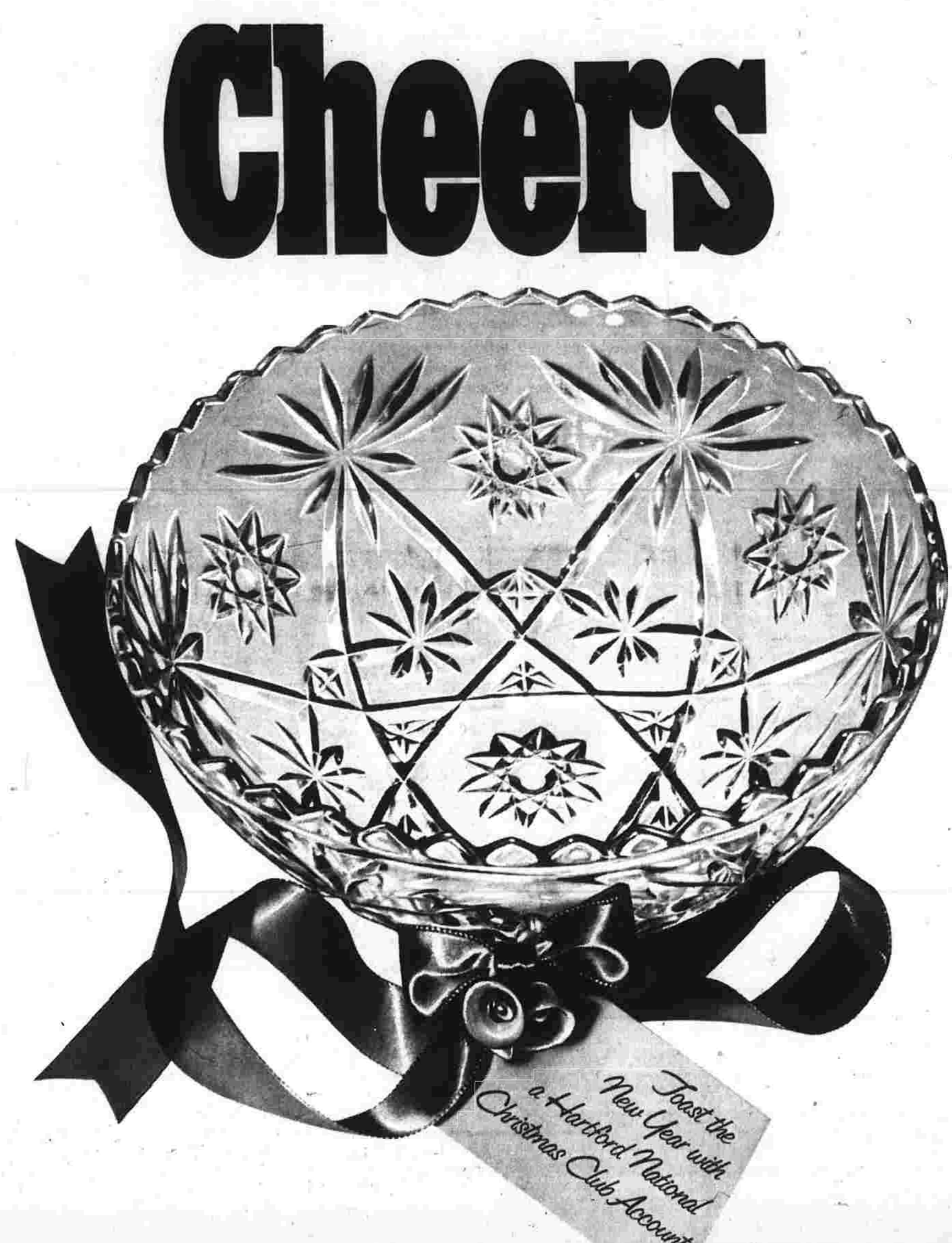

### Scranton Lifts Arab Hopes For More U.S. Sympathy

SCRANTON (AP) — William W. Scranton's tour of the Middle East has raised Arab hopes that the Nixon administration may be more sympathetic to the Arab cause than the Johnson administration was.

When the former governor of Pennsylvania arrived in the Arab world last week on a fact-finding tour for President-elect Nixon, he said he foresaw "no immediate basic change" in U.S. policy toward the Middle East. But when he crossed the Alesby Bridge into Israel Monday, he said American policy should be "more even-handed."

