unfortunate combination of circumstances? There is, perhaps, no real reason why he should be expected to behave differently than the Doolis, the Bakers, the Adams or the Wolcotts of our time, except the one possible reason—that possessing the brilliance and love of the bar he drew, he had an unparalleled opportunity to help write or ensure a high moral law, and did not take the bait.

Mistress Of Appliances

The New York Times carried a survey of the difficulties modern housewives confront in keeping their many labor-saving appliances in proper repair. Aids from the general household over the difficulty in getting services men to answer telephones, appear on the scene, obtain the proper parts, and not leave behind some new problem worse than the one they were called in to handle, the most striking thing about the survey was the number of instances in which the appliances which were breaking down had broken down in the same way no matter how many repairsmen treated it.

After having the repair service fix a washer-dryer combination three times, one couple finally gave up and just put a bucket under the machine to catch the water it leaks every time they use it. Another couple paid \$99 to have their refrigerator cured of a bad habit of going into a defrosting cycle all the time, and finally discovered it wasn't cured, and they discovered the real cure was merely the tightening of a plug, which should have cost nothing.

One housewife calculated that she has now spent, on one particular appliance, 100 service calls and repairs, four or five times as much as she paid for it originally. Another Manhattan housewife spent several months trying to get a 10-month old dishwasher repaired, fixed in desperation, demanding, and getting her money back, whereupon she bought a new dishwasher of a different make and immediately had trouble with it.

Many housewives, after finding that their appliances have such a tendency to stop working, are beginning to wonder if it is not, perhaps, a superstition, a conviction that the particular appliance they have is a demon, which is never going to work right, no matter how many experts work on it for how many dollars.

One way, or another, we believe there is on the way out of the nation's computer a new statistic, one which shows that the modern housewife spends almost as much time worrying about and being home for repairs to her appliances as those same appliances are supposed to be saving for her. Before the war, the routine of the old-time New England housewife is going to seem relaxed and pleasant and full of leisure time, which seemed a deserved and philosophical reward rather than a jangled excuse.

Perhaps the simplest explanation is also the best. It is that human nature is seldom gifted for seeing things as others might; it is not inconceivable that even Justice Fortas might have denounced, in theory, or in some anonymous application, the same conduct he himself happened to follow.

If it is a kind of national instinct to see a career big game, and an institution momentarily pulled, to see a kind of national necessity, or at least a terrible need, to have the act and role of purification attempted. This we have, in its essentials, in the fact that Justice Fortas has yielded to the bidding public drive against him and undered his resignation. This leaves the Court free to go its way, and Fortas himself free to go whatever future way he chooses. This much was almost inevitable.

The one final request in an affair of so many regrets is that the man who did not somehow sense, did not somehow feel overweighing upon him, some final compulsion to read constantly to some reader analysis, from his own lips, in which he himself might have tried to answer the question of just how he managed to escape seeking the property of his own conduct.

Any such examination of his own conduct by his own brilliant mind would certainly have led to the permission to make a linkage between whatever weakness there was within himself and the great cynical, pessimistic whims which seem especially typical of our present times.

