John Sparkman said today that he will lead a "quasi-official" delegation of American congressmen to Prague on Friday at the invitation of members of Czechoslovakia's Parliament. The Alabama Democrat is in Vienna for a meeting of the Interparliamentary Union. He said he expects the majority of the six other American senators and eight representatives attending the meeting to go with him to the Czechoslovak capital. The delegation will fly to the Soviet-occupied Communist country in a U.S. Air Force plane on Friday morning and is scheduled to return to Vienna that evening.

'Bug' Idles TurboTrain

BOSTON (AP) — The gleaming new TurboTrain, which made its maiden run between Boston and New York Tuesday, was left at the station today because of a "bug" in its gearbox. The bug was a frozen bearing brought about by broken oil line in the gearbox of the jet-powered train. "It is most embarrassing and unfortunate for all this to happen on the second day of service," said a spokesman for United Aircraft Corp., developer of the three-car unit. The spokesman said it was the first time in 23 months of testing that such a problem had developed. He said the train was being repaired at the Providence, R.I., maintenance plant, and a resumption of normal service was scheduled for Thursday. A spokesman for Penn Central, upon whose line the TurboTrain operates, said all fares were refunded and a conventional train left South Station about 15 minutes after the cancellation. On the train's first run Tuesday, Secretary of Transportation John A. Volpe said the new train would be a money-maker after a few "bugs" were cleared up.

NEW YORK (AP) — I must go down to the sea again—and work on that dammed boat. My old Susan K. doesn't really deserve such abuse, and in the flush of the sailing season doesn't receive it. But now that fitting out time is only a calendar page away, Susan K. has become a mental burden.

Legislative Briefs

Vending Machines
HARTFORD (AP)—The House completed action Tuesday on a bill requiring that the names of vending machine operators and their telephone numbers be attached to each machine.

The bill now goes to Gov. John Dempsey and would take effect Oct. 1.

Banks Committee
HARTFORD (AP)—The legislative Banking Committee, whose deadline for reporting bills was Tuesday, held up action on three major bills.

The bills, according to Senate Committee Chairman William Hickey of Stamford, can be brought out at some future date under emergency certification, which would require the signatures of House and Senate leaders.

The bills sent in committee would permit savings banks to handle checking accounts, would permit the establishment of bank holding companies in the state as well as give the state bank commissioner authority to approve all attempts at bank "takeovers," and permit savings banks to make changes in the formula on which their maximum dividend is based.

Hospital Pharmacies
HARTFORD (AP)—The job of imposing hospital pharmacy would be the sole responsibility of the Department of Consumer Protection under a bill reported favorably Tuesday by the legislature's Public Health and Safety Committee.

The action represents a victory for Consumer Protection Commissioner James J. Casey in his jurisdictional dispute with State Health Commissioner Franklin M. Footo.

In Dr. King's Memory
HARTFORD (AP)—A resolution honoring the memory of the late Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. was approved by the House Tuesday and sent to Dr. King's widow.

The Senate approved the resolution last Thursday, the day before the first anniversary of Dr. King's death.

Senate Passes 13 Bills
HARTFORD (AP)—The Senate passed 13 bills Tuesday, including one raising the minimum age for driving instructors from 18 to 21.

Another bill would raise the interest rate on unpaid property taxes from 6 per cent to 9 per cent.

Both the driving instructor bill and the tax interest bill were sent to the governor for signing.

State Lottery
HARTFORD (AP)—Rep. John A. Mirovick said Tuesday he has more than enough signatures on a petition to take out of the General Law Committee a bill to create a state lottery.

The bill, if passed by the House, would still have to be approved by the Senate, which last week rejected a bill that would have set up an advisory referendum on the lottery question. That bill had been overwhelmingly approved in the House.

Legal Leadership
HARTFORD (AP)—U.S. District Attorney Jon O. Newman testified Tuesday before the legislature's Judiciary Committee in favor of a bill that would set up leadership for state attorneys and public defenders in Connecticut.

The restructuring of the systems would upgrade the quality of justice in the state and strengthen its legal machinery, Newman said.

The bill would sharply reduce the penalty for conviction of possessing the illegal drug. The penalty now is a prison term of up to 10 years, the bill would reduce the maximum sentence to three years.

