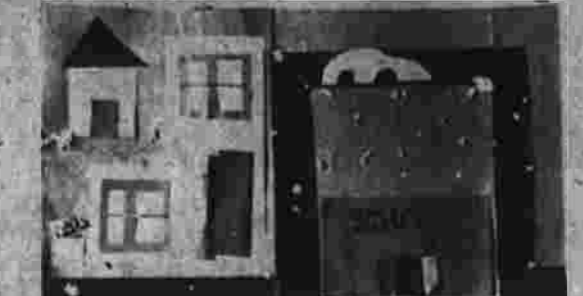

Health Council Cites Safe Legal Right to Abortion

DETROIT (AP) — "All women should have the right to legal abortions," the American Public Health Association's governing council declared today.

stand goes far beyond even the most liberal of the present state laws.
The APHA urges that access to abortion be accepted as an important means of securing the right to spacing and choosing the number of children wanted.

Most state laws prohibit abortions unless the mother's health is clearly endangered.

Illegal abortions are performed by the hundreds of thousands each year, often under conditions that result in serious infection or death, and later inability to have a child, and invariably at exorbitant cost.
These factors were reportedly mentioned in the debate over the resolution, as were expense of moral, ethical and religious grounds for opposing abortions and unrestricted abortions.