"The United States must take into consideration the feelings of all persons and countries in the Middle East and not necessarily one country over another," Scranton told newsmen in Jerusalem.

Authoritative sources said Nixon's envoy considered his mission "a completely new start, not bound by President Johnson's five-point Middle East peace formula." They added:

**Saves in North Ireland**  
BELFART, Northern Ireland (AP) — Rival religious and political factions in Northern Ireland said today that agitation is likely to continue despite an impending call for peace in the streets by Premier Terence O'Neill.

O'Neill warned in a television address Monday night that civil disorders had brought the state to the "brink of chaos" and that demonstrations should accept his government's policy of gradual reforms.

Roman Catholic civil rights groups said O'Neill's plea was "statesmanlike," but they were disappointed the one-man one-vote principle and other electoral reforms had not been accepted.

"Until these have been granted, the civil rights campaign must continue," a spokesman said.

Protestant extremists said they would continue their fight to preserve the constitution from change.

Nearly 100 persons were injured in Londonderry Oct. 8 during clashes between Catholic demonstrators and Protestant rioters led by the Rev. Ian Paisley.

Demonstrations spread to other cities in Northern Ireland as civil rights leaders pressed accusations that the Catholic minority is discriminated against in jobs, housing and voting regulations.

### Dread Initials, MVD Reappear in Russia

The initials "MVD" which long inspired Russian dread are back again.

The reappearance can mean a number of things: An echo of shockwaves from what happened in Czechoslovakia, a growing problem with crime and disorder, and perhaps a cautious jockeying for position among the dominant group in the Kremlin.

The letters stand for the Russian words "Ministerstvo Vnutrennikh Del," or Ministry of Internal Affairs. Under the notorious Lavrenty P. Beria, the MVD operated a vast secret police net. Beria was executed 18 years ago in the power struggle which followed Stalin's death.

The MVD structure was dismantled, and the limits were forgotten. Security police came under organs with less power. "Public order" was assigned to ministries of the 15 separate republics, with no over-all central ministry specifically charged. There was no indication in the announcements whether Shcherbakov, much of its functions were involved with counter-espionage.

In mid-1966 Moscow suddenly announced formation of an all-Union "Ministry for the Protection of Public Order," called MOOP for its Russian initials. It was placed under Col. Gen. Nikolai Shcherbakov, 68, long a colleague of the present party chief, Leonid Brezhnev, as a political officer in the army.

Now Pravda and Izvestia have announced that MOOP henceforth will be the "Ministry of Internal Affairs," that the militia forces under it will be beefed up and that it will carry on a determined drive to stamp out crime and "strengthen public order."

The leadership long has conceded it has a big crime problem. This embarrases the Communist party. Doctrinaire statist that crime is only a survival of capitalism and must disappear under "socialism." In April 1967 top party and law enforcement leaders from all over the nation held a conference on "ways of intensifying the struggle against crime." A few months later a second such conference was held on "problems of combating crime among minors." In an annoyed tone, Izvestia commented that "crime about what saw the police doing?" — did little good.

One persistent problem has been the steady rise of theft and embezzlement of Socialist property. Another has been hoodliganism among youth, a term which can mean anything from drunkenness and rioting to rape and murder.

But there was more to it than that. One of the most worrisome

of "crimes against the state" has involved "anti-Soviet literature." Police have been frustrated by the smuggling of contraband manuscripts abroad.

The authorities also have been baffled by the reaction of shock and dissent among intellectuals after the occupation of Czechoslovakia. It led to open defiance in the form of protests and demonstrations, for which a number of intellectuals are in prison or in exile.

These events seemed to accentuate an existing spirit of apathy among young people. Enrollment in the Young Communist League has been dropping steadily. More painful, at least 20 per cent of offenders arrested for crimes were members of the Young Communist League, which was designed to be an insurance against such things.

The MOOP evidently was a far from satisfactory arrangement for policing a police state. There was no indication in the announcements whether Shcherbakov was retained as minister in the new MVD, but the implication might well be that Brezhnev's protégé was a failure and that younger, tougher elements in the top leadership were taking a hand. A man like Alexander N. Shcherbakov, once considered a top contender for power, might be making his influence felt. When the MOOP was first formed, analysts saw in it a maneuver to limit Shcherbakov's authority.

In making the announcement of the changeover, it probably has caused some shudders in Russia, particularly among intellectuals who remember the old MVD. It could signify just one more evidence of a return to Stalinist methods.
