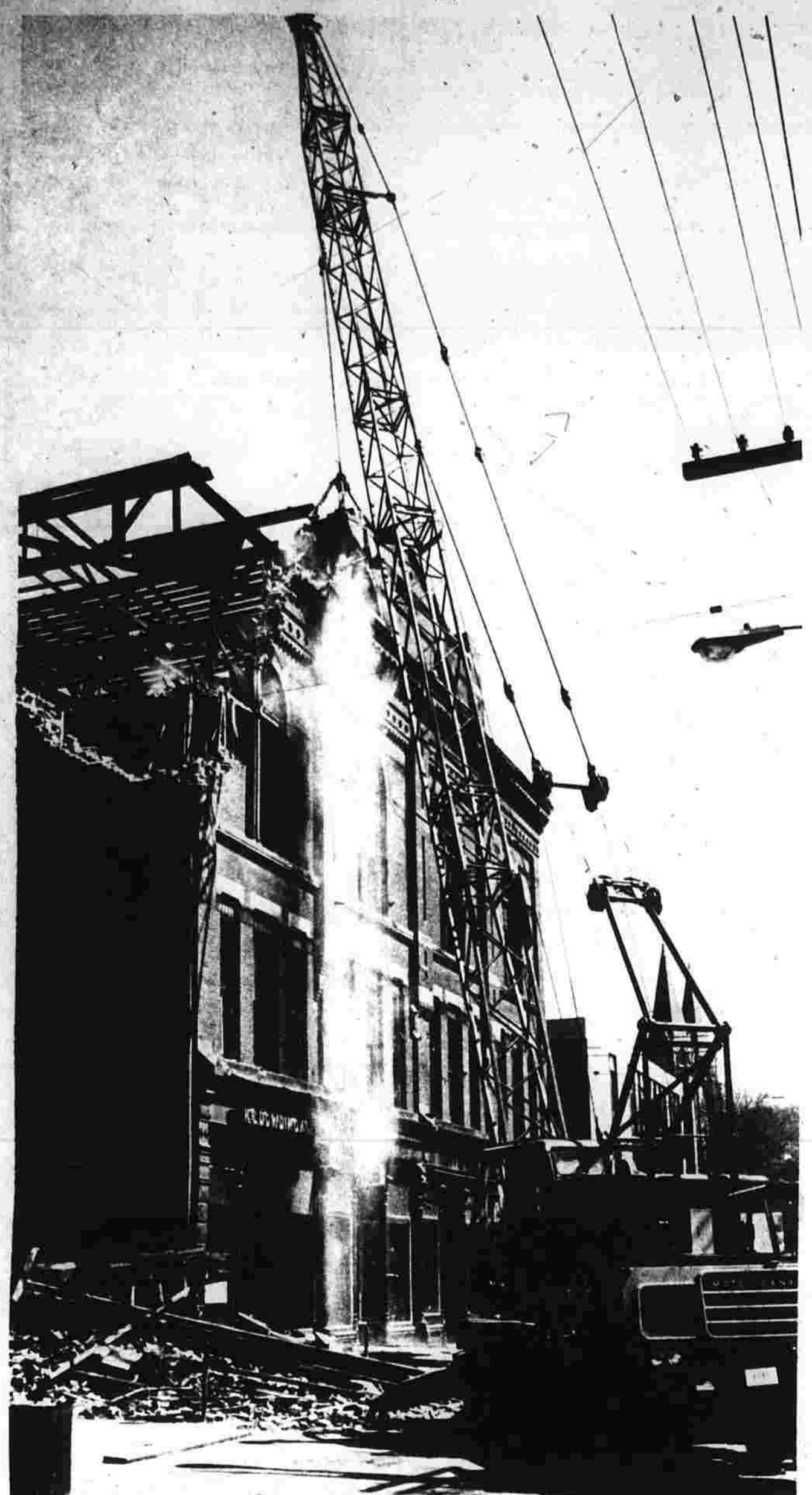

### Manager Tells Directors He Won't Replace Secretary

The Manchester Board of Directors learned last night that it can safely cut at least \$8,775 from the proposed \$14 million-plus budget for next year.