TOWN OF MANCHESTER, NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE

In accordance with the provisions of Sections 1 and 9 of the Town Charter, notice is hereby given of the adoption by the Board of Directors of the Town of Manchester, Connecticut, April 1, 1969, of an Ordinance as follows:

CHAPTER 23 ASSESSMENTS FOR CONSTRUCTION OR REPAIR OR BOTH OF SIDEWALKS AND CURBS

Sec. 23-1 is hereby repealed and the following are substituted in lieu thereof:

Whenever any sidewalk or curb is constructed or repaired or both in accordance with the terms of Chapter III of the Charter of the Town of Manchester, as amended, there shall be assessed against the land adjacent to such work one-half of the cost of the original installation of any such sidewalk, but none of the cost of constructing or repairing any curb, nor of the cost of repairing any sidewalk, where said repairs are done as part of a scheduled area repair program. However, where sidewalk repairs are done at the request of the adjacent landowner outside of a scheduled area repair program or as an emergency repair deemed necessary by the Director of Public Works, the adjacent landowner may have the option of such repair being done with bituminous concrete at no cost to him or paying the difference in cost between a bituminous concrete repair and a Portland cement concrete repair, this difference to be determined by the Department of Public Works and revised annually on April 15. The owner of any lands so assessed shall pay such assessment within thirty (30) days from the date of notice of such assessment, provided, however, that if the assessment shall exceed the sum of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, he may notify the Collector of Revenue within that time of his election to pay the amount so assessed in installments as follows: In semiannual payments, including interest at the rate of six (6%) per cent per annum, for a period not exceeding twenty-four (24) months from the date of notice of such assessment. All assessments unpaid after thirty (30) days from the date of notice of such assessment and all unpaid balances on assessments being paid in installments shall bear interest at the rate of six (6%) per cent per annum from the date of such notice.

Book Review

BERTHE EMMINGWAY. By Carlos Baker, *Bertram's*, \$10. "A Life Story" is the subtitle of Baker's book, and it is just that.

It is an immensely detailed account of Hemingway's life, but it does not come cheaply. Evaluations of his works; Baker book says that "in an earlier

It is an authorized biography in the sense that Baker was given access to Hemingway's letters—but not permitted to quote them verbatim; he had to paraphrase—and to the diaries and manuscripts which Hemingway left behind at his death. He also has conducted a prodigious number of interviews with people in the Hemingway orbit.

Baker's intent—largely realized—has been to record as fully as possible, all the many little facts about Hemingway's life, actions and reactions, his contacts with the world, his growth as a writer, his family affairs in his marriage, his self-revelations at unguarded moments and his bare-faced faults. In short, the book is a portrait of a man, but his style is of the famous writer's day to day life.

A SHAME-INVENTED REE FIDELING. By Sylvia Wright, Doubleday, \$4.95.

There are three stories in this book. Their subject matter—family relationships—seems of more interest to women readers than to men, but their style is of interest to everyone who admires writing talent.

"Mothers and Fathers" is a story of an old man and his wife who have come from Greece to America to visit their son and daughter-in-law while the old man receives treatment—unsuccessful—for cancer. There is an interplay of the generations and of differing cultures.

"Dess is Vm" is an retrospective story about an old maid who has had to support date her life—rather tragically, date with a man of melancholy—so visits with her sister and a woman friend, while she looks back on a lost love affair.

The title story is a fascinating series of scenes and memories, in which a woman summons up the past—old letters and photographs) the life of several generations in an old summer house on an island.

Miss Wright utilizes an unusual narrative technique, she brings editing the viewpoint of the narrator from one person to another, and at times there are such shifts of time and place that one viewpoint blends into another. It is a little like the montage effect with a camera. At times she even brings the author by the front of the stage for a moment as she speaks to the narrative. The device usually is effective, but occasionally it is a little baffling.

In her use of imagery, both visual and aural, and her ability to create an empathy between the reader and her characters, she has a poet's touch.

Incidents Becoming Routine Soviets Up Bomber Flights Near U.S., Canadian Soil

WASHINGTON (AP) — Soviet bomber flights to the fringe of North America have become a routine in recent months that U.S. fighters aren't always sent to intercept them, according to Pentagon sources.

