Once 'Everyone's Darlings,' Times Change for Beatles

LONDON (AP)—"These are not the days of yore, but I never change them for the Beatles," says George Harrison, "but it isn't like the old days. They have to be." Ringo Starr adds, "I'm shaking the way some sections of the public have turned on us. It's completely unexpected." What's happened to the Beatles? George, Ringo and the other Beatles—John Lennon and Paul McCartney—have given a public performance together in two years although they have continued to make hit recordings. Their joint business enterprises have run into problems. George and John were recently fined on drug charges. John and his Japanese bride, Yoko Ono, drew some newspaper headlines when they spent their honeymoon ostentatiously in a way for world peace, and invited full publicity. Amidst all this activity, Ringo Starr was busy on a separate career as a movie actor. But he did not turn his back on his fellow Beatles. In an interview he insisted early 1968 to promote films, records and clothing. In January John Lennon said it had turned sour and unless something was done they would be broke within six months. The interview was on the set of "The Magic Christian," a film that pairs Ringo with actor Peter Sellers. Millford Murder Held in Warden Of Her Husband

MILFORD, Conn. (AP)—A 22-year-old Millford woman was in custody today on a charge of murdering her husband, whose body was found in the cellar of the couple's home Tuesday. The accused, Mrs. Connie Curtin, had reported her husband's death to state police in Rhode Island Tuesday morning. Rhode Island authorities notified Millford police, who arrived at the body of Thomas Curtin, 26, about 9 a.m. with two bullet wounds in the head. He had apparently been killed Monday night by a small-bore revolver, police said. Mrs. Curtin waived extradition after being served with a charging Court bench warrant. Her lawyer, James J. O'Connell, said she was being held in the Millford jail. "I want say we will not fight, but we'll go on for a very long time unless we get about, or something." MIT To Ban New, Secret Lab Work

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP)—Massachusetts Institute of Technology has temporarily banned the undertaking of any new classified programs at two government-oriented laboratories. The ban is to remain in effect until a committee of trustees, faculty, students, alumni and laboratory staff investigates the relationship of the laboratories to the university. The ban was decided upon by MIT President Howard Johnson Oct. 1. Committee Chairman Dean William F. Pounds of MIT's Sloan School of Management said he hopes to have a final report by May 31. A university spokesman said today that work on present programs at the laboratories will continue and that he did not expect the ban to "have a substantial effect" on either facility. The moves were taken following student questioning of MIT's ties with the Department of Defense.

The ban was decided upon by MIT President Howard Johnson Oct. 1. Committee Chairman Dean William F. Pounds of MIT's Sloan School of Management said he hopes to have a final report by May 31. A university spokesman said today that work on present programs at the laboratories will continue and that he did not expect the ban to "have a substantial effect" on either facility. The moves were taken following student questioning of MIT's ties with the Department of Defense.

Colfax Demands Probe Finding To Deny Tenure

STORRS, Conn. (AP)—Charging violation of academic freedom, University of Connecticut Prof. J. David Colfax is demanding an inquiry into a Board of Trustees decision to deny him tenure. Colfax, an associate professor of sociology who has been active in antiwar protests here, has asked that the American Association of University Professors conduct the probe. In a letter to UConn President Homer D. Babidge Jr., Colfax maintains the decision was inconsistent with standard tenure policy at the university "and with other recent tenure actions, both within and without my own department. "I can only conclude that the decision was based upon my political activities and beliefs and not my capacity as a teacher or scholar. This is a clear violation of academic freedom." In March, the trustees made Colfax's appointment terminal rather than granting him tenure. He has been at UConn for six years. A tenure and promotions committee from the Sociology Department recommended Colfax for tenure, but an advisory council of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences did not recommend tenure.

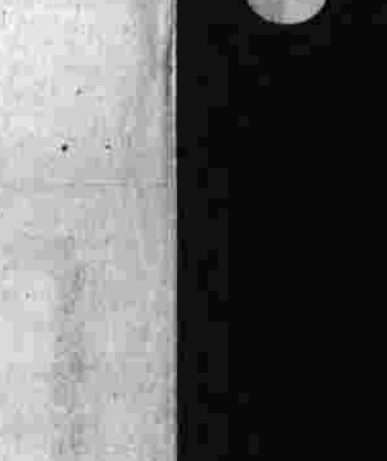

Tollard School Cut Means A 64-Mill Budget

The Board of Finance has recommended a revised budget of \$2,400,000 to be financed by a 2.5 mill rate. Action on the adoption of the budget by the Board will be delayed until May 13, 1969, because of the Finance Department's review of the budget.

