Sidelines TurboTrain  
NEW YORK (AP)—The new high speed TurboTrain between New York and Boston has broken down again.

The train was enroute to Boston Tuesday when a ruptured air line in the propulsion system sidetracked it at the New Rochelle station, Penn Central officials said.

Passengers completed the trip. The train was sent to Providence, R.I., for repairs by its manufacturer, United Aircraft Corp.

The railroad said a backup train would be used for today's regular run if repairs cannot be completed in time.

The rupture caused the train to ride very roughly but did not impair its safety, Penn Central said.

RESERVE SECOND HOPE IF  
MAIN CHANCE FAILS

When the opponents hold an even number of cards in a suit they will seldom each have half of those cards. For example, in today's hand the odds are about 1 to 1 against a 4-4 division of the eight missing spades.

It would be a poor main chance for a slam, but is quite acceptable as a second chance if the main chance fails.

Neither side vulnerable. Opening lead—king of spades. North's opening bid was sketchy when today's hand was played during the recent regional tournament in Columbus, Ohio.

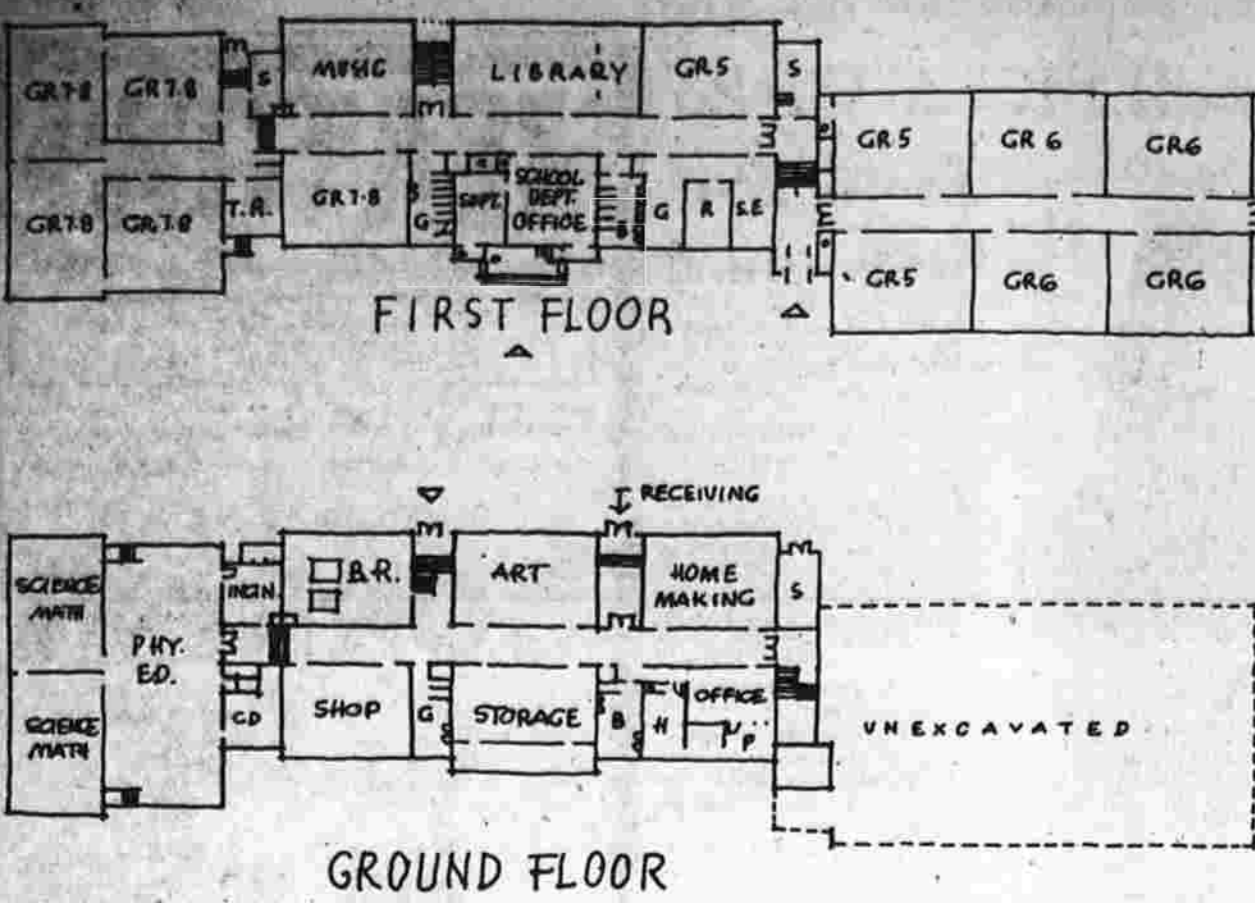

### Drug Abuses Top Concern, Poll Reveals

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP)—Abuse of drugs and narcotics among youth is ranked by Connecticut residents as the most serious problem the state faces in a copyrighted poll conducted for the Hartford Times.

Crime and violence in the streets, lack of respect for authority by young people and organized crime such as the Mafia were the next most serious problems found in the Connecticut Poll, the newspaper reported today.

People throughout the state were asked to comment on 25 problems commonly talked about and to rank them from "very serious" to "no problem at all."

The more than 500 persons questioned were selected on scientific polling principles to reflect the entire population of the state.

Only a per cent rated drug abuse as "no problem at all," and only 4 per cent considered it "very serious."

Concern over drug abuse runs noticeably higher in metropolitan Hartford: 82 per cent called it "very serious" and some-

what lower in the rest of the state.

Concern over high prices and inflation, on the other hand, was uniform throughout the state.

Other items showing high in the list of "serious problems" in the Times poll included racial violence in black ghettos, the public welfare system, water pollution, state taxes and the cost of auto insurance.