Over the last 15 months, these sources say, there have been about three dozen incidents of Soviet planes flying near central North America, usually Alaska or Canadian territory.

However, the Soviets have been careful to turn back before actually flying over U.S. or Canadian territory, the sources said.

While continental defenses often occasionally may decide not to scramble interceptors, the Soviet bombers are always monitored on radar from the time they get within a few hundred miles of the North American coast.

Only two or three of the Soviet missions have been disclosed publicly by the Pentagon, which indicates the low key attitude the U.S. government is taking.

The most recent Soviet flight sources report, occurred April 7 when eight to 10 TU-16 bombers came within 60 miles of the Northwest Alaska.

The Alaska Air Command scrambled F-10 interceptors, but no nose-to-nose confrontation was necessary.

The Dodge is a twin turbo jet aircraft roughly comparable to the old American B-27 and capable of speeds up to 500 mph.

Seven other Soviet flights near U.S. territory, this year are recorded on a list now stamped secret in the Pentagon.

In addition, there were more than 25 other similar incidents in 1967 not only off Alaska but near Newfoundland, Labrador, Iceland, and around the Aleutian Island chain in the Pacific.

Usually the Soviet planes show up in groups of two or three, but on one mission this past January, seven TU-16 Bear reconnaissance bombers came within 30 national miles of Northwest Alaska. The Bear is a 600 mph turbo prop capable of flying 7,500 miles without refueling.

Six to eight Bears were intercepted by U.S. fighters last summer, again off Northwest Alaska, in another major flight which went unpublicized.

ROBERT K. REICHERTS WASHINGTON (AP) — Robert K. —The Soviets collect various intelligence information from the missions. Even without flying over U.S. territory, they can take long range photographs, test radar detection systems and maintain data on American radio frequencies.

The decision whether to send U.S. jets to meet Soviet planes entering the air defense zone usually depends on the speed and angle of approach of the incoming flight.

Interceptors are designed mainly to assure the Soviets that their presence has been detected.

New England Vignettes

A few more notes have been included on the quality of the music and the marching at the annual Memorial Day parade in Ota, Mass.

The subject came up at town meeting during debate on a \$300 appropriation to hire a band for this year's ceremony. The Pillsbury field band had not the job last year.

Some of the parade participants said if the marching was bad it was because the band didn't get enough pay into their music. They suggested hiring another group.

Maxwell Fryman said some of the participants might march better if all the bands in town were closed on Memorial Day.

Raymond Amos said he thought the band played as well as anybody, and besides three-fourths of the veterans didn't have any sense of rhythm anyway.

The professors Orask of West Newton, Mass., can make music with a deck of French playing cards.

Across the bottom of each card is a bar of music. The bits of music can be combined to make 1,001 melodies.

Also in their collection is a deck of cards used by the Apache Indians in the southwestern United States. The cards are made of skin and their design is adopted from Mexican and Spanish playing cards. "Security just can't be achieved that way," physicist Lapp said in an interview.

U.S. Embassy Opposes FTC In Litton Case

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Federal Trade Commission is moving forward today with proceedings aimed at stripping Litton Industries of two German typewriter firms, despite pleas by the U.S. embassy in Bonn to forgo open hearings. A top official of Litton, one of the nation's biggest conglomerates and a major defense contractor, said the Bonn embassy had offered "any and all possible assistance and support which Litton may require in 1,000 five-megaton warheads."

Toll of War Shows Drop On Both Sides

Saigon (AP) - American, South Vietnamese and enemy combat casualties dropped last week to the lowest level in the first six weeks of the Viet Cong's spring offensive. Military analysts said one reason for the sharp drop in fighting was that a virulent strain of malaria is hitting the enemy troops in South Vietnam and they are having difficulty getting the medicine to curb it.

The helmeted officers, some swinging clubs, stormed through a mass of students to get inside the hall which had been seized Wednesday by youths protesting Harvard's Reserve Officers Training Corps program.

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (AP) - A Britnik's Inc. armored car guard was slain today in what police said was an apparently vain holdup attempt at a dairy company office. The guard, identified as John Glendinning, 63, of Warwick, R.I., was cut down in a short, sharp struggle as he was carrying a payroll on a flight of stairs at the H.P. Ode & Sons, Inc., plant.