The budget as compiled by the Finance Department represents a \$175,000 cut in the Board of Education budget, or seven mills.

Only \$7,254 of approximately one-third of a mill was deleted from the selection's budget overall total.

The proposed budget represents a \$75,812 increase over last year and will necessitate an eight-mill increase over the present 5.8 mill rate.

The Board of Finance estimates at the time of the original budget submissions by various departments were 73 mills. Finance board chairman Howard Wolgast yesterday expressed extreme displeasure at the interest shown in our schools and our town government by Tollard residents.

He held the large attendance at the recent budget hearing, estimated near 300, to be "indicative of the spirit and interest in the school and town government of the community."

In accordance with state statute, the finance board has cut several items in the Selection's budget, with others being added.

They have cut the education budget by \$175,000 but cannot tell the school board they are cutting the funds from.

It is now up to the school board to attempt to apply money to the budget in an attempt to find an expendable item.

Tollard Brairton Warns \$175,000 Cut Will Close Schools Next Spring

The unprecedented \$175,000 cut in the Board of Education budget, announced yesterday by the Board of Finance, has prompted a warning from school board members and Superintendent of Schools Robert Brairton.

Brairton predicted the "schools will find it necessary to close their doors some time in the Spring of 1970 if the \$175,000 cut is approved."

During a special meeting of the school board last night, the board discussed some items which could be eliminated from the school budget at the task of finding \$175,000.

"There is no way in which \$175,000 can be eliminated from the school budget," Brairton stated. "It is my judgment and a judgment that I will state to you as a financial fact that the Tollard public schools will not be able to operate through 1970 with this recommended reduction," the superintendent added.

Other items discussed at the meeting were the school board's request for a minimum enrollment to Tollard next year, which would allow an education budget \$121,000 cut. The Tollard proposed budget, which was submitted to the Board of Finance in this town ordered only a \$4,000 cut.

The Board of Education must work out where the budget cuts are recommended by the Board of Finance can be made. The Board of Education must negotiate in good faith under the provisions of P.A. 752, it is in my judgment totally unrealistic to expect that this Board of Education can operate the Tollard Public Schools on a budget reduced by anything near this amount."

Brairton noted last night he had requests totaling \$17,000 from the budget before presenting it to the school board.

The school board had in turn made some cuts. The total amount from the original budget requests now totals \$202,871.

The budget as submitted to the Board of Finance totaled \$1,888,882 which it reduced to \$1,894,273.

The school system anticipates a 400-plus student enrollment increase next year plus the start of a third year class at the high school.

The finance board's recommended budget represents a \$259,009 increase over last year. The estimated 30 new teachers needed next year, according to the superintendent, would require an estimated expenditure of \$228,000.

Teen Center Problem Resolved, But Tensions Come to Surface

Although town and school officials needed only 30 minutes last night to settle a dispute over 408 square feet of Teen Center space, the meeting of the two groups preceding the settlement threatened to erupt into a full-scale airing of their differences.

The 408 square feet is the space partitioned off in the east wing for the Teen Center storage space in the west wing of the Teen Center, the old Trade School building on School St.

The Teen Center utilizes the entire east wing for its Saturday night dances and half of the west wing for a lounge and game room and for a club room. The other half of the west wing already is being used for the school system.

Because the walled cloakroom utilizes almost half of the space remaining after the 408 additional square foot space was lost to the school system, the space available for two pool tables and one ping pong table was insufficient.

The problem was settled when all of the officials present accepted a suggestion by Principal Alan Cone.

The cloakroom will be removed, leaving space for pool tables and ping pong tables. On Saturday nights, when dance and other activities are held in the joint classroom, used during the week for education and training, the tables will be used as a cloakroom.

The 408 square foot space was partitioned off for storage areas for art, music and physical education teachers.

The move was part of a chain reaction, starting with the need for more space for data processing facilities in Bennett Junior High.

