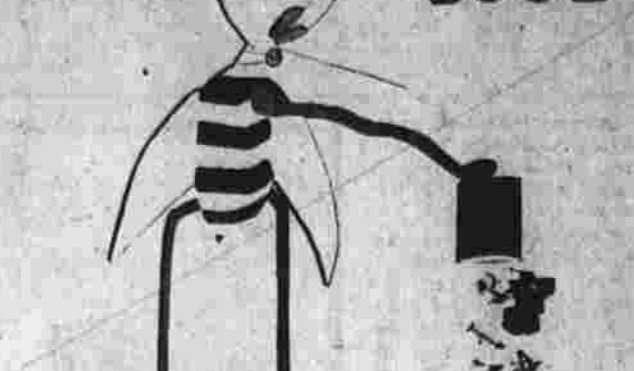

North Viets Attack With Heavy Losses

BACON (AP) — White U.S. planes and helicopters rained down flame, bullets and bombs, less than 500 South Vietnamese rangers and American artillerymen fought off about 1,000 North Vietnamese troops near the Cambodian border today, the U.S. military said. The North Vietnamese attacked on the small ranger camp 80 miles north of Saigon produced the heaviest fighting in weeks, with 150 of the enemy dead from the camp's defenses.

The other bodies were strewn over the cratered landscape which had been blasted by the American 105mm gun inside the camp and the U.S. planes and helicopters circling overhead. Four South Vietnamese were reported killed and 23 wounded. An American casualty was reported. The North Vietnamese tried to storm the jungle camp, named Landing Zone Dot, in an area where allied forces are awaiting for an estimated 15,000 to 20,000 North Vietnamese troops believed massed along the border. Dot was held by a battalion of South Vietnamese rangers and a U.S. helicopter battery.

The U.S. and South Vietnamese commands also announced that combat casualties in the war edged upward last week; the first full week since the bombing of North Vietnam was halted. The U.S. Command said 268 American troops were killed in action, compared with 150 the week before. South Vietnamese casualties climbed from 100 to 141 last week, and 1,451 enemy dead were reported. Enemy casualties were reported to be 2,163, a usual occurrence, but the 1,451 total presumably will be increased next week as the U.S. and South Vietnamese forces continue to push the North Vietnamese back.

The U.S. Command said 268 American troops were killed in action, compared with 150 the week before. LBJ to Consult Nixon On Foreign Relations

WASHINGTON (AP) — President-elect Richard M. Nixon said Thursday he had agreed to consult with President Lyndon B. Johnson on foreign relations. Nixon said he would consult with Johnson on all major foreign policy decisions prior to the inauguration.

Nixon said it is essential so that any action taken by the current administration "will be a decision that I would have approved of and not one that I would have rejected." He added that it is the case because such decisions would be likely to carry over from the current administration to the next.

Nixon personally announced his understanding with Johnson in a nameless career diplomat Robert Murphy to be his personal liaison man with the Johnson administration. In Brussels, Belgium, the U.S. and the United States announced that the Nixon administration in Washington will alter the U.S. commitment to defend Western Europe against Soviet aggression.

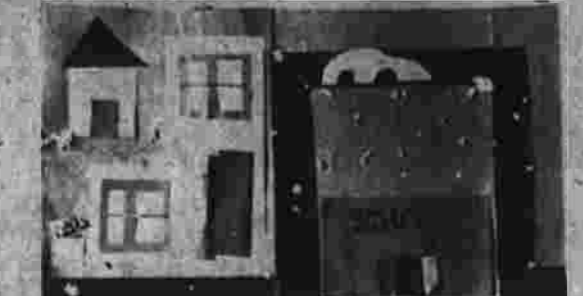