That is the sum that was recommended by Town Manager Robert Weiss for his executive assistant to be named assistant manager, and the proposed new shop session. Weiss told the directors that he does not plan to fill the post vacated March 24

## Vernon Henry Bldg., Treasures, Falling

The final chapter in the history of the Henry Building may be its most exciting. The audience is now far removed from the stage of the old Henry Opera House which stood on the top floors of the 19-year-old building. People watch as the crane takes off pieces of the crumbling brick structure and spits them down into the street.

The job is a dangerous and touchy one for the men doing it. The building is being torn down because of danger of collapse, and until the top floors are removed the danger remains.

According to the destruction crew, the lack of internal structure within the upper floors would cause the walls to fall out into the streets if they gave way. The men strung cables through the building for support and have been taking much of it down by hand. Two workmen left the job Saturday because their families objected to the personal danger involved.

Meanwhile, the historians are at the building files apart in slow motion, except for the members of the local historical society. They have been on the spot all week hoping to see the priceless theatre antiques which remain in the building which remain in the building which remain in the building.

The contractor up until Monday thought he could remove the items which the society members planned to store. They included the wrought iron horseshoe-shaped balcony railing and parts of the decorated boxes which stood at either side of the stage. There was stage machinery, a "flying machine" and elevator and the stage proscenium itself. The society also requested the intricate orchestra rail and overhead grooves which guided the movable scenery and the leather seats of the theater.

Now it is all destined to end up in the rubble inside the building because removal was considered too dangerous when the time for it came. One item was saved, but its savors walked off with it. An antiquated popcorn machine was gone when society members went to retrieve it. Everything else is under tons of rubble which fell into the building when the roof trusses were lifted off yesterday.

The date-stone was safely brought down by the skilled crane operator, and he almost had the stone bearing the name "Henry Building," but it broke into pieces when it was grabbed by the claws of the crane.

Actor Reminiscences

However, even if total theater made the last scene at the old Opera House there are also flashbacks such as the one in the mind of life-long resident, Martin Laubscher. As he watched the debris pile up, he remembered being a page boy in the operetta, "The Four Leaf Clover" in 1926. He recalled the satin costume with its plumed hat and the director, Mrs. Hanfrew. He was 12 years old at the time.

The landmark will probably be completely gone in another week. Those concerned about the threat of the building's collapsing on someone's head will turn to other important matters.

The historical society will feel badly about the loss but will renew its efforts to save other old things such as the tunnel on Tunnel Road, and the Town Hall, next door neighbor to the deceased.

### Brain Chemical Reportedly Plays Role in Sleeping

ATLANTIC CITY, N.J. (AP) — The mystery of why you sleep and why you stay awake is opening under increasing scientific analysis.

And an odd chemical in the brain seems to be involved, a Swiss scientist said Tuesday.

The substance is a naturally occurring brain chemical known as serotonin. It is chemically closely related to hormones, which stimulate cellular activity, said Dr. Werner P. Koella of Basel.

He finds, in cats, that if the normal level of serotonin is reduced or cut off, the animals stay awake for many hours or days.

But if they are given brain injections of infinitesimal amounts of serotonin, they fall asleep.

It appears that brain levels of serotonin play a role in determining whether you sleep or stay awake, Dr. Koella said. He emphasized that he was not saying serotonin is the only chemical involved.

There is still a question whether serotonin's presence or absence is a cause or an effect of sleep.

