PARIS (AP)—On the eve of President Nixon's visit to France, North Vietnam and the Viet Cong used the Paris peace talks today as a forum to assail him.

Tran Ban Kiem, the Viet Cong National Liberation Front's representative, and Ambassador Xuan Thuy, the Hanoi delegate, accused Nixon of jockeying for military position in Vietnam...

They recalled Nixon's campaign statements about seeking honor for peace and charged that the United States is carrying the war to a "position of unprecedented ferocity."

Referring to the shelling of cities in South Vietnam, "Such bloodthirsty, barbarous..."

The United States and the South Vietnamese, at this sixth session of the Paris talks, protested the renewed enemy shelling of cities in South Vietnam.

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Apollonauts' Colds Force Three-Day Launch Delay

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—The space agency today postponed the Apollo 13 launch three days, from Friday until Monday, because of colds suffered by the three astronauts who are to fly the 10-day earth orbit mission.

The launch was reset for 11 a.m. EST Monday.

There was concern at the time that the launching might have to be delayed anywhere from one to five days because of the illness.

The astronauts took medicine, drank large quantities and rested 12 hours Wednesday night.

They awoke in "good spirits" today and underwent a 45-minute medical exam.

After the thorough throat and nasal exam, the doctors pronounced the pilots improved but felt it wise to delay the flight to give them plenty of time to recover and to rest for what has been termed the most complex men's space flight ever attempted.

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Agostinelli Sole Opponent Area Mayors Ask Income Tax Now

The Capitol Region Council of Elected Officials (CRCEO) with 14 of its 26 member towns on hand and voting and with only Manchester Mayor Nathan Agostinelli opposed, last night endorsed the adoption of a state income tax in this session of the General Assembly.

Meeting in Waterfield's Room Hall, the council adopted a resolution which calls for "an equitable" state income tax, "in lieu of the increased taxes proposed by Gov. John Dempsey."

The resolution, in addition, urges the governor to appoint a representative commission to study and recommend to the legislature the most equitable and least burdensome tax forms, and to report back in one year (1970), "in a special session of the General Assembly."

The adopted resolution was a compromise of two proposals: one endorsed the appointment of a tax reform commission, forms, and to report back in one year, also at a special session; "when a state income tax would be considered."

Agostinelli, in casting the lone vote against the adopted resolution, said that he is in favor of the study, but that he is against the adoption of a state income tax in this session of the General Assembly.

A state income tax now, he said, would open the door to more spending, "and would add taxes upon taxes — none of which has ever removed, and all of which seem to increase, year after year."

He said that, should a study commission come in with recommended tax reforms, including the adoption of a state income tax, then he would be for it. He stressed the need for tax reform and for state spending cutbacks, before new taxes are added.

Among those present and voting for a state income tax in this session were Mayor John Grant of Yarmouth, First selectman Richard Morris of Bolton, Mayor Howard Fitz of West Windsor, Mayor Anthony Hartford, and Town Council President Richard Williams of Glastonbury.

It was the consensus of those present that economy in state government is needed, that it should be explored, and that it should be instituted at once.

Mrs. Uccello said the state doesn't approach its fiscal budget with the same sense of economy and cutbacks as it does by private business. Now is no time for new programs or for experimentation. Those who are getting more and more tax,"

Grant said, "The state doesn't spend to spend money, we should gear our spending to things that benefit us in the long run."

"Much of our spending," Grant said, "is on the state's debt."

Uccello said, "The state is now seeing the results of foreign spending that is being fruitless, and is saving us money."

Uccello said, "The state is asking, 'How can the state cut back when the towns look for more money?'"

Lack of Funds Could Delay Welfare Checks

HARTFORD Conn. (AP) — About 30,000 welfare recipients in Connecticut may have their monthly checks delayed unless the legislature or state finance officials make emergency action.

It was disclosed by the State Dept. of Social Services Wednesday that if the General Assembly does not act immediately on the \$10 million deficiency appropriation bill being considered by the legislature, the state will have no funds to cover assistance checks for the month of March.