### Conference on Religion Hears Attitudes About Sex Freer But No Revolution Indicated

FITZBURGH (AP)—Attitudes about sex are generally freer and franker today than they used to be, but it is highly doubtful that sex practices have changed much nationally, say several psychologists, educators and religious scholars.

They are taking part in a conference on modern youth and morality.

"Contrary to popular opinion, we are not having a sexual revolution," said Dr. William Young, of Tulane, a professor at the annual meeting of the Academy of Religion and Mental Health, a 4,000-member organization of clergymen, psychiatrists and others seeking to shed insights of their specialties.

The session here, with about 1,000 attending, is in collaboration with the government to lay the groundwork for a 1970 White House conference on children and youth.

"The announcement was at a Board of Directors budget work session, attended only by Mayor Nathan Agostinelli, David Odegaard, Wayne Manis, Anthony Pistrantonio and Mrs. Mary LeDuc."

Weiss said that acquisition of the parcel could provide "peace, quiet and time," and that he is recommending it.

The parcel, owned by Koch Bros., is adjacent to and south-west of the present land-fill operation.

Weiss said that the purchase may involve a land-swap plus a cash transaction. Cost factors and other terms still must be worked out, he said.

He said that the item will be placed on the agenda for a future meeting of the board.

Much of the budget workshop session last night centered on road repair.

Weiss revealed that Broad St. will be paved next week with a layer of overlay, from W. Middle Pike to Center St.

He said that the state has plans to spend approximately \$250,000 for realigning and repaving the Broad-Center-Pine-W. Center Sts. intersection.

He said the work is scheduled for next fall and guaranteed for next spring (1970).

He said he has state assurances that, if the town acquires additional right-of-way on Broad St., at the intersection, the state will widen the road at that point and will pave for a distance of 240 feet into Broad St.

Director of Public Works William O'Neill explained why the town's paving program leaves the impression that the better roads are repaired and the worse roads ignored.

The badly damaged roads need extensive repair, in many instances reconstruction, he said. That expense must come out of capital improvement funds, he explained.

Funds available for overlay are spent on roads that are in a lesser stage of disrepair and that can be saved, he said.

Weiss was asked why roads have been paved immediately after new traffic lines were painted, creating a situation of "painting-paving-painting."

