### Shainwold on Bridge

REACH CORRECT SLAM AFTER WEEK TWO-BID BY ALFRED SHAINWOLD. The week two-bid, favored by almost all experts in the United States, promises a strong attack and in a hand not yet worked out an ordinary opening bid would be a good enough hand to be made by a player who should not count on the opening bidder for much strength outside of the suit he has first bid.

North dealer. Opening lead - queen of clubs. Two important points are illustrated by the bidding of the 3-4 hand. First there is the question of which responses are forcing an opening weak two-bid. Some experts treat any weak two as a one for one. As shown in the diagram, South can afford to bid a simple two spade support, and South then jumps to four spades to reach the slam in spades.

Some experts treat two no-trump as the only forcing bid. In some a weak two-bid. Using this method, South would bid two no-trump first. North would then bid three spades. North would make at least two tricks in spades. Since South is not a hand-bid, he cannot afford to show his excellent support for North's strong hearts. North has announced that he has little but good hearts and the queen of spades. Since North cannot have the ace of diamonds and may not even have the queen, South knows that a diamond opening lead would jeopardize a contract of six hearts. (As the cards in a diamond lead would defeat six hearts at once.)

No opening bid will give South any trouble at six spades. If West led diamonds, South's draw trumps, and then runs the hearts to take the first 12 tricks.

### U.S. 'Brains' Invading Many Canadian Colleges

OTTAWA (AP) — One of Canada's current problems is a brain drain in reverse: a brain invasion.

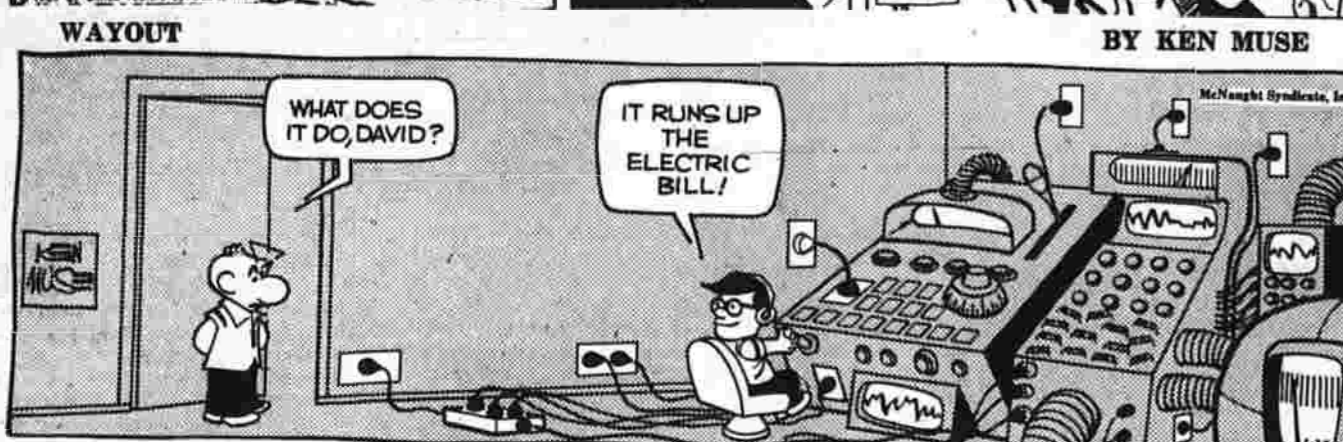

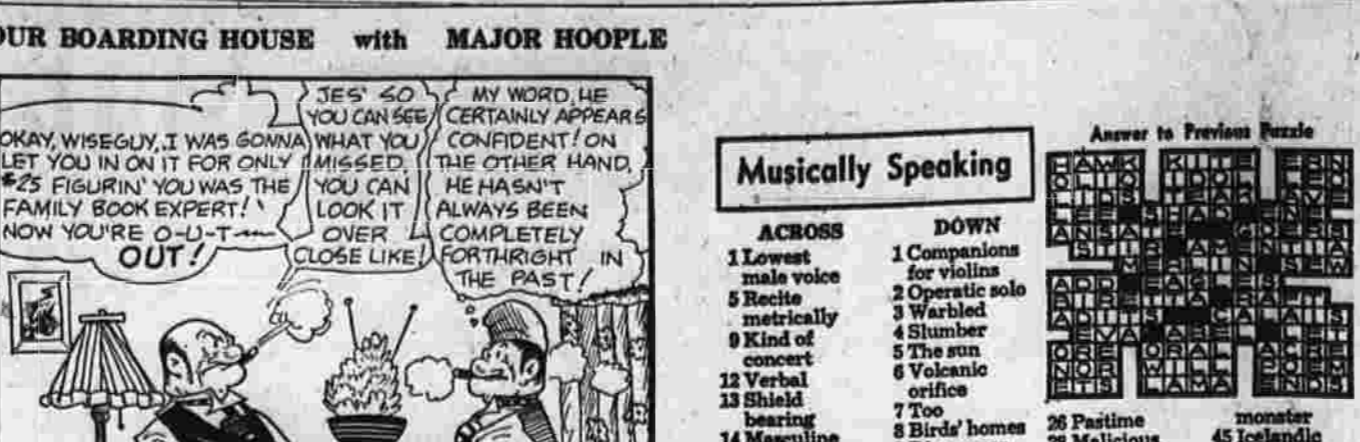

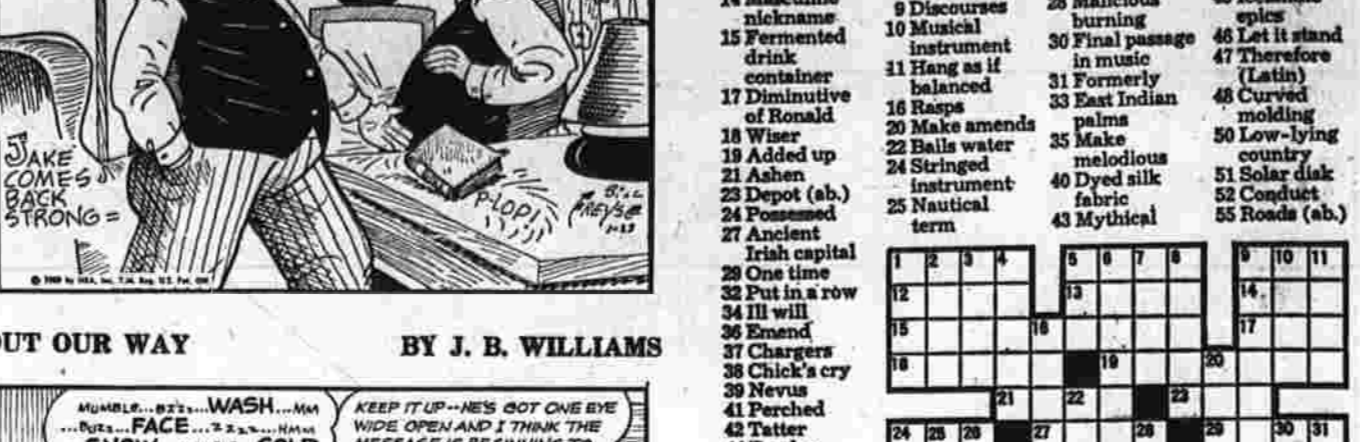