The checks were scheduled to go out this coming week, according to the state's Welfare Department. The state's finance department is expected to act on the bill by the end of the week.

More than \$40 million in welfare payments are scheduled to be made by the state's welfare department this month.

The bill would cover expenses until the end of the current two-year fiscal period, June 30.

State expenses are expected to exceed revenues by more than \$100 million by the end of the fiscal period, and another deficiency appropriation bill will be needed later in the legislative session.

Composing the problem of the state's budget is the state's deficit. The bill is scheduled for only a few days in the legislature.

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Henry Building Tenants To Stay If Workmen Can Brace Structure

The Henry Building will not be condemned as long as immediate steps are taken to ensure the safety of occupants and passersby. It is still a matter of a few days, according to the latest engineering report, but can be used with safeguards, and the business and firms in the building are remaining in operation today.

This was the decision resulting from two meetings and extensive re-examination of the structure yesterday. It had been announced earlier in the day that the town-owned building, which is at the corner of Park Pl. and Park St., would have to be vacated by all occupants by 5 p.m. because of massive deterioration. It was said there was a danger that the south wall might collapse at any time.

Tenants were very much disturbed over the sudden order to vacate the building, and a meeting was held at the town office to discuss the matter. It was said that another look at the building was ordered and the meeting was postponed until 3:30 p.m.

Consulting engineers for the town, Robert Dawson and John Puzos, and James Thompson, representing the tenants made inspections with Public Works Director Andrew Tricario, from a fire department ladder truck and reported their findings and recommendations at the afternoon meeting.

According to the report, "The inspectors further strengthened our first impressions of massive deterioration and structural failure of various parts of the building."

Dawson said that the defects appear to be in two classifications, those requiring immediate correction, and those requiring further study.

The report added that although the engineer's previous conclusion after an inspection last week still stands, certain parts of the building must be promptly repaired to enable the occupants to safely use the facilities.

The engineers recommended heavy duty sidewalk bridging with suitable protection for entrances to businesses and within

Salary Raised For Town Poets Still Unfilled

The Town of Manchester is advertising again for a recital poet, and will re-advertise soon for a superintendent of the water and sewer department.

The salary for the poet position is \$10,088 to \$12,168 annually, as authorized by the Board of Selectmen. The salary range had been \$8,788 to \$10,998. The increase was at the request of Town Manager Robert Vieja.

Applications for the position of poet were received on Feb. 21 deadline date for submission. The job has been vacant since Oct. 11, when the resignation of William Boyle became effective.

Mr. Boyle, who was Boyle's assistant, serving as acting recital poet. He has said that he is not interested in the position.

Previous advertising resulted in 16 applicants for the position. Only one was declared eligible and the position was offered to him. However, he turned the offer down and accepted a recreation-related position in private industry.

The poet of water and sewer maintenance was vacant since Jan. 11, when Lawrence Witkowski resigned to take a job with Griswold Engineering of Manchester.

Applications for the position were received on Feb. 15. One of the two other applicants is from Connecticut. The other is from out of state.

Witkowski said yesterday that he has notified the three that he will re-advertise the vacancy. He said that he has told them that their applications, already submitted, will be considered whatever their ones he receives.

Gen. Eisenhower Has Pneumonia De Gaulle, French Give Nixon Cordial Welcome

WASHINGTON (AP)—Former President Dwight D. Eisenhower, struggling to recover from a series of heart attacks and high-risk surgery last Sunday, has developed pneumonia, Army doctors reported today. Eisenhower, at the hospital since last April after suffering a heart attack in California, underwent abdominal surgery Sunday after doctors found an intestinal obstruction that threatened his life.

PARIS (AP)—President Nixon came to Paris today to a cordial French welcome, and soon was clustered with President Charles de Gaulle for the dramatic talks of his five-year European tour. Nixon said that he came to France seeking De Gaulle's help in efforts "to build a new sense of Western purpose" and to seek a "just and lasting peace."