He said that, in the future, no traffic lines will be painted on streets scheduled for paving, until the paving is completed.

### South Windsor Joplin Grouping Plan Cited By School Administrator

"The smart job idea," said Assistant Superintendent of Schools William Perry during a presentation of elementary curriculum questions relating to the Joplin plan, "is to have a grouping of students in the classroom."

Perry's presentations touched on various innovations in curriculum, including Project Outdoors, type of grouping you do, and a program of the Last Junior Museum in Manchester.

"The system will prevent a student from knowing exactly where he stands in relation to others in his class," Perry continued.

All these elements were made in response to board members' questions relating to the Modified Joplin Plan.

Grouping - now being used primarily for reading and math in Grades 1 through 5 in the elementary system.

The Joplin plan, according to Perry, is a superior system administratively, as well as academically. Under this system, he said, five or six students at one grade level are combined and regrouped according to their ability groups for both math and reading. The teachers in the five or six classes then take just one level to teach rather than the four or five levels they might have in her home room class.

In addition, the student has a greater opportunity to work successfully at a level which is comfortable to him.

Most of the questions from the board to Perry and the elementary principals who attend the meeting concerned individual differences at a specific grade level.

Board member James Arnold questioned the lack of uniformity which exists in the system, citing the example of the student who changes schools within South Windsor, and is put in either a higher or a lower group than he was in his original school.

Circumstances such as this are always going to occur, according to Perry and the principals, since individual schools at any particular time are bound to have children of different abilities and different ranges of abilities.

One school, they said, may have a lower range of groups, while another may have a higher range. In that circumstance, a student moving from one school to another is bound to change the group level. This, the administrators claim, is better than having to throw a student into a group which is either too fast or too slow for him, since the rate than he, simply because the name of the group is the same as the name of the group from which he just came.

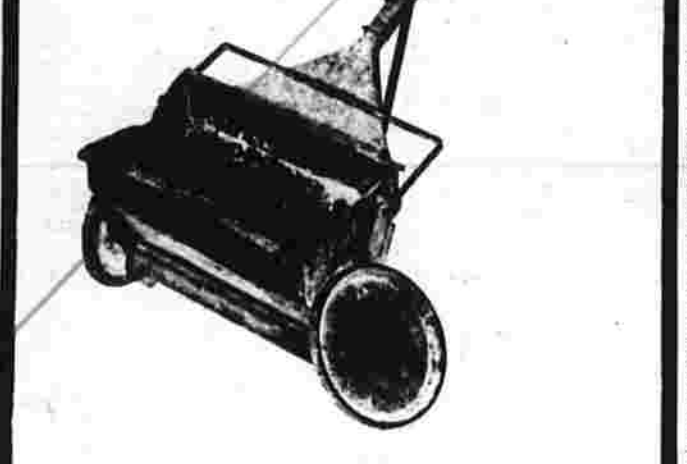

### Vernon Dye Firm Asks Exemption On Sewer Fee, Citing Pact

An easement agreement made in 1967 between the American Dyeing Corp. of Groves St. and the former City of Rockville is now being disputed by both parties.

On a motion made by Mayor John H. Grant Monday night, the Board of Representatives voted to make no action on a request of Nat Schwedel, treasurer of the American Dye, that the plant be exempt from paying a sewer user charge now imposed on all Vernon users of the sewer system.

The 15-year old easement agreement was made many years prior to the consolidation of the three local governments. Consolidation has been in effect for about four years. The agreement was made to allow the dyeing plant to use the sewer system.

Schwedel interposed the agreement to mean that the company should not be charged the user charge which originated with consolidation. This was necessary because many people in care are still serviced by septic tank systems.

It would not be equitable, while the condition exists, to charge the dyeing plant a sewer fee while the sewer service future exists.