The dispute over the taking was between Town Manager Robert Weiss told the Board of Directors eight days ago that despite assurance from Dr. Donald Hennigan, Superintendent of Schools, that discussions would precede his order for partitioning, the order had gone out.

The directors had expressed dismay and disbelief at Hennigan's order and had requested last night's meeting.

The threatened disruption of last night's meeting was precipitated by a remark made by Hennigan, for which he later apologized.

"I only wish," Hennigan said, "that the manager and the directors would show the same concern for the problems of the 10,000 attending school daily as they do for the 400 who attend the Teen Center once a week."

Town Manager Weiss was quick to reply, "Let's stick to the subject. We're here to talk about the matter and there's no solution, and if the townspeople have nothing to say about it, then we're wasting our time, and we can go home now."

School Board chairman John Rottner tried to make peace. "We're here to find a solution," he replied. "What Dr. Hennigan is trying to show is that there is an interrelation between the Teen Center and the school system. But Director Harold Turkington said, 'There's no priority here to night on concern with all of the children over in the town versus the teen-agers.'" he said.

"It's not right," he said. "It's not right to charge us with lack of interest or concern in things other than the Teen Center."

Food Prices May Climb 3 Per Cent

WASHINGTON (AP) — Government experts are having second thoughts about their previous optimistic forecast that the increase in food prices this year might be held to between 2 and 3 per cent.

The Agriculture Department is in the process of re-examining its earlier projections, and it may be that we'll find the outlook for food prices will rise as much as 3 per cent over last year, an official said. This still would be an improvement over 1968 when food prices soared 4.3 per cent.

The department is scheduled to issue a summary report on the national food situation May 1. Before any revised food cost analysis, to be included in the report, will reflect a larger gain than previously expected.

Last week it was reported that food prices went up four-tenths of one per cent in March — a month in which grocery prices normally remain level.

The department's farm price report for the month ending April 15 shows a decline of three-fourths of one per cent in the index for prices farmers receive for their products, but it was the first drop since October.

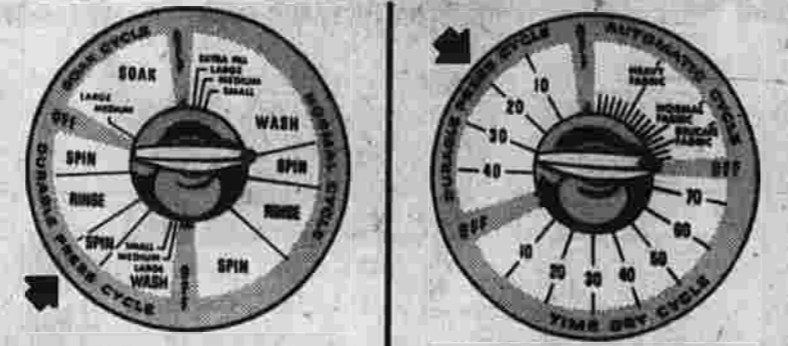

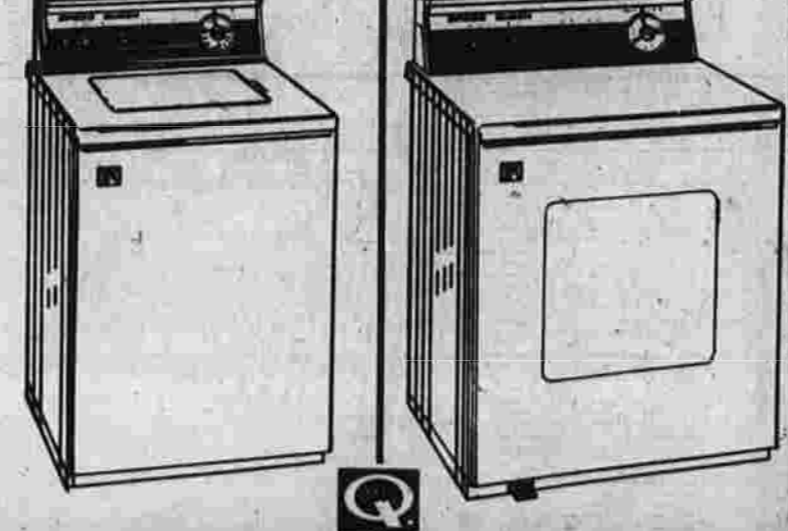

Anti-Soviets Plot Uprising in South Moravia

PRAGUE (AP) — An anti-Soviet group, plotting an armed uprising, has been discovered in southern Moravia, the Czechoslovak Communist party newspaper Rude Pravo reported today.

