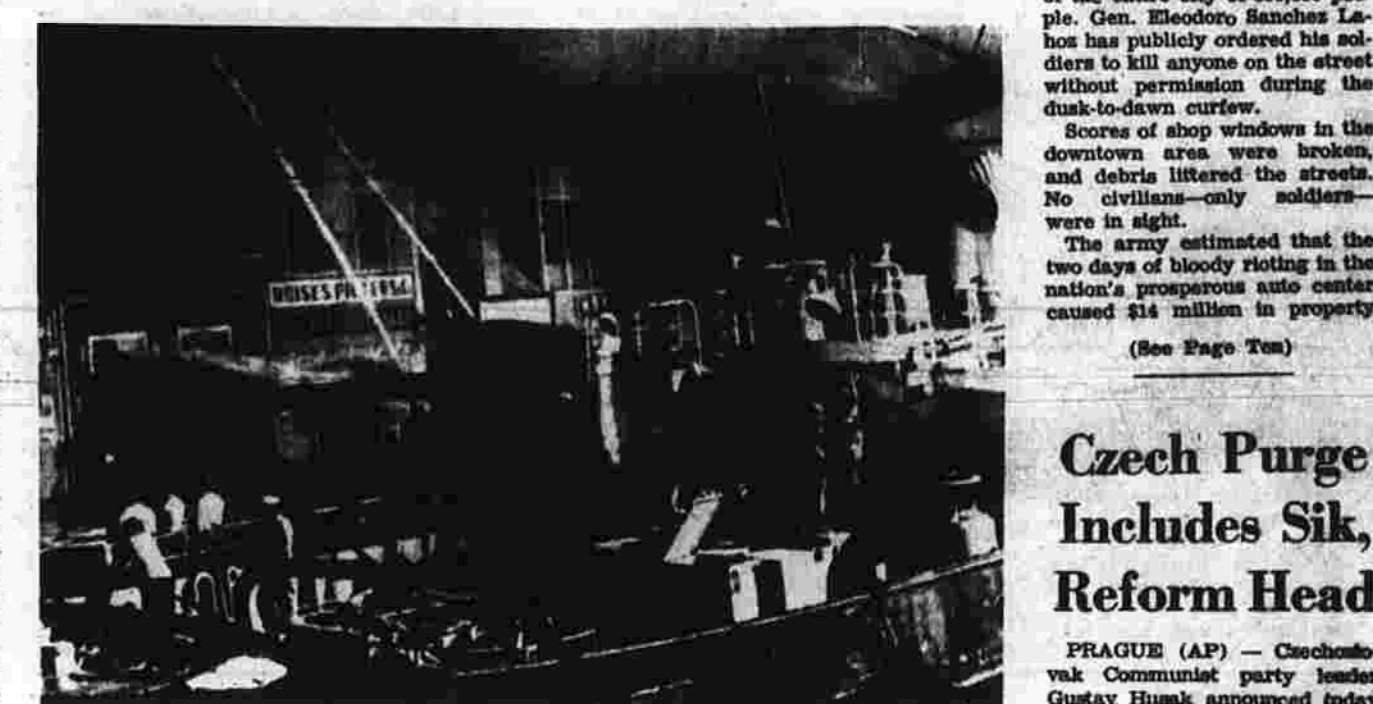

37 Greeks Sentenced, Convicted of Subversion.
SALONIKA, Greece (AP)—Thirty-seven persons convicted of subversion against the Greek military dictatorship were sentenced today to prison terms ranging from 15 months to life. Two persons were acquitted.

Argyrios Baras, 45, who published a leftist weekly newspaper until the army seized power in April 1967, was one of four defendants sentenced to life.

Three persons received suspended sentences.

All 39 of the accused were charged with instigating armed rebellion and attempting to assassinate the regime's first premier, Constantine Kiliass, under orders from a Communist-led organization, the Patriotic Front.

Police witnesses testified that the group planned to overthrow the American consulate in Salonika and a North Atlantic Treaty Organization military base in the city.

The trial brought the number of persons convicted by special courts-martial here to 108 during the past three weeks to more than 400.

Roman Union Leaders Ready to End Slowdown

ROME (AP)—Union leaders announced today that they were ready to accept government proposals and end a marathon work slowdown that has left Italy with hundreds of tons of undelivered mail.

Officials of the Post and Telegraph unions named no date for the resumption of postal service, but indicated it would be soon.

The workers' demands include the abolition of overtime hours, the filling of thousands of vacancies and early pay.

The slowdown began early this month during a wave of strikes and general worker unrest here and in other parts of Italy.

'New Democratic Life' Promised Lived

KHARTOUM, Sudan (AP)—Maj. Gen. Gaafar el Numeiri, chairman of the National Revolutionary Council that overthrew the government Sunday says his belief regime will lead the country to "new democratic life" as soon as possible.

Numeiri, interviewed over Sudanese radio and television, gave no details about what kind of structure the new government would have, but he said he had no intention of leaving the Sudan.

Awadallah, the new prime minister, indicated earlier that there would be a one-party system "similar to the Arab Socialist Union in neighboring Egypt."

Numeiri said the politicians who were in power when his government took over had been arrested and would be tried. These presumably included the ousted heads of state, President Ismail al-Bashir and Premier Mohammed al-Bashir.

The revolutionary regime, which swept to power in a bloodless coup that abolished all political parties and parliament, and concentrated executive power jointly in Numeiri's military council and Awadallah's cabinet.

Shainwold on Bridge

IGNORE OLD RULE FOR GOOD DEFENSE
BY ALFRED SHEINWOLD

The old rule "second hand low" advises a defender to play low when he is second to play to a trick that has been played by declarer or the dummy. This rule protects the beginner against waiting his intermediate cards, such as nines, tens, and so forth, but the good player must look for exceptions to the rule.

Opening lead—Seven of spades.

Both sides vulnerable.

Declarer took the first trick in dummy with the queen of spades and returned the three of hearts. East began a high-signal by playing the six of hearts, and South showed the ace of diamonds by getting a 5-3 break or of finding a deep finessé with the four hearts in the West hand.

This does not materialize, and South did not expect to win South's trick to pass a club to West. This maneuver is equalized when West pounced on the trick with the ten of hearts.

Daily question: Dealer, at your right, opens the bidding with one spade. You are west, holding: Spades, K-8-5; Hearts, A-8; Diamonds, 10-9-2-1; Clubs, A-K-5-2.

What do you say?

Answer: Pass. You should take action when you have a diamond suit of your own or strong support for any suit in which partner has length, but it is when you have moderately strong support hand you should simply pass and await developments. You may occasionally miss a part score by passing, but your side will not be hearts when declarer first lands make a game unless your partner is strong enough to speak up trick to west.