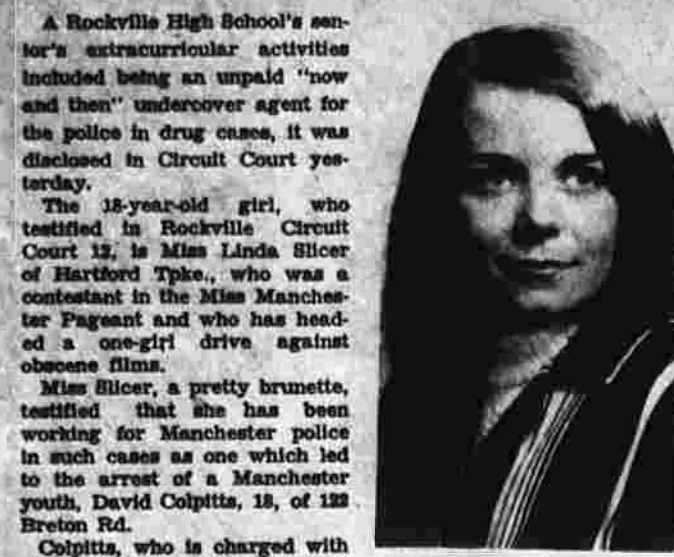

**High School Girl, 18, Tells Court**  
**Of Role As Police Drug Informer**

A Rockville High School senior's extracurricular activities included being an unpaid "now and then" undercover agent for the police in drug cases, it was disclosed in Circuit Court yesterday.

The 18-year-old girl, who testified in Rockville Circuit Court 12, is Miss Linda Sloer of Hartford 7346, who was a constant in the Miss Manchester Pageant and who has headed a one-night drive against obscene films.

Miss Sloer, a pretty brunette, testified that she has been working for Manchester police in such cases as one which led to the arrest of a Manchester youth, David Colpitts, 18, of 123 Breton Rd.

Colpitts, who is charged with possession and attempted sale of controlled drugs, was present yesterday at a court hearing on a defense motion to dismiss and suppress evidence. Miss Sloer's testimony was subpoenaed by the defense.

The girl admitted she was not on any particular police assignment on the afternoon of March 14 when she met Colpitts for the first time in Vernon's Rockville Shop on Park St. in Rockville.

She said she had out classes from school in order to work on her senior, theme and was asking someone about the bus schedule when Colpitts approached her.

They struck up a conversation which according to her testimony, "led very quickly into the subject of drugs."

She said she told Colpitts that she was a "speed freak" and took "speed" and "grass," but that she was in rough shape and taking any at the time. "Speed" is a strong dose of an amphetamine and "grass" marijuana.

No Drugs Offered  
 Colpitts' attorney, Wesley Gryk, asked her if she was on her coat sleeve when she was offered "speed" and "grass," and she answered "they haven't the vaguest," adding that it was a peace symbol she said that at no time did she offer to sell her any drugs.

**Los Angeles Now Patrolling**  
**In Helicopter and Cruiser**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — It was about midnight when a buzzer went off in the police station. Someone had tripped the silent burglar alarm in a store. The dispatcher sent a patrol car—and a helicopter.

Pilot Hal Brasher and observer Roger Coit, both policemen, were over the scene of the crime in about a minute. At 800 feet, they flicked on a \$500,000 candycandy light, turning night into day over an area the size of a football field.

"This is a police helicopter," boomed from their loudspeaker. "Come out with your hands in the air."

A second or so later a man sprinted from the store, hoping to elude them in nearby alleyway. The "copter" crew easily kept him in their light, and off in the patrol car, arriving five minutes later, made the arrest.

"It must have sounded like the voice of God to that fellow," chuckled Capt. Paul J. Gillen, West Valley division commander. "He was still shaking like a leaf when they looked him at the station."

The "copter" patrols began on an experimental basis a month ago. The West Valley division covers the high-income San Fernando Valley, a suburban complex that would be the nation's seventh largest city if it weren't part of Los Angeles. It is 85 miles across and surrounded by towering mountains.

Homes of many wealthy families nestle in mountain cul-de-sacs. It can take quite a while to reach them. "The key to good police work is fast response," says Gillen, "and the 'copter' does just that."

He tells the story of a woman who called about 1 a.m. to say her neighbors were on vacation and a suspicious car was in their driveway.

"After police explain what they are doing, the complainants say they're all for it, he adds.