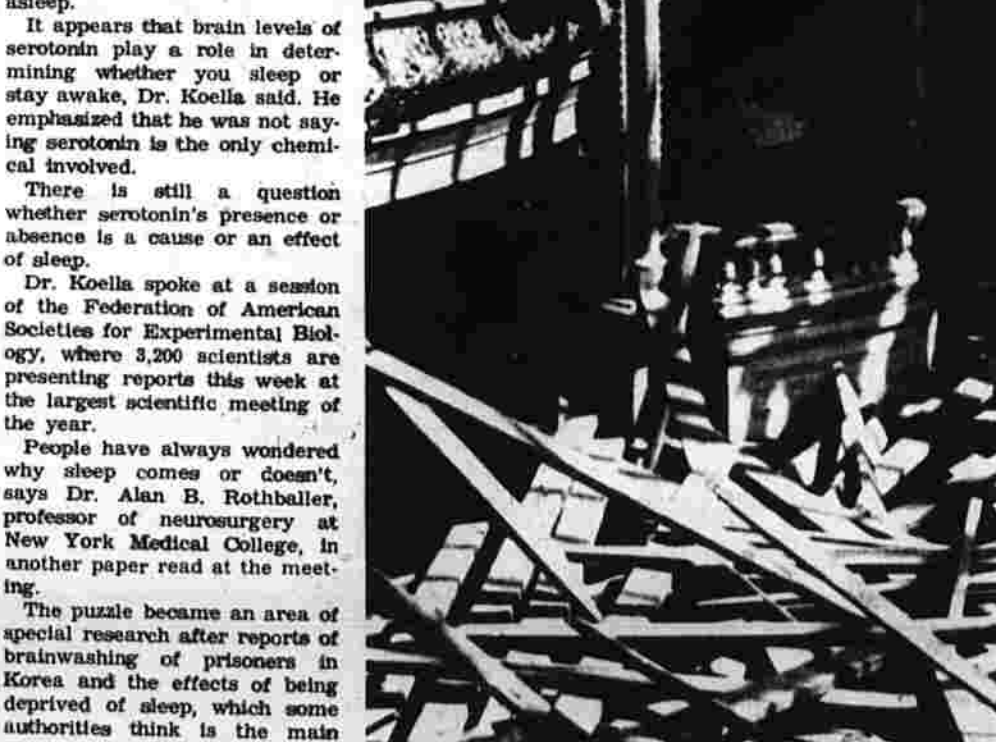
Dr. Koella spoke at a session of the Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology, where 3,200 scientists are presenting reports this week at the largest scientific meeting of the year.

People have always wondered why sleep comes or doesn't, says Dr. Alan B. Rothballer, professor of neurosurgery at New York Medical College, in another paper read at the meeting.

The puzzle became an area of special research after reports of brainwashing of prisoners in Korea and the effects of being deprived of sleep, which some authorities think is the main reason why brainwashing works.

Some sleep chemical may circulate in the spinal fluid bathing the brain, Dr. Rothballer said. He cited research by Dr. John Pappeheimer of Harvard University indicating that some chemical in the spinal fluid of rats seemed to stay awake for long periods could induce quick sleep when given to animals who were refreshed and awake.

## Disadvantaged Children Suffer Most Integration Plan Rejection Costly to Southern Schools

EDITOR'S Note — By the end of March, 128 school districts in 17 Southern and border states had lost federal funds for failure to comply with desegregation guidelines. What happens when funds are cut off? Who gets hurt? Does it force compliance? To get answers, The Associated Press investigated results in Georgia where 28 of 126 districts have lost federal funds. Two counties graphically show what happens.

VIENNA, Ga. (AP) — Refusal to accept integration guidelines cost rural Dooly County \$328,000 a year in federal funds, a figure equal to 40 per cent of the school budget, and crippled enrichment programs at Negro schools.

The cutoff helped force a tax rate.

But hurt worst were hundreds of disadvantaged school children most of them poor and Negro.

Losers were not the five school board members who rejected an integration plan of the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare—HEW—two years ago.

The losers were school children; those needing special preschool help and remedial training but now without a program.

And sick children, who lost a school nurse.

Hungry children, who were getting hot lunches free.

"My biggest problem? Not being able to feed the children," said Negro Principal Francis E. Williams at Paul Vance School in Dooly County.

Dooly, the state's top cotton-growing county located in south Georgia, and Jones County, a sparsely populated pulpwood area near Macon, show the pattern of what results from cutting off federal funds for schools.

Most of the money went to Negro schools since they have by far the most low-income families, a key qualification for the larger grants. Withdrawal of funds was felt sharply in these schools while the situation in predominantly white schools was not significantly changed.

