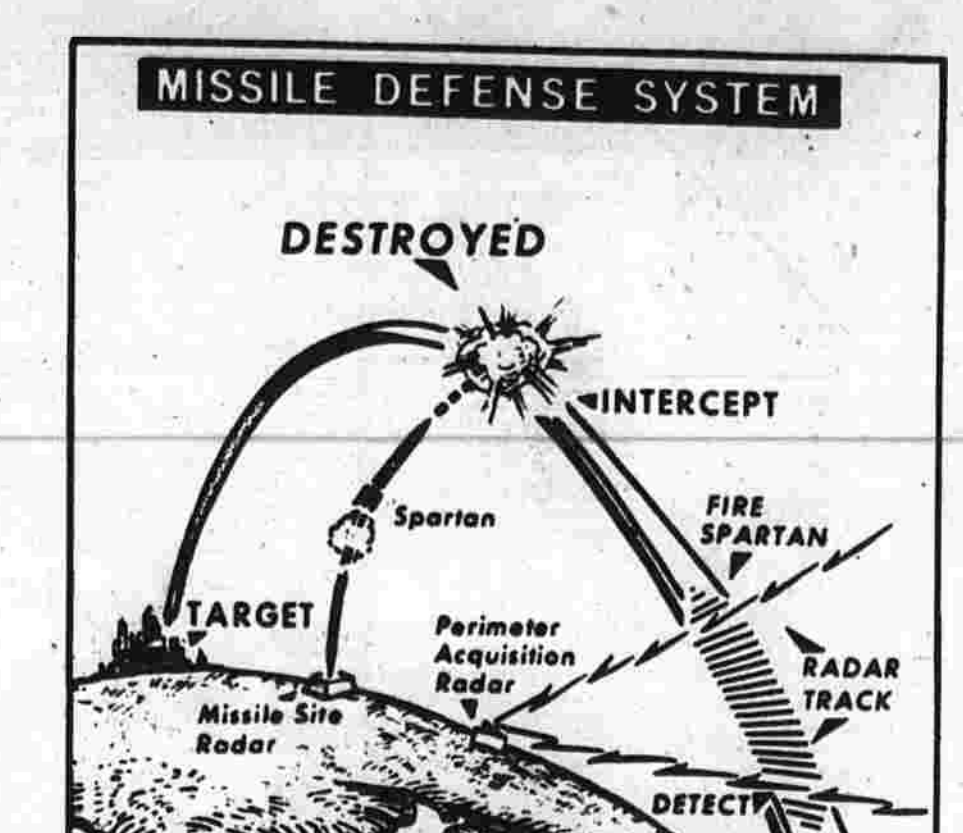

Manchester Area \$2.5 Million More Seen in ADM Grants

Manchester Area towns will receive an additional \$2,577,010 in state ADM grants to education during the next biennium under the terms of Gov. Jovan Dempsey's proposed \$2,000 per pupil grant.

The grant, now under attack by various groups interested in stemming the government's budget, will in turn reduce the demands on the local property taxes.

WPA rapidly mounting educational costs responsible for the largest portions of increased town budgets, the ADM grant becomes the backbone of local state aid.

The Connecticut State Department of Education yesterday released a multi-page report comparing the amount of ADM state grants now being received under the present formula, and those which would be received under the proposed \$200 rate.

Bhutto Calls For Ayub's Resignation

KARACHI (AP) — Former Foreign Minister Zulfikar Ali Bhutto, leader of Pakistan's leftist party, today rejected President Mohammed Ayub Khan's concessions to his opponents and called for Ayub's immediate resignation.

After four days of talks with other opposition leaders, Ayub announced Thursday he had agreed to demands for parliamentary rule and free elections. He already had announced his intention to retire from the presidency at the end of the year.

Bhutto, who had boycotted the talks, termed Ayub's concessions "half measures." He demanded that the president step down immediately to make way for a caretaker government that would rule until elections can be held.

Another dissent party leader, Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, head of the Awami League of East Pakistan, announced he was pulling his party out of the coalition of opposition groups that negotiated with Ayub.