**Vernon**  
**Renewal Unit Gets Go-Ahead**  
**On Steps Toward Phase 2**

The Board of Representatives this week gave the go-ahead to the Redevelopment Agency to make application to the Department of Community Development for funds to prepare an application for a neighborhood development program. Phase 1 of the redevelopment program consisted of demolition of a certain area, in the center of Rockville, demolition of all the buildings within the area, and relocating the tenants of the demolished buildings.

Phase 2, it is proposed, will be more of a rehabilitation program of the existing buildings.

Health Commissioner Dr. Franklin Foote, chairman of the redevelopment commission, explained the agency was not asking for more money, just approval to make the application.

Since last June the agency explored the possibility of submitting the Neighborhood Development Program application and reached the conclusion, according to committee chairman Mrs. Betty Lou Williams, that this type of application would be in the best interests of the town.

The money previously allocated would constitute the town's cash share. The rest will be paid in servicers of the town planer and such a program.

Upon receipt of state approval the agency will then complete a Neighborhood Development Program application for submission to the Department of Community Development.

**Railbus Seen**  
**1st Big Step to Rapid Transit**

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) — Development of the railbus can be the "first big step toward an integrated rapid-transit system," the president of the Connecticut Company told the Women's Travel and Transportation Club Tuesday night.

Charles F. Whitten said the "advantages of low cost, federal financial support, strategic location of tracks and an operational technique which extends now are to numerous to be ignored."

Railbus is one element of a "spoke" system of such lines, which, with associated peripheral parking lots, is being proposed by the company as a solution to metropolitan mass transit problems, the bus company president said.

Whitten explained that bus routes and railbus trucks would converge at a central business district having a station. Suburbanites could then drive to the station, park their cars and travel to the city on high-speed buses.

A system of local feeder bus routes would loop through residential and satellite business districts as well, he noted.

Trucks, said Whitten, he added, for effective railbus lines to serve North Hartford, Bloomfield and suburbs to the north-west. Existing tracks in the east could serve East Hartford, Manchester, South Windsor, East Windsor and Enfield and in the south, another existing line for Westfield and Rocky Hill.

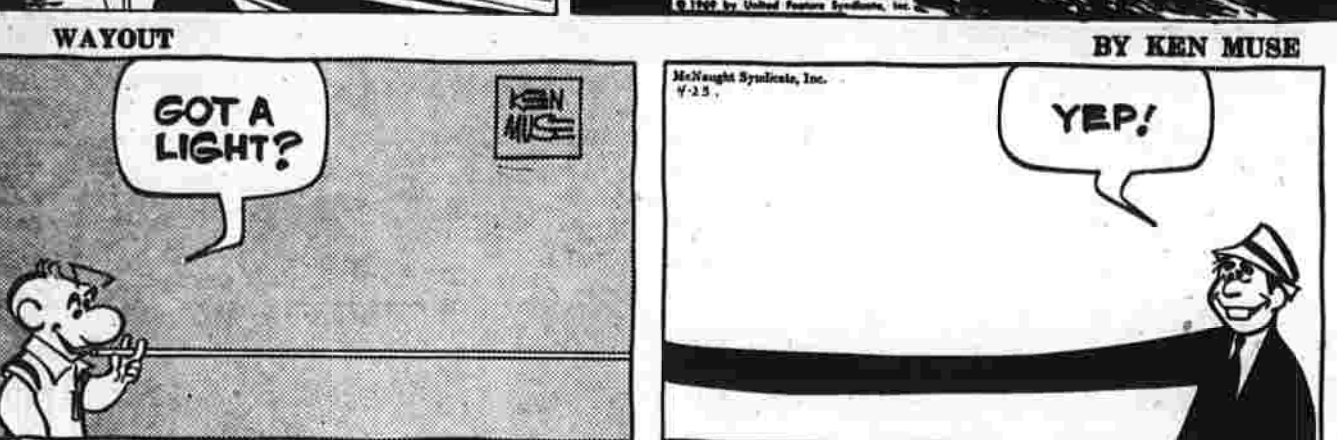