That has been the main effect in Georgia systems, which authorities say are losing upwards of \$1.5 million a year. Some Georgians argue that HEW's cutoff of funds penalizes children because of actions of school boards.

But an HEW official says the school authorities must take the blame for not complying with "the law of the land."

Regardless of blame, the effects are the same.

Dooly County, 50 miles south of Macon, is bisected by Interstate 75, the major north-south tourist route. The county's 11,000 population is 80 per cent Negro, as is the school enrollment of 3,100.

School Supt. W. F. Stone gave this breakdown of the federal funds it received before termination in 1967:

- Remedial-enrichment programs—under Title I of 1964 Civil Rights Act—\$278,000.
- Antipoverty—Head Start, others—\$40,000.
- "Impact area" funds based on the number of military dependents in schools, \$28,000.
- Vocational education \$18,000.

The total of \$389,000 is equal to nearly 40 per cent of the 1967 school budget of \$964,876. But since the bulk of the federal funds were for added, enrichment programs, the county had to make up only about \$20,000 in its budget, Stone said.

This was done by raising property taxes \$4 per \$1,000 valuation last year, producing about \$85,000 for schools.

A pressing problem was that of hot lunches for many Negro pupils, farm children whose families fall below the poverty level of \$1,000 a year income and often must be trained to the milk because they have none at home, Stone said.

Principal Williams and his teachers at Vance elementary have taken it on themselves to raise money in their community. A pilot program of special state aid has helped.

"Sometimes we have only 19 children out of 494 at this school who can pay for lunch," Williams said. "The majority still eat free."

Stone said that with federal funds 783 meals per day had been provided free. Local efforts have kept the free lunch program going, but on a curtailed basis.

Lost with the federal money also:

- A special reading teacher, a physical education teacher and six teacher assistants, a music teacher, a band instructor, three lunch-room workers and two janitors — all for the Negro school.
- Dooly County's school board halted two years ago when HEW's formula eliminated 160 pupils and 14 teachers cross the color line, Stone said.

"The theory of 'cutting off funds' was that the federal government in such situations was in the position of subsidizing segregation," said Paul Rilling, regional civil rights director for HEW in Atlanta.

"The difference is in things we might have done," he said. "We're operating like we always operated before we got the funds."

Jordan said \$50,000 was spent in a reading program for Negro schools. Other federal money went into science equipment, textbooks, physical plant, lunchbooks, record players and four pianos.

All this went to Negro schools. And there were ambitious plans for more programs before the money was cut off, said Marie H. Collins, a Negro teacher who coordinated the federal program.

"Actually it seems like we brought things to a standstill," said Negro Principal Charles Adams of Bradley Elementary, Adams also plagued with hunger problems. He said classroom equipment, such as reading machines and projectors, were still in use

## Vernon Marine Wins Navy Medal

Lt. Lowell E. Smith of Mt. Vernon Dr. is the first Hartford-based Marine to receive the new Navy Achievement Medal for superior performance of duty under combat conditions.

Lt. Smith entered the Marine Corps in June 1966 after receiving his degree in economics from Cornell University and was commissioned through the NROTC program.