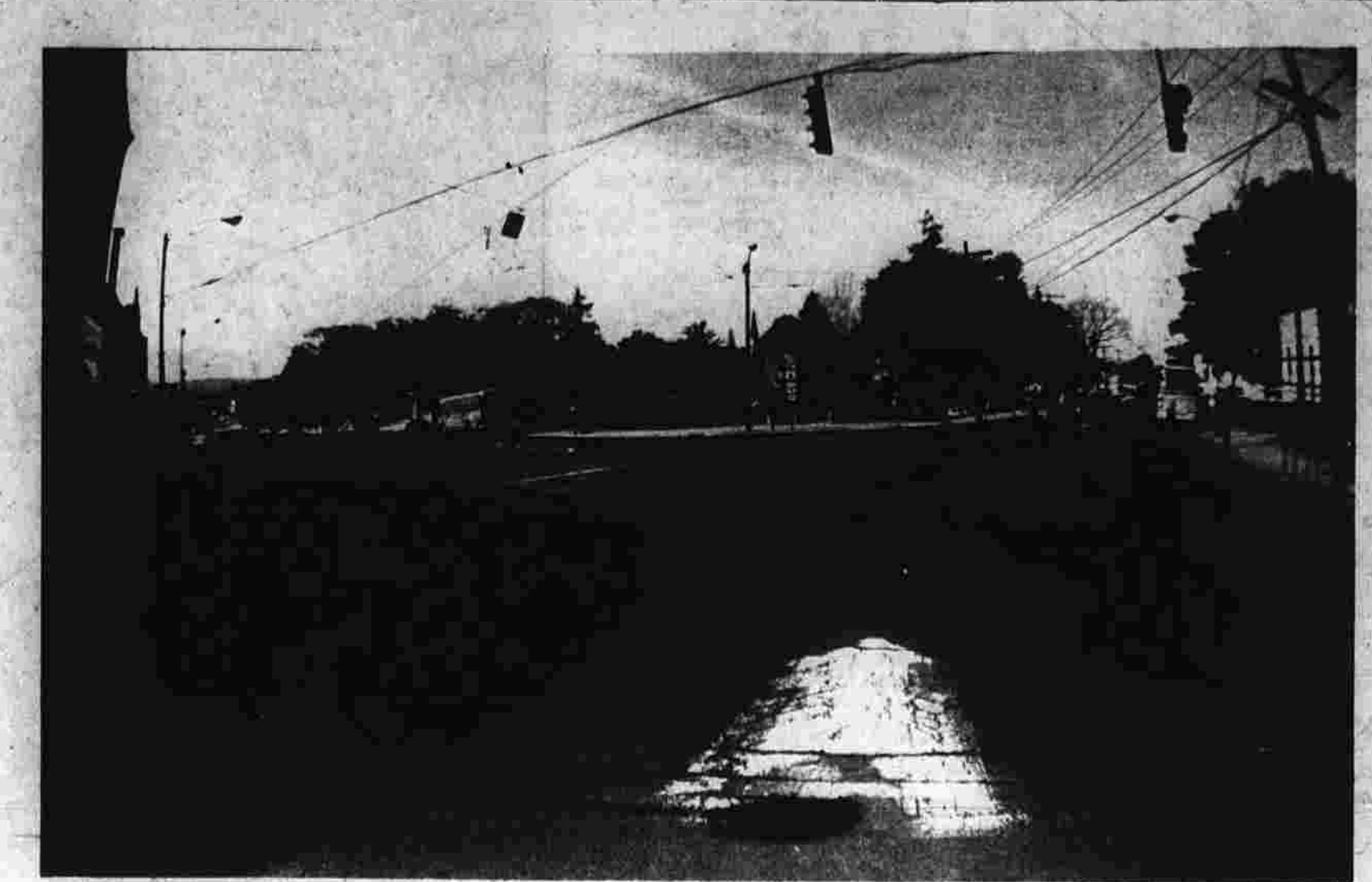

Mr. Fortas has not been alone in the kind of living which he, personally, is now to pay a price.

He did have a chance, once the situation closed in on him because of the identity of his connections and the highness of his own place, to make himself unique by bringing himself to public confession that what he had done was wrong—actually wrong. Instead, he has chosen to treat his case as one of misunderstanding or of misinterpretation, in instances in which no real fault was involved, unless it might be the fault of those petty enough to raise the issue of purity.

Why should Mr. Fortas, of all people, be the first to find the role of public confessor? Why should he not, like everybody else in similar situations, treat his own case as one of poor luck, or an

**Wonders of the Universe
Power for Lunar Colony**

DR. L.M. LEVITT, DIRECTOR of the Fels Planetarium of The Franklin Institute, is stepping out on the moon to mark the beginning of the new era of lunar exploration. Other experiments will follow in rapid succession. Eventually, this must lead to a permanent colony on the moon and one of the most critical needs for that settlement will be power. How will they obtain this power?

In a book published more than 10 years ago, J. Prosser, a physicist, proposed a permanent settlement on the moon by 1980. I described how the early lunar settlers could live and how the ecological cycle could be closed. A nuclear power plant was postulated as the source of power. Today, while this still remains a possibility, the details of this nuclear power plant are not so well defined.

Engineers have long studied the problem of supplying power to lunar outposts, but, frankly, no one knows yet what the power requirements will be and, even if they were spelled out, no one can indicate the form the generating equipment will take. What must be realized is that the stay-time on the moon governs the type of generator used. The Surveyor spacecraft used solar cells and batteries to provide an average power of 100 to 120 watts for picture-taking purposes. During the long lunar night the batteries provided the power. The power plant will be modularized so it can operate using a single Saturn, or two or more units as temporarily imperative. A solar and chemical system has also been proposed. Fuel cells, which made news during the Apollo flights, combine oxygen and hydrogen into water, which is then used to generate electricity. Each of the four units will be capable of generating about 8,000 watts.

The fuel for the power generation will be the radioisotope plutonium 238, and fuel will be provided for three units with a lifetime of about one year. In the event of a failure, the fuel will simply be transferred to the standby unit. This was a House which thus proved capable of facing directly up to the fact that it was legislating the morality and conscience of one group of the state's population for all other groups, and then going ahead to vote precisely that way.

