theme.

"We will still have our partisan differences. But the place to start untangling this country is for the two men who led their parties in a very, very hard fight for the presidency."

'Sense of Wonder' For City Dweller

WASHINGTON—Jules Power is an energetic man, given to rapid-fire conversation and is the possessor of a long record for quality television programs. He has headed the fine "discovery" series for even years and last year he collected even more than his usual quota of awards for a special called "How Life Begins."

His contribution this season is a documentary called "The Sense of Wonder" (7:30 p.m., Wednesday, ABC). It is based on a slim volume by the late Rachel Carson, which was published after her death.

"This is an especially significant program," Power says. "A child has a natural curiosity about nature, but this is nearly always lost when that child becomes an adult."

"We hope to restore some of the lost curiosity."

Jules paused for a moment and continued: "We hope to awaken your interest in looking at nature and we believe that that the people are now more ready to go back to nature."

"A Sense of Wonder" is aimed at city dwellers. "When you do a TV special," he continued, "your audience is mainly an urban audience. I'd estimate that 75 to 80 per cent of the audience is city people."

Power has tried to demonstrate that there is much of nature to be enjoyed in cities. "I'll give you an example," he said. "We have some beautiful shots of sunflowers that are growing through sidewalks. We also have film of weeds coming up through cracks in the concrete."

Another sequence shows that

after bulldozers have piled up dirt for new buildings, "things start growing out of the earth. This is because nature, under the most difficult conditions, finds a way to exhibit itself."

If Power has his way, viewers will leave "the sense of wonder" and go exploring the backyard with a flashlight. This is another of the sequences in the program. To Power, "It's a beautiful scene where the parent goes with a child and hunts for the insects that play their little fiddles in the grass and shrubbery."

"All it takes is a flashlight." Power hired actress Helen Hayes as the narrator. "We needed an actress of her skill," Power explained, "to convey the beauty and meaningfulness of