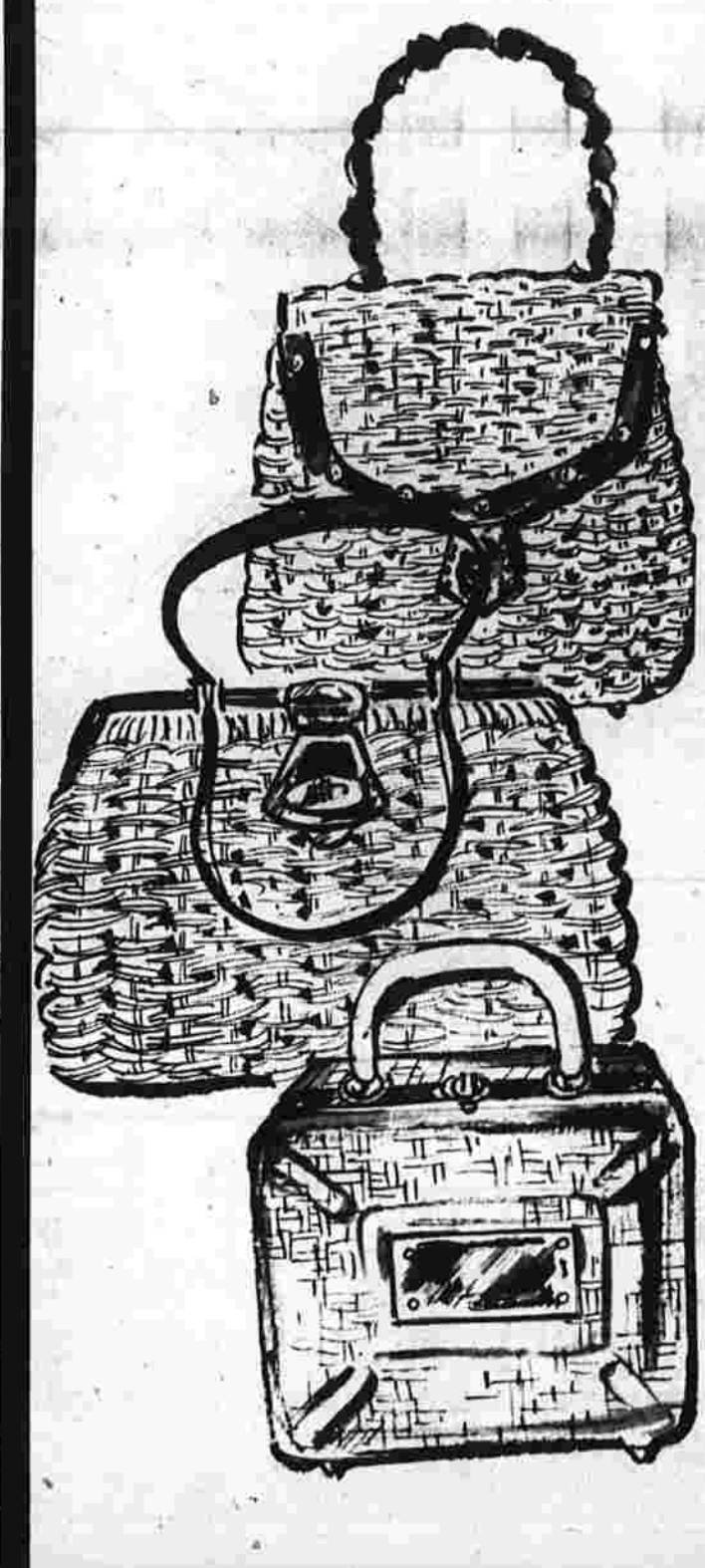

### Black Studies Program Set At Wesleyan

MIDDLETOWN, Conn. (AP)—Wesleyan University will establish an Afro-American Institute in the fall of 1969, it was announced Monday by President Edwin D. Eberington. The proposal for the institute was approved by the university trustees this weekend following a unanimous vote by the faculty last week. Staffing will be provided from among existing departments of the university through dual appointments. A program for recruiting additional black faculty members already has been instituted with the cooperation of departmental chairmen and a faculty-student committee, Eberington said. A committee of professional consultants will be nominated by black undergraduates and appointed by the president to recruitment, student and faculty exchanges and other matters pertaining to education of black students at Wesleyan. The institute will work toward implementation of a program of studies concerning Afro-American history and culture but there are no plans at present to offer a regular major in Afro-American studies. Students wishing to major in this area will work out special inter-departmental major programs under existing requirements. Such students would spend a portion of their under-

graduate careers at other institutions such as the Martin Luther King Jr. Center in Atlanta, Ga. There are about 100 black students among Wesleyan's approximately 1,200 male undergraduate students. Only five years ago the college had only two black students in its 300-member freshman class of that year.

