



Russia's Nigerian Foothold Add Nigerian developments to the signs that the cold war, instead of dwindling, now seems to be reviving, as if its in herent evil were potent enough to face down and outrage and outlive all the

wistful better instincts of man.

With Nigeria, Russia seems to be gaining something of the African foothold we were once afraid it might obtain in the Congo. It seems to have gained it warm place with the Nigerian federal government by siding with it in its ef forts to control the rebellion of Biafra. Britain has also supplied the Nigerian federalists with the arms they needed for their military operations, but apparently not as generously as Russia. rance has been on the side of the Biafran rebels, apparently seeing to it, in directly, that they have been receiving enough military supplies to stay in the field far beyond the date of their expected collapse. While Russia, Britain nd France have thus been doing their espective bits to see that the Nigerian ctions do not lack for the ammunition with which to shoot at each other, the United States has, for once, kept out of the armaments business. But this abstention may be regretted by some policy makers, of course, if Russian influence n Nigeria does prove to be strong and

The real regret is not that the United ates has not supplied arms to the war in Nigeria, but that it has not been able to find any way of trying to promote the cause of peace. When there was a in the newly freed Congo, and the possibility that the world's great powers might meddle in it for their own power politics advantage, there was a resort o the United Nations. The United Nations mission, for all the controversy surrounding it, did succeed in quelling the civil war and in keeping the Congo out of any single big outside nation's pocket. But the United States has obviously not had either the energy-time or the ingenuity to find, somewhere in between the resort to the United Nations which dealt with the Congo and the resort to unilateral American force which became our own effort to deal with Vietnam, any formula by which the outside world might be able to deal with civil war in Nifgeria.

So, while Russia has been buying into the Nigerian situation with arms, which is one kind of tracedy, we have been failing to get into the situation with erry policies of peace and mercy, which may be the greater tragedy involved. What would really cheer us, and cheer the world, would be some American or

United Nations policy that might try to lift the Nigerian conflict out of the grim unconditionality other nations have beloed create there. Meanwhile, there is one grim kind of solace, from some of the professional

diplomats who think they know Nigeria

and the Nigerians best, for those now concerned about Russia's seeming advance there. "The Russians," said one British diplomat the other day, "have yet to plumb the depths of Nigerian ingratitude."

"Must Be Corrupt" - Forever?

Former Ambassador George F. Ken-

nan has now joined the ranks of those who seem to take a certain cynical pride in recommending that we accept a certain amount of evil in life as something not likely ever to be eliminated. He was speaking in this vein in the Princeton University Chapel the other Sunday. His sermon was not from the church but to the church, and his recommendation was that the church stay out of politics because politics is "a process which must be corrupt."

Since it "must be corrupt," politica will not yield to the tender idealistic influences of religion, and any close relationship between the two will merely wind up soiling and weakening religion "However lofty the ideals of states

men," Mr. Kennan said, "the workings of government are morally ambivalent. Some people, Mr. Kennan noted, are currently saying that "the church is endangered unless its activity becomes relevant to the problems of today." But, he himself said, "the church EVENING SENTINEL

should not forget its true function by trying to participate in an area of lasman affairs where it really doesn't belong and where it must be a poor com

Then he defined the "true function" of the church as "to help man seek forgiveness for the corruption he meets in the secular world."

Not to avoid this corruption, we make our own note, not to abolish it, not to cure it, not to try to heal it, but merely to "seek forgiveness" for it. We are not undamiliar with this com placently cynical approach to the unquestioned fact that evil and ugliness do exist in our world, sometimes woven deeply into the customs and routines of our institutions. What we never quite understand, how-

ever, is just how and why people who take such a position—that the idealists, the religious, the church, should not ris sullying themselves by attempting to do something direct about eliminating some of the evil in the world-manage to find life itself something worth continuing. Why exist, if not to strive for something positive? Why analyze and identify evil, if not to have at it? Couldn't politics, some day, be made just a little less

A Plot You'll See We can't wait for everybody to see it on television, so we relate the story now, as it actually happened in Federal Court down in New York the other day. The vice president of a metals company was convicted by a federal jury of charges of trying to control the world price of copper by blowing up a railroad oridge in the African nation of Zambia. The vice president's company had large and perhaps injudicious holdings in copper. The world price was going down and his company was faced with a million dollar loss unless the trend was reversed. And what the jury believed was that the vice president offered two characters down in Miami \$25,000 if they would fly a plane over the bridge and blow it up so there would be no way of transporting copper out of Zambia. Shut-

ting off the supply of that major producer would, the plot calculated, help raise the world price of copper. What happened, instead, was that security agents of a friendly power somehow learned of the plot, and elerted officials in Zambia. The men who had been approached in Miami told their story to the FBI. The vice president can get up to three years in prison and a \$30,000 fine for conspiring to destroy property within a country which is at




