The merits of the proposed changes have been overshadowed by the question of confidence in De Gaulle's stewardship, which is exactly what he intended. The threat of defeat has spurred the Gaullists to frantic new efforts, but many voters still appear apprehensive about the referendum and the future of the 11-year-old De Gaulle epoch.

The president will broadcast another appeal for support Friday night. His traditional argument, "De Gaulle or chaos," appears to have lost much of its force. The Gaullists are looking for a replacement for the old man. De Gaulle's resignation victory in the legislative elections last June came in the wake of six weeks of student violence and labor strikes that scarred the middle class into the arms of the Gaullists.

Memories of those hectic days have faded, and the parties of the left are in disarray, obviously posing no threat to the established order. And the argument that no one can replace De Gaulle is offset by the comeback being made by former Premier Georges Pompidou, now regarded as a strong candidate to succeed De Gaulle.



From Your Neighbor's Kitchen

By VIVIAN F. FERGUSON

Pennsylvania Dutch — that intriguing culture and cuisine which developed in Lancaster County, Pa. during the first quarter of the 18th century, attracts countless tourists to the area which once was native Shesha Indian territory. A religious haven, settled by William Penn, the area was settled by Mennonites from the German Palatinate as early as 1700. They were followed by other nationalities — Swiss, French, Scots-Irish, Welsh, English — all of whom had their own language, customs, and religious practices. The Lutheran and Reformed churches still form the largest segments of the Pennsylvania Dutch people. The three so-called "plain" people are the Mennonites (the oldest historically and most numerous); the Amish; and the Schuthers, sometimes known as Dunkards, the latter names deriving from the method of baptism performed by immersion or dunking. Most of the Pennsylvania Dutch are German, Swiss or French Huguenots who intermarried with the English, Irish, Scotch resulting in a unique culture.

Since we find no Dutch background, why weren't the people called Pennsylvania German? The Quakers (or Friends) mistakenly called the Germans "Dutch," and you can easily understand since Germany was called Deutschland. English-speaking people had done this from early times.

The cookery of this region reflects the mode of living — hearty and simple. Many dishes were developed because the housewife improvised with what she had. Since the spices of the old country were not available, the ladies learned to cook without them. Recipes were devised and passed from mother to daughter by word of mouth (see recipe below). Perhaps the only instructions would be "flour to stiffen" or "sugar to sweeten." The cook was on her own as far as quantities were concerned.

Joan Bendisen was brought up in Harrisburg, Pa., right on the fringe of the Pennsylvania Dutch region. She attended Lycoming College, Williamsport, Pa., where she majored in psychology. Consequently, she joined the staff of the Institute of Living, Hartford, Conn., and worked in the development of new psychiatric tests. While at the institute she met the late radiologist, Dr. Gilbert W. Hestrich and became his secretary. In 1958 she held a "sweet corn" as the Pennsylvania Dutch say.

Apple per servings required. Place slices in a bowl and stir in generous portions of sugar, cinnamon and nutmeg (use spatula). Mix until all apple slices are well coated with dry ingredients. The cooking spoon apple mixture onto center section of roll-out dough. Spread over the fruit. Pinch edges together. Top with one teaspoon brown sugar and one pat of butter. Place in shallow baking pan. Sprinkle bottom of pan with brown sugar and add 1/4" water. Bake at 400 degrees until brown and apples tender (45 minutes to one hour). Serve in soup bowls. Spoon pan juices over dumplings. Then, pour milk over all. This "wonderful soup" as the Pennsylvania Dutch say.

While chicken is cooking, prepare potatoes and dumpling dough. (Prepared commercial biscuit dough may be substituted for the latter). Peel and slice potatoes as for scalloped potatoes. Soak in salted water. Mix dry ingredients for dumplings. Add milk a few drops at a time, blending into the dry ingredients with a fork. Dough should be fairly dry and stiff. Roll out on floured board, to about 1/4" thickness. With a sharp knife, cut into two-inch squares.

When chicken is tender, drain potatoes well. Add potatoes and dumpling dough in layers atop the chicken, starting with a layer of potatoes, then dough, etc. until all are used. Cover and cook an additional 1/4 to 1/2 hours, adding salt and pepper to taste.

Main Course Apple Dumplings (Soup Bowl Size) Triple the dumpling recipe above and add one extra teaspoon sugar. Roll out to 1/4" thickness on lightly floured board, after dividing into pieces according to serving portions required. When rolled out, dough should be 6.8" wide and circular as in pie crust. Cove, pare and slice to 1/4" thickness one large cooking

CRPA-CRCEO Merger Seen Inhibiting Planning

The proposed merger of the town planning board has to a Capitol Region Planning Agency (CRPA) and the Capitol Region Council of Elected Officials (CRCEO) within the next year would inhibit the planning process, according to CRPA chairman Seymour Le. Although admitting the proposed merger might eventually be accomplished, both Le and CRCEO executive director Robert Brown expressed strong enough to make the merger practical.

"CRCEO is not ready to even talk about this issue," Brown said, pointing to CRPA's 10-year history, he noted CRPA stated. "Had there been a merger, it would not like to see it housing needs throughout the region."

'Fat Letters' vs. 'Thin Letters'

High School Seniors Await College-of-Choice Replies

LOS ANGELES — If you don't know what "fat letters" are — as opposed to "thin letters" — the chances are that you're not 17 years old, or the teacher, father, sister, brother, guidance counselor or parent acquaintance of a 17-year-old.

In the particular parlance and mythology of college-bound high school seniors, "fat letters" are acceptance notices from colleges. They are fat because besides the "yes, we want you" message from the dean of admissions, they also contain catalogs, housing brochures and medical forms; all the paraphernalia for the freshman year.

"Thin letters," on the other hand, usually contain only a single sheet of letterhead stationery on which is written a succinct, positive or negative, emphatic rejection. Letters, fat or thin, are the chief spring days of college choice decisions began in early April through the prestigious Ivy League schools, will be delivered this week.

With half the high school graduates in the country going to college these days, more than that in states like California and New York, the competition for places in the best known schools is sometimes fierce.

Further, Astin and Panos could find "no clear pattern of institutional characteristics which either fostered or inhibited student achievement."