**Gasoline Byproduct May Produce Protein** GENEVA (AP)—Man may be eating a byproduct of gasoline when the world's population exhausts the food supply. Prof. E.J. Bigwood of Brussels University said in an interview with the magazine of the World Health Organization that researchers in France and other countries are seeking to produce protein from micro-organisms

that are hydrolyzed on petroleum refining. He said the experimental protein is of extremely high biological value and is 2,000 times quicker to produce than meat protein. Total animal protein production in 1968 was estimated at about 20 million tons, said Bigwood, and requirements will reach 40 million tons in a few years and about 80 million tons by the end of the century.

Washington (AP) - Nimbus 3, the first nuclear-powered weather satellite, has started sending pictures of the earth's cloud cover and it is expected to continue operating more than a year.

The Goddard Space Flight Center at Greenbelt, Md., reported Monday that Nimbus 3 and a companion satellite were in good orbit 876 to 703 miles above the equator over the north and south poles.

Its polar orbit enables the satellite's camera to scan all the earth's weather.

Two plutonium-238 reactors provide power for the equipment which includes a new infrared detector camera designed to give a complete picture of entire earth daily. Previous weather satellites have required two cameras to do the work which the one new camera can handle.

The mission was described as the first civilian use of nuclear energy in space.

Glen T. Seaborg, chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission, hailed the achievement as a milestone that "should demonstrate the value of nuclear power or missions to the moon and beyond."

The 1,200-pound Nimbus, heaviest yet in the weather probe state of Alaska, was launched Sunday night. The piggy-back satellite which was sent into orbit near the Nimbus is the 18th in the Army's Reconnaissance Satellite series.

Nimbus 3, circling the earth every 107 minutes, is to transmit signals to more than 400 Automatic Picture Transmission stations which record the data.