Jensen Cites Town's 'Top Credit Rating'

In a rebuttal to statements of fiscal conservatism in Bolton by the Democratic party, Milton Jensen, GOP town committee chairman, today cited Bolton's "top national credit rating."

In his third "truth statement," Jensen blasted the Democratic leadership for what he termed "scurrilous tactics" in talking townspeople into facing a budget cut.

Jensen said that "the lack of confidence and lack of vision displayed by the Democrats is detrimental to the best interests of the townspeople."

"These tactics of 'gloom and doom,'" he said, "have degraded the town and have created an impression of fiscal irresponsibility which can have adverse effects in future years, regardless of the particular party in power."

Public Works Budget Sifted, But Town Board Cuts Are Few

The Public Works Department budgets were reviewed with a fine-tooth comb last night by the Board of Representatives, but few cuts were made and some of Mayor John Rosen's cuts were restored after consideration.

Board member James Roche made a motion, which was not passed, that Andrew Tricorno, director of public works, cut \$15,000 from his supervisory total budget.

In asking for the cut, Roche said that "nobody wants to do it but it has to be done. We can't go along with a 10-percent cut in the general government budget has to take all of the cuts."

Roche further explained that he had already cut \$40,000 from the general fund. "It was suggested by Stuart Nett, another board member, that there should be an understanding with all department heads that if money budgeted isn't expended in the fiscal year it is supposed to be, then the budget should be cut back to the bare minimum the next year," he said.

Two other small items cut from the budget were restored by the board. PARIS (AP) — As a former president Charles de Gaulle is entitled to about \$24,000 a year from the government, plus a secretary and a chauffeured limousine.

The law gives him an allotment equivalent to that paid a state congressman in regular service. This is \$120,000-\$130,000 a month.

He also is automatically a member of the Constitutional Council, which deals with the legality of presidential elections. This post brings a monthly salary similar to that received by certain above-scale civil servants—\$1,387 to \$1,541.

De Gaulle has always lived frugally. He has income from book royalties, but other private sources of income, if they exist, are not clear.

He Hates Broadway
Negro Pianist Conducts Orchestra for 'Promises'

NEW YORK (AP) - Harold Wheeler, the 25-year-old who conducts the orchestra in the Broadway musical, "Promises, Promises," is a most unlikely candidate for the job.

He doesn't want to be a conductor. He is hated Broadway. And he was hired originally as a dance arranger for the show, a job he describes by saying, "After opening night, my job was all over."

Wheeler is one of Broadway's youngest conductors. He is also one of the few Negroes to conduct a Broadway musical and is believed to be the only one ever to have led the orchestra on opening night.

Perched on a stool in his crowded West Side apartment, Wheeler explained that he had never conducted before and, in fact, didn't really want to work in a Broadway show.

"I took the job because it was so far behind and still work with a composer who was aware of what's happening stylistically," he said.

Burt Bacharach, the composer, moved Wheeler up to conductor because he liked the young man's piano playing.

Wheeler's main interests are acting and composing. "I hope I don't start getting a lot of offers to conduct other shows," he said.

Asked when he first became interested in music, Wheeler, a native of St. Louis, laughed and said, "I can start at a when I started taking piano or I can start at when I started playing around with the piano. At 8, I was playing for my Sunday School class."

He studied piano, with the aid of several scholarships, through high school, then continued his music studies at Howard University in Washington, D.C. After graduation in 1968, he worked in Washington night clubs.

He went to the Manhattan School of Music on a student loan and worked at odd jobs until he was hired by CBS as a program director for their FM radio station.

But, Wheeler, no longer felt like a musician. "One Monday I didn't come in to work. Tuesday I came in and gave my notice," he said.

Between leaving CBS in February, 1968, and getting the job with "Promises, Promises" in August, Wheeler free-lanced to pay the rent.