There was in better or more dramatic illustration of how the House could get that way than that offered by the argument advanced by Rep. Norris O'Neill, the Hartford Democrat, in his own vote that afternoon. The Hartford Democrat has become so famous as an anti-matter liberal, for whom no concept of political pleasing seems to exist, because the health of the whole Church, as well as the health of humanity, are largely dependent upon the vigor and fidelity of Catholicism.

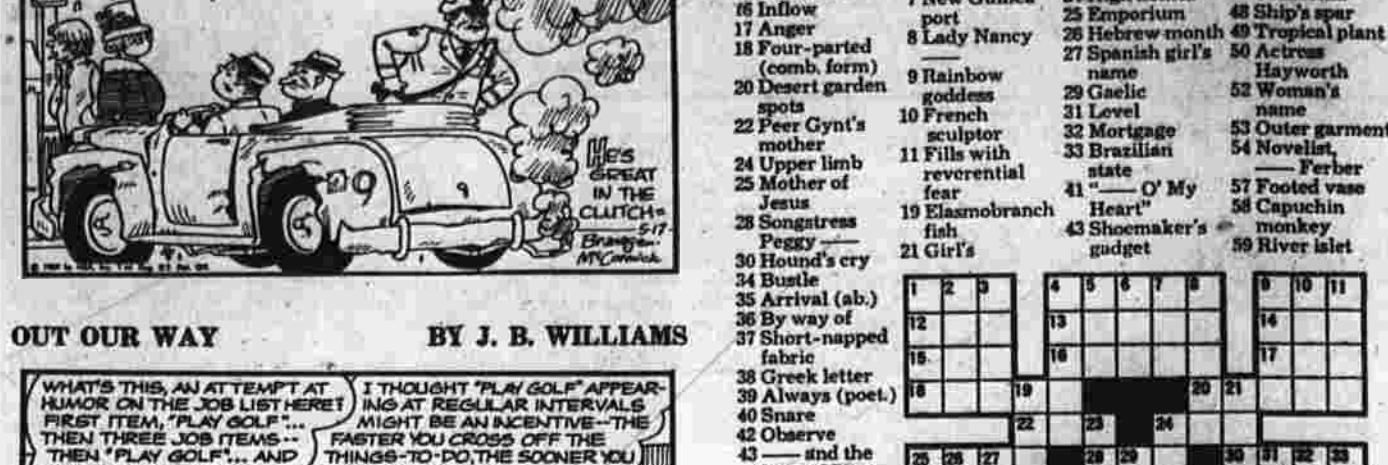
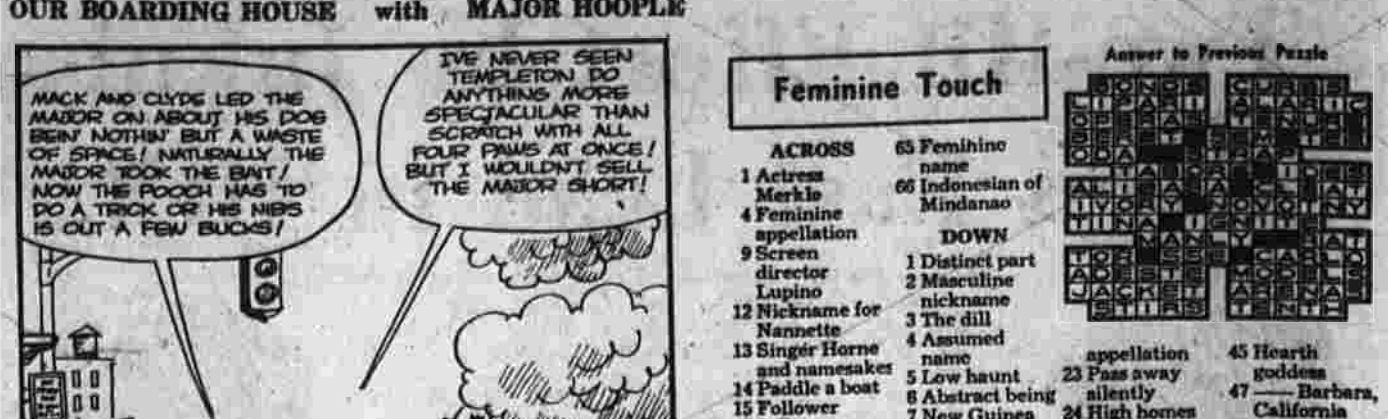

Iona's staff will remain the same from top to bottom, Sleith said. He will become the president of the Iona division of General Signal which has 18 divisions with 84 plants in the U.S. and Canada.

All hiring practices including the hiring of the mentally retarded and the physically handicapped will continue, Sleith said. The town plant hires 400 people in the slow months of the spring and 700 or more in the fall.

The main office and plant will remain on Iona's site across what is known as the "Iona Triangle." The new office will be in town.