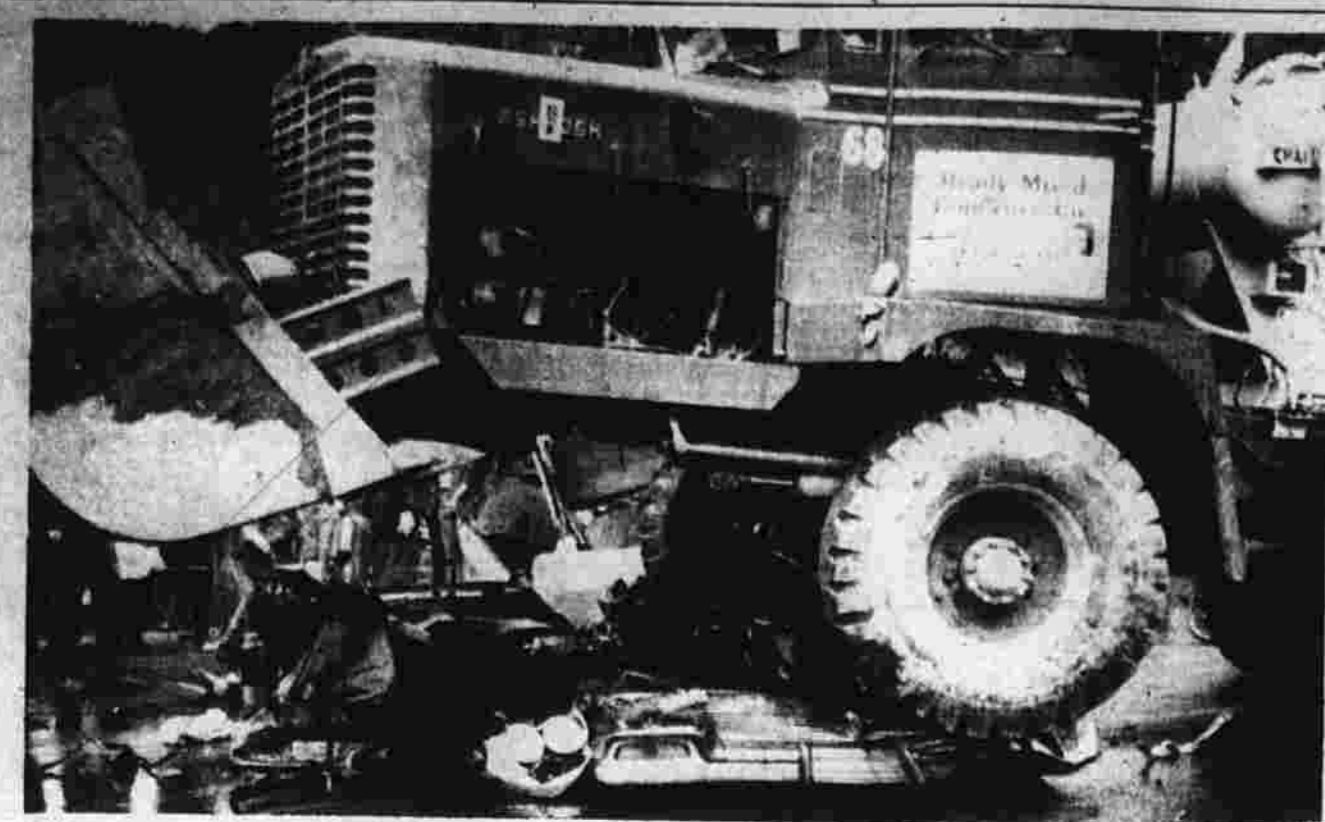

Girl's Nude Body Found Near Site of Four Slayings

YPSILANTI, Mich. (AP)—The partially nude body of a young girl, with an electric cord around her neck, was found today in the area where four other girls were murdered in the past two years.

The victim was identified as 15-year-old Dawn Bauman of Ypsilanti, who had been reported missing by her mother last night.

Eight-inch-long gashes were carved on her chest and stomach with a sharp instrument, reported Washburn County Sheriff Douglas J. Harvey.

It was a vicious and brutal killing, Harvey said. He indicated the evidence showed similarities to the other slayings, which are unsolved.

Four other girls in the Ann Arbor-Ypsilanti area of southeast Michigan have been murdered in the past two years in cases that have baffled law officers.

An area resident, who was not identified by police, discovered the latest victim straddling a road today on a lonely dirt road.

The body was sent to the nearby University of Michigan Hospital for an autopsy to determine the cause of death.

Police sealed off about a square mile around the scene, warning newsmen and others from the area.

The victim, clad only in a short-sleeved white shirt, was lying on her back at the shoulder of a dirt road, about three miles north of Ypsilanti.

An electric cord was wrapped around her neck and she had a white cloth jammed into her mouth, reported Sheriff Harvey.

Details of the murder resembled the death of 18-year-old Marilyn Skelton of Romulus. She was found nude March 23 with a garrotte belt wrapped around her neck.

Harvey said the latest body apparently was dumped at the road sometime after dark Tuesday night.

One black strap shoe was found near the body. Another shoe was found a mile south of the road.

Miss Skelton's badly beaten body was found about two miles distant. The body of Mary Plescar, 19, at Eastern Michigan University, was found last night about a mile away on August 1968.

In all the cases, the victims had been stripped and beaten. The body of Jane Louise Miller, 23, a University of Michigan law student, was found in a cemetery March 21. She had been shot several times.

In the other death, Joan E. Schell, 20, and her boyfriend, were found last July. Both Miss Plescar and Miss Schell had been stabbed.

By PHIL CASEY. The Washington Post-Washington Zoo, which didn't even know it was expecting, has given birth to a rare white tiger.

This cub, only the second white tiger ever to be born in the zoo or anywhere else in this country, arrived early Sunday morning.

Residing Mohini and her new white cub, there are few white tigers outside of India. There is one in a Miami zoo, obtained from India last year, and there are six in the Bristol, England, zoo. Bristol was raised in India, and apparently rich. That zoo got two white tigers from India last year they produced a litter of four white cubs. All the rest of the white tigers, and they are very few, are in India.

White tigers aren't true albino. The whiteness is thought to be caused by a recessive hereditary factor. Mohini was mated with Ramanna, her yellow-tiger son, who has white genes. His will be mated with him in the future, and it is believed that each litter should produce a white cub.

