South Windsor High School Postponement May Be Board Topic Tonight

The postponement of the proposed high school is expected to be one of the topics discussed tonight at the first Board of Education meeting held since the decision was made.

While the board postponed the building project while they reviewed the architect's projections, it is not yet clear that the town will not need some construction by 1972 to avoid overloading the classes.

Until the board has time to review the projections further, townpeople are awaiting an explanation from the board as to why the board took so long to review its projections.

When the board postponed the project, only one day after it had been announced that the Public Building Commission and the architect would be proceeding with the project, the Democrats opened the 1969 election campaign with the board's decision as its number one target.

"We have a good treasury so we can get these groups," La-Coe said.

Treasurer Betty Hunter said she tries to maintain over \$1,000 in their checking account. Current savings account, she said, has about \$4,000 now.

"This time of year, we lose a bit each week. This means we break even at the end of the year," she said.

A membership card costs \$2. When the center takes in a flood of new members in the fall, the treasury swells, she explained. But members pay only 50 cents each Saturday night.

Recent benefits allowed the teens to give \$120 checks to the March of Dimes and the Senior Citizens Center. They are planning the next benefit for May 24 to support IOH (Institution of the Handicapped). IOH is a local, non-profit corporation. In it, teen-agers help handicapped children to learn how to swim.
