Don Ho's Singing Doesn't Impress Him

NEW YORK—(NEA)—Anyone who has ever been to Hawaii is a friend of Don Ho's. And anyone who is a friend of Don's, as much an island staple as poi, will turn on the TV to watch him.
Which is why the Kraft Music Hall was smart to sign Don for six summer shows, which will be taped in the islands. Additionally, Don will be seen in the April 16 presentation of the "Kraft Music Hall" which will star Johnny Cash. And to complete the Ho-down, his special, "Singer Presents Hawaii Ho," will be repeated on NBC in late May.
A lot of activity for a man who says he doesn't think much of his singing.
So relaxed he makes Dean Martin seem like a puppet on a string, Don came to New York, said nothing would keep him from Hawaii long ("We're getting quite civilized," he says ironically), made plans to open at the Empire Room of the Waldorf-Astoria in late April, then talked with much more honesty about his talent than one usually hears from a performer.
"I'm in the business by mistake," he said. "I worked in my mother's bar and I ran it for a year. Business was so bad I started singing with a ukulele. It mushroomed. I'm not a singer. I'm the guy who runs the show. I don't like to sing. My real joy is a gathering of people — this goes back to my beach boy days — where I start a song and everyone joins in. In the bar, all I did was get the drinks to sing and they were very happy.
"I've made a few records (he records for Reprise) and one came close to being a big hit. So now when people come to see me, they expect to hear me sing. It gets to be a drag. But that's fun."
Of his many albums, only his Christmas LP, arranged by Gordon Jenkins, has pleased Don. "I'm a dumb kid from the islands and I've done what people told me to do. I haven't asserted myself — until now. Now I have my own production company. I know what I can do. A guy like me can't sing Goulet-type songs. I've a limited range of one octave.
"To be honest, I don't think I can sing, but I make so much money at it, it's pathetic. If I can make it in this business, anyone can."

Don Adams to the Rescue

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — If you're looking for a cliff-hanging adventure in television programming, consider the case of "Get Smart."
No, I don't mean the on-the-tube tapers of Agent 86, also known as Maxwell Smart, the fallible operative of CONTROL. I'm referring to the real-life feat of comedian Don Adams in saving his television series from cancellation. Like Smart, Adams was a most reluctant hero.
"You'll be seeing 'Get Smart' for a fifth year, but on a different network. Rarely has a series switched networks ('My Three Sons,' Alfred Hitchcock, Danny Thomas) and 'Get Smart' almost didn't make it. Adams related the sequence of events: "NBC notified us three days before the deadline that they were going to let 'Get Smart' go. But they wanted me to stay on and sign for specials next season and my own variety program the following year. It was a fantastic offer, and I was seriously considering it."
"I was in-between on 'Get Smart' in four years it had won a flock of Emmies, including two for myself, and I felt that it had made a real contribution to television comedy. I was ready to walk away from it and go on to producing and directing features, which I have long wanted to do."
On the other hand, he felt a loyalty to "Get Smart," and he was a trifle peeved at the way NBC had used it to bolster ratings of less promising shows.
"For a lead-in they had given us 'Please Don't Eat the Daisies,' which was like 9th in the ratings. Then it was 'Maya, The Jungle Elephant,' or whatever the hell it was. Then 'Adam 12.' We had to fight for our audience every season."
"Finally NBC put us opposite the second half-hour of Jackie Gleason. I don't mind facing the first half-hour of an hour show—but the second! Even so, 'Get Smart' managed to get a respectable rating."
News of the "Get Smart" cancellation swept through the executive offices of the networks, abc came up with a reprieve offer, but it wasn't sweet enough. Then CBS made a proposal to take over "Get Smart" and back Adams' production company in developing projects.
In the previous hours before the NBC deadline, Adams spoke on the telephone with NBC's Herb Schlosser and CBS' Mike Dann. When the comedian finally went to sleep, he had decided to cast his lot with NBC.
"That morning I was awakened by a telephone call from The New York Times congratulating me for being on the CBS schedule, which was reasonable," said Adams.
"What had happened was that my managers had met with CBS, which was able to come up with an immediate decision. "NBC couldn't act that fast, and it would have lost my bargaining position if I had waited. It was too bad, because I am very fond of the NBC boys. But I told them it was their mistake for not opening negotiations two weeks before the deadline instead of three days."
"Now Adams is committed for three more years of "Get Smart," a future that causes him to wince. "But a lot of time and effort and love have gone into that show," he added. "I'll stick with it."

The Hair Is Leslie Uggams

After what must have been a busy few days in the executive suites, CBS Thursday afternoon came up with the name of the heir to the Smothers Brothers time period and next season's opponent of NBC's formidable "Bonanza."
It will be a slight girl with a big voice, Leslie Uggams, in a variety hour.
Viewers with very long memories will remember Leslie from the days of "Name That Song" when she was an appealing child contestant. Later, of course, she was a regular on the Mitch Miller sing-a-long and after that starred in a Broadway musical.
Present plans are to surround the star with three other regulars in the cast plus the usual parade of guest stars. Judging from her past record, Miss Uggams may kick up a pleasant storm of music but it is unlikely that she will make the kind of waves that dethroned the network.
Meanwhile, CBS still has to decide what to do with the Sunday night time period during the warm weather months.
Most of the CBS programs will just be reruns as usual. Carol Burnett will have singer Jimmy Rodgers as a substitute; Red Skelton's will be Liberace. Reruns of last summer's "The Prisoner" will take over Jonathan Winters spot—and "The Queen and I" will depart to make room for "Animal World" reruns, first seen on NBC.

From Movie to TV Series
NEW YORK (AP) — The movie as a pilot is an idea that has been getting a workout on television lately.
Such new shows as ABC's "Marcus Welby, M.D.," NBC's "Then Came Bronson" and two segments of the three-part "Bold Ones" were shown as movies. CBS' "Medical Center" will be seen as a movie called "UMC" on April 17.
"This concept has advantages for both the viewer and the networks. From an audience standpoint, the viewers see a new movie and get a sneak preview of a new series.
The advantages to the networks are considerable. They get an audience and critical reaction to a new show before it is committed to series production.
More important, the cost of a pilot can virtually be written off. The cost of a half-hour pilot has now climbed to \$300,000 and an hour pilot to as much as \$600,000.
A two-hour movie serving as a pilot runs to about \$1 million, but most of that can be recovered from the advertising revenues of two showings before the series begins. In addition, the movie can be distributed to theaters overseas.
The movie filmed as a pilot runs the risk of coming out as something less than a movie, however.
"Then Came Bronson," seemed all style and little substance, devoting itself entirely to establishing the character of Bronson as a man on a motorcycle with places to go, things to do, people to see.
"Marcus Welby" on the other hand, was a taut story. It had much to do taking care of the doctor's love interest, getting his daughter married, and firmly establishing his relationship with his young assistant.
"A pilot is shot differently than a four-hour movie," said David Victor, executive producer.
