\$1,500 Set on Test Borings At Site for Middle School

The Middle School Building Committee last night authorized the expenditure of \$1,500 to \$1,600 for test borings at the site of the proposed middle school.

The site of the proposed middle school is located on the eastern side of the town, near the intersection of the main road and the road leading to the farm.

Plans for the educational park layout which includes the Meadowbrook and Hills schools as well as the middle school will be submitted to the town board for their consideration.

Some people have regarded the concept of an educational park with reservations, pointing to the high density of the area. The possible addition to Meadowbrook School or the use of portable classrooms will add to this density.

The closeness of the schools permits greater flexibility in meeting staffing needs, greater use of specialized teachers and augmentation of programs in the various schools by creating greater participation among the schools.

Original plans called for a 50 per cent interchange of pupils between the Hills Memorial School and the Middle School.

The typical classroom in the middle school will have vinyl tile floors, and spray glass concrete block walls. Window sashes will be installed with one window per classroom.

The building committee picked up an additional classroom in the school last night, agreeing to partition the large home economics room on a temporary basis to serve as two classrooms.

Football Injuries Are Few, High School Parley Told

If attendance is any indication, but compared to the total number of hours devoted to football football in the "Pro and Con" during practice as well as games, the incidence of injury to high school football players is relatively low.

Dr. Donovan concluded that much research is currently being conducted to determine how much injury is caused by equipment failure. He said that research has already indicated that many knee injuries are a result of the type of contact which occurs on the field.

As this research continues, he said, and the results of the research are introduced into football, the incidence of injury should go down.

Richard Tingley, athletic director of Rockville High School, said that football cost \$7,000 to introduce into Rockville High School. He said, included the cost of the football, the cost of the uniforms, the cost of the transportation, and the cost of the field.

He said that between 12 and 15 per cent of the potentially injured were knee injuries, while another 12 per cent were hand injuries. To put it another way, said Dr. Donovan, one out of every 13 high school football players could expect to receive a potentially permanent injury.

This might seem high, he said, but he pointed out that the incidence of injury to high school football players is relatively low.

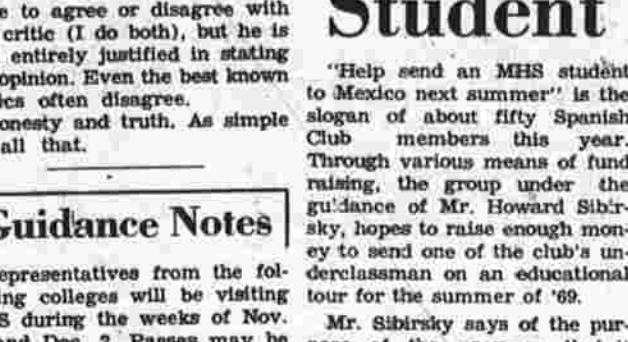

U.S. Command Cites Count Of Enemy Activity in DMZ

SAIGON (AP) — The U.S. Command said today enemy activity has continued "at a brisk rate" in the demilitarized zone in the three weeks since President Johnson halted the bombing of North Vietnam.

The spokesman said reconnaissance had disclosed 212 indications of enemy activity, 71 were spotted in the northern half of the zone and 139 in the southern half, he said. He added that U.S. artillery and jet strikes had been used in the DMZ 67 times since Nov. 1.

In the latest such incident, the U.S. artillery shelled a machine-gun nest in the DMZ Nov. 1. Of these 222 were labeled "aggressive" and 100 were labeled "defensive."

The spokesman said reconnaissance had disclosed 212 indications of enemy activity, 71 were spotted in the northern half of the zone and 139 in the southern half, he said.

De Gaulle, Cabinet Meeting To Decide Future of France

PARIS (AP) — Charles de Gaulle and his Cabinet went into extraordinary session today to decide the future of the French franc. Devaluation was a foregone conclusion in France and the only question was how much the currency will be trimmed.

The newspaper Le Monde quoted informed sources as saying a devaluation of 6.76 per cent was in order. This would bring the franc down from its present level of 20 cents to a fraction above 19 cents.

Along with devaluation, De Gaulle and his Cabinet were expected to discuss an economic program to make certain the nation gets maximum benefit from the move.

West Germany's finance minister, Franz Josef Strauss, said Paris newspapers and radio stations spoke of devaluation in the past few days.

De Gaulle was reported preparing to make a nationwide television address soon, possibly tonight. Sources at the Elysee Palace would not confirm this.

Sources said ministers of the 11 nations in the Paris summit would meet in Paris Sunday to discuss the Cabinet's decision. Devaluation of the franc would lead to the devaluation of other currencies tied to it, including that of France's former colonies in Africa.

The informant also said Premier Maurice Couve de Murville is expected to appear before Parliament today to explain new currency measures.

A wave of criticism about the government's handling of the monetary crisis came from newspapers, union leaders, politicians and even members of the Gaullist Union for the Defense of the Republic.

The newspaper figures said: "Treasonous and adroitness are the sentiments of the French people and of the political world. Unpleasant before the French and the government on domestic affairs as well as international ones."
