Incinerator Plan Assailed

Eighteen residents last night opposed the installation by the North Central Refuse District of an incinerator on Dart Hill Rd. At a Planning and Zoning Commission public hearing, 11 people were opposed to an application by the NCRD to amend the zoning regulations to add "incinerator and sanitary land fill" operations.

Mr. Alfond also testified that the proposed facility would be "ideal" and would be "desirable" to have in the area. He stated that the NCRD's application for permission to install an incinerator on the Vermont-South Windsor town line.

Three people favored the application for adding "incinerator and sanitary land fill" to the regulations while only two favored putting an incinerator on the Gerber Farm site. The crowd at the meeting was estimated at 37, in addition to several commission members and experts called to testify.

Commission chairman Joseph Carto explained that in the first section of its application the NCRD was asking for a zone change for all rural residential zones, and not just the Gerber Farm property. "If the Commission permitted construction of the incinerator without changing the entire zone," Carto said, "it would be considered spot zoning and would be illegal."

Atty. Edwin A. Lussman, representing the NCRD, called several experts from engineering firms and from the State Department of Health to support the claim of the NCRD that the incinerator would not be unhealthy, unsightly, unsafe or noisy.

Mr. Alfond, a registered professional engineer and traffic consultant, testified that he had surveyed the site and he felt that a main access Rd. to the site should be installed opposite Newmark Rd. on Dart Hill Rd.

Such a road he said, would provide visibility for at least 500 ft. in each direction, and Dart Hill Rd. would be well able to handle the increased traffic load created by the incinerator. He said that the road would be a "safe intersection."

State To Probe Waterbury Case Involving Police

WATERBURY, Conn. (AP) — At the request of the state's Attorney General, Superior Court Judge Milton H. Meyers has ordered State Referee Patrick E. O'Sullivan to conduct an inquiry into reported involvement of Waterbury policemen with stolen goods.

Authorities said the inquiry, requested by McDonald Tuesday, will begin March 24 and will operate in ways similar to that conducted in private and witness cases may be called.

A statement from State Police Captain Wayne Bishop reported that the NCRD was accompanied by McDonald's weeks. For the last six weeks, the police have been receiving reports of breaking and entering and stolen goods.

In other developments involving Waterbury policemen Tuesday, Henry Hyman, 52, chief of police, and Paul Moyahnan, 42, assistant superintendent of the police force, were suspended after being arrested on charges of intoxication and breach of peace.

The arrests, which apparently had no relation to McDonald's case, were made at about 1:40 a.m. outside McDonald's home in Middlebury. McDonald reportedly called the state police barracks at Bethany to report that someone was creating a disturbance.

A reception for the mayor, WASHINGTON (AP) — Ever since the late President John F. Kennedy's death, Haitian art collectors have been mad about Haitian primitive paintings.

UConn Faculty Pay Termed 'Competitive'

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — University of Connecticut President Homer D. Babbigg Jr. says UConn faculty salaries are competitive with other similar colleges, but they are not the highest of any in the country.

Testifying before the legislature's Appropriations Committee Tuesday, Babbigg said the university's salaries are among the top 10 or 12 in the nation, however.

"We have in the past five years achieved our goal, which was to put the University of Connecticut in a strong competitive posture with the best public universities in the United States," he said.

Babbigg said UConn can live with the \$74.2 million recommended by Gov. John Dempsey in his budget. The trustees of the university had asked for \$83.3 million.

The present budget is \$61.5 million.

Book Review

PARTY'S COMPLAINT by Philip Roth. Random House, \$5.95.

The trouble with me is that everybody hates it so seriously. It's no longer a sport, but an intrusion.

And institutions—the grim, official standard of me that appears in most contemporary novels can stand as an example of how I have been treated.

NEW YORK (AP)—Four important drawings by Henri Matisse from the highlight of his career are in the spotlight at the Museum of Modern Art through March 30.

They have an interesting relevance to other Matisse works in the art museum. The earliest drawing of the group is related to Matisse's first venture into sculpture. His second was a female figure, "Madolesse I," in 1901, and one of this figure is in Dallas, Tex., at the MMA's collection.

The third, dating from about 1907, is a "Nude Study," showing a model from the back. It is exhibited beside a similar study already in the MMA collection. The fourth item is a pen and ink portrait of Yvonne Landberg, donated by Mrs. Bernard F. Gimbel, which was one of the preliminary studies for Matisse's famous oil portrait of the same young woman, now in the Philadelphia Museum of Art.

Although they were probably made by Matisse and his assistants, these drawings are significant in that they show a selective sampling of a small number of works from the more than 800 drawings that the museum has acquired since the summer of 1965, raising from the school of Paris to up-to-date works by European and American painters and sculptors.

A work sheet of study and still life drawings by Picasso, created in 1909, is included. One of its elements is a bowl of fruit which reappears in "Fruit Dish," a still life painting which grew daily more abstract. At the last sitting, while the paint was still wet, Matisse included with the wooden ends of his brushes the lines that curve out from the figure.

This show is a selective sampling of a small number of works from the more than 800 drawings that the museum has acquired since the summer of 1965, raising from the school of Paris to up-to-date works by European and American painters and sculptors.

American represented in the show is Robert Motherwell. From his series of brush and ink drawings of 1965 known as the "Lyric Suite" he contributed two to the museum and two of the examples are in this exhibit.

There also are two drawings by William de Kooning, a 1967 pencil drawing by Claes Oldenburg, and a 1966 drawing by Jasper Johns.

One highlight of the show is the juxtaposition of a Paul Klee and a drawing by Vasily Kandinsky, holding very much as though they had been drawn by the same artist.

State CoC Cites Spending Control To Control Taxes

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP)—The state's continuing loss of jobs and spending is controlled, the Connecticut State Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors said Monday.

Board Chairman Gordon W. Taft recommended that Gov. John Dempsey's administration slash its budget requests by 10 to 15 per cent, and he also called for creation of a Council of Economic Advisors composed of private citizens.

No new or permanent arguments have been put forward which would necessitate the adoption of such a sweeping revenue measure during the coming biennium, Taft declared.

The statement did not single out any of the budget recommendations as excessive, but attacked several of the governor's tax proposals aimed at raising revenue to meet the state's needs.

It also termed as "nothing more than a gross income tax" the proposed tax on interest, dividends and capital gains received by individuals.