Though the cub seemed to be a male, before Mohini is too old to bear young, the white offspring could be mated with her and produce litters of white cubs.

The zoo set up the TV monitoring system which enables officials to observe how Mohini and cub are making out without frightening the mother and causing her to injure or kill the cub.

At last night, another a n d cub were getting along fine, although Mohini seemed to be lapping the cub.

It turned out, a few hours after that birth, that Mohini wasn't through with her surprise. She gave birth to a male yellow tiger Sunday afternoon. This cub, smaller a n d weaker, was taken from the mother by her husband on a bottle.

Mohini's first white tiger cub, born in 1964, died of dysentery in 1965, and zoo officials have been hoping for another white cub ever since.

The people at the zoo were really stunned by the birth. They had given up on Mohini's pregnancy. She had been mated with Ramanna last November and when she got that "pregnancy watch" had been set up in February, when she should have given birth. The "pregnancy watch" was canceled on Feb. 20th because the 93-month gestation period had expired.

But the zoo had overlooked something. And that was that Mohini and Ramanna had gotten together again on Dec. 29. It was an easy mistake to overlook, zoo workers said, and you have to understand the mating habits of tigers. They mate, or copulate, five or six times an hour for 40 or more hours.

Generally, they explained, the male and female tiger mate mainly for about two days, and it is an awkward spectacle. They mate, or copulate, five or six times an hour for 40 or more hours. Well, on Dec. 29, the day that Mohini finally got pregnant, it didn't work that way at all. They barely got to know each other that day, and had had intercourse of the carnivore Bert Barber. They mated only five times, for an hour or so, and was generally considered to be a mere flirtation. Science was wrong again.

Seven Mercury Astronauts Introduced Ten Years Ago

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP) — The years ago this month seven men chosen from a nation of 179 million stepped before television cameras in Washington, D.C., and were introduced as the first American space-

second U.S. orbital flight, but doctors discovered a slight heart murmur and grounded him. He served in the astronaut office as director of flight crew operations.

Chapman replaced Slayton on the second orbital journey in 1962 and gave the world a scare when he overrode his landing mark by more than 200 miles and was not found for more than an hour. He lost his flight status after being injured in a motorcycle accident in Bermuda.

Shepard also has outside business interests that have made him rich, including a bank presidency in Houston, Tex. Grisson made a 16-minute suborbital trip similar to Shepard's and had to scramble for his life when his Liberty Bell 7 capsule sank on landing in 1961. He commanded the first two-man Gemini mission in 1966 and was assigned to head the first three-man Apollo team in 1967. But tragedy intervened, as Grisson, Edward H. White II and Roger B. Chaffin died in the Apollo 1 launch pad fire at Cape Kennedy Jan. 27, 1967.

# Modification in Nuns' Dress, Only Outside Sign of Reform

By GEORGE W. CORNELL

NEW YORK (AP)—The "new nun" today is the surprise package of the religious instinctive of innovation.

While much of church officialdom still is grappling over how to handle new ideas, she's carrying them out.

"We're way ahead of the priests," says Sister Margaret Mary Bach. "Once a woman gets an impression that something should be done—soon! She does it. But a man sits and thinks about it."

It's a difference in temperament, she adds, between the abstractly analytical male and the intuitive female.

In any case, the tide of change and renovation has swept the Catholic orders of women in this country, transforming in varying degrees the rules and ways of their 176,000 members.

Although the modification in nuns' dress has been the most obvious indication of change, she said, this is only the outward sign of a whole new theological view, which she terms "incarnation theology."

It emphasizes that in Christ, God is revealed as a "personally and concretely existing" presence in the world, as she said. "How can you cuddle up to that?"

The daughter of Dr. and Mrs. Mark Bach, of Milwaukee, Wis., Sister Margaret Mary was a school teacher and swimming coach before entering her order in 1963. "I still like to play tennis with a good player," she said. "I was previously on the faculty of Marymount College in Queens, N.Y., and currently is completing her dissertation for a doctorate in philosophy from the Catholic University of America, and also is lecturing widely.