Rehman is demanding autonomy for the 70 million inhabitants of East Pakistan and a strong voice for his people in any federal system. He said these issues should have been settled at the talks. Crowds marched through Dacca, the capital of East Pakistan, Thursday night to express their resentment at the failure of the talks to meet Rehman's demands.

GOP Broiled Before Vote Sen. Goldwater Proves Big Man on Dance Floor

WASHINGTON (AP)—Sen. Barry Goldwater, who came closer than most men to being elected president, proved he was the only member of Congress who asked the hostesses to leave the White House ballroom at the three straight presidential receptions this week.

One of them was "Hello Dolly," the bouncy tune that was virtually the theme song of the Republicans' campaign and administration but then it was "Hello Lyndon" as Goldwater appeared at the last reception Thursday night with a bandage on the third finger of his right hand, where a cyst had just been removed. He shook President Nixon's hand with his left.

Nixon Win Seen Close on ABM \$

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Nixon is confident that he will win approval from the Democratic Congress of a Sentinel missile system protecting the nation's deterrent punch rather than its cities. Majority Leader Mike Mansfield, who has been critical of the program, said Nixon now has the Senate votes to proceed with the \$6-billion to \$7-billion system the President wants to defend the U.S. offensive missile and bomber might. But, the Montana Democrat said, the picture could change before what shapes up as Nixon's first major confrontation with Congress—a vote likely to come in about two months on appropriations for the first phase. This will involve construction on two sites and procurement of 10 more. Administration sources also said a sampling of Senate positions showed enough votes. But they indicated the Senate would be the target of an all-out campaign of presidential persuasion. The comments of oppositionists in that chamber showed why. "Make no mistake—Congress can stop this," said Wisconsin Democrat William Proxmire. "The industrial-military establishment won at the White House," said Democrat Albert Gore of Tennessee. "The President's decision is his first serious mistake," said Democrat Eugene J. McCarthy of Minnesota. Helping somewhat to offset this criticism was the movement of Senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen from a hazy position to one of outright support. Nixon's program also won the reluctant but important backing of the Senate GOP whip, Hugh Scott of Pennsylvania, who had been an advocate of delay. Leaders of the House, on the other hand, indicated in their comments that once through the Senate funds for the antiballistic missile (ABM) system may be in his friendlier hands. Nixon climaxed an intensive review of the Sentinel program, suspended amid rising criticisms several weeks ago, by announcing his plans to go ahead with a limited version at a nationally broadcast news conference Friday. Nixon said the decision would produce "a very spirited debate and it will be a very close vote." He said one vote could make the difference, but added: "I think, however, that after the members of the House and the Senate consider this program, which is a minimum program, and which particularly provides options to change in other directions if we find the threat has changed, or that the art has changed, our evaluation of the technique has changed, I think that we have a good chance of getting approval." First skirmishes in the battle, which could open serious and lasting wounds even if the President eventually wins, likely will come Wednesday when Defense Secretary Melvin R. Missile Systems Top Item Disarmament Talks Reopen Next Week

GENEVA (AP)—The 17-nation disarmament conference reopens here Tuesday after a seven-month recess. It will be the first prolonged confrontation between top officials of President Nixon's administration and the Kremlin. The biggest priority in the proposed bilateral talks between the United States and the Soviet Union on limiting antimissile systems. The Soviet-led invasion of Czechoslovakia last August delayed the start of these negotiations, but an informed Western source said the international climate has sufficiently improved for such talks to get under way within a few months. President Nixon's decision to "substantially modernize" America's antiballistic missile shield and new Communist Chinese sabre-rattling along the Manchurian border could help clear things moving. Both Westinghouse and Moscow believe the Chinese will be capable of launching long-range nuclear missiles within the next two years. The conference is almost certain to center on the American and Soviet missile systems. U.S. Army Gen. Ramsey Clark and Tennessee Gov. Buford Ellington occurred. Nixon Spearheading Drive To Cool Campus Violence
